LEADING OFF: Halos play the fifth contest of a six-game home stand (3-0) vs. Detroit (3-0) & Oakland (Aug. 10-12; 1-0)...Last night marked 27th comeback win & 19th one-run victory...With four consecutive wins, Angels are over .500 for first time since July 29th...Halos are 8-1 in last nine home games and have scored 89 runs across last 12 affairs (7.4 per) at the Big A...LAA is 23-18 vs. A.L. West foes...Halos have won four straight, are 5-4 this month, 10-10 since the break & 16-17 since July 1st...Angels are 9.5 games back of second wild card... Halos have spent last 44 days in 4th place...LAA is 13-21 when lefty starts (46-37 vs. RHS)...On Monday, Angels set out on a nine-game trip to San Diego (8/13-15), Texas (8/16-19) & Arizona (8/21-22).

FAST FACTS: Halos are 16-4 in last 20 home games vs. Oakland...Tyler Skaggs makes his third start of season against A's – has not allowed an earned run in either start (13.1 IP, 10 H, 0 ER, 1 BB, 13 K).

KNOW THIS: With a sixth inning single last night, Albert Pujols became one of nine players all-time with 1,000 hits in each league (2,073 hits with St. Louis & 1,000 with LAA)...Four former Angels are on the list - Dave Winfield, Frank Robinson, Vlad Guerrero & Orlando Cabrera...Is also 11th player to reach 1,000 hits as an Angel.

ALL THE WAY UP: Justin Upton has homered in three straight games for the seventh time in his career...Smashed a HR in career-best four straight contests earlier this season (May 8-11)...18 of his 24 HRs on season have come at home...On pace to reach 30+ HR & 90+ RBI for second straight campaign and is only MLB left fielder with at least 20 HR every year since 2013.

<u>DID YOU KNOW</u>? Not only did **Pujols** become one of just nine players all-time with 1,000 hits in each league, he joined **Eddie Collins (White Sox & Philadelphia A's)** as one of only two players in MLB history with at least 2,000 hits in one league and 1,000 in another...**Collins** tallied 2.007 knocks with the **Sox** and 1.308 with the **A's** (STATS LLC).

HI, MY NAME IS... With newly acquired Williams Jerez making his MLB debut Tuesday (via Kinsler trade to Boston), he became the 30th pitcher to appear for the Angels this season – one hurler shy of matching the club record (31 pitchers last season).

<u>SUCCESS vs. ATHLETICS</u>: Justin Upton (.438; 7/16, 3 2Bs, HR) & Andrelton Simmons (.333; 4/12, 2B, HR) have Angels' best career numbers against **Edwin Jackson...Upton** is hitting .317 vs. A's this season (13/41; 3 HR, 11 RBI)...**Cam Bedrosian** is 2-0 with two saves & 2.54 ERA (28.1 IP - 8 ER) in 30 career games vs. **Athletics**.

THE NEW ME: Kole Calhoun has 11 HRs his last 25 affairs and his 15 HRs since June 18th lead A.L....In the 25 games, he is hitting .323 (31/96) with 24 runs, six doubles, one triple, 11 HR & 27 RBI...In 44 games back from D.L., batting .291 (46/158) with 34 runs, nine doubles, a triple, 15 HR & 35 RBI to raise season average from .145 to .215 (had 1 HR & 11 RBI over previous 50 G).

#27 at 27: Mike Trout turned 27 Tuesday...His 61.9 career WAR is second-highest all time by a position player through age-26 season behind only Ty Cobb...He and Willie Mays are only players with three 30 HR/20 SB seasons by age-26 campaign-or-younger (first in A.L. history)...Trout joined Mickey Mantle, Jimmie Foxx & Eddie Mathews as only players with 600 BB & 225 HR prior age 27...Of the 15 other players with 200+ HR at 26-or-younger, none had more stolen bases (186) & only three had a higher OBP (.415) (ELIAS).

TROUT TO D.L. Trout has missed the last eight games with a right wrist contusion (day-to-day)...He suffered the injury on a head-first slide August 2nd at Tampa Bay...Monday he received a cortisone injection and today was placed on the 10-day D.L. (retro to 8/6).

