LEADING OFF: Angels open the final road trip of season to **Oakland** (Sept. 18-20) & Houston (Sept. 21-23)...LAA has won seven of last 10 road games...LAA is 8-7 this month & 25-28 since break...Angels have spent last 82 days in fourth place... Halos are 21-21-7 thru 49 series... Club is 37-38 at home and 37-38 on road.

 $\underline{\textit{UP-RISING}}:$ With his 30^{th} HR Sunday, Justin Upton set the franchise record for HR by a left fielder, breaking **Garret Anderson's** previous mark of 29...**Upton** is the first Halo outfielder (other than **Mike Trout**) with a 30-homer campaign since **Vlad Guerrero** in 2006 (33 HR).

ROAD WORK: Halo starting pitchers logged a 1.92 ERA (56.1 IP – 12 ER) on last road trip (10 G), second lowest mark in club history for a trip of at least 10 games. (STATS LLC).

SHO TIME & WALLY WORLD: Shohei Ohtani reached 20 HRs in 91 non-pitching games, second-fastest LAA rookie to reach 20 HRs (Wally Joyner hit 20 by 82nd game in 1986) & eighth rookie in club history to reach 20 HRs (first since Mike Trout in 2012).

BEING EXTRA: Mike Trout's 503 career extra-base hits rank seventh in MLB for a player by age-26 season (Alex Rodriguez has most - 569).

HEY BABE: Shohei Ohtani and Babe Ruth (1919) are only players in MLB history with 10 pitching appearances and 20 HRs in a season.

HI, MY NAME IS... INF Sherman Johnson will be the 60th player (35 pitchers-16 starters) to appear in 2018 to extend the single-season franchise mark (MLB record for players used is 64 by 2014 Texas Rangers)...15 players have made MLB debuts in 2018 breaking team record of 12 (1996 & 1975)...37 players on Angels' current active

RISING SON: With 20 HRs, Shohei Ohtani passed Kenji Johjima (18 HR w/ Seattle in 144 games in 2006) for most rookie HRs by a Japanese native...Ohtani & Hideki Matsui (5 times) are only Japanese-born players with 20+ HRs in a season...He is the seventh Japanese rookie with 40 extra-base hits, first since Nori Aoki in 2012 (most is 59 XBH by Matsui in 2003).

HALO HARDWARE: On Sept. 14th the Angels announced the 2018 team awards with Mike Trout taking home Team MVP honors (7th straight season, Co-MVP in 2017 with A. Simmons) & Andrew Heaney with the Nick Adenhart Award as top hurler (voted by

TROUT & TY: Trout's 63.5 career WAR is currently ahead of Ty Cobb (63.4) for tops all time by a position player through age-26 season.

FROM THE START: Since August 28^{th} , LAA starting pitchers have a 3.13 ERA (83.1-29 ER), **second-best ERA in A.L in span (18 G)**.

KNOW THIS: Mike Trout is two stolen bases shy of second career 30 HR/25 SB campaign (also, 2012)...Would be only player in franchise history with multiple 30/25 seasons (Bobby Bonds in 1977)...Leads MLB with 115 walks, two shy of his club record (116 BB) set in 2016.

SHO OFF: Over his last 14 games, Ohtani is batting .360 (18/50) with 14 runs, three doubles, a triple, five home runs, three SBs & 12 RBI in span...Ohtani is lone MLB player in 2018 with multiple games of two HRs and a stolen base (ESPN STATS)...He is the first Halo since Tim Salmon in 2000 to win A.L. Player of the Week honors twice in one season...Ohtani is the first player in MLB history with 20+ HR & 50+ pitching Ks in same season.

FISH FACTS: Mike Trout is just second A.L. player with seven seasons of 60+ extra-base hits by age 26 season-or-younger (Alex Rodriguez)...Trout has tied team record reaching base 4+ times on 16 occasions this season to equal mark set by Brian Downing in 1987 (STATS LLC)...Trout and Willie Mays are only players with three seasons of 30 HR/20 SB prior to their age-27 campaign... Vying to be fifth player all-time (first in A.L.) with 120 walks, 30 HRs and 25 stolen bases: Barry Bonds (6 seasons), Jeff Bagwell (2 seasons), Chipper Jones (1999) and Bobby Abreu (2004). $\underline{\textbf{PUJOLS SURGERIES}} : \underline{\textbf{Albert Pujols}} \ underwent \ a \ procedure \ to \ remove$ a bone spur from his right elbow Sept. 12^{th} ...Also had an arthroscopic debridement of his left knee August 30^{th} ...Pujols ranks 23^{rd} all-time with 3,082 hits and sixth all-time with 633 HRs...<u>One of four players</u> with 3,000 hits & 600 HR (Mays, Aaron & ARod).

