MANY MOONS AGO: The Dodgers tonight begin a six-game road trip with the opener of a two-game Interleague series against the AL West's Oakland Athletics, who have won six consecutive games. The two squads split a pair of games at Dodger Stadium way back on April 10 and 11. In the NL West, Arizona's victory last night puts them 0.5 game in front of the Dodgers as Los Angeles looks to secure its sixth straight division title. Following tomorrow night's series finale, the Dodgers will travel to Denver and begin a key four-game series with the Colorado Rockies on Thursday night.

- LA Los Angeles has posted a 36-21 (.632) record since the beginning of June, which is the best winning percentage in the NL over that time.
- LA The Dodgers are 7-6 in Interleague play this season, including a 1-2 on the road.

HAUNTED HOUSE: Los Angeles is just 11-20 against the A's in the regular season since Interleague Play began in 1997. Even starker, the Dodgers have dropped 14 of 16 games all-time at the Oakland Coliseum, including eight consecutive contests. The last Los Angeles win in Oakland was on July 14, 2001 in 15 innings. The Boys in Blue have also never won a series in Oakland. Though these two teams don't play often, there are many connections between them:

- LA Prior to joining the Dodgers, General Manager **Farhan Zaidi** spent 10 seasons in the Athletics organization.
- LA Dodger bench coach **Bob Geren** spent 13 seasons in the Oakland organization (1999-2011), including serving as the manager from 2007 until June 9, 2011, posting a 334-376 record. Geren also spent three seasons as the bullpen coach for the A's from 2003-05 and spent one season as the bench coach in 2006.
- LA Dodger pitching coach **Rick Honeycutt** played for Oakland from 1987-93 and once again in 1995. Honeycutt won a World Series with the A's in 1989.
- LA Prior to being acquired by the Dodgers at the 2016 trade deadline, tonight's starter **Rich Hill**, was 9-3 with a 2.25 ERA (19 ER/76.0 IP) in 14 starts for the A's.
- LA **Max Muncy**, who leads the Dodgers with 24 homers, was selected by the A's in the fifth round of the 2012 Draft and appeared in 96 games in 2015-2016 for Oakland.
- LA Former Los Angeles outfielder and current Dodger broadcaster **Rick Monday** was made the first ever player selected in the Major League First-Year Player Draft in 1965 by the Kansas City Athletics. Monday played six seasons for the Athletics (1966-71) and was named an All-Star in 1968.

RETURN TO THIS HILL: Former Athletic **Rich Hill** will take the mound in Oakland tonight and make his 15th start of the 2018 season. Hill gave up one earned run in 6.0 innings last Wednesday vs. the Brewers and took the no decision. In his last three outings following the All-Star break, Hill is 2-0 with a 0.95 ERA (2 ER/19.0 IP) and 21 strikeouts while holding opposing hitters to a .200 average in that time. In his last nine games (eight starts) since returning from the disabled list on June 19, the southpaw has gone 3-2 with a 2.36 ERA (13 ER/49.2 IP) and has limited the opposition to a .215 average. He has also punched out 56 batters against 13 walks and has posted a 1.07 WHIP during that span.

- LA Hill is 0-1 with a 7.36 ERA (3 ER/3.2 IP) in five career games (one start) against the A's. His last appearance vs. Oakland was out of the 'pen in 2013 and his only start vs. the A's came on June 7, 2009 as a member of the Baltimore Orioles.
- LA Hill has been tough with runners in scoring position this season, as he is limiting hitters to a .120 (6-for-50) mark, which is the fifth best mark among big league pitchers with 50 or more batters faced. Since the 2017 season, the veteran has held the opposition to a .164 average with runners in scoring position, which ranks second in the big leagues (min. 150 BFP), trailing only Blake Snell (.153).
- LA Hill is 2-4 with a 5.82 ERA (42 ER/65.0 IP) in 23 career Interleague games (11 starts). His only Interleague appearance this season was on July 14 out of the 'pen against the Angels (1.0 scoreless inning).

THE BULL DOZIER: Newly acquired second baseman **Brian Dozier**, ripped a two-run double on Sunday and continued his hot start with the Dodgers. Since being acquired July 31, Dozier has gone 6-for-15 (.400) with four runs, three doubles, two home runs and seven RBI in five games with Los Angeles. With the Dodgers, Dozier has reached base safely in nine of 18 plate appearances and since the beginning of July, he has reached base safely in 24 of 31 games.

- LA Since the start of 2016, just one player has hit more homers after the All-Star break than Dozier:

- LA Since the 2014 season, Dozier has scored 492 runs, which is the third most in the big leagues during that span, trailing just Mike Trout (516) and Charlie Blackmon (505).

