RAY MATTER—Last night the Rays allowed a 10th-inning, solo homer to **Khris Davis** to fall to 9 GB of the Athletics for the AL's second Wild Card with 16 games remaining...any combination of seven A's wins or Rays losses will eliminate the club from postseason contention...the homer was one of only 3 hits allowed by the Rays, and first since the 4th inn.

- + The Rays have lost two of their last 3 games, but they are 9-3 in their last 12 games, outscoring opponents, 67-38, over that span... they are 18-5 (.783) since Aug 19, best winning pct. in the majors since then, and 31-19 (.620) since the All-Star break, 3rd in the majors behind the Athletics (35-16, .686) and Red Sox (33-17, .660).
- + The Rays are 76-53 (.589) following a 4-13 start to the season.
- + At 80-66, the Rays are two wins shy of clinching their first winning record since 2013 (92-71), and they would need to finish the season 10-6 or better for their sixth 90-win campaign in 11 seasons as the Rays...their 80 wins tie their most under Manager **Kevin Cash**.

DOMESWEET DOME—The Rays are 46-26 (.639) at home this season, tied for 3rd in the majors behind the Red Sox (52-21, .712) and Yankees (49-24, .671)...this winning pct. is currently 3rd for a single season in franchise history behind 2008 (57-24, .704) and 2009 (52-29, .642)...they are 13-2 in their last 15 games and 34-10 in their last 44 games after a 12-16 start.

- + The Rays have won in walk-off fashion nine times, most in the AL and tied for 3rd in the majors behind the Cardinals (10) and Brewers (10)...this is their most since a club-record-tying 13 walk-off wins in 2013...their five walk-off home runs are most in the AL and 2nd-most for a single season in franchise history behind 2011 (7).
- + Since May 26, the Rays have played 50 games at home: 37 wins, 11 1-run losses, and 2 losses by 2 runs or more.

CLOSE SHAVES—Last night was only the fourth time in their last 28 games the Rays played a game decided by 1 run, and it was their first 1-run loss since Aug 12 at TOR...in comparison, 50 of the club's first 118 games (42.4 pct.) of the season were decided by 1-run margins...the Rays are 25-29 (.463) in 1-run games, leading the majors in 1-run losses, while their 54 1-run games are 2nd in the majors behind the Mariners (55)...the single-season club records are 56 1-run games and 30 1-run losses.

- + Last night was the 14th time this season the Rays lost when allowing 2 runs or fewer, most in the majors ahead of the Pirates (11) and extending the single-season club record over 2012 (12)...it was the 23rd time they lost when yielding 3 runs or fewer, most in the majors and one shy of tying the single-season club record (24, 2014).

RAYS vs. ATHLETICS—The Rays are 3-2 against the Athletics this season (0-1 at home, 3-1 on the road), and three of the 5 games have been decided by 1-run margins...the Rays are 8-4 over the last two seasons against the Athletics after going 2-5 in 2016...dating back to July 22, 2016 at OAK, 10 of the 15 games between the clubs have been decided by 1 run...the Rays entered this series having won three straight series over them for the first time since Aug 23, 2007–Aug 14, 2008 (4)...all-time, the Rays are 71-105 (.403), their 2nd-worst winning pct. against any AL opponent.

PITCHING PROPERLY—The Rays have yielded only 2 runs and 4 hits over their last 2 games, and it marks the second time this season they have allowed 3 hits or fewer in consecutive games, following June 25-26 vs. WAS...the Rays have yielded 2 runs or fewer in three straight games, matching their 2nd-longest such streak of the season behind June 25–July 1 vs. WAS/HOU (6)...despite trading four veteran pitchers in the week leading up to MLB's non-waiver trade deadline, the Rays lead the majors with a 2.84 ERA (346-IP, 109-ER) since the beginning of August.

- + Overall, the Rays rank 3rd in the majors with a 3.63 ERA, behind the Astros (3.11) and Dodgers (3.44)...only three times have the Rays finished a season with a lower ERA: 2011, 2012 and 2014.
- + The Rays have recorded 12 shutouts this season, their most since 2015 (12), despite going the first 51 games without one.

