INSIDE THE NUMBERS

Denard Span is batting .377 (20x53) with 7 runs, 3 doubles, 3 triples, 1 home run, 6 RBI, 2 HBP, 3 walks, a .424 OBP and a .604 SLG in 16 games since July 28.

Over his last 9 road starts (4/28-c), **Mike Leake** has a 2.91 ERA (19 ER, 58.2 IP)...his 2.91 road ERA is 8th-best

The Mariners are averaging 4.69 runs-per-game (286 R, 61 G) on the road, 5th-best in the AL/11th-best in the Majors.

Mitch Haniger has 15 hits in his last 7 games since August 8...he leads the American League in hits over that span.

Kyle Seager has 1,098 career hits...only 5 Mariners have at least 1,100 hits with the club: Ichiro Suzuki (2,542), Edgar Martinez (2,247), Ken Griffey Jr. (1,843), Jay Buhner (1,255) and Alvin Davis (1,163).

The Mariners and Athletics meet for the 12th (6-5) of 19 games in 2018...since 2015, the Mariners are 22-11 (.667) at Oakland:

TODAY'S TILT... the Mariners conclude a 2-state, 3-city, 10-day, 10-game road trip with the finale (0-2) of 3 games at Oakland...swept a 4-game series at Houston over the weekend after beginning the trip by going 1-2 at Texas...following an off day tomorrow, will return to Safeco Field on Friday for a 6-day, 6-game homestand against Los Angeles-NL (3 G) and Houston (3 G)...today's game will be televised on **ROOT** SPORTS NW and broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners have won 4 of their last 6 games and 6 of their last 10...are 14-21 (7/4-current) since winning a season-high 8 straight games (6/25-7/3)...the Mariners have won 29 of their last 57 games, 36 of their last 66, 40 of their last 72, 45 of their last 78 and 47 of their last 82...Seattle is 55-41 in its last 96 games, 60-44 over its last 104 games and 65-48 in its last 113 games...Seattle is 22-19 during the day and 47-33 at night...Seattle is 36-24 at Safeco Field, 33-28 on the road.

- Call it a Comeback the Mariners have 29 comeback wins this season, tied for 5th-most in the AL and 10thmost in the Majors...they trail only Chicago-NL (37), Boston (36), Oakland (32), Philadelphia (32), Toronto (31),
- Milwaukee (31), San Francisco (31), Houston (30) and Colorado (30), while tied with Minnesota (29).

 Swung On and Belted Nelson Cruz has hit 15 career home runs at the Oakland Coliseum, tied with Mitch Moreland for the most among active visiting players...he ranks ahead of Adrián Beltré (14), Mike Trout (14), Albert Pujols (10), **Robinson Canó** (9), Chris Davis (9) and Mark Trumbo (9). **Cruz Control - Nelson Cruz** is batting .396 (19x48) with two outs and runners in scoring position this
- season, the 5th-best mark in the American League...has 25 RBI with two outs and RISP, tied for 4th-most in the AL (also: Xander Bogaerts-BOS and Jurickson Profar-TEX).
- Road Warrior Kyle Seager has 13 home runs and 44 RBI in 61 games on the road this season...among AL leaders in road games, Seager ranks T5th in RBI (also: Evan Gattis-HOU) and T10th in home runs (also: **Nelson Cruz**, **Mike Zunino** and 5 other players).
- Nine is Fine Edwin Díaz has earned the save in each of the Mariners last 9 wins (7/25-c)...marks the 2nd time this season he has picked up the save in at least 7 straight team wins (also: 7, 6/30-7/20)...Tom Wilhelmsen (8/28–9/22/12) and Danny Farquhar (8/3–29/13) share the club record of 10 saves in 10 consecutive team wins.
- Close Games the Mariners are 45-19 (.703) this season in games decided by 1 or 2 runs, the highest winning percentage in the Majors...the Mariners are 30-16 (.652) in 1-run games (most 1-run wins in MLB) and 15-3 (.833) in games decided by exactly 2 runs (best 2-run winning percentage in MLB). **Four Score** - the Mariners are 49-16 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 20-36 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.

Get Through 8 - the Mariners are 1 of 2 Major League clubs with a 1.000 winning percentage (60-0) when leading after 8 innings this season, joining Oakland (59-0).

ONE IS THE LONELIEST NUMBER...seven of the 11 games between the Mariners and Athletics this season have been decided by 1 run, including each of the last 5 meetings between these two clubs... overall, the Mariners are 2-5 in one-run games vs. Oakland this season...each of the 11 head-to-head matchups between Seattle and Oakland have been decided by 3 or fewer runs...the Mariners are 30-16 (.652) in one-run games this season, leading the Major Leagues in wins, while the Athletics are 2nd in wins with a mark of 25-10 (.714)...dating back to the start of 2016, the Mariners are 86-61 (.585) in one-run games, leading the Majors in one-run wins, winning percentage and games played (147); over that same span, Oakland is 71-59 (.546) in contests decided by one run, ranking 3rd in winning percentage, T3rd in wins and T7th in games played (130).

