Mitch Haniger has 14 hits in his last 6 games, dating back to Aug. 8...he leads the Majors in hits over that span.

Three Mariners have at least 25 doubles: Kyle Seager (27), Jean Segura (27) and Mitch Haniger (25)...the Mariners are 1 of 5 American League teams with at least 3 players with 25+ doubles apiece

The Mariners rank T2nd in the American League with 73 player games of 3+ hits...are tied with Los Angeles-AL while trailing only Boston (75)...Jean Segura (4) and **Mitch Haniger** (3) each had at least 3 hits last night.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 2-state, 3-city, 10-day, 10-game road trip with the 2nd (0-1) of 3 games at Oakland...swept a 4-game series at Houston over the weekend after beginning the trip by going 1-2 at Texas...following this series and an off day on Thursday, will return to Safeco Field on Friday for a 6-day, 6-game homestand against Los Angeles-NL (3 G) and Houston (3 G)...tonight's game will be televised on ROOT SPORTS NW and broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners have won 4 of their last 5 games and 6 of their last 9...are 14-20 (7/4-current) since winning a season-high 8 straight games (6/25-7/3)...the Mariners have won 29 of their last 56 games, 36 of their last 65, 40 of their last 71, 45 of their last 77 and 47 of their last 81...Seattle is 55-40 in its last 95 games, 60-43 over its last 103 games and 65-47 in its last 112 games...Seattle is 22-19 during the day and 47-32 at night...Seattle is 36-24 at Safeco Field, 33-27 on the road.

- **Leaderboard James Paxton** ranks 5th in the American League with 175 strikeouts...trails only Chris Sale-BOS (219), Trevor Bauer-CLE (214), Gerrit Cole-HOU (207) and Justin Verlander-HOU (206).
- Swung On and Belted Nelson Cruz has hit 15 career home runs at the Oakland Coliseum, tied with Mitch Moreland for the most among <u>active visiting players...</u>he ranks ahead of Adrián Beltré (14), Mike Trout (14), Albert Pujols (10), **Robinson Canó** (9), Chris Davis (9) and Mark Trumbo (9).
- Canada's Son in 7 career starts vs. Oakland, James Paxton is 3-0 with a 3.32 ERA (16 ER, 43.1 IP).
- Cruz Control Nelson Cruz is batting .383 (18x47) with two outs and runners in scoring position this season, the 6th-best mark in the American League...has 24 RBI with two outs and RISP, 6th-most in the AL.
- Road Warrior Kyle Seager has 13 home runs and 44 RBI in 60 games on the road this season...among AL leaders in road games, Seager ranks T5th in RBI (also: Evan Gattis-HOU) and T10th in home runs (also: Nelson Cruz, Mike Zunino and 5 other players).
- Nine is Fine Edwin Díaz has earned the save in each of the Mariners last 9 wins (7/25-c)...marks the 2nd time this season he has picked up the save in at least 7 straight team wins (also: 7, 6/30-7/20)...Tom Wilhelmsen
- (8/28–9/22/12) and Danny Farquhar (8/3–29/13) share the club record of 10 saves in 10 consecutive team wins. Close Games the Mariners are 45-18 (.714) this season in games decided by 1 or 2 runs, the highest winning percentage in the Majors...the Mariners are 30-15 (.667) in 1-run games (most 1-run wins in MLB) and 15-3 (.833) in games decided by exactly 2 runs (best 2-run winning percentage in MLB).

  Four Score - the Mariners are 49-16 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 20-35 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Get Through 8** the Mariners are 1 of 2 Major League clubs with a 1.000 winning percentage (60-0) when leading after 8 innings this season, joining Oakland (58-0).

LATE AND GREAT...Mitch Haniger is slugging .628 in the 7th inning and later this season, which ranks 7th-best in the Major Leagues...his .628 slugging percentage in the 7th and later is currently 5th-best in single-season club history, trailing only Ken Griffey Jr. in 1994 (.769), Edgar Martinez in 1994 (.657), Griffey Jr. in 1993 (.654) and Martinez in 1997 (.630)...Haniger has also hit 11 home runs in the 7th and later, T3rd-most in the Majors this season (also: Jesús Aguilar-MIL), trailing only Matt Carpenter-STL (13) and Khris Davis-OAK (13).

HOW WILL THE WEST BE WON?...the Mariners are .500 or better vs. each of their 4 AL West Division rivals...the Mariners are 6-4 (.600) vs. Oakland; 7-6 (.538) vs. Houston; 8-7 (.533) vs. Los Angeles-AL and 6-6 (.500) vs. Texas...overall, Seattle is 27-23 (.540) vs. AL West opponents, the 8th-best intra-division record in the Major Leagues...of the 7 teams who have a better record vs. their respective divisional opponents, 5 lead their division: Boston (.741/43-15 vs. AL East), Cleveland (.685/37-17 vs. AL Central), Atlanta (.667/38-19 vs. NL East), Pittsburgh (.596/28-19 vs. NL Central), Houston (.593/32-22 vs. AL West), Arizona (.580/29-21 vs. NL West) and St. Louis (.569/33-25 vs. NL Central).