CY ZILLA?—In addition to leading the majors with 19 wins, as of today **Blake Snell** leads the AL with a 2.03 ERA as BOS **Chris Sale** no longer qualifies—though he is scheduled to start tomorrow...no AL pitcher has finished a season with at least 19 wins and a 2.03 ERA or better since BOS **Roger Clemens** (21 wins, 1.93 ERA) in 1990...twelve of Snell's 28 starts have come against the majors' five highest-scoring teams by runs per game, the Red Sox (4), Yankees (3), Indians (2), Astros (2) and Athletics

(1)...in these 12 starts, he is 9-2 with a 2.00 ERA (72-IP, 16-ER), including 8 starts allowing 1 run or fewer and three scoreless starts.

PITCHING PLANS—Tonight's game will be started by **Ryne Stanek**, the 47th time the Rays will use an opener and 26th time using Stanek in that role...the Rays opened the season with bullpen days as needed in place of a traditional starter, and since May 19, they have used openers to start games—generally facing 3-9 batters, depending on matchups.

- + In March, the Rays announced a season-opening rotation of **Chris Archer**, **Blake Snell**, **Nathan Eovaldi** and **Jake Faria**...all four pitchers spent time on the disabled list and two were traded in July...the Rays have used other starters in 80 of 146 games (54.8 pct.).
- + Since the debut of the opener on May 19 at LAA, Rays pitching ranks 2nd in the majors and 1st in the AL with a 3.30 ERA—before that, their 4.43 ERA was 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.
- + The Rays have a pitched to a AL-best 3.45 ERA in the 1st inning.
- + The Rays are 42-36 with traditional starters and 38-30 otherwise.

REDEFINING RELIEF—55.9 pct. of the team's innings pitched have been covered by the bullpen...the starters have thrown 576.1 IP, fewest in the majors, and the relievers have thrown 729.1 IP, most in major league history, passing the 2012 Rockies (657.0)...the Rays bullpen is one of five in major league history to reach 600 IP, and the previous four all finished with losing records...so far this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + 54 apps of at least 50 pitches and 26 apps of at least 70 pitches, both the most since Baseball Reference data is available (1908);
- + 81 decisions, most since Baseball Reference data is available;
- + 130 apps of at least 2 IP, most since the 1992 Royals (137);
- + 63 apps of at least 3 IP, most since the 1987 Angels (73);
- + 41 apps of at least 4 IP, most since the 1924 Cardinals (41);
- + 29 apps of at least 5 IP, most since the 1924 Phillies (30)

CHANGE IN APPROACH—The Rays have totaled 133 HR this season, 4th-fewest in the majors, and are on pace for 147 HR, which would be 81 HR fewer than their club-record 228 HR last season...they have won 26 games this season without the benefit of a home run, most in the majors, and they are 29-6 (.823) when hitting multiple homers in a game.

- + The Rays rank 4th in the majors with 108 SB to the Indians (121), Red Sox (115) and Brewers (115), and their most since 2012 (134).
- + The Rays have only three players with double-digit homers, fewest in the majors...the Blue Jays, Dodgers and Yankees lead the majors with 10 players in double digits...the Rays have never finished a season with fewer than four players with 10+ homers.

PHAM-LY MATTERS—**Tommy Pham** is batting .391 (27-for-69) over his 17-game hitting streak, the longest active in the majors and two shy of tying the club record...his .319 avg. with the Rays is higher than any other player (min. 100 PA) traded in the week leading up to the non-waiver trade deadline—closest is MIL **Mike Moustakas**, batting .277 (39-for-141) since joining the Brewers on July 28...the Rays are 18-6 (.750) with Pham in the starting lineup and 62-60 (.508) otherwise.

MINOR MATTERS—Last night Triple-A Durham lost Game 4 of the Governors' Cup Finals, 5-2, to Scranton/Wilkes-Barre to set up tonight's decisive Game 5, with first pitch scheduled for 4:05 p.m. ...this is a rematch of last season's Governors' Cup Finals, and the Bulls are seeking to win back-to-back titles for the first time since 2002-03...in the Midwest League Finals, Class-A Bowling Green is tied, 1-1, in the best-of-five, with Games 3-4 and Game 5 (if necessary) being played at home starting tonight.

RECENT OUTINGS—Last night vs. OAK, faced the minimum in the 3rd inning, yielding a 1-out walk before an inning-ending double play off the bat of **Jonathan Lucroy**...on Mon vs. CLE, inherited 2-on, 1-out in the 5th inning and struck out **Edwin Encarnacion**, his only batter faced, on 3 pitches for the second out...last started on Sun vs. BAL, and walked all 3 BF on 15 pitches (3 strikes), though his first walk was erased with a caught stealing...his 0.1 IP matched **Jonny Venters** on June 6 at WAS and **Sergio Romo** on May 27 vs. BAL for the shortest start by a Ray this season...became the second starter in franchise history to allow 3 BB in a start of 0.1 IP or fewer, following **Steve Trachsel** on May 26, 2000 vs. SEA.