ICE IN THEIR VEINS...the Mariners have played their share of close games this season, ranking 2nd in the Majors in one-run games (46) and T2nd in games decided by 2 or fewer runs (64)...the Mariners are batting .263 (567x2156) when the score is within 1 run, the 2nd-highest average in such situations in the Majors; they trail only New York-AL (.264/499x1890)...Dee Gordon is 2nd among all players with a .339 (84x248) average when the score is within 1 run...Nelson Cruz ranks T3rd in the Majors (also: Nolan Arenado-COL) with 49 RBI when the score is within 1 run, while Mitch Haniger is T8th with 45 RBI (also: Eugenio Suarez-CIN).

TO BE THE BEST...the Mariners are 38-35 (.521) this season vs. teams whose season winning percentage is .500 or better, the 6th-best record in the Majors...Seattle trails only Boston (.636/35-20), New York-AL (.621/36-22), Arizona (.550/44-36), Philadelphia (.537/36-31) and Houston (.534/39-34).

HAMMERIN' HANIGER...Mitch Haniger has hit safely in 12 of his last 15 games, including 8 multi-hit games, dating back to July 31...over that span, he is batting .393 (24x61) with 9 runs, 9 doubles, 1 home run, 10 RBI, 3 walks, a .415 on-base percentage and a .590 slugging percentage (1.006 OPS)...Haniger leads the American League in hits since July 31, while also ranking T1st in doubles (also: J.D. Martinez-BOS) and 5th in batting...he has 5 multi-hit games in his last 7 games (8/8-c), batting .517 (15x29) in that time.

THE EDWIN DÍAZ REPORT...in 59 appearances this season, Edwin Díaz is 46-for-49 (93.9%) in save opportunities with a 1.98 ERA (13 ER, 59.0 IP) with 100 strikeouts and 15 walks...he is currently 1 of 5 pitchers (done 6x) in single-season Major League history with at least 45 saves, 100 strikeouts and an ERA under 2.00, joining Bryan Harvey-CAL (1991), Eric Gagne-LAD (2002 and 2003), Greg Holland-KC (2013) and Kenley Jansen-LAD (2016)...here are some notes on Díaz's standout season:

- Leads the Major Leagues with 46 saves...Craig Kimbrel-BOS is 2nd with 36.
- Ranks 2nd among Major League relievers with 100 strikeouts...Josh Hader-MIL is 1st with 104.
- Leads the Major Leagues with 24 one-run saves...Blake Treinen-OAK is 2nd with 15.
- His 46 saves are 2nd-most in club history...trails only Fernando Rodney (48, 2014).
- Has successfully converted 27 consecutive saves, tied for the 2nd-longest streak in club history...is tied with Eddie Guardado (4/13-8/9/05), while trailing only J.J. Putz (31, 9/30/06 - 7/20/07)...since June 2, Díaz is 27-for-27 in save opportunities with a 0.92 ERA (3 ER, 29.1 IP) with 50 strikeouts and 3 walks in 29 games...has allowed only 1 run over 27.1 innings in 27 save opportunities in that time.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...Mitch Haniger has 7 doubles over his last 6 games dating back to August 9... BUT DID YOU KNOW?...that Haniger is just the 4th Mariners player in club history with as many as 7 doubles in a 6-game span?...Haniger is the first to do so since Desi Relaford recorded 7 doubles from Sept. 1-8, 2002...**Edgar Martinez** tallied at least 7 doubles over a 6-game span on 5 occasions, including a club record 8 doubles in 6 games from May 23-29, 1996... Jim Presley accomplished this feat twice, both in 1986...STATS LLC.

ABOUT LEAKE

- 30-year-old right-hander is making his 25th start of the season. 30th Mariners start, 263nd career appearance (258th career start) and 6th start vs. Oakland today.
- A native of San Diego, CA, graduated from Fallbrook (CA) High School. Played in 3 seasons (2007-09) at Arizona State University...went 16-1 with a 1.71 ERA (27 ER, 142.0 IP) with 162 strikeouts and 24 walks in 19 games (18 starts) in his junior season (2009), earning Baseball America First-Team All-American, Pac-12 Pitcher of the
- Year and First-Team All-Pac-12. Selected by Oakland in 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft...did not sign.
- Selected and signed by Cincinnati out of the 1st round (8th over all pick) in the 2009 MLB Draft.
- Is 10-13 with a 5.12 ERA (134 ER, 235.1 IP) in 41 career games (39

LAST OUTING...has pitched 5 consecutive quality starts, tied for the 2nd-longest <u>active</u> streak in the American League (also: Carlos Carrasco-CLE & David Price-BOS), trailing only Carlos Rodón-CWS...did not factor into the decision in the Mariners 5-2 win vs. Houston on Aug. 10...allowed 2 runs on 8 hits and 1 walk while striking out 4 batters across 6.0 innings pitched.

