RAY MATTER—The Rays have won nine of their last 11 games, and their win on Wed vs. CLE brought them back to a season-high-tying 15 games over .500...this is only the sixth season in franchise history the Rays have ever been as many as 15 games over .500 (2008, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013), and they made the postseason in four of these previous five seasons...the Rays have outscored opponents, 66-36, over this 11-game stretch.

- + On Wed vs. CLE, the Rays vielded 1 hit, matching their season low. and it was their fewest allowed at home since May 29, 2016 vs. NYY (1)...their only hit allowed was a solo homer by José Ramírez leading off the 7th inn., snapping Blake Snell's no-hit bid at 6 IP.
- Since Aug 19, the Rays are 18-4 (.818), best winning pct. in the majors over that span...they are 26-12 (.684) since the start of August, tied with the Red Sox and Athletics for best in the majors.
- Since matching the worst 17-game start in franchise history (4-13), the Rays are 76-52 (.594), 6th-best winning pct. in the majors since April 18 behind the Red Sox, Astros, Yankees, Athletics and Cubs.
- The Rays have 80 wins this season, matching their most under fourth-year Manager Kevin Cash (2015, 2017)...they are two wins shy of clinching their first winning record since 2013 (92-71) and would need to go 10-7 or better in the remaining 17 games for their sixth 90-win campaign in 11 seasons as the Rays.

DOME SWEET DOME—The Rays are 46-25 (.648) at home this season, 3rd in the majors behind the Red Sox (52-20, .722) and Yankees (48-24, .667)... since Aug 9, the Rays are 13-1 at home, matching the best 14-game home stretch in club history...they have outscored opponents, 85-34, over these 14 games...their loss on Tues vs. CLE snapped a franchise-record 12-game home winning streak, longest in the majors since the 2016 Indians (13).

- + Since June 11, the Rays are 34-9 (.791) at home, best winning pct. in the majors over that span...before this, they were 12-16 at home.
- The Rays have 46 wins at home, their most since 2013 (51)...they have clinched a winning record at home for a second consecutive season after going .500 or worse in 2014, 2015 and 2016.
- The Rays have won in walk-off fashion nine times, most in the AL and their most since 2013 (13)...they have hit five walk-off home runs, most in the AL and tied for 2nd in the majors.
- Since May 26, the Rays have played 49 games at home: 37 wins, 10 1-run losses, and 2 losses by 2 runs or more.

WHERE WE STAND—The Athletics lost last night, bringing the Rays to 8 GB of the second Wild Card with 17 games remaining...the Rays were 7 GB at the end of play on Sep 4, but they haven't been closer than that to the second Wild Card since they

were 6.5 GB of the Mariners through games of June 1...no other teams are between the A's and Rays-Wednesday marked the first time all season the Rays ended the night with a better record than the Mariners, and they have gained 14 games on them since the start of play on June 17.

- The Rays entered August only one game over .500 and 9 GB of the Mariners for the second Wild Card, and despite improving to 15 games over they have gained only one game on the second Wild Card over that stretch...the Rays have a 0.8 pct. chance of making the postseason according to Baseball Prospectus, a 0.2 pct. chance according to FanGraphs and 0.1 pct. chance per ESPN.com.
- The Rays are on pace for 89 wins, and since the second Wild Card was introduced in 2012 the only teams to win that many games and miss the postseason are the 2013 Rangers (91, lost "Game 163" tiebreaker against the Rays), 2012 Angels (89) and 2012 Rays (90).
- The Rays have gone 27-24 this season against the five AL teams currently positioned to make the playoffs, incl. 18-7 since June 22.
- A team with the same record as the Rays would be 0.5 GB in the NL West, 1.5 GB in the NL East and 1.5 GB in the AL Central.

RAYS vs. ATHLETICS—The Rays went 3-1 in a 4-game series at the Oakland Coliseum from May 28-31, but they lost the series finale and missed a chance to sweep a road series over the A's for the first time in club history...two of their 3 wins were shutouts, in games started by Ryne Stanek (1-0 win in 13 innings) and Nathan Eovaldi (season debut, 6-0 win).

