THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY - AUG. 27
2006 - **Willy Taveras** extends his club-record hit streak to 30 games with a leadoff single in a 13-1 win at Pittsburgh...his record still stands today.
1986 - **Nolan Ryan** wins his 250th career game in a 7-1 victory over the Cubs.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The defending World Series Champion Houston Astros, winners of five straight games, will open up a 10-day, 10-game homestand tonight with the first of three against the Athletics...**RHP Gerrit Cole**, who has started four games against the A's already this season, will open the series for the Astros.

RING NIGHT 4: Due to the record-breaking demand and spectacular response from fans to the third Replica World Champions Rings giveaway presented in July, all ticketed Astros fans in attendance tonight will receive the popular giveaway at gates upon entry... after this giveaway, the Astros will have distributed over 160,000 replica rings.

STREAKERS: The Astros current five-game winning streak is their sixth this season of five-or-more games... they've posted a 12-game streak (June 6-18), two six-game streaks and now three five-game streaks.

THRU 130: At 80-50, the Astros have tied their best 130-game record in club history, also reached by the 1998 Astros...to keep pace with the 1998 club, the Astros need to win tonight...a win tonight would also push the Astros to 31-games above .500, which would tie their season high, last reached on Aug. 7 (73-42).

THE RACE IS ON! This series is a big one on the schedule, as the Astros and Athletics are locked in a tight division race, which is currently tilted in the Astros favor by 1.5 games...the lead can be attributed to the Astros 10-6 record against the A's this season in a season series that will conclude this week.

PUNCHING TICKETS: **RHP Gerrit Cole**, who has posted 38 strikeouts in 24.2 innings pitched against the A's this season, enters tonight ranking second in the AL in strikeouts with 226, trailing only teammate **RHP Justin Verlander** (229)...prior to this season, the last Astros pitcher to post 226 strikeouts in a season was **RHP Nolan Ryan**, who struck out 228 in 1988.

YESTERDAY'S WIN: The Astros completed a sweep of the Angels yesterday in Anaheim with a 3-1 afternoon victory at Angel Stadium...**LHP Framber Valdez**, who was making his first Major League start, earned the victory, tossing 5.0 innings and allowing one run on two hits...**SS Carlos Correa** provided the Astros with all the offense they would need with a two-run single.

ROAD WARRIORS: The Astros have gone 47-21 (.691) on the road this season, which is the best road record in baseball...the Astros are in a position to post one of the best road records of all-time, as their current 47-21 mark ranks fourth all-time and is the best since the 2001 Mariners went 59-22 (.728).

MEDIA WALL OF HONOR: Voting for the 2018 inductee into the Houston Baseball Media Wall of Honor, which is open to season-credentialed media only, concludes tonight...the nominees for this honor are: **Phil Boudreaux**, **Larry Dierker**, **Kenny Hand**, **Clark Nealon** and **Karen Warren**.

HE'S BACK: The Astros have won all five games since **2B Jose Altuve's** return from the DL on Tuesday, while the offense has hit .324 (58x179) with 33 runs scored (6.6 runs/game)...Altuve missed 21 total games (his first-ever DL stint), with Houston going 8-13...Altuve has hit .350 (7x20) with one double, one homer, three RBI, one steal and a .435 OBP since his return.

SHARK WEEK: IF Tyler White has been the Astros best offensive performer since the All-Star Break, as he has hit .333 (25x75) with 12 extra-base hits (4 doubles, 2 triples, 6 homers), 16 RBI and a 1.063 OPS in 21 games.

MR. AUGUST: LF Marwin Gonzalez has four home runs in his last seven games, and eight home runs in 21 games in August...he ranks tied for third in the AL in homers this month and fourth in OPS (1.072).

TWO-BAG BREGMAN: 3B Alex Bregman has hit 40 doubles this season, a new single-season career-high...he has hit 35 of those doubles as a third baseman, tying a single-season franchise record set by **Sean Berry** in 1996...Bregman is tied with **Francisco Lindor** for the most doubles in the American League this year.

THE KID: 3B Alex Bregman has reached base safely in 45 consecutive road games, the longest active streak in the Major Leagues and the second-longest streak in club history, behind **Jeff Bagwell's** club-record streak of 51 games set from 1998-99...Bregman's 45-game streak is the longest single-season streak in franchise history.

PIÑA POWER: IF Yuli Gurriel has hit safely in 12 of his last 13 games, batting .313 (15x48) with four doubles, one triple, two homers, eight RBI and a .928 OPS.

TOMORROW AT WHATABURGER: OF Tony Kemp will be signing autographs and interacting with fans tomorrow from 11 a.m.-12 p.m. at the 5400 FM 1640 Whataburger location in Richmond, TX...he will be joined by Astros mascot **Orbit** and members of the Astros Coca-Cola Shooting Stars and Shuttle Crew.