HAMMERIN' HANIGER...Mitch Haniger has hit safely in 11 of his last 14 games, including 8 multi-hit games, dating back to July 31...over that span, he is batting .404 (23x57) with 8 runs, 8 doubles, 1 home run, 10 RBI, 3 walks, a .426 on-base percentage and a .596 slugging percentage (1.023 OPS)... Haniger leads the American League in hits since July 31, while also ranking 2nd in doubles and 5th in batting...he has 5 multi-hit games in his last 6 contests (8/8-c), batting .560 (14x25) over that span.

THE EDWIN DÍAZ REPORT...in 59 appearances this season, Edwin Díaz is 46-for-49 (93.9%) in save opportunities with a 1.98 ERA (13 ER, 59.0 IP) with 100 strikeouts and 15 walks...he is currently 1 of 5 pitchers (done 6x) in single-season Major League history with at least 45 saves, 100 strikeouts and an ERA under 2.00, joining Bryan Harvey-CAL (1991), Eric Gagne-LAD (2002 and 2003), Greg Holland-KC (2013) and Kenley Jansen-LAD (2016)...here are some notes on Díaz's standout season:

- Leads the Major Leagues with 46 saves...Craig Kimbrel-BOS is 2nd with 35
- Ranks 2nd among Major League relievers with 100 strikeouts...Josh Hader-MIL is 1st with 104.
- Leads the Major Leagues with 24 one-run saves...Blake Treinen-OAK is 2nd with 14.
- His 46 saves are 2nd-most in club history...trails only Fernando Rodney (48, 2014)...ranks ahead of Kazuhiro Sasaki (45, 2001).
- Has successfully converted 27 consecutive saves, tied for the 2nd-longest streak in club history...is tied with Eddie Guardado (4/13-8/9/05), while trailing only J.J. Putz (31, 9/30/06 - 7/20/07)...since June 2, Díaz is 27-for-27 in save opportunities with a 0.92 ERA (3 ER, 29.1 IP) with 50 strikeouts and 3 walks in 29 games...has allowed only 1 run over 27.1 innings in 27 save opportunities in that time.

STREAKING...Alex Colomé has an active 18.2 scoreless innings streak, dating back to June 30...during this span, he is 1-0 with 13 holds, 19 strikeouts and 6 walks in 18 games...since June 30, he has lowered his ERA from 4.86 (18 ER, 33.1 IP) to 3.12 (18 ER, 52.0 IP)...his 18.2 scoreless innings streak is the 3rd-longest active streak in the Majors, trailing only Chris Sale-BOS (28.0 ShO IP, 7/6-c) and Eduardo Rodríguez-BOS (19.0 ShO IP, 6/29-c)...Colomé's streak is the longest by a Mariners pitcher this season.

EL CABALLO...since making his Mariners debut on May 27, Alex Colomé leads the Major Leagues with 22 holds...in 31 relief appearances with the Mariners this season, he is 1-0 with 1 save, 22 holds, a 2.37 ERA (8 ER, 30.1 IP), 29 strikeouts and 8 walks...despite recording his 1st hold on May 28, he ranks T2nd in the American League with 22 holds this season (also: José Alvarado-TB), trailing Matt Barnes-BOS (25).

AS YOU KNOW...James Paxton recorded a career-high 16 strikeouts in his last outing against Oakland earlier this season on May 2 at Safeco Field...BUT DID YOU KNOW?...that dating back to the start of the 2017 season, Paxton ranks T2nd among all pitchers with 38 strikeouts vs. the Athletics?...he is tied with Gerrit Cole-HOU while trailing only Brad Peacock-HOU (41).

- ABOUT PAXTON...
  29-year-old left-hander is making his 24th start of 2018, his 98th career MLB start & 8th career start against the Athletics tonight.

- Selected by Seattle in the 4th round of the 2010 MLB June Draft. Native of Ladner, BC...attended Delta Secondary School. Pitched for the University of Kentucky, 2007-09...was 11-5, 4.91 ERA (81 ER, 148.1 IP) and 168 K's in 55 G/24 GS. Originally selected by Toronto in the Supplemental 1st round (39th overall) in the 2009 MLB June Draft, but did not sign.
- Went 1-2 with a 4.08 ERA (8 ER, 17.2 IP) in 4 starts with Grand Prairie in the Independent League in 2010.

  Pitched for the World squad in the 2011 MLB Futures game... named to Midwest League All-Star team in 2011.

  Pitched 6th no-hitter in Mariners history on May 8, 2018 at Toronto.

- Is 4-2 with a 2.59 ERA (21 ER, 73.0 IP) in 12 career GS in August.