A NEW LOOK—Has made 25 starts, 2nd-most on the team behind **Blake Snell** (28)...all 25 starts have come since May 26, four more than any other pitcher in the majors over that span...is the first pitcher with 25 starts and 25 relief apps in a season since **PHI Hugh Mulcahy** (26 starts, 30 relief apps) in 1937 and the first AL pitcher since **PHA Eddie Rommel** (31 starts, 25 relief apps) in 1923...is the first rookie in major league history with 25 starts and 25 relief apps in a single season.

- + This will be the 47th time the Rays use an opener, all of them since May 19 at LAA...he is 0-2 with a 2.57 ERA (35-IP, 10-ER) in his 25 starts.
- + Twenty of his 25 starts this season have been scoreless.
- + Has pitched to a 1.48 ERA (24.1-IP, 4-ER) in the 1st inning.

RUBBER ARM—After pitching the 3rd inning last night vs. OAK, will be starting on 0 days' rest for the fifth time this season—will become the first pitcher to do that five times in a single season since **STL/DET Grover Lowdermilk** (5) and **DET Harry Coveleski** (5) in 1915, according to Baseball Reference...on Sep 3-4 at TOR, became the second pitcher in club history to start back-to-back days, joining **Sergio Romo** on May 19-20 at LAA...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he was the first rookie to start on consecutive days since **STL George Munger** from July 28-29, 1943 vs. PHI.

MAKING THE LEAP—Since the start of June, is 1-2 with a 2.17 ERA (49.2-IP, 12-ER) and .186 opp avg. (32-for-172) in 43 apps (23 starts) to lower his ERA from 4.66.

- + Ranks among AL rookies in apps (52, 6th) and starts (25, 1st)...min. 50 IP, is 1st among AL rookies with a .184 opp avg. and 3rd with a 10.62 SO/9 IP ratio.
- + Has only allowed 1 XBH in 89 PA against lefties this season (double).
- + His 0.87 ERA (31-IP, 3-ER) at home is 3rd-best in the majors (min. 20 IP).
- + His avg. fastball velocity this season is 97.9 mph, according to StatCast, and his max velocity is 100.5 mph in his start on May 26 vs. BAL.

WATCH YOUR BACK—On Tues vs. MIA, **NYM Jacob deGrom** recorded his 26th consecutive start yielding 3 runs or fewer, the longest single-season streak in major league history...Stanek has allowed 3 runs or fewer in all 25 starts, and can tie deGrom's streak tonight.

QUIRKS OF THE OPENER—His 11.57 SO/9 IP ratio as a starter is 2nd-highest for a rookie in a season (min. 20 starts) to **CHC Kerry Wood** (12.58) in 1998.

- + Has made 8 starts without allowing a hit, the most for any pitcher within a single season since Baseball Reference data is available (1908).
- + From June 7-July 10, made nine consecutive scoreless starts to set a major league record—though he totaled only 13.2 IP over this span—passing **LAD Zack Greinke** (6, 43.2 IP), **LAD Orel Hershiser** (6, 55 IP) and **LAD Don Drysdale** (6, 54 IP).
- + According to Stats LLC, his 10 scoreless starts before the All-Star break were a major league record.

FROM THE OTHER SIDE—Is winless in all 25 starts, passing **Jason Hammel** (17) in 2006-07 for the longest winless streak in club history...this is the 8th-longest in the majors since Baseball Reference data is available (1908) and is three shy of the record shared by **ATL/TOR Jo-Jo Reyes** from 2008-11 and **OAK Matt Keough** from 1978-79...his 25 starts of 2 IP or fewer are the most for a pitcher within a single season—no other pitcher has made more than 8 starts of this type in a season...his 11 starts of 1 IP or fewer are the most in a single season, passing **PIT Max Butcher** (7) in 1940.

ELITE COMPANY—Named after Hall of Famer **Ryne Sandberg** despite being born into a family of Cardinals fans...last season, became the third "Ryne" in major league history, following Sandberg and All-Star pitcher **Ryne Duren**...his manager in Durham was Sandberg's nephew, **Jared Sandberg**.

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than **SD Andy Green**.
- + On Tues vs. CLE, was ejected by home plate umpire **Mark Carlson**, his eighth ejection as Rays manager, first since July 18, 2017 at OAK.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