SPANISH PRESS CONFERENCE: Tomorrow at 2:30 p.m., the Astros will host an all-Spanish press conference featuring General Manager and President of Business Operations **Jeff Luhnow** and Spanish-speaking players, including pitcher **Héctor Rondón**...the press conference will take place in the press conference room at Minute Maid Park...media interested in attending Tuesday's all-Spanish press conference should RSVP with **Alexandra Noboa** at anoboa@astros.com.

LAST START - 8/20 AT SEA: did not factor in the decision last Monday in Seattle in the Astros 7-4 loss against the Mariners...tossed 5.0 innings, allowing 3 runs on 7 hits with 2 walks and 7 strikeouts.

COLE TRAIN: 27-year-old was selected to the **2018 AL All-Star** team... marked his 2nd-career All-Star nomination, as he was an NL All-Star in 2015 with the Pirates.

- is making his 27th start of the season...has been dominant in his outings, combining to strike out 226 hitters thru 26 starts (164.2IP).

K KING COLE: ranks 3rd in the Majors in strikeouts, trailing only **Max Scherzer** (244) and **Justin Verlander** (229).

- also ranks 2nd in the Majors strikeouts per 9.0 innings (12.35), trailing only **Chris Sale** (13.50)...if he continues at this pace, he will set a single-season franchise record, which is currently owned by **Nolan Ryan** in 1987 (11.48, 270SO/211.2IP).

- has combined with **Justin Verlander** (229) to post 455 strikeouts this season, which ranks 4th in franchise history for a duo in a single season... the duos on top of that franchise list include **Nolan Ryan** and **Mike Scott** in 1987 (503) and in 1986 (500), and **Don Wilson** and **Larry Dierker** in 1969 (467).

- his 226 K's rank 11th on the franchise's single-season strikeout list... prior to Verlander this season, the last Astros pitcher to post at least 226 strikeouts in a single season was **Nolan Ryan** in 1988 (228 K).

- has set franchise strikeout milestones already this year, as he now owns the franchise record for strikeouts prior to the All-Star Break of a single season with 169...also set an AL record for K's in the month of April this season with 61.

- has had 7 double-digit strikeout games this season, all being 11-or-more strikeouts...is the only pitcher in the Majors this season with 7 games of 11-plus strikeouts...now has more double-digit strikeout games (7) this season than he did in 127 starts with the Pirates (6).

AMONG THE LEADERS: new to the AL in 2018, has translated well, as he currently ranks 4th in the American League in opponent OPS (.584), 3rd in opponent batting average (.194), 5th in WHIP (1.01), 5th in ERA (2.73) and 7th in innings pitched.

VS. OAK: is making his 5th start of the season against the Athletics and the 6th of his career...has been dominant against Oakland as he is 2-0 against the club in 4 starts this season...3 of those 4 games have been quality starts and has only allowed 2 home runs in those starts.

TOUGH TO SQUARE UP: his .194 opponent batting average is shaping up to be one of the best marks by a starting pitcher in club history, as it currently ranks 4th by an Astro...the franchise record for a single season was .186, set by **Mike Scott** in 1986.

- has been particularly tough on left-handed hitters, limiting them to a .171 (48x281) average with a .551 OPS (.259 OBP/.292 SLG).

- has struck out 41.0% of all left-handed hitters he has faced, the best among Major League starting pitchers...**Justin Verlander** (38.4%) and **Charlie Morton** (36.9%) rank 3rd and 4th in that category, respectively.

WELCOME TO HOUSTON: was acquired from the Pirates on Jan. 13, 2018 in exchange for 4 players: **RHP Michael Feliz**, **OF Jason Martin**, **IF Colin Moran** and **RHP Joe Musgrove**.

- has posted a 45-game road on-base streak, the longest active streak in the Majors and the 2nd-longest streak in Astros history...**Jeff Bagwell** posted a club-record 51-game streak from 1998-99...Bregman's 44-game streak is the longest in a single season in franchise history.
- has reached base safely in 83 of his last 85 games overall.
- hit 2 doubles on Sat. at LAA to give him a career-high 40 on the season...has hit 35 doubles as a third baseman, tying the single-season franchise record set by **Sean Berry** in 1996.
- leads the club in RBI (79), doubles (40) and walks (75), and ranks T-1st in HR (24), which are all career-high marks.
- is 1 of 7 players in American League history to reach the following totals in a single season: 40 doubles, 24 HR, 10 steals, 75 walks...the only others to do it: **Mookie Betts** (2017), **Grady Sizemore** (2006), **Roberto Alomar** (1999), **George Brett** (1988), **Lou Gehrig** (1927, 1930), **Babe Ruth** (1921, 1923).
- ranks T-1st in the AL in doubles (40) along with **Francisco Lindor**...leads the Astros and ranks 7th in the AL in OPS (.904)...ranks 2nd in the AL in walk/strikeout ratio (1.10), 4th in walks (75), 5th in extra-base hits (65), 6th in WAR (6.7, STATS) and 9th in OBP (.387).
- has 4 walkoff PA's (single, double, HR, E2)...leads the AL with 3 walkoff hits.
- was named to his 1st-career **All-Star Team** this year and became the first player in club history to be named the **All-Star Game MVP**.