<u>SHO ME SOMETHIN'</u> Shohei Ohtani is the first player in MLB history with 10+ HR & 50+ pitching Ks in same season (*STATS*)...<u>Just third player in baseball history with 12 HR & four wins in a season joining Jimmy Ryan (1888 White Stockings) & Babe Ruth (1919 Red Sox).</u>

LOOKING AHEAD: 34 of 44 remaining games are with divisional foes: 13 vs. Texas (6 home, 7 road), 10 vs. Houston (3 home, 7 road), seven vs. Oakland (4 home, 3 road) & four vs. Seattle (all at home)...17 of 28 games this month are on road...Seven interleague games remain (8/13-15 at SD, 8/21-22 at ARI & 8/27-28 vs. COL).

WE GOT A GUY THERE: Three-time Gold Glover Andrelton Simmons leads MLB shortstops with 167 putouts and has third-fewest errors (8) among A.L. SS (min. 90 GS)...He leads baseball with a 13.2 UZR (Ultimate Zone Rating) & ranks third in MLB with 16 defensive runs saved (FanGraphs)...Since 2015, his 91 runs saved are tops in MLB.

MINOR MINUTE: Baseball America's Top 100 Prospects features four Halo farmhands: OF Jo Adell (11), RHP Griffin Canning (48), OF Brandon Marsh (89) & LHP Jose Suarez (90).

<u>SHELVED:</u> Angels have 13 players currently on the D.L. (club record is 15 set June 15th)...Average D.L. stint for LAA this season is 41 games...53 players to appear are most in MLB (team record is 55 in 2017)...30 pitchers (12 SP) are one shy of club record (31 in '17)... Placed MLB-most 22 players on D.L. in first half.

MVP x 3? Despite missing eight games, two-time A.L. MVP Mike Trout ranks in Top 5 in A.L. in several offensive categories, including HR (T5th; 30), runs (5th; 82), runs created (2^{ndt}; 119), times on base (1st; 221), total bases (T5th; 232), walks (1st; 99), IBB (1st; 20), OBP (1st; 459), SLG (3rd; .624), OPS (2nd; 1.083), OPS+ (1st; 191.0) and offensive WAR (6.8: 1st)

<u>WALK TALK</u>: Trout's 99 walks are 17 shy of his own club record (116 in 2016)...4th player in A.L. history with 20+ SB & 20+ IBB, joining Ichiro (2002; 2005), Rafael Palmeiro (1993) & Reggie Jackson (1974)...With next free pass, will reach 100 BB, 25+ HR & 20 SB for third time in career (2013 & 2016), no other American Leaguer has accomplished more than once: Toby Harrah (1977) & Carl Yastrzemski (1970)...If Trout reaches 25 HR/30 SB/100 BB, it will be third time doing so (Barry Bonds in 1991 is only other in MLB).

GLOVE STORY: Club ranks tied for second in A.L. with .987 fielding pct...Halos lead MLB turning 128 double plays...Catchers own a 41.5 caught stealing pct. (22 of 53), tops in A.L. (2nd in MLB)...Trout is only CF in MLB with a 1.000 fielding pct...Kole Calhoun's 27 OF assists since 2016 are tops in A.L.

<u>PITCHING POINTS</u>: Halo relievers lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 20.1 % to score (40 of 199)...<u>LAA pitchers</u> have 46 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through 117 affairs (5th in A.L. with 1,012 K)...Bullpen has logged 437.2 IP, second in A.L. to **Tampa Bay...**LAA has allowed 151 HRs, fourth-most in A.L..<u>Since 2017</u>, Jose Alvarez is tied for A.L. lead with 123 games pitched (Blake Parker ranks third in junior circuit with 122 games).

THIS N' THAT: Francisco Arcia's 12 RBI thru first three home starts of career are an MLB record - previous Angels record: Shohei Ohtani – 7 (STATS LLC)...Arcia posted 10 RBI across his first two career games (4 RBI in MLB debut, 6 RBI in 2nd game) to set an MLB record...A. Simmons leads MLB in PA per SO at 18.91 (435 PA/23 K)...He also leads MLB batting .319 (43/135) with two strikes...Angels' 160 HRs hit rank T2nd in A.L...Trout's 7.5 WAR ranks second in MLB...Mike Scioscia (1,629 wins) ranks 18th on all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17th with 1,769)...Since 2012, Trout hasn't gone more than two consecutive games without reaching base.

