WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers lost to the A's last night, 9-0, and team has a 0-1 record to open this 6-game, 7-day road trip to the Bay Area against OAK (0-1) and SF (3 G) with an off day on Thursday...team went 4-2 on homestand that preceded this trip...Texas has won 3 of 5 and 10 of last 18 G, going 4-5 in last 9, 5-6 in last 11, and 7-8 in last 15 G... team's 14-9 (.609) record since 7/27 is T6th-best in MLB and 4th-best in A.L. to BOS (.773, 17-5), CLE (.739, 17-6), and OAK (.667, 14-7)...have lost 20 of 36 and 22 of last 39 G, the longer span beginning 7/6...team is 29-27 beginning 6/16.

- The Rangers are 10-8 (.558) in August, T4th-best record in the A.L. and T8th-best in MLB...the 10 August wins have already surpassed last month's total, as 8-17 (.320) record in July marked lowest win pct. in A.L. and 2nd-lowest in MLB (SD: 5-20, .200)...at 15-15 (.500) since the AS break, TEX is T6th-best record in the A.L., as just 5 of the 15 teams in the league have a record above .500 in the 2nd 'half'.
- At 56-71 (.441), Rangers are 11th in the A.L. in winning percentage...the 56 wins are fewest for Texas after 127 G since 2014 (49-78) and 2nd-fewest for club since start of 2008.
- Texas has been under the .500 mark since a season best 1-1 on 3/30...club currently sits 15-under after missing out on another opportunity to reach 13-under...high point since the break is 14-under, and team has gone 0-6 in last 6 chances to reach 13-under...team was season-high 20 G under .500 at 42-62 on 7/26...TEX won season-high 7 straight from 6/16-23, preceded by longest losing skid at 7 G, 6/7-15.

SERIES STUFF: Texas needs back-to-back wins to take this series at the Coliseum...team has a 4-1-2 record in club's last 7 series, this after having gone 0-5-1 in previous 6 series... club is 1-1-1 in last 3 road series, dropping 3 of 4 at NYY in last away series from 8/9-12...Rangers are 2-2-3 in road series vs. A.L. West, going 3-7-0 in home series vs. the division.

- In 2nd games of series, Rangers have won 4 of 5 and 5 of last 7 after losing 6 in a row...team's 23-17 (.575) record in Game 2's is T5th in A.L. and T9th in MLB.

IN THE STANDINGS: After sitting between 21.0 and 23.0 games back in the A.L. West for 20 consecutive days from 7/28-8/16, Rangers are 20.0 GB of division-leading OAK/HOU for a 4th straight day, smallest division deficit since 7/6 (-19.5 GB)...there are 7 MLB teams with larger division deficits than Texas, including BAL's MLB-high 50.5-game deficit in the A.L. East...season high deficit of 25.0 G on 7/26...club has been in 5th place in the A.L. West for the last 133 days and in either 4th or 5th place for 143 of 144 days (T2nd following win on 3/30).

ON THE ROAD: Texas is 27-33 (.450) away from Arlington this season, 8th-best winning percentage in A.L...club has dropped 2 straight and 5 of 6, going 5-5 in last 10, 6-7 in last 13, and 13-13 beginning 6/18.

VS. OAKLAND: The Rangers are 5-9 vs. OAK in '18, losing 5 straight to the Athletics...TEX 4-7 in last 10 G vs. A's and has gone 23-25 vs. OAK beginning 6/14/16...Rangers have lost season series vs. A's in 4 of last 6 seasons, and would need to go 5-0 in final 5 meetings to take the 2018 series... Rangers are 2-3 at the Coliseum this year, including 2-2 in last 4 at this park after going 0-9 at this historic facility from 4/18/17-4/2/18...Texas leads all-time series 366-361 while A's have 189-172 edge at the Coliseum.

BAY AREA REGULARS: The Rangers' are in the midst of week-long stay in the Bay Area, as Texas will play 3 G here at the Coliseum (Mon-Wed) followed by a 3-G weekend series at AT&T Park (Fri-Sun)...it marks the 2nd such visit the Rangers have ever made to Northern California, as club was also in town for a week from 6/4-10/12, going 1-3 against the A's before taking a 3-G weekend set versus the Giants, 2-games-to-1.

- The Rangers are playing 9 consecutive road games in the Bay Area, as club will start its next road trip with a 3-G series at OAK from 9/7-9.

TO THE LEFT: Entering tonight's game against Brett Anderson, Texas has lost 4 straight and 5 of last 6 games when facing left-handed starters, and have a 16-24 record in 2018... prior to a win on Saturday vs. LAA in which the Rangers pinned 10 H and 6 R in 5.1 IP against Andrew Heaney, team had endured 3 straight wins/quality starts by opposing LH starters: J.A. Happ (8/9 at NYY), CC Sabathia (8/12 at NYY), and Patrick Corbin (last Tues. vs. ARI)...despite the recent losses, Rangers still rank 3rd in the A.L. with a .766 OPS vs. LH starters, trailing only NYY (.845) and BOS (.786).

