TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 2-state, 3-city, 10-day, 10-game road trip with the first of 3 games at Oakland...swept a 4-game series at Houston over the weekend after beginning the trip by going 1-2 at Texas...following this series and an off day on Thursday, will return to Safeco Field on Friday for a 6-day, 6-game homestand against Los Angeles-NL (3 G) and Houston (3 G)...tonight's game will be televised on *ROOT SPORTS NW* and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network. **ODDS AND ENDS**...the Mariners have won 4 in a row and 6 of their last 8 games...are 14-19 (7/4-current) since winning a season-high 8 straight games (6/25-7/3)...the Mariners have won 29 of their last 55 games, 36 of their last 64, 40 of their last 70, 45 of their last 76 and 47 of their last 80...Seattle is 55-39 in its last 94 games, 60-42 over its last 102 games and 65-46 in its last 111 games...Seattle is 22-19 during the day and 47-31 at night...Seattle is 36-24 at Safeco Field, 33-26 on the road.

- Ring 'Em Up Edwin Díaz has recorded multiple strikeouts in each of his last 6 saves, dating back to Aug.
 5...this marks the longest streak of successfully converted saves with at least 2 strikeouts in club history, surpassing three players with 5 such saves: Díaz (7/2-17/17), David Aardsma (6/11-24/09) and Norm Charlton (8/29 9/8/95).
- Swung on and Belted Mike Zunino's 7th-inning home run yesterday at Houston was measured at 110.8 MPH off the bat, marking the Mariners 21st homer of at least 110 MPH exit velocity this season (*StatCast*)... Seattle's 21 such home runs are 4th-most in the Majors this season, trailing New York-AL (35), Texas (28) and Chicago-AL (24).
- Nine is Fine Édwin Díaz has earned the save in each of the Mariners last 9 wins (7/25-c)...marks the 2nd time this season he has picked up the save in at least 7 straight team wins (also: 7, 6/30-7/20)...Tom Wilhelmsen (8/28–9/22/12) and Danny Farquhar (8/3–29/13) share the club record of 10 saves in 10 consecutive team wins.
- **Road Warrior** Kyle Seager has 13 home runs and 43 RBI in 59 games on the road this season...among AL leaders in road games, Seager ranks 6th in RBI and T10th in home runs (also: Nelson Cruz, Mike Zunino and 5 other players).
- Close Games the Mariners are 45-17 (.726) this season in games decided by 1 or 2 runs, the highest winning percentage in the Majors...the Mariners are 30-14 (.682) in 1-run games (most 1-run wins in MLB) and 15-3 (.833) in games decided by exactly 2 runs (best 2-run winning percentage in MLB).

 Four Score the Mariners are 49-15 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 20-35 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
 Get Through 8 the Mariners are 1 of 2 Major League clubs with a 1.000 winning percentage (60-0) when leading after 8 innings this season, joining Oakland (57-0).

HOW WILL THE WEST BE WON?...the Mariners are .500 or better vs. each of their 4 AL West Division rivals...the Mariners are 6-3 (.667) vs. Oakland; 7-6 (.538) vs. Houston; 8-7 (.533) vs. Los Angeles-AL and 6-6 (.500) vs. Texas...overall, Seattle is 27-22 (.551) vs. AL West opponents, the 8th-best intra-division record in the Major Leagues...of the 7 teams who have a better record vs. their respective divisional opponents, 5 lead their division: Boston (.741/43-15 vs. AL East), Cleveland (.685/37-17 vs. AL Central), Atlanta (.655/36-19), Pittsburgh (.596/28-19), Houston (.593/32-22), Arizona (.580/29-21) and St. Louis (.569/33-25).

<u>GETTING SERIES</u>...with a 4-game sweep of Houston over the weekend, the Mariners improved their series record this season to 20-12-7 (.603), the 7th-best mark in the Majors...they trail only Boston (.763/27-7-4), New York-AL (.725/25-7-8), Houston (.684/24-10-4), Oakland (.632/22-12-4), Chicago-NL (.628/20-10-9) and Arizona (.605/19-11-8)...<u>the Mariners 4-game sweep of the Astros marked the first time in club history that the Mariners had swept the defending World Series champions in a 4-game series (*Elias Sports Bureau*).</u>