HOT HALOS: Since June 27th, rookie Justin Anderson has fashioned a 1.10 ERA in 15 games (16.1 IP – 2 ER; 6 BB, 19 K) and has allowed one earned run across last 12 outings (13 IP)...Since June 27th, he has lowered his ERA from 4.00 to 2.91...A. Simmons has hit safely in nine of his last 11 (five multi-hit games over last nine contests)...Jaime Barria is 2-0 with 2.70 ERA (16.2 IP – 5 ER; 3 BB, 10 K) last three starts...Taylor Cole has allowed one earned run over last 10.2 IP (0.84 ERA; 3 BB, 11 K)...Over his last five games, Shohei Ohtani is batting .421 (8/19, 5 R, 2B, 3 HR, 7 RBI, 3 SB)...Cam Bedrosian has a 1.93 ERA (28 IP - 6 ER) since June 1.

ALBERT ALERT: Albert Pujols ranks 24th all-time with 3,073 hits (Ichiro is 23rd with 3,089)...Pujols ranks sixth all-time with 632 HR (Willie Mays is 5th w/660 HR)...He is one of four players with 3,000 hits & 600 HRs (Aaron, Mays & Rodriguez)...AP is seventh all-time with 1,974 RBI (BBREF)...Lou Gehrig is sixth with 1,995 RBI...Albert's 1,286 career extra-base hits rank sixth all-time (Mays is 5th w/ 1,323 XBH)...Only two players have logged 3,000 hits, 600 HR & 2,000 RBI (H. Aaron & A. Rodriguez; Pujols is 26 RBI shy).

<u>Vs. OAKLAND:</u> Angels are 12-5 in last 17 games vs. A's...<u>Halos lead 2018 series 7-4</u>...When these teams last met on June 17th, Angels were 38-34 and A's were 36-36...*Since then, Halos have gone 21-24 while Oakland is 32-12*...LAA has won four consecutive season series vs. A's (2014-17).

<u>PADRES ON DECK</u>: Halos head down the 5 Freeway to visit the Padres for a three-game series, the 10th all-time regular season meeting, and just second visit to PETCO Park (fifth time to SD)...<u>San Diego has taken two of three in each of last two season series (2015 at Big A and 2012 at PETCO)...Padres lead all-time series 15-13...**Justin Upton** was an all-star in his lone season with Padres in 2015.</u>

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

August 11

(1996) George Arias, Randy Velarde and Chili Davis all homered in the sixth inning, tying a club mark, in the Angels' 6-5 win over Kansas City; (1975) Angels swipe six bases in the 8-1 win vs. NYY — matching the club record for a nine inning game.

August 12

(1974) Nolan Ryan set an A.L. record with 19 strikeouts in a 4-2 win over Boston...In the effort, Ryan broke Bob Feller's previous mark of 18 K's, a record that stood for over 40 years...Broken in 1986 when Boston's Roger Clemens set a ML record with 20 strikeouts; (1982) Doug DeCinces homers at Minnesota, his 12th HR in a 13 games – the most in a two-week stretch in club history; (2005) Vladimir Guerrero connects for two upper deck home runs at Safeco Field, the first player to accomplish the feat in the same game at the ballpark.

In two starts vs. A's this year, is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (13.1 IP - 0 ER) and 13 strikeouts