GOLD STANDARD: Three-time Gold Glover Andrelton Simmons leads MLB shortstops with 219 putouts and has fourth-fewest errors (9) in junior circuit among shortstops (min. 100 GS)...Leads MLB with a 17.9 Ultimate Zone Rating in 2018 (UZR) – FanGraphs...Since 2015, his 97 defensive runs saved (DRS) also lead MLB...Thru 917 career games, Simmons' defensive WAR is 25.3 – best by any shortstop in MLB history...Simmons' 109 double plays lead MLB shortstops and his 4.21 range factor per game leads A.L. shortstops.

DID YOU KNOW? David Fletcher's 78 hits since joining the club on June 13 are second-most among A.L. rookies...Junichi Tazawa is the fifth Japanese native in Angels' history (Shigetoshi Hasegawa, Hideki Matsui, Hisanori Takahashi & Shohei Ohtani).

GLOVE STORY: With 70 errors this season, Angels are on pace to break club record for fewest miscues in a full campaign (80 set last season)...Fewest in a strike-shortened season is 76 in 1994...Club ranks fourth in A.L. with .987 fielding pct...Halos lead MLB turning 162 double plays (team record is 203 in 1985)...Catchers own a 41.1 caught stealing pct. (31 of 74), tops in A.L... Mike Trout is only CF in MLB (min. 70 G) with a 1.000 fielding pct...Kole Calhoun's 27 OF assists since 2016 rank third in A.L.

HEAN MACHINE: Andrew Heaney has set career highs in wins (9), starts (28), strikeouts (165) and innings pitched (170.0)...First Halo to reach 165+ Ks since 2015 (Garrett Richards; 176) and has four 10+ strikeout games this season.

LEADING MEN: Mike Scioscia is in his 19th consecutive season with the Angels...Of the four major sports, only Greg Popovich (entering 23rd season) has more non-interrupted tenure with his current team.

BULLPEN BITS: 3.63 bullpen ERA ranks sixth in A.L...Halo relievers lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 22.1 % to score (54 of 244)...Bullpen has logged 577.0 IP, second in A.L. to TB... Since 2016, Jose Alvarez's 201 games pitched lead A.L. (166.1 IP)... Over last two seasons (2017-18), Alvarez leads A.L. with 137 games pitched - Blake Parker ranks fifth in span (134 games).

THIS N' THAT: Angels' 197 HRs his this season are second-most in team history (236 HRs in 2000)...LAA had a club-record 15 players on D.L. simultaneously twice this season...Halos sent 25 different players to D.L., most in MLB this season...Angels are one of seven teams in A.L. with a positive run differential (+36)...Andrelton Simmons leads MLB in PA per SO at 14.82 (563 PA/38 K) – also leads MLB batting .295 (52/176) with two strikes...Mike Scioscia (1.644 wins) ranks 18^{th} on the all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17^{th} with 1.769).

HOT HALOS: Justin Upton is riding a five-game hit streak batting .389 (7/18; 4 HR, 3B)...As a reliever this season, Taylor Cole owns a 1.27 ERA (28.1 IP – 4 ER) and 28 strikeouts...Since July 7th, has allowed two earned runs in 23 IP (0.78 ERA)...Felix Pena has allowed three-orfewer runs in seven of his last eight outings, a 2.76 ERA (49 IP – 15 ER) in span...Only issued one walk across last 21 innings...Andrelton Simmons has five multi-hit efforts last 10 games and 11 RBI his last 17 contests (batting .319 last 17 G; 22/69)...Jose Fernandez has hits in eight of 10 and 20 of 27 games with LAA this season (hits in 17 of 21 starts)...21 of last 25 outings for **Justin Anderson** are scoreless...**David Fletcher** has hits 24 of last 30 games (10 multi-hit efforts) batting .308 (37/120) with 18 runs, eight doubles, a triple and $\,$ 11 RBI in span...Mike Trout has reached base in 15 of last 17 G & hitting .367 (33/90) with 21 runs, eight HR, 16 RBI & 22 BB his last 27

@ OAKLAND: Angels are 12-7 in last 19 games vs. A's...Halos lead 2018 series 7-6...LAA has won four consecutive season series vs. A's (2014-17)...Justin Upton is hitting .340 vs. A's this season (16/47: 5 2B, 3 HR, 12 RBI)... Cam Bedrosian is 2-0 with two saves & 2.54 ERA (28.1 IP - 8 ER) in 30 career games vs. Athletics.

