<u>LEADING OFF:</u> Happy Birthday to Zack Cozart!...Halos play the final contest of a six-game home stand (4-1) vs. **Detroit** (3-0) & **Oakland** (1-1)...Angels shut out for eighth time of season last night...Halos are 8-2 in last 10 home games...LAA is 23-19 vs. A.L. West foes...Club has won four of five, are 5-5 this month, 10-11 since the break & 16-18 since July 1st...Angels are 10.5 games back of second wild card... Halos have spent last 45 days in 4th place...LAA is 13-21 when lefty starts (46-38 vs. RHS)...Tomorrow, Angels start a nine-game trip to San Diego (8/13-15), Texas (8/16-19) & Arizona (8/21-22).

<u>GHOST OF CHILI DAVIS</u>: Last night, **Francisco Arcia** became just the fifth true position player to pitch in club history and first since **Chili Davis** on June 17, 1993 vs. **Texas** (25+ year streak without a true position player taking the mound was longest in MLB).

HI, MY NAME IS... With catcher Francisco Aria making his pitching debut last night, he became the 31st different pitcher to appear for the Angels this season – matching the club record set last season.

<u>THIS IS EASY</u>: With a scoreless inning from **Arcia** last night, the last four true position players to pitch for the Halos have posted a combined five scoreless innings - **1993 Chili Davis** (2 IP), **1993 Rene Gonzales** (1 IP) and **1990 Donnie Hill** (1 IP).

FAST FACTS: Halos are 16-5 in last 21 home games vs. Oakland...
Taylor Cole makes his first MLB start – the 13th different starter for LAA this season (club record is 17 SP in 1967)...He has allowed one earned run over his last 10.2 IP (0.84 ERA; 3 BB, 11 K).

KNOW THIS: With a sixth inning single Friday, Albert Pujols became one of nine players all-time with 1,000 hits in each league (2,073 hits with St. Louis & 1,001 with LAA)...Four former Angels are on the list - Dave Winfield, Frank Robinson, Vlad Guerrero & Orlando Cabrera...He is also one of only two in MLB history with at least 2,000 hits in one league and 1,000 in another...Eddie Collins tallied 2,007 knocks with the White Sox and 1,308 with the A's (STATS LLC).

ALL THE WAY UP: Justin Upton has homered in three of last four games and has an extra-base hit each of last four contests...18 of his 24 HRs on season have come at home...On pace to reach 30+ HR & 90+ RBI for second straight campaign and is only MLB left fielder with at least 20 HR every year since 2013.

THE NEW ME: Kole Calhoun has 11 HRs his last 26 affairs and his 15 HRs since June 18th are tied with J.D. Martinez for A.L. lead...In the 26 games, he is hitting .310 (31/100) with 24 runs, six doubles, one triple, 11 HR & 27 RBI...In 45 games back from D.L., batting .284 (46/162) with 34 runs, nine doubles, a triple, 15 HR & 35 RBI to raise season average from .145 to .212 (had 1 HR & 11 RBI over previous 50 G)...His 10 HRs in July were most in any month of his career.

#27 at 27: Mike Trout turned 27 August 7th...His 61.9 career WAR is second-highest all time by a position player through age-26 season behind only Ty Cobb...He and Willie Mays are only players with three 30 HR/20 SB seasons by age-26 campaign-or-younger (first in A.L. history)...Trout joined Mickey Mantle, Jimmie Foxx & Eddie Mathews as only players with 600 BB & 225 HR prior age 27...Of the 15 other players with 200+ HR at 26-or-younger, none had more stolen bases (186) & only three had a higher OBP (.415) (ELIAS).

TROUT TO D.L. Trout has missed the last nine games with a right wrist contusion (day-to-day)...He suffered the injury on a head-first slide August 2nd at Tampa Bay...Monday he received a cortisone injection and Friday was placed on the 10-day D.L. (retro to 8/6).

<u>SHO ME SOMETHIN'</u> Shohei Ohtani is the first player in MLB history with 10+ HR & 50+ pitching Ks in same season (*STATS*)...<u>Just third player in baseball history with 12 HR & four wins in a season joining Jimmy Ryan (1888 White Stockings) & Babe Ruth (1919 Red Sox).</u>

LOOKING AHEAD: 33 of 43 remaining games are with divisional foes: 13 vs. Texas (6 home, 7 road), 10 vs. Houston (3 home, 7 road), six vs. Oakland (3 home, 3 road) & four vs. Seattle (all at home)...17 of 28 games this month are on road...Seven interlegue games remain (8/13-15 at SD, 8/21-22 at ARI & 8/27-28 vs. COL)...24 of final 36 games against teams with winning records.