HE SLAYS THE A'S ... since making his Mariners debut vs. Oakland on Sept. 1. 2017, is 1-0 with a 2.75 ERA (6 ER, 19.2 IP) with 14 strikeouts and 3 walks in 3 games against the Athletics, all quality starts...Leake has made 3 career starts in the Coliseum, collecting a 2.89 ERA (6 ER, 18.2 IP) with 8 strikeouts...overall, he is 1-1 with a 3.13 ERA (11 ER, 31.2 IP) with 4 quality starts in 5 career appearances vs. the A's...his teams are 4-1 in those 5 starts

QUALITY AND QUANTITY...12 of his last 15 starts (5/22-c) have been quality starts, including 3 outings of 8.0 innings while allowing 2-or-fewer earned runs...his 42.0 innings pitched in June were tied with Jacob deGrom-NYM for most in the Majors...among ML starters, only James Paxton (43.0 IP in May) has tossed more innings in a single calendar month this season.

GOING FOR DISTANCE...his 3 starts this season of at least 8.0 innings pitched and 2-or-fewer runs allowed (5/27 vs. MIN, 6/7 at TB and 6/23 at BOS) are T3rd-most in the Majors (6 others), trailing only Trevor Bauer-CLE (4), Jacob deGrom-NYM (4), Corey Kluber-CLE (4) and Max Scherzer-WAS (4).

<u>GETTING LOOSE</u>...through Leake's first 25 pitches in a game, opponents are batting .327 (49x150) with a .365 OBP, but in pitches 26 through 100+, Leake has limited batters to a .264 average (113x428) with a .304 OBP.

GIVE 'EM A CHANCE ... has exited 17 of his 24 starts with a lead (12 games) or a tie score (5 games)...in 3 of his other 7 starts, exited trailing 1-3 after 6.0 IP, 0-3 in the 6th inning and 2-3 after 6.0 IP...the Mariners are 16-8 in his 24 starts this season.

HELLO, SEATTLE...since making his Mariners debut on Sept. 1, 2017, is 11-8 with a 3.84 ERA (76 ER, 178.2 IP) in 29 starts (19 quality starts)...during that

span, Leake leads Mariners starters in games started, innings pitched and quality starts...in 22 of his 29 Mariners starts, Leake has gone at least 5.0 innings and allowed 3 or fewer earned runs...the Mariners are 19-10 in Leake starts since his Mariners debut.

STAYING GROUNDED...is ranked 5th in the American League with a ground ball rate of 50.0%, trailing only Dallas Keuchel-HOU (55.0%), Lance McCullers Jr.-HOU (54.8%), Lance Lynn-MIN/NYY (50.1%) and Alex Cobb-BAL (50.4%)

TAKING HIS TURN...since making his Major League debut in 2010, has made 257 starts, T12th-most among all pitchers...among all pitchers since 2010, ranks 14th in innings pitched (1593.0).

2017 SEASON RECAP....went 10-13 with a 3.92 ERA (81 ER, 186.0 IP) with 130 strikeouts and 37 walks in 31 starts...was acquired along with cash considerations and international slot money from STL on Aug. 30, 2017 in exchange for minor league infielder Rayder Ascanio...went 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA (9 ER, 32.0 IP) with 27 strikeouts and 2 walks in 5 starts with Seattle.

<u>DURABLE</u>...made 30 starts in each of the past 6 seasons...is one of 4 pitchers in the Major Leagues to make at least 30 starts in every season from 2012-17, joining Jon Lester, Max Scherzer and Ian Kennedy.

GOING FOR DISTANCE...recorded 3 starts in 2017 of at least 8.0 IP and 1-or-fewer runs allowed (4/7 vs. CIN, 5/24 at LAD and 6/30 vs. WAS)...only 6 pitchers in MLB made more such starts last season (Corey Kluber, 8, Chris Sale, 4, Carlos Martinez, 4, Zach Greinke, 4, Jacob deGrom, 4 and Carlos Carrasco, 4).

CAREER...has appeared in 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2010-15), San Francisco (2015), St. Louis (2016-17) and Seattle (2017-c)...has a career record of 91-84 with a 3.99 ERA (707 ER, 1593.0 IP) with 1,075 strikeouts and 372 walks in 262 career games (257 starts)...made his Major League debut in a start on April 11, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL with Cincinnati...selected by Oakland in the 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft but did not sign... selected and signed by Cincinnati in the 1st round (8th overall pick) of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Arizona State University.
