### THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY - AUG. 19

**2004** - The Astros turn a triple play in a 12-10, comeback win at Philadelphia...the play goes 5-4-3 in the 5th inning from **3B Morgan Ensberg** to **2B Jeff Kent** to **1B Mike Lamb**...**C Todd Pratt** was the victim.

**TODAY'S GAME:** The defending World Series Champion Houston Astros continue this nine-game AL West road trip today as they look to avoid a series sweep against the A's at Oakland Coliseum...**RHP Justin Verlander** (11-8) will start today for the Astros with a chance to claim his 200th career victory, while the A's will counter with **LHP Sean Manaea** (11-8).

**QUEST FOR 200:** **RHP Justin Verlander** enters today with 199 career victories and is seeking to become the 114th pitcher in MLB history to reach 200 wins... only two active pitchers have reached 200 wins: **RHP Bartolo Colon** (247) and **LHP CC Sabathia** (244).

**JET SETTER:** **RHP Justin Verlander** has been dominant in road games this season, as his 1.74 ERA (14ER/72.1IP) on the road leads the Majors...in 11 road starts this year, the 2018 All-Star has gone 9-2 with 88 strikeouts and a .195 opponent batting average.

**ROAD WARRIORS:** The Astros have gone 41-20 (.672) on the road this season, which is the second-best record in baseball behind the Red Sox (44-21, .677)...the Astros lead the Majors in road ERA (2.78) and rank second in road OPS (.783) behind Oakland (.804).

**GOING BACK TO CALI:** The Astros have been at their best in the state of California this season, as they have gone 14-5 (.737) in 19 games in The Golden State... this includes games against the A's (6-2), Angels (4-2), Dodgers (2-1) and Giants (2-0).

**PUNCHING TICKETS:** **RHP Justin Verlander** (217K) and **RHP Gerrit Cole** (219K) are the first pair of Astros teammates to reach 200 strikeouts in the same season since **RHP Roger Clemens** (218K) and **RHP Roy Oswalt** (206K) in 2004...their combined strikeout total ranks among the best duos in franchise history.

**ABOUT YESTERDAY:** The Astros dropped a 7-1 contest to the A's yesterday at Oakland Coliseum...the Astros offense mustered just two hits, one of which was a 9th-inning solo home run by **LF Tony Kemp** (1x3)... **LHP Dallas Keuchel** (5ER/5.2IP) took the loss, snapping his four-game road winning streak.

**DOWN BY THE BAY:** Prior to this series in Oakland, the Astros had won six consecutive games at Oakland Coliseum...dating back to 2016, the Astros have gone 16-6 (.727) in their last 22 games at the venue.

**THE KID:** **3B Alex Bregman** has reached base safely in 38 consecutive road games, the longest active streak in the Major Leagues and the fourth-longest streak in franchise history...only **Jeff Bagwell** (51 games from 1998-99, 43 games in 1998) and **Jose Altuve** (43 games in 2016) posted longer streaks.

**THE RACE IS ON!** The AL West race is in full swing as the Astros enter today tied for the division lead with the A's...the Astros and A's will match up four more times to close out the regular season: today's game in Oakland, and a three-game series in Houston later this month from Aug. 27-29.

**WEST COAST SWING:** The Astros nine-game, west coast road trip is proving to be a critical one in a tight AL West Division race...following today's game, the Astros will head to Seattle for three games against the Mariners from Mon.-Wed., and Anaheim for a three-game set next weekend.

**INJURY REPORT:** The Astros extensive injury report got considerably lighter with Friday's activation of **OF George Springer** (left thumb sprain) and the recent activation of **SS Carlos Correa** (lower back soreness)... Houston's injury report still includes **OF Jake Marisnick** (left groin discomfort) and four former All-Stars in **2B Jose Altuve** (right knee soreness), **RHP Chris Devenski** (left hamstring tightness), **C Brian McCann** (right knee discomfort) and **RHP Lance McCullers Jr.** (right elbow discomfort).

**GETTING STRONGER EVERY DAY:** **2B Jose Altuve** is scheduled to begin a rehab assignment at Triple A Fresno today...he joins two other Astros on rehab assignments with Fresno in **RHP Chris Devenski** and **C Brian McCann**...last night, McCann caught 5.0 innings in what was his first rehab start at catcher (started at DH on Thursday)...Devenski has made two scoreless appearances thus far on his assignment.

**STEPPING UP:** Since **2B Jose Altuve** was placed on the DL on July 29, the Astros have gone 7-10 in 17 games...since that date, **IF Marwin Gonzalez** has hit .288 (17x59) with two doubles and four home runs, while **IF Tyler White** has hit .347 (17x49) with two doubles, a triple, four home runs, 12 RBI and a 1.142 OPS.