WE GOT A GUY THERE: Three-time Gold Glover Andrelton Simmons leads MLB shortstops with 168 putouts and has third-fewest errors (8) among A.L. SS (min. 90 GS)...He leads baseball with a 13.2 UZR (Ultimate Zone Rating) & ranks third in MLB with 16 defensive runs saved (FanGraphs)...Since 2015, his 91 runs saved are tops in MLB.

<u>SHELVED:</u> Angels have 14 players currently on the D.L. (club record is 15 set June 15th)...Average D.L. stint for LAA this season is 41 games...53 players to appear are most in MLB (team record is 55 in 2017)...31 pitchers (13 SP) in a season have matched club record set last season...*Placed MLB-most 22 players on D.L. in first half.*

<u>MVP x 3?</u> Despite missing nine games, two-time A.L. MVP **Mike Trout** ranks in Top 5 *in A.L.* in several offensive categories, including **HR** (T5th; 30), **runs** (5th; 82), **runs** created (2nd; 119), **times on base** (1st; 221), **walks** (1st; 99), **IBB** (1st; 20), **OBP** (1st; 459), **SLG** (3rd; .624), **OPS** (2nd; 1.083), **OPS+** (1st; 195.0) and **offensive WAR** (7.2; 1st).

<u>WALK TALK</u>: Trout's 99 walks are 17 shy of his own club record (116 in 2016)...4th player in A.L. history with 20+ SB & 20+ IBB, joining Ichiro (2002; 2005), Rafael Palmeiro (1993) & Reggie Jackson (1974)...With next free pass, will reach 100 BB, 25+ HR & 20 SB for third time in career (2013 & 2016), no other American Leaguer has accomplished more than once: Toby Harrah (1977) & Carl Yastrzemski (1970)...If Trout reaches 25 HR/30 SB/100 BB, it will be third time doing so (Barry Bonds in 1991 is only other in MLB).

<u>GLOVE STORY:</u> Club ranks tied for second in A.L. with .987 fielding pct...Halos lead MLB turning 129 double plays...Catchers own a 41.5 caught stealing pct. (22 of 53), tops in A.L. (2nd in MLB)...<u>Trout is only CF in MLB with a 1.000 fielding pct</u>...Kole Calhoun's 27 OF assists since 2016 are tops in A.L.

<u>PITCHING POINTS</u>: Halo relievers lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 20.4 % to score (41 of 201)...LAA pitchers have 46 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through 118 affairs (5th in A.L. with 1,019 K)...Bullpen has logged 443.1 IP, second in A.L. to Tampa Bay...LAA has allowed 154 HRs, fourth-most in A.L...Since 2017, Jose Alvarez is tied for A.L. lead with 123 games pitched (Blake Parker ranks third in junior circuit with 122 games).

THIS N' THAT: Francisco Arcia's 12 RBI thru first three home starts of career are an MLB record - previous Angels record: Shohei Ohtani – 7 (STATS LLC)...Arcia posted 10 RBI across his first two career games (4 RBI in MLB debut, 6 RBI in 2nd game) to set an MLB record... Simmons leads MLB in PA per SO at 19.01 (439 PA/23 K)...He also leads MLB batting .316 (43/136) with two strikes...Angels' 160 HRs hit rank 4th in A.L...Mike Scioscia (1,629 wins) ranks 18th on all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17th with 1,769)...Since 2012, Trout hasn't gone more than two straight games without reaching base.

HOT HALOS: In his last 15 games, Justin Upton is hitting .322 (19/59) with four doubles, four HR and 11 RBI...Albert Pujols has a six-game hit streak...Batting .298 (25/84) with five doubles, six HR and 10 RBI across his last 21 games...Since June 27th, rookie Justin Anderson has fashioned a 1.10 ERA in 15 games (16.1 IP – 2 ER; 6 BB, 19 K) and has allowed one earned run across last 12 outings (13 IP)...Since June 27th, he has lowered his ERA from 4.00 to 2.91...Jaime Barria is 2-0 with 2.70 ERA (16.2 IP – 5 ER; 3 BB, 10 K) last three starts...Over his last six games, Shohei Ohtani is batting .391 (9/23, 5 R, 2B, 3 HR, 7 RBI, 3 SB)...Cam Bedrosian has a 1.93 ERA (28 IP - 6 ER) since June 1.

ALBERT ALERT: Albert Pujols ranks 24th all-time with 3,074 hits (Ichiro is 23rd with 3,089)...Pujols ranks sixth all-time with 632 HR (Willie Mays is 5th w/660 HR)...He is one of four players with 3,000 hits & 600 HRs (Aaron, Mays & Rodriguez)...AP is seventh all-time with 1,974 RBI (BBREF)...Lou Gehrig is sixth with 1,995 RBI...Albert's 1,286 career extra-base hits rank sixth all-time (Mays is 5th w/ 1,323 XBH)...Only two players have logged 3,000 hits, 600 HR & 2,000 RBI (H. Aaron & A. Rodriguez; Pujols is 26 RBI shy).