LAST OUTING...earned his 10th win of the season as the Mariners defeated the Astros 8-6 on Aug. 9...allowed 4 runs on 7 hits and 3 walks while striking out 5 batters across 5.2 innings

LEADERBOARD ... ranks 6th in the Majors (5th in AL) with an 11.33 strikeouts-per-9.0-innings ratio (175 K, 139.0 IP)...his 7 games with 10+ strikeouts are T4th-most in the Majors, tied with Justin Verlander-HOU and Jacob deGrom-NYM and trailing only Max Scherzer-WAS (13), Chris Sale-BOS (11) and Trevor Bauer-CLE (10)...Paxton ranks 5th in the AL (8th in the Majors) with 175 strikeouts, trailing Sale (219), Bauer (214), Gerrit Cole-HOU (207) and Verlander (206).

THE RIGHT STUFF...has held right-handed hitters to a .199 batting average (84x422), while lefties have batted .326 (31x95) against Paxton this season... righties hold an OPS of only .592 against him this year, while lefties have posted a mark of .884...for his career, Paxton has limited righties to a .631 OPS, while lefties have recorded a .739 OPS against him.

HE'S BACK...activated from the 10-day disabled list on July 30...originally placed on the DL on July 13 with lower back inflammation...has made 3 starts since his return, posting a 3.20 ERA (7 ER, 19.2 IP) with 20 strikeouts and 4 walks during that span.

NO-NO...pitched the 6th no-hitter (5th by a single pitcher) in Mariners history in Toronto on May 8...issued 3 walks, struck out 7 batters and needed just 99 pitches to accomplish the feat...recorded his 1st career complete game and 1st career shutout.

- Is the 2nd Canadian-born pitcher in MLB history to throw a no-hitter, joining Dick Fowler, who tossed a no-no for the Philadelphia Athletics vs. the St. Louis Browns in
- the second game of a doubleheader on Sept. 9, 1945.

  Became the first American League pitcher to record a 16-strikeout game and a no-hitter in the same season since Nolan Ryan achieved both in the same game on May 1, 1991 vs. Toronto with the Texas Rangers...STATS, Inc.

  Marks 4th Mariners no-hitter since 2012, tied with SF for most during that span.

  Marks the 3rd no-hitter in the Majors this season (Sean Manaea-OAK, 4/21 vs. BOS;
- four pitchers-LAD, 5/4 at SD in Monterrey, Mexico).

KKKKKKKKKKKKKKK...recorded a career-high 16 strikeouts across 7.0 scoreless innings on May 2 vs. OAK...Paxton's 16 strikeouts are tied for the most in a single game in the Majors this season (also: Gerrit Cole-HOU, 5/4 at ARI)...marks the most strikeouts by a Mariners pitcher since Randy Johnson struck out 19 on 8/8/97 vs. CWS...became the first pitcher in Mariners history to record at least 2 strikeouts in each of the first 7 innings of a start.

WHIFF...recorded 49 strikeouts over his 5 starts from April 11 to May 2...is one of 5 Mariners pitchers in club history (done 65x) with at least 49 strikeouts over a span of 5 starts, the first since Félix Hernández also had 49 strikeouts over 5 starts, June 23 - July 14, 2012...Randy Johnson accomplished this feat 56 times while with the Mariners, followed by Mark Langston (4), Mike Moore (3), Hernán-

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 12-5 with a 2.98 ERA (45 ER, 136.0 IP) with 156 strikeouts and 45 walks in 24 starts... led club in wins (12) and strikeouts (156)... recorded a career-high 12 wins and 136.0 IP (previous: 121.0 IP in 2016)...spent 2 stints on the 10-day DL (5/3-30/17, 8/11-9/15/17)...went 6-0 with a 1.37 ERA (6 ER, 39.1 IP) with 46 strikeouts and 6 walks in 6 starts in July; named AL Pitcher of the Month...became the first pitcher in club history to earn 2 AL Player of the Week honors in a single season.

CAREER...is 39-25 with a 3.34 ERA (206 ER, 555.1 IP) with 579 strikeouts in 96 career starts...has spent 8 years in the Mariners organization, including parts of 6 Major League seasons, after being selected by Seattle in 4th round of the 2010 MLB Draft...made MLB debut on Sept. 7, 2013 vs. TB.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: RHP MIKE LEAKE (8-7, 4.11 ERA)

30-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 25th start of the season tomorrow vs. Oakland...has recorded a quality start in 5 straight games dating back to July 15...has thrown 7.0+ innings in 7 of his 24 starts this season, including 3 outings of 8.0 innings...recorded his 15th quality start of the season in his last start, a 5-2 Mariners win at HOU on 8/10 (6.0,8,2,2,1,4)...2017: Went 10-13 with a 3.92 ERA (81 ER, 186.0 IP) in 31 starts combined between St. Louis (4/7-8/26) and Seattle (9/1-24)...went 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA (9 ER, 32.0 IP) in 5 starts with the Mariners after being acquired by Seattle on Aug. 30...