The Rays are 8-3 over the last two seasons against the A's after go-

ing 2-5 in 2016...they have won three consecutive series over them for the first time since Aug 23, 2007-Aug 14, 2008 (four straight)... all-time, they are 71-104 (406) and 41-46 (471) at home.

ROSTER MAKEOVER—Twelve of the 25 players on the active roster for the series finale between the Rays and Athletics on May 31 at the Oakland Coliseum are not on tonight's active roster...of the 31 players on tonight's active roster, only 13 were on it for the last meeting between these two clubs...three were reinstated from the disabled list, four were acquired via trade and 11 were promoted from the minor leagues

+ Only three players have been on the club's active roster all season: C.J. Cron. Sergio Romo and Jesús Sucre...only 15 of the 41 players from last year's season-ending active roster or disabled list remain in the organization, and only three of the 36 players from the 2016 season-ending roster or disabled list remain: Matt Duffv. Kevin Kiermaier and Blake Snell...Kiermaier is the only player who was on the roster for Kevin Cash's managerial debut in 2015.

PLAYOFF PUSH—Since going 2-4 against the White Sox (0-3) and Orioles (2-1) over the final 6 games of a 9-game homestand from July 31-Aug 9, the Rays are a major-league-best 22-8 (.773), yet they have gained only two games on the Athletics (21-11) over that span...both the Rays and A's rank among major league leaders in several categories since then.

PITCHING PLANS-Tonight's game will be started by Diego Castillo, the 46th time the Rays will use an opener and seventh time using Castillo in that role...the Rays opened the season with bullpen days as needed in place of a traditional starter, and since May 19, they have used openers to start games—generally facing 3-9 batters, depending on matchups.

- Since the debut of the opener on May 19 at LAA, Rays pitching ranks 2nd in the majors and 1st in the AL with a 3.32 ERA-before that, their 4.43 ERA was 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.
- The Rays have a pitched to a AL-best 3.48 ERA in the 1st inning.
- The Rays are 42-36 with traditional starters and 38-29 otherwise.

REDEFINING RELIEF -55.7 pct. of the team's innings pitched have been covered by the bullpen...the starters have thrown 574.1 IP, fewest in the majors, and the relievers have thrown 721.1 IP, most in major league history, passing the 2012 Rockies (657.0)...the Rays bullpen is one of five in major league history to reach 600 IP, and the previous four all finished with losing records...so far this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + 54 apps of at least 50 pitches and 26 apps of at least 70 pitches, both the most since Baseball Reference data is available (1908);
- 80 decisions, most since Baseball Reference data is available;
- 129 apps of at least 2 IP, most since the 1992 Royals (137);
- 63 apps of at least 3 IP, most since the 1987 Angels (73);
- 41 apps of at least 4 IP, most since the 1924 Cardinals (41);
- 29 apps of at least 5 IP, most since the 1924 Phillies (30)

PHAM-LY MATTERS-Tommy Pham's 16-game hitting streak is the longest active in the majors and three shy of tying the club record...he made his Rays debut on Aug 1 and is batting .322/.422/.540 (28-for-87) in 23 games (all starts) since then...the Rays are 18-5 (.783) with Pham in the starting lineup and 62-60 (.508) this season when he doesn't start.

- Last pitched on Mon vs. CLE, starting and going 2 IP, outlasting Indians starter Corey Kluber...allowed a RBI single to Edwin Encarnacion in the 1st inning.
- Has pitched to a 3.86 ERA (9.1-IP, 4-ER) in 6 starts, with 3 runs scoring on a 3-run homer by Johan Camargo in the 1st inning on Aug 29 at ATL...has gone 1.2, 1.2, 2.0, 1.0, 1.0 and 2.0 IP in his starts, with 6, 7, 9, 4, 4 and 8 BF in those starts.

- Recorded multiple strikeouts in the first 5 apps of his career, all as a reliever, the first reliever to do that since LAD Grant Dayton in 2016, and first AL reliever to do it since TEX Neftalí Feliz in 2009, according to Baseball Reference...was the only Rays reliever to begin his career in this fashion.
- On June 13 vs. TOR, recorded his first career win in his fourth career app...his only baserunner allowed in 2 IP was a 8th-inning, 2-out single.

- Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