(1986) Reggie Jackson became the sixth player in club history to hit three home runs in a game in an 18-3 win vs. **Kansas City**...At 40 years, 123 days, Jackson was the second oldest player in ML history to connect for three HR in a contest (**Stan Musial** did it at 41 years, 229 days in 1962); September 19

(1962) Jim Fregosi hit the first insidethe-park home run in franchise history in the Angels' 9-4 win vs. Baltimore; (1973) Frank Robinson sets a new Major League record after logging a homer in the 32nd different ballpark of his career as the Angels down the Rangers 6-2 at Arlington

Reinstated from disabled list prior to tonight's game (left adductor strain)

- WELCOME BACK: Reinstated from third disabled list stint prior to tonight's game (missed 32 games with a left adductor strain)...Also missed nine games (Aug. 1-11) during second DL trip with left adductor strain...During first DL stint, missed nine games (July 1-12) with a right adductor strain (was scratched from scheduled start on June 21 with right hamstring tightness, but made two more starts before being placed on the DL for first time this year).
- Making 22nd start of the season and 12th on the road...ls in sixth Major League season (fourth with Angels)...Made
 Opening Day roster for third time in career (also, 2014 & 2017).
- <u>APPROACHING 400 K's:</u> Is eight strikeouts shy of 400 in his career...Recorded 300th career strikeout earlier this year against **Aaron Hicks** in 4th inning on April 29 vs. New York (A.L.)
- OUTLIERS: Has allowed 17 ER across last two games (6.2 IP)...Had allowed 17 ER in previous 11 starts combined (66 IP).
- OFF THE BOARDS: Has allowed two-or-fewer runs in 15 of 21 starts this season...Had streak of six straight starts
 allowing one-or-fewer earned runs from June 3 July 12, which was tied for second longest in Angels history.
- INSIDE THE PARK: Had streak of 53 innings pitched without allowing a home run snapped in last start on 2nd inning solo HR by Jake Bauers...Steak of eight straight starts without allowing a home run was longest for an Angels lefty since Jim Abbott in 1991...Ranks 13th in the American League with a 0.71 HR/9 innings rate this season (min. 100 IP).
- 100K: Has reached the 100+ strikeout plateau in a single season for first time in career...Skaggs (105 SO) and Andrew Heaney (102) became first pair of Angels teammates with 100+ strikeouts before the All-Star Break since Garrett Richards (127) and C.J. Wilson (107) in 2014.
- LAST TIME OUT: Charged with loss in last start on August 11 vs. A's at Angel Stadium after tossing 3.1 innings and allowing seven earned runs on 10 hits (season-high) with one walk and five strikeouts... Was placed on disabled list the following day.
- STRIKEOUT STREAK: Had streak of 12 straight games with 5+ strikeouts snapped on July 20 by Astros...It was the longest streak by an Angels lefty since Chuck Finley (16 consecutive games) in 1997.
- <u>GETTING FAMILIAR:</u> Since start of 2017, has allowed three home runs the first time through the batting order in a game (333 PA), but has yielded 18 HR in 330 PA the second time through the order in a game in that span.
- SORRY LEFTIES: Is holding lefties to a .235 (27/115) batting average this season, which ranks seventh among A.L. lefties.
- <u>VS. OAKLAND</u>: In eight career starts against the Athletics, is 2-5 with a 5.32 ERA (44 IP 26 ER)...In three starts vs. A's this year, is 2-1 with a 3.78 ERA (16.2 IP 7 ER) and 18 strikeouts...Did not allow a run in 13.1 IP in first two starts against Oakland this year, but allowed seven runs in last start on Aug. 11.
- AT OAKLAND COLISEUM: In five career starts at the Coliseum, is 2-3 with a 3.52 ERA (30.2 IP 12 ER)...Has not allowed a run in last 14.1 innings pitched in Oakland...This season, is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (13.1 IP 0 ER) in his two starts at the ballpark.
- <u>FIRST HALF ROAD TRIPS:</u> Made 10 road starts before the All-Star Break pitching to a 5-2 record and 2.11 ERA (59.2 IP 14 ER)...His road ERA ranked third in the Majors behind **Jacob deGrom** (1.79) and **Justin Verlander** (1.99) in the first half.
- <u>HOT JUNE</u>: In five June starts, went 3-1 with a 0.84 ERA (32 IP 3 ER) and 36 strikeouts...<u>Established the lowest June ERA in Angels history</u> (min. 30 IP)...Three straight starts with a win (June 3-15) was the longest streak of his career...*Is the only Angles pitcher to win at least three consecutive starts this season.*
- NEW CAREER HIGH: Set career high with 114 pitches thrown on April 10 at Texas (previous was 105 pitches for Arizona on Aug. 27, 2012 vs. Cincinnati.
- SEASON DEBUT: Earned the win in first start of year on March 30 at Oakland after working 6.1 scoreless innings, allowing three hits with no walks and five strikeouts...With win this year, is now 5-1 with a 1.60 ERA (39.1 IP 7 ER) in his six career season debuts

- Owns a 21-29 career record with a 4.37 ERA (432.1 IP 210 ER) and 392 strikeouts in 78 career games (all starts).
- Underwent Tommy John surgery on August 13, 2014 by Dr. Neal Elattrache after suffering left forearm strain during start on July 31, 2014 at Baltimore
- Originally drafted by Angels in 1st round (40th overall) of the 2009 amateur draft...Was traded by Angels to D-backs on August 7, 2010 in the deal which brought **Dan Haren** to the Halos...Acquired back by Angels on December 10, 2013 along with LHP **Hector Santiago** in trade which sent OF **Mark Trumbo** and RHP **A.J. Schugel** to Arizona.