MANNY HAPPY RETURNS: On this date in 1979, **Manny Mota** tied Smoky Burgess' all-time pinch-hit record of 144 hits with a single against the Astros. Mota finished his 13-year career as the all-time leader with 150 pinch-hits, a record that has since been broken by former Dodgers **Lenny Harris** and **Mark Sweeney**. Chase Utley leads the 2018 Dodgers with 13 pinch-hits (second, NL).

- LA On August 7, 1972, **Sandy Koufax** was inducted into Baseball's Hall of Fame.

JAKE CAN RAKE: Double-A Tulsa Drillers outfielder **Jacob Scavuzzo** was named Texas League Player of the Month for July after leading the league in extra-base hits (18), total bases (75), home runs (10), RBI (30), slugging (.708) and OPS (1.090) while finishing third in average (.349) and hits (37). Scavuzzo, 24, was selected by the Dodgers in the 21st round of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft out of Villa Park High School in Villa Park, California.

- In 15 games (14 starts), he has gone 4-4 with a 3.63 ERA (30 ER/74.1 IP), posting a 1.29 WHIP and a 3.12 strikeout to walk ratio
- Since returning from the DL (recurring blisters) on June 19, he has gone 3-2 with a 2.36 ERA (13 ER/49.2 IP) in nine games (eight starts), while holding batters to a .215 average and posting a 1.07 WHIP... has struck out 56 batters against 13 walks

CAREER NOTES:

- Veteran southpaw enters his 14th big league season and his third year with the Dodgers, after going 12-8 with a 3.32 ERA in 25 starts in his first full season with the club in 2017
- Has gone 50-36 career record with a 3.96 ERA and a 1.25 WHIP in 246 games (119 starts) with the Chicago Cubs (2005-08), Baltimore Orioles (2009), Boston Red Sox (2010-12, '15), Cleveland Indians (2012), Los Angeles Angels (2014), New York Yankees (2014), Oakland Athletics (2016) and Los Angeles Dodgers (2016-17)
- In 119 career starts, he has gone 46-34 with a 3.90 ERA (286 ER/659.2 IP) and has limited batters to a .223 average...in 127 relief appearances, he has gone 4-2 with a 4.38 ERA (42 ER/86.1 IP) and has held the opposition to a .238 average
- Has held hitters to a .225 career average and has been effective against hitters from both sides of the plate, limiting lefties to a .220 mark and holding right-handers to a .227 average
- Has a 9.43 career strikeout per nine innings and a 2.49 strikeout-to-walk ratio, striking out 782 against 314 walks in 746.0 innings
- Made his Major League debut on June 15, 2005 against the Florida Marlins as a member of the Cubs, allowing two runs on three hits and striking out two in an inning of relief
- Has made four career postseason starts with the Cubs (2007) and the Dodgers (2016), going 1-2 with a 4.50 ERA (8 ER/16.0 IP) and striking out 22 batters against just eight walks
- Selected by the Chicago Cubs in the fourth round of the 2002 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Michigan

vs. OAKLAND

- Last faced the Athletics as a member of the Cleveland Indians on August 17, 2013 at the Oakland Coliseum, where he got one out (strikeout) in relief
- In five games (one start) against Oakland, he has gone 0-1 with a 7.36 ERA (3 ER/3.2 IP), striking out six against five walks, while limiting batters to a .154 average
- As a member of the Athletics, he went 9-3 with a 2.25 ERA (19 ER/76.0 IP) in 14 starts, striking out 90 against 28 walks, while posting a 1.09 WHIP, before being traded to Los Angeles along with Josh Reddick on August 1, 2016

TOMORROW'S STARTER at OAKLAND: LHP CLAYTON KERSHAW (5-5, 2.55 ERA)

- Last pitched Thursday against Milwaukee at Dodger Stadium, where he allowed two runs on five hits in 6.0 innings, earning the win in the Dodgers' 21-5 victory...struck out seven against two walks on 98 pitches
- In 16 starts, he has gone 5-5 with a 2.55 ERA (27 ER/95.1 IP), limiting the opposition to a .229 average and posting a 1.07 WHIP, while averaging 9.25 strikeouts per nine innings

vs. OAKLAND

- Last faced the Athletics on August 18, 2015 at the Coliseum, where he allowed one run on five hits in 7.0 innings, striking out seven against two walks, while not factoring into the decision in the Dodgers' 5-4 defeat
- Has no record in three starts against the A's, posting a 0.87 ERA (2 ER/20.2 IP), while holding batters to a .171 average and posting a 0.92 WHIP

- Since May 17, the 'pen has allowed 97 earned runs over 261.2 innings (3.34 ERA in that time, 3rd NL) and has held hitters to a .215 average (leads NL) in 71 games...have struck out 275 batters against 89 walks, while posting a 1.14 WHIP during that span
- Since pitching coach Rick Honeycutt joined the Dodgers in 2006, the Dodger pitchers rank first in the Major Leagues in ERA (3.63), WHIP (1.25), strikeouts (16,743), strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.72) and all opponents' slashline numbers (.243/.309/.379/.687)
