Dating back to Aug. 11, **Ryon Healy** is batting .370 (17x46) with 5 R, 2 2B, 2 HR, 7 RBI, 2 BB in 13 games...during this stretch his .370 average ranks 9th in the Majors (min. 45 AB)...teammate **Jean Segura** leads the ML during this time frame with a .415 (22x53) average.

The Mariners starters are 25-7 with a 1.51 ERA (40 ER, 238.0 IP) in 32 starts when tossing a least 7.0 innings.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their penultimate road trip of the season – a 10-day, 9-game, 3-city trip – with the 2nd of 4 games at the Oakland Athletics (1-0)...the Mariners opened the road trip taking 2 of 3 games vs. the Arizona Diamondbacks at Chase Field and fell 0-2 in a brief 2-game series vs. the San Diego Padres...following this series, will return to Safeco Field on Monday for a 10-day, 8-game homestand against Baltimore (3 G), New York-AL (3 G) and San Diego (2 G)...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT** SPORTS NW and broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...Mariners have won 10 of their last 19 and 12 of their last 23 games...are 20-28 (7/4-current) since winning a season-high 8 straight games (6/25-7/3)...the Mariners have won 35 of their last 70 games, 42 of their last 79, 46 of their last 85 and 53 of their last 95...Seattle is 61-48 in its last 109 games, 66-51 over its last 117 games...Seattle is 23-23 during the day and 52-36 at night...Seattle is 38-28 at Safeco Field, 37-31 on the road.

- Close Games the Mariners are 48-21 (.696) this season in games decided by 1 or 2 runs, the highest winning percentage in the Mariners are 46-21 (.096) this season in games decided by 1 of 2 furts, the highest winning percentage in the Majors...the Mariners are 32-18 (.640) in 1-run games (most 1-run wins in MLB) and 16-3 (.842) in games decided by exactly 2 runs (best 2-run winning percentage in MLB).

 Four Score - the Mariners are 54-17 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 21-42 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.

 Get Through 8 - the Mariners are 1 of 2 Major League clubs with a 1.000 winning percentage (64-0) when leading after 8 innings this season, joining Oakland (65-0).

 1000 PRI - Nelson Cruz (295) is 5 doubles away from 300 in his career. Cruz (995) is also 5 PRI away from

- Milestone Tracker Kyle Seager (391) has tied Harold Reynolds (391) for 7th-most walks in club history... also Seager (533) trails Raúl Ibañez (540) by 7 for 8th-most runs scored in club history

ROAD WARRIOR...Jean Segura is batting .336 (86x256) with 47 runs, 16 doubles, 2 triples, 3 home runs, 28 RBI, 3 HBP, 17 walks and 13 stolen bases in 61 games on the road this season...he leads the American League with 86 hits on the road, while also ranking 2nd in average (.336), T3rd in runs scored (47), T4th in stolen bases (13) and 10th in on-base percentage (.383)...Segura's .336 road batting average is currently the 13th-highest in franchise history (best: **Ichiro Suzuki**, .405 in 2004) and highest since Ichiro's .337 average in 2007.

<u>STEAL AWAY</u>...Dee Gordon currently leads the American League with 29 stolen bases...with 1 more stolen base, Gordon will extend his streak of seasons with 30+ steals to 5 consecutive seasons...only Jose Altuve (6, 2012-17, 4 SB in 2018) has a longer active streak while Billy Hamilton (4, 2014-17, 29 SB in 2018) is also 1 stolen base away from his 5th consecutive season with 30+ stolen bases.

WE'RE GOING STREAKING...Mitch Haniger currently has a season-high 11-game hitting streak (8/18-current), batting .340 (16x47) with 10 runs scored, 2 doubles, 4 home runs, 6 RBI, 1 HBP and 6 walks...his active 11-game hitting streak is currently T2nd-longest in the Major Leagues (along with Alex Bregman-HOU), trailing only a 13-game hitting streak by Milwaukee's Lorenzo Cain...Haniger's 11-game hitting streak is also the 2nd-longest in his career, trailing only a 13-game hitting streak, April 6-19, 2017.

PLAYER OF THE MONTH...Mitch Haniger has hit safely in 23 of 27 games in August, including 12 multi-hit games...over that span, he is batting .351 (40x114) with 19 runs, 12 doubles, 5 home runs, 15 RBI, 1 HBP, 9 walks, a .400 on-base percentage and a .588 slugging percentage (.988 OPS)...among American League leaders in the month of August, Haniger ranks 4th in average, trailing only Mallex Smith-TB (.389/28x72), J.D. Martinez-BOS (.388/37x98) and Mookie Betts-BOS (.354/25x99)...leads the AL during August in hits (40) and doubles (12)...is T4th in extra-base hits (17), T4th in total bases (67) and 10th in on-base percentage (.400).