**SHARK WEEK:** **IF Tyler White** is on a career-long seven-game hitting streak in which he has hit .400 (10x25) with one double, one triple, four homers and 10 RBI.

**FIVE GUYS:** The Astros have only used five starting pitchers this season, the fewest in the Majors, and two less than their closest counterparts, the Rockies (7) and Indians (7)...the Astros rotation has posted the best ERA (3.08) and WHIP (1.09) and the most strikeouts (868) in the Majors this season.

**FEEL THE BREEZE:** Astros starters have posted 25 double-digit strikeout games this season, a new club record (previously 24 in 1969)...ties the second-most double-digit strikeout games by a team in AL history (last, 2017 Indians).

**LAST START - 8/14 VS. COL:** got his 8th loss of the season in Houston's 5-1 defeat against Colorado...allowed 2 runs on 6 hits in 6.0 innings...struck out 11 hitters without issuing a walk...

- marked the 4th time this season he posted double-digit strikeouts and no walks in a start, becoming the only pitcher to do so 4 times in 2018... despite the loss, it was his 20th quality start of the season.

**STILL SHINING:** the 35-year-old veteran was named to his 7th **All-Star** Team this season, but did not pitch in the game...marked his first All-Star selection since 2013.

- ranks among the top 5 AL pitchers in WHIP (2nd, 0.91), strikeout to walk ratio (1st, 7.75), quality starts (T-1st, 20), opponent OBP (3rd, .245), innings pitched (3rd), walks per 9.0 innings (3rd, 1.53), strikeouts per 9.0 innings (3rd, 11.88), ERA (4th), opponent batting average (4th, .202) and strikeouts (3rd, 214).

**QUEST FOR 200:** is just 1 win shy of 200 for his Major League career...will become the 114th pitcher in MLB history to reach the 200-win plateau (per STATS Inc.)...has earned all of his wins as an American Leaguer, which will make him the 40th pitcher to win 200 games as a member of the American League.

- if he gets the win today, would join a group of 19 pitchers who reached 200 wins within in 412 games or fewer...that group includes 13 Hall of Famers: **Pete Alexander** (HOF, 350g), **Juan Marichal** (HOF, 355g), **Walter Johnson** (HOF, 370g), **Tom Seaver** (HOF, 384g), **Mike Mussina** (389g), **Roger Clemens** (392g), **Whitey Ford** (HOF, 395g), **Greg Maddux** (HOF, 396g), **Jim Palmer** (HOF, 397g), **Bob Feller** (HOF, 400g), **Randy Johnson** (HOF, 401g), **Andy Pettitte** (401g), **CC Sabathia** (401g), **Carl Hubbell** (HOF, 402g), **Bob Gibson** (HOF, 404g), **Roy Halladay** (406g), **Warren Spahn** (HOF, 409g), **Stan Coveleski** (HOF, 409g) and **Tim Hudson** (412g).

**VS. OAK:** will be making is 20th-career start against Oakland and 3rd of the season...has been dominant against the Athletics as he is 11-6 in his career against the club, posting a 2.55 ERA (35ER/123.1IP)

- enters today on a 3-game winning streak against the A's dating back to the 2014 season...has gone 7-1 in his last 8 starts against them.

**CHASING NOLAN:** per Elias Sports, ranks 24th in Major League history in strikeouts (2,633)...entered the season 42nd on that list, and so far has passed **Luis Tiant** (2,416), **Jamie Moyer** (2,441), **Andy Pettitte** (2,448), **Sam McDowell** (2,453), **Jim Kaat** (2,461), **Mark Langston** (2,464), **Tim Keefe** (2,475), **Jack Morris** (2,478), **Don Drysdale** (2,486), **Christy Mathewson** (2,507), **A.J. Burnett** (2,513), **Bartolo Colon** (2,516), **Javier Vazquez** (2,536), **Jerry Koosman** (2,556), **Bob Feller** (2,581), **Chuck Finley** (2,610), **Tom Glavine** (2607) and **Warren Spahn** (2,583)...his next target is **David Cone** (2,668).

- has 8 double-digit strikeout games this season, which ranks 4th in the Majors and leads the club...has 50 double-digit strikeout games in his career, which ranks T-19th all-time in MLB history with **Johan Santana**.
- has reached the 200-strikeout mark for the 8th time in his career...is 1 of 10 pitchers all-time with this many seasons of 200 strikeouts...also **Nolan Ryan** (15), **Randy Johnson** (13), **Roger Clemens** (12), **Tom Seaver** (10), **Pedro Martinez** (9), **Bob Gibson** (9), **Bert Blyleven** (8), **Steve Carlton** (8) and **Gaylord Perry** (8).

**NO FREE PASSES:** has allowed just 1 walk over 15.2 innings so far in the month of August...has gone 9.2 consecutive innings without a walk.
