RAY MATTER—The Rays have won 10 of their last 13 games, outscoring opponents, 74-43, over that stretch, and are a season-high-tying 15 games over .500...this is only the sixth season in franchise history the Rays have ever been as many as 15 games over .500 (2008, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013), and they made the postseason in four of these previous five seasons...the Rays are 8 GB of the Athletics for the AL's second Wild Card with 15 games remaining, and any combination of seven A's wins or Rays losses will eliminate the club from postseason contention.

- + The Rays are 19-5 (.792) since Aug 19, best winning pct. in the majors since then, and 32-19 (.627) since the All-Star break, 3rd in the majors behind the Athletics (35-17, .673) and Red Sox (34-17, .667).
- + The Rays are 77-53 (.592) following a 4-13 start to the season.
- + Entering today's rubber match, the Rays are 6-0-1 in their last seven series and 9-1-1 in their last 11 series dating back to Aug 7.
- + At 81-66, the Rays have clinched their best record under Manager **Kevin Cash**, and they are one win shy of clinching their first winning record since 2013 (92-71)...they would need to go 9-6 or better for their sixth 90-win campaign in 11 seasons as the Rays.

DOMESTIC SWEET DOME—The Rays are 47-26 (.644) at home this season, tied for 3rd in the majors behind the Red Sox (53-21, .716) and Yankees (49-25, .662)...this winning pct. is currently 2nd for a single season in franchise history behind 2008 (57-24, .704)...they are 14-2 in their last 16 home games and 35-10 in their last 45 home games after a 12-16 start.

- + The Rays are 16-9 at home against the five AL teams currently positioned to make the postseason: 5-5 against the Red Sox and a combined 11-4 against the Indians, Astros, Yankees and Athletics.
- + The Rays have won in walk-off fashion nine times, most in the AL and tied for 3rd in the majors behind the Cardinals (10) and Brewers (10)...this is their most since a club-record-tying 13 walk-off wins in 2013...their five walk-off home runs are most in the AL and 2nd-most for a single season in franchise history behind 2011 (7).
- + Since May 26, the Rays have played 51 games at home: 38 wins, 11 1-run losses, and 2 losses by 2 runs or more.

DUELING OPENERS—Last night the Rays and Athletics combined to use 14 pitchers and throw 311 pitches...it was the first time both starting pitchers went 1 IP or fewer since Oct 1, 2015, when the Orioles hosted the Blue Jays and there was a 3 hour, 25 minute rain delay at the end of the 1st inning...it was the first time both starting pitchers went 1 IP or fewer in a game not delayed due to weather since July 28, 2015, when NYY **Chris Capuano** yielded 5 R/ER in 0.2 IP and TEX **Martin Pérez** pitched a scoreless 1st but allowed eight consecutive batters to reach in the 2nd inning... finally, it was the first time neither starting pitcher went into the 2nd inning in a game not delayed due to weather since Aug 8, 2003, when PIT **Brian Meadows** and COL **Jason Jennings** both yielded 4 R/ER in 1 IP.

RAYS vs. ATHLETICS—The Rays are 4-2 against the Athletics this season (1-1 at home, 3-1 on the road), and three of the 6 games have been decided by 1-run margins...the Rays are 9-4 over the last two seasons against the Athletics after going 2-5 in 2016...dating back to July 22, 2016 at OAK, 10 of the 16 games between the clubs have been decided by 1 run...the Rays entered this series having won three straight series over them for the first time since Aug 23, 2007-Aug 14, 2008 (4)...all-time, the Rays are 72-105 (.407), their 2nd-worst winning pct. against any AL opponent.

UP NEXT: RANGERS—The trip to Texas is the first time the Rays leave the Eastern Time Zone since their trip to Minnesota from July 12-15, the last series before the All-Star break...the Rays have won four of their last five series against the Rangers, and went 2-1 in the first series, April 16-18 at Tropicana Field, to improve from 3-12 to 5-13 on the season...the Rays are 81-95 all-time against the Rangers (46-41 at home, 35-54 on the road) and 41-38 in the Rays era after going 40-47 as the Devil Rays.

BY THE NUMBERS—The Rays are on pace for 89 wins, and since the second Wild Card was introduced in 2012 the only teams to win that many games and miss the postseason are the 2013 Rangers (91, lost "Game 163" tiebreaker against the Rays), 2012 Angels (89) and 2012 Rays (90).