VS. THE A'S...Dee Gordon has hit safely in 12 of his last 13 games vs. the Athletics (5/23/17-current), including recording 7 multi-hit contests...during this stretch he is batting .431 (25x58) with 10 runs scored, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 9 RBI and 7 stolen bases...since 2017, his .431 average vs. the A's is the 2ndhighest in the Major Leagues (min. 30 PA), trailing only Dustin Pedroia-BOS (.483/14x29).

ROAD HOMERS...since 2015, Nelson Cruz (87), Kyle Seager (66) and Robinson Canó (47) have combined to hit 200 home runs on the road...Cruz's 87 road home runs since 2015 lead all Major League players, while Seager ranks 3rd and Canó ranks T19th in the American League...during this stretch as a team, the Mariners have hit 395 home runs on the road, 4th-most in the AL trailing only Toronto (427), Houston (422) and Oakland (410)...Cruz has 15 career home runs at the Oakland Coliseum, including 12 home runs over his last 37 games.

THE DÍAZ REPORT...in 64 games this season, Edwin Díaz is 50-for-54 (92.6%) in save opportunities with a 1.97 ERA (14 ER, 64.0 IP) with 108 strikeouts and 15 walks...here are some notes on Díaz's standout season:

- Leads the Major Leagues with 50 saves...Craig Kimbrel-BOS is 2nd with 37.
 Is the 14th pitcher (done 17x) in ML history to record at least 50 saves in a season.
 Ranks 2nd among Major League relievers with 108 strikeouts...Josh Hader-MIL is 1st with 113.
 Leads the Major Leagues with 25 one-run saves...Blake Treinen-OAK is 2nd with 16.
 Has struck out 44.8% (108 K, 241 BF) of batters faced this season, the 5th-best single-season strike-out rate by a reliever in Major League history.
 Has struck out his 1st batter faced 30 times this season, most in the Majors (Adam Ottavino-COL, 29).
 His 50 caves are a franching record, pagging Egrapado Radgey (48, 2014).
- His 50 saves are a franchise record, passing Fernando Rodney (48, 2014). His 108 strikeouts are 2nd-most as a reliever in club history...trails only Bill Caudill (111, 1982).
- The Mariners are 59-0 when he enters with a lead, including 28-0 when he enters with a 1-run lead.

MAKING THEMSELVES AT HOME...since 2015, the Mariners are 24-11 (.686) in 35 games vs. the Athletics at the Oakland Coliseum...Seattle's .686 winning percentage at the Oakland Coliseum since 2015 is the best road winning percentage by any team against a divisional opponent ranking ahead of Boston at Toronto (25-12/.676), Houston at Seattle (24-13/.649), Chicago-NL at Milwaukee (23-13/.639) and New York-NL at Philadelphia (23-13/.639)...during that stretch, Seattle is averaging 5.09 runs/game (178 R, 35 G) while posting a 3.63 ERA (126 ER, 312.1 IP) against the Athletics.

AS YOU KNOW...the Mariners are 37-31 (.544) on the road this season with 13 road games remaining in the regular season schedule...BUT DID YOU KNÓW?...the Mariners .544 road winning percentage is currently the 5th-best in Mariners club history?...the Mariners have only had a higher winning percentage in 2001 (.59-22/728), 2014 (46-35/.568), 2002 (45-36/.556) and 1997 (45-36/.556) while ranking ahead of 2000 (44-37/.543), 2003 (43-38/.531), 1996 (42-38/.525) and 2015 (42-39/.519)...the Mariners have finished .500 or better on the road 8 time in club history.

ABOUT LEAKE

- 30-year-old right-hander is making his 27th start of the season. 32nd Mariners start, 265th career appearance (260th career start) and 7th career start vs. Oakland tonight.
- A native of San Diego, CA, graduated from Fallbrook (CA) High School. Played in 3 seasons (2007-09) at Arizona State University...went 16-1 with a 1.71 ERA (27 ER, 142.0 IP) with 162 strikeouts and 24 walks in 19 games (18 starts) in his junior season (2009), earning Baseball America First-Team All-American, Pac-12 Pitcher of the
- Year and First-Team All-Pac-12. Selected by Oakland in 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft...did not sign.
- Selected and signed by Cincinnati out of the 1st round (8th over all pick) in the 2009 MLB Draft.
- Is 10-14 with a 5.02 ERA (139 ER, 249.1 IP) in 43 career games (41 GS) in August.