- WELCOME BACK: Reinstated from second disabled list stint prior to tonight's game (missed nine games with a left
 adductor strain)...During first DL stint, missed nine games (July 1-12) with a right adductor strain (was scratched from
 scheduled start on June 21 with right hamstring tightness, but made two more starts before being placed on the DL for
 first time this year).
- Making 21st start of the season and 10th at home...Is in sixth Major League season (fourth with Angels)...Made Opening Day roster for third time in career (also, 2014 & 2017).
- THE FIRST HALF ROAD: Made 10 road starts before the All-Star Break pitching to a 5-2 record and 2.11 ERA (59.2 IP –
 14 ER)...His road ERA ranked third in the Majors behind Jacob deGrom (1.79) and Justin Verlander (1.99) in the first
 half
- OFF THE BOARDS: Has allowed two-or-fewer runs in 15 of 20 starts this season...Had streak of six straight starts
 allowing one-or-fewer earned runs from June 3 July 12, which was tied for second longest in Angels history.
- INSIDE THE PARK: Had streak of 53 innings pitched without allowing a home run snapped in last start on 2nd inning solo HR by Jake Bauers...Steak of eight straight starts without allowing a home run was longest for an Angels lefty since Jim Abbott in 1991...Ranks third in the American League with a 0.71 HR/9 innings rate this season (min. 100 IP).
- 100K: Has reached the 100+ strikeout plateau in a single season for first time in career...Skaggs (105 SO) and Andrew Heaney (102) became first pair of Angels teammates with 100+ strikeouts before the All-Star Break since Garrett Richards (127) and C.J. Wilson (107) in 2014.
- LEFT OUT: Is holding lefties to a .235 (27/115) batting average this season, which ranks 10th in the A.L. among lefties.
- LAST TIME OUT: Charged with loss in last start on July 31 at Tampa Bay after allowing a career-high 10 earned runs on eight hits with three walks and three strikeouts...Most earned runs allowed by an Angels pitcher since Scott Kazmir (13 ER on July 10, 2010 at Oakland).
- <u>STRIKEOUT STREAK</u>: Had streak of 12 straight games with 5+ strikeouts snapped on July 20 by Astros...It was the longest streak by an Angels lefty since **Chuck Finley** (16 consecutive games) in 1997.
- <u>HOT JUNE</u>: In five June starts, went 3-1 with a 0.84 ERA (32 IP 3 ER) and 36 strikeouts...<u>Established the lowest June ERA in Angels history</u> (min. 30 IP)...Three straight starts with a win (June 3-15) was the longest streak of his career...*Is the only Angles pitcher to win at least three consecutive starts this season.*
- <u>GETTING FAMILIAR</u>: Since start of 2017, has allowed three home runs the first time through the batting order in a game (324 PA), but has yielded 16 HR in 321 PA the second time through the order in a game in that span.
- VS. OAKLAND: In seven career starts against the Athletics, is 2-4 with a 4.20 ERA (40.2 IP 21 ER)...Enters tonight's start with 14.1 inning scoreless streak against Oakland...In two starts vs. A's this year, is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (13.1 IP 0 ER) and 13 strikeouts.
- AT ANGEL STADIUM: In 30 career starts at the Big A, is 6-11 with a 4.26 ERA (164.2 IP 78 ER)...In nine home starts this season, is 3-4 with a 3.22 ERA (50.1 IP 18 ER)...In last seven home starts, is pitching to a 2.18 ERA (41.1 IP 10 ER)...Angels have won 16 of his 30 career home starts.
- 300 K's: Recorded 300th career strikeout against Aaron Hicks in 4th inning on April 29 vs. New York (A.L.)
- NEW CAREER HIGH: Set career high with 114 pitches thrown on April 10 at Texas (previous was 105 pitches for Arizona on Aug. 27, 2012 vs. Cincinnati.
- <u>SEASON DEBUT:</u> Earned the win in first start of year on March 30 at Oakland after working 6.1 scoreless innings, allowing three hits with no walks and five strikeouts...With win this year, is now 5-1 with a 1.60 ERA (39.1 IP 7 ER) in his six career season debuts.
- <u>COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT</u>: During the offseason, represented Angels at the annual Kids Holiday Party event for the Angels Baseball Foundation at the ESPN Zone in Downtown Disney.

- Owns a 21-28 career record with a 4.26 ERA (429 IP 203 ER) and 387 strikeouts in 77 career games (all starts).
- Underwent Tommy John surgery on August 13, 2014 by Dr. Neal Elattrache after suffering left forearm strain during start on July 31, 2014 at Baltimore
- Originally drafted by Angels in 1st round (40th overall) of the 2009 amateur draft...Was traded by Angels to D-backs on August 7, 2010 in the deal which brought **Dan Haren** to the Halos...Acquired back by Angels on December 10, 2013 along with LHP **Hector Santiago** in trade which sent OF **Mark Trumbo** and RHP **A.J. Schugel** to Arizona.