- Isiah Kiner-Falefa has batted a team-best .293 (27-92) against lefties this season, including a .415 (17-41) mark with a 1.100 OPS versus southpaws since 6/6...Adrián Beltré is 2nd on the club with a .289 BA (26-90) against LHP in 2018... while Shin-Soo Choo's season avg. against LHP is .252, he owns a .352 (45-128) figure against LH starters, best figure on the club in '18.

BLANKED: Texas was shut out last night for the 7th time this season, just 2nd time since the AS break (also 7/31 at ARI)...each of the 7 shutouts against the Rangers in '18 have come on the road...Texas is one of 4 ML clubs to endure 7+ SHO away from home, also DET (10), WAS (8), and PHI (8)...Rangers are also the only MLB team that has not been shut out at home in '18.

DEEP: After Kris Davis continued his record-setting HR pace against the Rangers last night, it's worth noting that this series features 2 of the A.L.'s top 5 in HR in 2018 with Davis (T2nd, 37) and Joey Gallo (T4th, 32)...most HR in MLB in 2017-18: 91-G. Stanton, 83-J.D. Martinez, 80-K. Davis, 78-A. Judge, 73-J. Gallo...Gallo's 11.81 AB/HR since the start of 2017 ranks 3rd in majors to Martinez (10.69) and Judge (11.72), while Davis (12.59) ranks 6th.

BELTRÉ CLOSING IN ON MR. PADRE: Adrián Beltré did not play in 2 straight after returning to the lineup as the DH on Saturday...he left the game last Monday vs. Arizona with a left hamstring strain...Beltré enters this week with 3138 career hits, 19th all-time and 3 shy of matching the great Tony Gwynn for 18th place on the all-time hits list...with 1685 career RBI, Beltré is also just 10 shy of matching Cal Ripken Jr for 24th on the all-time RBI list...Beltré has batted .355 (11-31) with a HR, 3 2B, and 6 RBI over his last 8 games vs. OAK this season.

LECLERC OF LATE: Jose Leclerc has posted 10.0 SHO IP over his last 10 appearances, and he owns a 0.83 ERA (2 ER/21.2 IP) in his last 22 outings...in his last 8 G beg. 7/30, opponents have gone 2-for-26 with one BB and 15 SO, as he has whiffed 15 of 27 (55.6%) BF in that span while converting all 5 save chances and finishing 6 TEX wins.

- Leclerc's 5 August saves are T2nd in MLB to SEA's Edwin Diaz (8).

CAN'T FIGHT THE YOUTH: Sunday's HR by Odor was the 98th in by a Ranger in his age 25-or-younger season (age as of 6/30) in 2018...the MLB-leading figure is also the 2nd-highest total in Rangers history, trailing only 104 HR in 2017...last year's 104 HR by age-25-or-younger season players for the Rangers ranked T2nd in MLB to the Cubs' 149.

EASE HIS PAIN: Jurickson Profar's HBP last night was his 12th of the year, 6th-most in the A.L...Robinson Chirinos is T3rd in the league with 13 HBP, as this is just the 2nd campaign in club history with multiple batters having 12+ HBP... the others: 2003 (A. Rodriguez/Teixeira) and 2015 (Choo/Odor)...Texas batters' 71 HBP in '18 are 2nd-most in MLB (78-TB) and 5th-most in club history (record is 81 HBP in '17).

SHORTS: Nomar Mazara's current 8-G hit streak is 7th-longest by a Ranger in '18, as just 5 streaks have reached double-digits...last night's 9-run loss was Rangers' 4th-largest defeat of '18 (3 of the 4 since the break) and biggest loss on the road this season.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#57 Ariel Jurado, RHP
(2-2, 6.41)

TONIGHT: Pronounced air-REE-el hurr-RAH-doe...the 22-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make the 6th ML appearance/start of his career tonight in the middle installment of this 3-G series at the Coliseum...is 2-1, 6.14 (15 ER/22.0 IP) in 4 starts since being recalled for his 2nd big league stint on 7/28...opponents are batting .286/.341/.536/.876 over that stretch...will pitch on regular 4-days' rest after a no decision in the Rangers' 8-6 comeback win on Thursday vs. the Angels...was on Rangers' active roster for one day during his 1st stint with the club for his ML debut on 5/19 at CWS...he was optioned back to Frisco the following day...has spent the bulk of the season at Double-A Frisco, going 5-3 with a 3.28 ERA (37 ER/101.2 IP) in 16 G/GS for the RoughRiders while posting a 1.220 WHIP figure, 5.1 SO/9, 1.5 BB/9, and 1.1 HR/9...is in his 5th professional season after being signed by Texas as a non-drafted free agent out of Panama in 2012...has consistently induced ground balls throughout his minor league career, with a 1.94 GO/AO rate entering 2018...remained one of the top Texas prospects entering 2018, as he ended last season ranked as the organization's no. 9 prospect according to MLB.com...was named the organization's Nolan Ryan Minor League Pitcher of the Year in 2015 following a breakout campaign with Single-A Hickory...only 6 natives of Panama have ever played for the Rangers, most recently Paolo Espino (2017)...Rangers are 3-2 in his 5 starts.