TOTAL: 26 GS, 8-8, 4.03 **LAST OUTING**...allowed 5 runs on 7 hits over 6.0 innings in the Mariners 2-5 loss to Arizona on Aug. 26...all 5 runs scored in the 3rd inning; three consecutive singles loaded the bases and the runs scored on a sac-fly, a single and a 3-run home run by Paul Goldschmidt...Leake retired the last 11 batters he faced and did not allow a baserunner outside of the

HE SLAYS THE A'S ... since making his Mariners debut vs. Oakland on Sept. 1, 2017, is 1-0 with a 1.95 ERA (6 ER, 27.2 IP) with 20 strikeouts and 4 walks in 4 games against the Athletics, <u>all quality starts</u>...Leake has made 4 career starts in the Coliseum, collecting a 2.03 ERA (6 ER, 26.2 IP) with 14 strikeouts; has allowed just 1 earned run and 1 walk in the Coliseum this season...overall, he is 1-1 with a 2.50 ERA (11 ER, 39.2 IP) with 5 quality starts in 6 career appearances vs. the A's...his teams are 5-1 in those 6 starts.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY...13 of his last 17 starts (5/22-c) have been quality starts, including 4 outings of 8.0 innings while allowing 2-or-fewer earned runs...his 42.0 innings pitched in June were tied with Jacob deGrom-NYM for most in the Majors...among ML starters, only **James Paxton** (43.0 IP in May) has tossed more innings in a single calendar month this season.

STAYING GROUNDED...is ranked 3rd in the American League with a ground ball rate of 49.8%, trailing only Dallas Keuchel-HOU (54.6%) and Lance Lynn-MIN/NYY (50.6%)...opponents have grounded into 23 double plays with Leake on the mound this season, tied with Cole Hamels-TEX/CHI for the most in the

<u>LEADERBOARD</u>...among Major League leaders, ranks 5th in walks per batter faced (.047), 7th in walks per 9.0 innings (1.74/31 BB, 160.2 IP), T9th in quality starts (16), T12th in innings pitched (160.2), 14th in home runs per 9.0 innings (1.06), 21st in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.29/102 K, 31 BB), 23rd in WHIP (1.26/31 BB, 171 H, 160.2 IP) and 20th in ERA (4.03/72 ER, 160.2 IP).

GOING FOR DISTANCE...his 4 starts of at least 8.0 innings pitched and 2 or fewer runs allowed (5/27 vs. MIN, 6/7 at TB, 6/23 at BOS & 8/15 at OAK) are T3rd-most in the Majors (3 others), trailing only Jacob deGrom-NYM (6) and Kevin Gausman-BAL/ATL (5).

GIVE 'EM A CHANCE ... has exited 18 of his 26 starts with a lead (12 games) or

a tie score (6 games)...in 3 of his other 8 starts, exited trailing 1-3 after 6.0 IP, 0-3 in the 6th inning and 2-3 after 6.0 IP...the Mariners are 17-9 in his 26

HELLO, SEATTLE...since making his Mariners debut on Sept. 1, 2017, is 11-9 with a 3.78 ERA (81 ER, 192.2 IP) in 31 starts (20 quality starts)...during that span, Leake leads Mariners starters in games started, innings pitched and quality starts while ranking 2nd in ERA (James Paxton, 3.76)...in 23 of his 31 Mariners starts, Leake has gone at least 5.0 innings and allowed 3 or fewer earned runs...the Mariners are 20-11 in Leake starts.

TAKING HIS TURN...since making his Major League debut in 2010, has made 259 starts, T12th-most among all pitchers (also: Clayton Kershaw)...among all pitchers since 2010, ranks 14th in innings pitched (1607.0).

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 10-13 with a 3.92 ERA (81 ER, 186.0 IP) with 130 strikeouts and 37 walks in 31 starts...was acquired along with cash considerations and international slot money from STL on Aug. 30, 2017 in exchange for minor league infielder Rayder Ascanio...went 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA (9 ER, 32.0 IP) with 27 strikeouts and 2 walks in 5 starts with Seattle.

DURABLE...made 30 starts in each of the past 6 seasons...is one of 4 pitchers in the Major Leagues to make at least 30 starts in every season from 2012-17, joining Jon Lester, Max Scherzer and Ian Kennedy.

CAREER...has appeared in 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2010-15), San Francisco (2015), St. Louis (2016-17) and Seattle (2017-c)...has a career

record of 91-85 with a 3.99 ERA (712 ER, 1607.0 IP) with 1,087 strikeouts and 373 walks in 264 career games (259 starts)...made his Major League debut in a start on April 11, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL with Cincinnati...selected by Oakland in the 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft but did not sign... selected and signed by Cincinnati in the 1st round (8th overall pick) of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Arizona State University.
