Tonight's Game: The Nashville Sounds continue their four-game series against the Sacramento River Cats at First Tennessee Park. It's the first and only meeting between the two teams in 2018. The Sounds topped the River Cats 3-1 in last night's series opener. Tonight, right-hander Daniel Mengden starts for the Sounds against left-hander Daniel Camarena for the River Cats.

Daniel Mengden: 25-year-old Daniel Mengden starts for the Sounds in tonight's game. The right-hander 2-1 with a 4.43 ERA in five games (four starts) with Nashville this year. He last pitched on July 30 at Salt Lake and was chased after recording just two outs in the first inning as he threw 41 pitches. He allowed four runs on five hits in the no-decision. Mengden started the season with Oakland and is 6-6 with a 4.47 ERA in 16 starts for the A's. Oakland acquired Mengden from the Houston Astros along with Jacob Nottingham in exchange for Scott Kazmir on July 23, 2015. The Houston, Texas native was originally drafted by the Houston Astros in fourth round of the 2014 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of Texas A&M University.

Daniel Camarena: 25-year-old Daniel Camarena starts for the River Cats in tonight's game. The right-hander is 0-6 with a 5.37 ERA in 11 games (10 starts) with Sacramento this year. He made one start with Double-A Richmond and allowed two earned runs in seven innings. Camarena last worked on July 30 against the Iowa Cubs and took the loss after he allowed six earned runs on nine hits in three innings. He began the season in the Yankees organization with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and made eight starts for the RailRiders, going 2-3 with a 5.08 ERA before being released on May 20. Camarena signed a minor league contract with San Francisco on May 24. He was originally drafted by the Yankees in the 20th round of the 2011 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of Cathedral Catholic (CA) High School.

2018 Standings: The Sounds have spent the following amount of days in the American Southern Division standings in 2018: First: 1, Second: 78, Third: 42, Fourth: 3.

Leaderboard: Anthony Garcia leads the Sounds in runs (64), doubles (23), home runs (19), and RBI (68). If he finishes the season in the lead in all four of those categories he would be the first Sounds player to do so since Chris Truby in 2004.

Crazy Eight: Chris Bassitt tossed eight innings in his start last night to match a Sounds season-high. It was the third time this season a Sounds starter went eight innings. Frankie Montas did so on May 14 against Memphis and Ben Bracewell went eight against Omaha on July 16. The Sounds are 2-1 in those games.

Knock Three Times: Bassitt allowed just three hits in his start last night and Josh Lucas did not allow any. The three hits yielded by the Sounds matched a season-low. The Sounds limited the New Orleans Baby Cakes to just three hits on April 7.

Kicking the Dust Off: Dustin Fowler was not getting consistent at-bats with Oakland prior to being optioned by the A's on August 1 but has made his presence felt in Music City. In his two games with the Sounds he is 5-for-8 with two runs and a stolen base. In his 32 games with the Sounds this season he has amassed 16 multi-hit games.

Back above .500: Last night's win put the Sounds above .500 at 56-55. Prior to tonight the last time Nashville was over .500 was after an 11-3 win against Tacoma on June 8 that pushed their record to 30-29.

W6: The Sounds are currently on their longest winning streak of the season at six games. The six-game streak surpassed their two previous five-game winning streaks in 2018. They won five straight from April 14-19 and from July 6-13. The Iowa Cubs snapped both streaks.

Hendriks Dialed In: Reliever Liam Hendriks has thrown 10.1 consecutive innings without allowing a run. Since July 15, Hendriks has eight straight scoreless outings and has racked up 17 strikeouts while allowing only 7 hits.

Turning Me On...Base: Two different current Sounds players are currently sporting on-base streaks of at least 12 games. Boog Powell has reached safely in all 12 games he has played for the Sounds this season. Beau Taylor has reached base safely in 13 straight games. His season-long is 17 games.

There's No Place Like Home: Last night's win for the Sounds gave them 33 at First Tennessee Park. At 33-23, the Sounds are on pace to have their best season at home in the four-year history of the ballpark. The Sounds were 31-38 in 2017, 36-36 in 2016 and 32-40 in 2015 for a grand total of 132-137. Nashville needs four wins over the final 14 home games to surpass the high of 36 wins at First Tennessee Park in 2016.

Sounds Going Six: Last night's eight-inning start by Chris Bassitt was the 45th time a Sounds starter has gone at least 6.0 innings in 2018. Nashville is 25-20 in those games. Among current starters, James Naile has gone at least 6.0 innings 11 times, Eric Jokisch has done it 10 times, Frankie Montas and Bassitt have four, and Daniel Mengden has done it two times. Sounds starters have logged at least six innings in each of the last four games.

Milestone Watch: Several Sounds are nearing career milestones. Shortstop Jorge Mateo needs one more double to reach the century mark for his career. Outfielder Brett Vertigan has 99 career stolen bases.

Last Outing: Mengden last pitched on July 30 in a start against the Salt Lake Bees at Smith's Ballpark. The right-hander had the shortest outing of his career as he lasted just 2/3 of an inning before being pulled due to a high pitch count. He gave up four runs on five hits in the start and threw 41 pitches, 23 for strikes. The Sounds won the game 11-8 in 11 innings.

Against Opponent: Mengden has pitched against Sacramento one time in his career. In a start at First Tennessee Park on May 20, 2016, Mengden was on his game as he surrendered just one run on five hits in seven innings. He issued one walk and amassed eight strikeouts in Nashville's 2-1 win.

2018 Season Highlights:

- Began the season on Oakland's Opening Day roster, the first MLB Opening Day roster in his career.
- Threw a complete-game two-hit shutout against Arizona on May 26.
- Recorded wins in four consecutive starts from May 15-31.
- Placed on Oakland's 10-day DL on June 27 with a right foot sprain.
- Made two Major League rehab appearances for Nashville on July 6 and 13 before being optioned to Nashville prior to his July 19 start.
- Had the shortest appearance of his career on July 30 at Salt Lake as he lasted just 2/3 of an inning before being relieved.

Career Notes:

- Made his MLB debut on June 11, 2016 at Cincinnati.
- At the age of 23 year, 113 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher to start a game since Trevor Cahill on June 19, 2011.
- Just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1913 to lose each of his first three career games while allowing three or fewer runs in each game.
- Traded from Houston to Oakland on July 23, 2015.

College/Prep Notes:

- Attended Texas A&M University from 2012-2014 and went 15-17 with a 3.20 ERA and 230 strikeouts with the Aggies.
- Named SEC All-Defensive Team and SEC All-Tournament Team in 2013.
- Spent Summer 2013 with Team USA Collegiate National Team where he was teammates with fellow A Matt Chapman along with Trea Turner, Kyle Schwarber, Alex Bregman, Bradley Zimmer, and former Vanderbilt star Tyler Beede.
- Graduated from Westside (TX) High School in 2011 where he was a three-time District 20-5A MVP and an AFLAC All-American.
- His grandfather is former Texas state senator, Walter Henry Mengden Jr.