LAST START: Settled for a no decision in no decision in the Rangers' 8-6 comeback win on Thursday vs. the Angels (6.0 IP, 9 H, 6 R-ER, 1 BB, 3 SO, 1 HR, 84 pitches/54 strikes)...exited the game trailing 6-4 after 6 innings...allowed 5 straight singles to open the game and a total of 6 hits in the first inning...permitted just one run on 3 hits over his final 5 innings of work...set down the final 7 batters he faced starting with a triple play to end the 4th inning.

ON THE ROAD: Is slated for his 4th road start, going 1-2 with a 6.32 ERA (11 ER/15.2 IP) over his previous 3 outings...6 of the 11 runs came in his last road start on 8/9 at NYY, surrendering 4 HR over 5.0 IP...on 7/28 at HOU, became the youngest Ranger ever to win a road start within his 1st 2 ML games (22.179).

2018: Opposition is batting .288/.345/.538/.884 through 5 starts...13 of 30 hits allowed have been XBH (6 2B, 3B, 6 HR)...has averaged 2.03 HR/9 after a 0.7 HR/9 rate over 568.1 IP at the minor league level...his 53.8 ground ball percentage is 8th-highest among A.L. pitchers with at least 5 starts.

FIRST WIN: Earned his first career win in Rangers' 7-3 victory on 7/28 at HOU (6.0 IP, 2 H, 1 R-ER)...retired first 9 batters faced before George Springer hit a solo home run to lead off the 4th...became the youngest Ranger ever to win a road start within his 1st 2 ML games (22.179)...1st pitcher in Rangers history to win a start within his 1st 2 ML appearances when the opposing starter was a former Cy Young Award winner...just one other Ranger has won a start against the defending WS champs within his 1st 2 ML games: Brian Sikorski on 8/16/00 vs. NYY...Jurado was the 1st Ranger to do it on the road.

ML DEBUT: Made his ML debut on 5/19 at CWS, taking loss in Rangers' 5-3 defeat (4.2 IP, 6 H, 4 R-ER, 2 BB, 2 SO, 0 HR, 81 pitches/55 strikes)...all 4 runs allowed came in a 34-pitch 3rd inning, this after Texas had extended lead to 3-0 in the top of the 3rd...Daniel Palka hit a 2-out, 2-R triple to cap the Sox' scoring in that frame...Kevin Jepsen allowed a solo HR to Jose Abreu in the 7th inning of what was Jepsen's final outing w/ TEX.

CAN'T FIGHT THE YOUTH: At 22 years, 109 days old for his ML debut, Jurado became the youngest Ranger to make a start for Texas since Martin Pérez (22.108) on 7/21/13 vs. BAL...Jurado was the youngest Ranger to start in his ML debut since Tommy Hunter (22.029) on 8/1/08 vs. TOR...also became just the 7th native of Panama to ever appear for Texas, joining Paolo Espino (2017) as the only Panamanians with the club since Bruce Chen in 2007...he became the Rangers' 1st international signing to start for the club in his major league debut since Omar Beltre on 6/30/10 at LAA.

AT FRISCO: Has spent the balance of the season at Double-A Frisco, going 5-3 with a 3.28 ERA (37 ER/101.2 IP) in 16 G/GS for the RoughRiders while posting a 1.220 WHIP figure, 5.1 SO/9, 1.5 BB/9, and 1.1 HR/9...had quality starts in each of his last 5 outings at Double-A, going 3-0, 2.10 (8 ER/34.1 IP) with 4 BB/24 SO...last start came on 7/23 vs. Midland (W, 7.0 IP, 7 H, 1 R-ER, 1 BB, 5 SO, 0 HR, 98 pitches/65 strikes)...at the time of his most recent promotion on 7/28, ranked among Texas League leaders in BB/9 (1st, 1.50), baserunners/9 (2nd, 11.24), ERA (3rd, 3.28), WHIP (3rd, 1.220), opp. BA (3rd, .272)...was selected a midseason TL All-Star (did not pitch in game) and was league's player of the week for May 21-27.

2017: Posted career highs in starts (27), innings (157.0) while leading Frisco in both categories...also posted a career-high ERA figure (4.59) and was charged with a career-high 11 losses after entering season with 8 career losses over 4 pro seasons...his 157.0 innings ranked 2nd in the Texas League, while his 0.92 HR/9 rate ranked 3rd among league qualifiers.