- + The Rays are 28-25 against the five AL teams currently positioned to make the postseason, including 19-8 (.704) since June 22.

- + The Rays were only one game over .500 as late as the end of play on Aug 18, and they were 12 GB of the second Wild Card at that time...despite improving to 15 games over in the 24 games since then, they have gained only four games in that race.
- + A team with the same record as the Rays would be tied in the NL West, 1.5 GB in the AL Central and 1.5 GB in the NL East.

PITCHING PLANS—Today's game will be started by **Diego Castillo**, the 48th time the Rays will use an opener and eighth time using Castillo in that role...the Rays opened the season with bullpen days as needed in place of a traditional starter, and since May 19, they have used openers to start games—generally facing 3-9 batters, depending on matchups.

- + In March, the Rays announced a season-opening rotation of **Chris Archer**, **Blake Snell**, **Nathan Eovaldi** and **Jake Faria**...all four pitchers spent time on the disabled list and two were traded in July...the Rays have used other starters in 81 of 147 games (55.1 pct.).
- + Since the debut of the opener on May 19 at LAA, Rays pitching ranks 2nd in the majors and 1st in the AL with a 3.32 ERA—before that, their 4.43 ERA was 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.
- + The Rays have a pitched to a AL-best 3.43 ERA in the 1st inning.
- + The Rays are 42-36 with traditional starters and 39-30 otherwise.
- + Rays starters have gone 3 IP or fewer 62 times this season, most by a team since Baseball Reference data is available (1908), ahead of the 1949 St. Louis Browns (40)...their starters have gone 2 IP or fewer 53 times, most ever by a team ahead of the 1977 Mariners (27).

REDEFINING RELIEF—56.1 pct. of the team's innings pitched have been covered by the bullpen...the starters have thrown 577.1 IP, fewest in the majors, and the relievers have thrown 737.1 IP, most in major league history, passing the 2012 Rockies (657.0)...the Rays bullpen is one of five in major league history to reach 600 IP, and the previous four all finished with losing records...so far this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + 55 apps of at least 50 pitches and 27 apps of at least 70 pitches, both the most since Baseball Reference data is available (1908);
- + 82 decisions, most since Baseball Reference data is available;
- + 131 apps of at least 2 IP, most since the 1992 Royals (137);
- + 64 apps of at least 3 IP, most since the 1987 Angels (73);
- + 42 apps of at least 4 IP, most since the 1915 Athletics (42);
- + 30 apps of at least 5 IP, most since the 1924 Phillies (30)

ABOUT THE OFFENSE—The Rays rank 2nd in the AL in both avg. (.257) and on-base pct. (.330), trailing the Red Sox in both categories...last season, they finished 12th with a .245 avg. and 10th with a .317 OBP...never in franchise history have the Rays finished a season among the AL's top two teams in avg. or on-base pct.—their highest finish in avg. was 3rd in 2005 and their highest finish in on-base pct. was 3rd in 2013.

- + The Rays have hit 13 HR in their last 9 games, including 9 HR with runner(s) on base and 5 HR with 2 runners (or more) on base.

MINOR MATTERS—Last night Triple-A Durham defeated Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, 6-2, in the decisive Game 5 of the Governors' Cup Finals and clinched their sixth league title since becoming a Rays affiliate in 1998...they previously won it in 2002, 2003, 2009, 2013 and 2017...**Joe McCarthy** totaled 4 RBI, on a 1st-inning solo homer and 4th-inning bases-clearing double...the Bulls will face the winner of the Pacific Coast League for the Triple-A National Championship on Tuesday night in Columbus.

- + Class-A Bowling Green won Game 3 of the Midwest League Championship Series, 6-1, to move within a game of the title...RH **Paul Campbell** gets the start for the Hot Rods in Game 4 tonight.