<u>Vs. OAKLAND:</u> Angels are 12-6 in last 18 games vs. A's...<u>Halos lead 2018 series 7-5</u>...When these teams last met on June 17th, Angels were 38-34 and A's were 36-36...*Since then, Halos have gone 21-25 while Oakland is 33-12*...LAA has won four consecutive season series vs. A's (2014-17)...**Upton** is hitting .318 vs. A's this season (14/44; 3 HR, 11 RBI)...**Cam Bedrosian** is 2-0 with two saves & 2.54 ERA (28.1 IP – 8 ER) in 30 career games vs. **Athletics**.

<u>PADRES ON DECK</u>: Halos head down the 5 Freeway to visit the Padres for a three-game series, the 10th all-time regular season meeting, and just second visit to PETCO Park (fifth time to SD)...<u>San Diego has taken two of three in each of last two season series (2015 at Big A and 2012 at PETCO)...Padres lead all-time series 15-13...<u>Justin Upton</u> was an all-star in his lone season with Padres in 2015.</u>

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

August 12

(1974) Nolan Ryan set an A.L. record with 19 strikeouts in a 4-2 win over Boston...In the effort, Ryan broke Bob Feller's previous mark of 18 K's, a record that stood for over 40 vears... Broken in 1986 when Boston's Roger Clemens set a ML record with 20 strikeouts: (1982) DeCinces Doug homers Minnesota, his 12th HR in a 13 games the most in a two-week stretch in club history; (2005) Vladimir Guerrero connects for two upper deck HRs at Safeco Field, the first player to accomplish the feat in the same game at the ballpark.

August 13

(1965) Dean Chance accomplished a dubious distinction on this date...In his only plate appearance, he struck out and culminated a streak of 11 consecutive plate appearances with a strikeout...A record that still stands for most consecutive strikeouts (consecutive plate appearances) in a season in the A.L...The ML record belongs to Sandy Koufax who struck out in 12 consecutive PA.

Making first career Major League start today

- FIRST START: Making first start of Major League career and ninth appearance of the season for Angels...Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake on Aug. 4 for second stint of season with Angels...Has not allowed a run in five innings pitched since being recalled.
- HOT STRETCH: Dating back to July 7, has pitched to a 0.77 ERA across his last 11.2 innings pitched for Angels (one ER allowed in that span).
- LONG RELIEF: Has recorded 4+ outs in seven of eight relief appearances for Angels this season.
- <u>LEFT OUT:</u> This season, is holding left-handers to a .103 (3/29) batting average.
- SOLID DEBUT: Made Angels debut on July 1 and pitched three scoreless innings...First reliever to work at least three shutout frames in Angels debut since David Pauley in 2012.
- FIRST STINT: In six games during first stint with team, went 0-2 with a 2.25 ERA (12 IP 3 ER) and 13 SO.
- INSIDE THE PARK: Has allowed just one home run with Angels this season (17 IP)...Lone HR came on July 15 at Dodger Stadium (Kiké Hernandez)...Allowed just four homers in 52.1 innings for Triple-A Salt Lake.
- WITH THE BEES: In 32 games for Triple-A Salt Lake this season, is 3-0 with a six saves (nine opportunities) and a 5.16 ERA (52.1 IP - 30 ER) and 60 strikeouts.
- LAST TIME OUT: Worked 1.1 perfect innings in last relief appearance on Wednesday vs. Detroit and struck out three of four batters faced.
- VS. OAKLAND: Today marks first career appearance vs. Athletics.
- AT ANGEL STADIUM: In four games at Angel Stadium, is 0-1 with a 2.45 ERA (7.1 IP 2 ER) and 11 strikeouts...Has not allowed a run in last six innings pitched at home.
- STARTER #13: With start today, becomes 13th different starting pitcher for Angels this season...13 different starters is tied with Oakland for second most in the Majors this season (Tampa Bay - 15) and matches the Halos total from last year...Angels record for most starters in a season is 17 (1967).
- WITH THE JAYS: Prior to joining Angels, only previous Major League appearance came on Aug. 9, 2017 for Toronto vs. NYY (1 IP, 6 H, 4 ER, 1 BB, 1 SO, 1 HBP).
- $\underline{\textbf{2018 SPRING TRAINING:}} \text{ Made one appearance for Angels this Spring and worked one scoreless inning on}$ March 22 at Dodgers.
- CAREER NOTES: Drafted by Blue Jays in 29th round of 2011 First-Year player Draft out of Brigham Young University (Provo, UT)...Signed by Angels as a minor league free agent on March 5, 2018...Native of Simi Valley, CA...Attended Bishop Gorman HS (Las Vegas, NV) and the College of Southern Nevada before serving a mission in Toronto for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints...Played final collegiate season at BYU following his mission.
