


## GAME NOTES





#### LOS ANGELES DODGERS (63-51) at Oakland Athletics (67-47)

LHP Clayton Kershaw (5-5, 2.55) vs. RHP Mike Fiers (7-6, 3.48) Wednesday, August 8, 2018 | 7:05 p.m. PT | Oakland Coliseum | Oakland, CA Game 115 | Road Game 56 (32-23) | Night Game 82 (45-36)





THE BRIGHT SIDE OF THE BAY: The Dodgers tonight continue their a six-game road trip (1-0) with the finale of a two-game Interleague series against the AL West's Oakland Athletics, following last night's 4-2 victory. The Dodgers can not only earn a sweep tonight, but also a season series win over the A's, having won two of three this year vs. Oakland. In the topsy-turvy NL West, the Dodgers are back in front, 0.5 game ahead of the Diamondbacks. Following tonight's contest, the Dodgers will fly to Denver and begin a key four-game series with the Colorado Rockies on tomorrow night.

- L.A. has posted a 37-21 (.638) record since the beginning of June, which is the best winning percentage in the NL over that time.
- The Dodgers are 8-6 in Interleague play this season, including a 2-2 mark on the road.

**<u>DEMONS EXERCISED:</u>** Last night the Dodgers won a game in Oakland for the first time since July 14, 2001 and snapped an eight game losing streak at the Oakland Coliseum. Los Angeles is just 12-20 against the A's in the regular season since Interleague Play began in 1997. Tonight, the Boys in Blue will look to win their first-ever series in Oakland. Though these two teams don't play often, there are many connections between them:

- Prior to joining the Dodgers, General Manager Farhan Zaidi spent 10 seasons in the Athletics organization.
- Dodger bench coach Bob Geren spent 13 seasons in the Oakland organization (1999-2011), including serving as the manager from 2007 until June 9, 2011, posting a 334-376 record. Geren also spent three seasons as the bullpen coach for the A's from 2003-05 and spent one season as the bench coach in 2006.
- Dodger pitching coach Rick Honeycutt played for Oakland from 1987-93 and once again in 1995. Honeycutt won a World Series with the A's in 1989.
- Prior to being acquired by the Dodgers at the 2016 trade deadline, last night's winner, Rich Hill, was 9-3 with a 2.25 ERA (19 ER/76.0 IP) in 14 starts for the A's.
- Max Muncy, who leads the Dodgers with 24 homers, was selected by the A's in the fifth round of the 2012 Draft and appeared in 96 games in 2015-2016 for Oakland.
- Former Los Angeles outfielder and current Dodger broadcaster Rick Monday was made the first ever player selected in the Major League First-Year Player Draft in 1965 by the Kansas City Athletics. Monday played six seasons for the Athletics (1966-71) and was named an All-Star in 1968.

ACE IN O-TOWN: The Dodgers tonight will send left-hander Clayton Kershaw to the mound for his 17<sup>th</sup> start of the season as he looks to record the 150th victory of his illustrious career. Tonight is Kershaw's first crack at No. 150 and the last hurler to accomplish the **PERFECTION:** On this date in 2003, **Eric Gagné** set a Major League feat in a Dodger uniform was **Kevin Brown** on July 25, 1999 in Arizona. Kershaw has won two consecutive starts, including last Thursday's 21-5 laugher over Milwaukee (6.0 IP, 5 H, 2 R, 7 K). This season, the southpaw has a 2.55 ERA (27 ER/95.1 IP), 98 strikeouts against just 19 walks and a .229 opponents' batting average. Kershaw has 11 quality starts overall and has worked a quality outing in five of his last six starts. Among hurlers with at least 15 starts this season, he ranks fourth in the National League in ERA, while his 5.16 strikeout-to-walk ratio ranks sixth and his 1.07 WHIP is tied for the sixth best on the Senior Circuit.

- Kershaw has made just three career starts against the Athletics and though still winless, he has been dominant, allowing just two earned runs in 20.2 IP (0.87 ERA) while striking out 22. The native of Texas has limited A's hitters to a .171 average and his last start vs Oakland came on Aug. 18, 2015 at the Coliseum. In two starts at Oakland Coliseum, Kershaw has given up just two runs in 15.0 innings.
- Since coming off the disabled list on June 23, Kershaw is 4-1 with a 2.33 ERA (12 ER/46.1 IP) and 45 strikeouts against just eight walks in eight starts. He has also limited the opposition to a .225 average and has posted a 1.01 WHIP. The Dodgers are 6-2 in those games.