TONIGHT'S START

- + On Fri vs. OAK, started and retired all 6 BF including a career-high-tying 4 SO... according to StatCast, 11 of his 29 pitches (37.9 pct.) were 100 mph or more.
- + Has pitched to a 3.18 ERA (11.1-IP, 4-ER) in 7 starts, with 3 runs scoring on 1st-inning, 3-run homer by **Johan Camargo** on Aug 29 at ATL...has gone 1.2, 1.2, 2.0, 1.0, 1.0, 2.0 and 2.0 IP in his starts, with 6, 7, 9, 4, 4, 8 and 6 BF in those starts.
- + Is 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA (24-IP, 6-ER) in his last 16 apps (7 starts), including 13 scoreless outings, after allowing 9 runs in his previous 5 apps from July 15-29.
- + Has gone 1.1 IP or longer 16 times this season, and 2 IP or longer 11 times...has thrown as many as 36 pitches, 2x-last Aug 29 at ATL (2 IP).
- + In his last 9 apps (7 starts) since Aug 19 at BOS, has thrown 29 pitches clocked at 100 mph or more...did this once in his first 29 apps this season.
- + His avg. fastball velocity this season is 97.4 mph, according to StatCast, and his max velocity is 101.3 mph in his start on Sep 2 at CLE.
- + Recalled from Triple-A Durham on June 5...went 0-1 with a 1.03 ERA (26.1-IP, 3-ER), 4 saves, 32 SO and .167 opp avg. in 19 apps for the Bulls.
- + Is one of a club-record 16 different starting pitchers used by the Rays this season, tied with the Angels and Twins for most in the majors...the Rays used eight starting pitchers all of last season—in fact, the 16 starters this season are more than the team's total from the previous three seasons combined (14, 2015-17).

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- + On July 1 vs. HOU, inherited the bases loaded with 1 out in the 8th inning...struck out **José Altuve** in a 10-pitch at-bat and got a groundout for the third out.
- + Recorded multiple strikeouts in the first 5 apps of his career, all as a reliever, the first reliever to do that since LAD **Grant Dayton** in 2016, and first AL reliever to do it since TEX **Neftalí Feliz** in 2009, according to Baseball Reference...was the only Rays reliever to begin his career in this fashion.
- + On June 13 vs. TOR, recorded his first career win in his fourth career app...his only baserunner allowed in 2 IP was a 8th-inning, 2-out single.
- + On June 6 at WAS, made his major league debut and pitched a perfect 7th inning, including strikeouts of **Brian Goodwin** and **Trea Turner**.

2017 SEASON

- + Split the season between Double-A Montgomery and Triple-A Durham, earning a June 3 promotion...marked the third straight year he received an in-season promotion...combined to go 4-5 with a 2.76 ERA (71.2-IP, 22-ER) and 15 saves in 51 apps (1 start) between the two levels.
- + Named Minor League Reliever of the Year by the Rays Baseball Operations dept. ...led the Rays system in saves (15) for a second consecutive year.
- + Recorded the save in the Governors' Cup clinching win over Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (Yankees) and the Triple-A National Championship Game over Memphis (Cardinals)...did not allow a run in 4 apps in the IL postseason spanning 5 IP (1-H, 0-BB, 8-SO).

X-RAY REPORT

- + Diego is one of 10 children—and all of them are married...he has six brothers and three sisters.
- + Diego is known to cook for his teammates...he learned to cook as a 10-year-old by watching his mother in the kitchen...he once shared his special family recipe of chicken, rice and plantains in a November 2016 cooking video on the Rays Twitter account.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RH TYLER GLASNOW (1-6, 4.48 ERA)

LAST START—On Tues vs. CLE, yielded multiple homers in an outing for the first time since June 9, 2017 vs. MIA (2)...both runs allowed came via the solo home run, by **Yan Gomes** in the 5th inning and **Edwin Encarnacion** in the 6th inning...was his second time facing the Indians in his last 3 starts and he lasted a career-high 7 IP in both of those starts...marked his fourth career start without a walk, but first time in a start longer than 5 IP...his line: L, 7 IP, 6 H, 2 R/ER, 0 BB, 3 SO, 2 HR, 90 pit, 66 str.

+ Is 0-4 with a 4.70 ERA (38.1-IP, 20-ER) in 8 starts with the Rays, but has received 2 runs or fewer of support in all 8 starts, including 4 starts with no run support...has allowed 2 runs or fewer in five of his 8 starts since the trade.

vs. TEXAS—Has never faced the Rangers.

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + On Tues vs. CLE, was ejected by home plate umpire **Mark Carlson**, his eighth ejection as Rays manager, first since July 18, 2017 at OAK.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