THE EDWIN DÍAZ REPORT...in 59 appearances this season, Edwin Díaz is 46-for-49 (93.9%) in save opportunities with a 1.98 ERA (13 ER, 59.0 IP) with 100 strikeouts and 15 walks...he is currently 1 of 5 pitchers (done 6x) in single-season Major League history with at least 45 saves, 100 strikeouts and an ERA under 2.00, joining Bryan Harvey-CAL (1991), Eric Gagne-LAD (2002 and 2003), Greg Holland-KC (2013) and Kenley Jansen-LAD (2016)...here are some notes on Díaz's standout season:

- Leads the Major Leagues with 46 saves...Craig Kimbrel-BOS is 2nd with 35.
- Ranks 2nd among Major League relievers with 100 strikeouts...Josh Hader-MIL is 1st with 104.
- Leads the Major Leagues with 24 <u>one-run</u> saves...Blake Treinen-OAK is 2nd with 14...his 24 one-run saves ties Eric Gagne (2003) for the Major League record with most one-run saves in a season.
- His 46 saves are 2nd-most in club history...trails only Fernando Rodney (48, 2014)...ranks ahead of Kazuhiro Sasaki (45, 2001).
- Has successfully converted 27 consecutive saves, tied for the 2nd-longest streak in club history...is tied with Eddie Guardado (4/13–8/9/05), while trailing only J.J. Putz (31, 9/30/06 7/20/07)...since June 2, Díaz is 27-for-27 in save opportunities with a 0.92 ERA (3 ER, 29.1 IP) with 50 strikeouts and 3 walks in 29 games...has allowed only 1 run over 27.1 innings in <u>27 save opportunities</u> in that time.

HAMMERIN' HANIGER...**Mitch Haniger** has hit safely in 10 of his last 13 games, including 7 multi-hit games, dating back to July 31...over that span, he is batting .385 (20x52) with 6 runs, 7 doubles, 1 home run, 8 RBI, 3 walks, a .411 on-base percentage and a .577 slugging percentage (.988 OPS)...he has 4 multi-hit games in his last 5 contests...among American League leaders since July 31, Haniger ranks T1st in hits (also: Mookie Betts-BOS and J.D. Martinez-BOS), T2nd in doubles (also: Betts) and 6th in batting.

ONE IS ALL IT TAKES...with yesterday's 4-3 victory over Houston, the Mariners improved to 30-14 (.682) in one-run games this season...Seattle leads the Majors in one-run wins in 2018, while ranking 2nd in winning percentage behind Oakland (.697/23-10)...the Mariners are 14-7 (.667) in one-run games <u>on the road</u> this season, leading the Majors in wins while ranking 4th in winning percentage...with 43 games remaining in the regular season, the Mariners 30 one-run wins rank T3rd-most in single-season club history (also: 1984 and 2016), trailing only the Mariners clubs of 2009 (35) and 1982 (31)...since 2016, the Mariners are 86-59 (.593) in games decided by one run, leading the Majors in wins, winning percentage and games played (145).

AS YOU KNOW...Edwin Díaz earned the save in each of the 4 games of the Mariners 4-game sweep at Houston...<u>BUT DID YOU KNOW?</u>...that Díaz becomes the 4th pitcher in Major League history (since 1969 when save became an official stat) to record 4 saves in a 4-game series?...he joins Joe Nathan-MIN (9/10-13/14 at DET), John Wetteland-NYY (7/11-14-96 at BAL) and Sparky Lyle-BOS (4/27-30/70 vs. OAK)...Kent Tekulve-PIT earned 4 saves over 4 days in a 6-game series (2 make-up games) at Houston from Aug. 17-20, 1978... STATS LLC.

- MLB Draft out of Rocky Mountain High School (Fort Collins, CO) but did not sign...drafted and signed by the Cardinals with the 19th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga Universi-ty...became the highest draft pick in the history of the Gonzaga aseball program.
- Baseball program.

 Made his MLB debut with Cardinals June 25, 2014 at Colorado.

 Went 2-1 with a 4.50 ERA (3 ER, 6.0 IP) with 4 strikeouts and 2

 walks with St. Louis in the 2014 postseason...earned 2 wins in the NLDS vs. Los Angeles, becoming the 4th rookie in postseason history to win 2 games in the Division Series (also: Dave Righetti-NYY, 1981, Jaret

Wright-CLE, 1997 and Francisco Rodriguez-LAA, 2002).

- AST START ... allowed a career-high 7 earned runs over 5.0 innings in the Mariners' 7-11 defeat against the Rangers... has lost 2 conescutive starts after winning 5 straight starts between June 29 - July 29... during the winning streak he posted a 1.57 ERA (6 ER, 34.1 IP) with 31 strikeouts while holding opposing hitters to a .198 batting average.