THE BULL DOZIER: Newly acquired second baseman Brian Dozier was a thorn in the A's side last night. Batting from the leadoff spot for the first time as a Dodger, he went 1-for-2 with three walks and is now 7-for-17 (.412) with four runs, three doubles, two homers, seven RBI and a .565 on-base percentage in six games since being acquired on July 31. Dozier has reached base safely in 13 of 23 plate appearances with Los Angeles and since the beginning of July, he has reached base safely in 25 of 32 games.

Since the start of 2016, just one player has hit more homers after the All-Star break than Dozier:

- Since the 2014 season, Dozier has scored 492 runs, which is the third most in the big leagues during that span, trailing just Mike Trout (516) and Charlie Blackmon (506).

record by converting his 39th consecutive save to start a season and went on to save all 55 of his opportunities that year. Gagné saved 161 career games for the Dodgers, which is second on the franchise list, trailing only the club's current closer, Kenley Jansen (261). Jansen is tied for first in the NL with 32 saves this season, converting 32 of 35 opportunities.

PINGING AND PONGING: The sixth annual PingPong4Purpose celebrity ping pong competition, which is the signature event for Kershaw's challenge, the nonprofit organization led by Clayton and Ellen Kershaw that aims to serve vulnerable and at-risk children living in Los Angeles, Dallas, Zambia and the Dominican Republic, will take place the evening of Thursday, August 23 at Dodger Stadium. This year, the Kershaws will honor Oscar winner Matthew McConaughey and his wife, Camila, founders of the just keep livin Foundation, with the Kershaw's Challenge Impact Award for their work. The just keep livin Foundation is dedicated to empowering high school students with the tools to lead active lives and make healthy choices for a better future, implementing afterschool fitness and wellness programs across the country. Emmy winner Bryan Cranston will be the emcee for the event this year, along with his wife, Robin Dearden.

- Last pitched Thursday against Milwaukee at Dodger Stadium, where he allowed two runs on five hits in 6.0 innings, earning the win in the Dodgers' 21-5 victory...struck out seven against two walks on 98 pitches
- In 16 starts, he has gone 5-5 with a 2.55 ERA (27 ER/95.1 IP), limiting the opposition to a .229 average and posting a 1.07 WHIP, while averaging 9.25 strikeouts per nine innings
- Became the 13<sup>th</sup> Dodger in franchise history to reach 2000.0 innings and became the 11<sup>th</sup> active pitcher in the league to reach the milestone
- Has limited right-handed batters to a .211/.259/.330 slash line, striking out 76 against 16 walks
- In seven road starts, he has gone 2-2 with a 1.94 ERA (9 ER/41.2 IP), limiting opposing batters to a .225 average and posting a 0.96 WHIP

- Threw his first-career no-hitter on June 18, 2014 vs. Colorado, striking out a career-high 15 batters on 107 pitches in Dodgers' 8-0 win...his 15 K's were the most ever for a Dodger in a no-hitter and, according to Elias Sports Bureau, the most by any pitcher in ML history that did not allow a runner to reach base via hit, walk or hit by pitch...became the 25<sup>th</sup> Dodger pitcher to throw a no-hitter
- Reached the 200-strikeout mark in six consecutive seasons (2010-2015)...he is one of only three Dodgers with six or more seasons with more than 200 Ks, joining Sandy Koufax (6) and Don Drysdale (6)...Kershaw and Koufax (1961-66) are the only ones to accomplish the feat in six consecutive seasons
- Became the third different Dodger pitcher to win the pitching Triple Crown in 2011, joining **Dazzy Vance** (1924) and **Sandy Koufax** (1963, '65, '66), leading the Majors with a 2.28 ERA, tying the NL lead with 21 wins and ranking first in the league with 248 strikeouts

- Last faced the Athletics on August 18, 2015 at the Coliseum, where he allowed one run on five hits in 7.0 innings, striking out seven against two walks, while not factoring into the decision in the Dodgers' 5-4 defeat
