**LEADING OFF: PLEASE NOTE TOMORROW'S GAME AIRS EXCLUSIVELY ON MLB LIVE ON FACEBOOK WATCH.** Tonight the Angels play the second game (1-0) of last road trip to Oakland (Sept. 18-20; 1-0) & Houston (Sept. 21-23)...**LAA has won eight of last 11 road games...**LAA is 9-7 this month & 26-28 since break...Angels have spent last 82 days in fourth place...Halos are 21-21-7 thru 49 series.

**KNOW THIS:** Felix Pena has allowed three-or-fewer runs in seven of his last eight outings, a 2.76 ERA (49 IP – 15 ER) in span (allowed one walk across last 21 innings)...**Mike Trout enters tonight's game with a .629 slugging pct., currently tied for best in team history (set by Trout last season)...Trout's .404 (19/47) clip this month leads MLB...**Angels' 199 HRs hit this season are second-most in team history (236 HRs in 2000)...95 HRs on road are fourth-most in team annals (club record is 106 in 2000)...**Last night's grand slam by Kaleb Cowart was first for Angels this season – leaves SF Giants as lone MLB club without a slam in 2018.**

**UP-RISING:** Justin Upton set the franchise record for HR by a left fielder (30), breaking Garret Anderson's previous mark of 29...**Upton is the first Halo outfielder (other than Mike Trout) with a 30-homer campaign since Vlad Guerrero in 2006 (33 HR).**

**IMMEDIATE DIVIDENDS:** Ty Buttrey, acquired July 30th via Ian Kinsler trade with Boston, has opened his MLB career posting a 0.59 ERA (15. 1 IP – 1 ER) with four saves (4 BB/19 K) in 14 appearances...**Has joined Minnie Rojas (1966) as only Angels with four saves through first 14 MLB games.**

**FROM THE START:** Since August 28<sup>th</sup>, LAA starting pitchers have a 3.02 ERA (86.1 – 29 ER), **second-best ERA in A.L. in span (19 G)**...**Halo starters have a 1.82 ERA (59.1 IP – 12 ER) across last 11 road affairs.**

**BEING EXTRA:** Mike Trout's 504 career extra-base hits rank sixth in MLB for a player by age-26 season (Alex Rodriguez has most - 569).

**HEY BABE:** Shohei Ohtani and Babe Ruth (1919) are only players in MLB history with 10 pitching appearances and 20 HRs in a season.

**HI, MY NAME IS...** INF Sherman Johnson will be the 60th player (35 pitchers-16 starters) to appear in 2018 to extend the single-season franchise mark (MLB record for players used is 64 by 2014 Texas Rangers)...**15 players have made MLB debuts in 2018 breaking team record of 12 (1996 & 1975)...37 players on LAA's active roster.**

**RISING SON:** With 20 HRs, Shohei Ohtani passed Kenji Johjima (18 HR w/ Seattle in 144 games in 2006) for most rookie HRs by a Japanese native...**Ohtani & Hideki Matsui (5 times) are only Japanese players with 20+ HRs in a season...**Seventh Japanese rookie with 40 extra-base hits (most is 59 XBH by Matsui in 2003).

**HALO HARDWARE:** Angels' 2018 team awards go to Mike Trout taking home Team MVP honors (7<sup>th</sup> straight season, Co-MVP in 2017 with A. Simmons) & Andrew Heaney for the Nick Adenhart Award as team's top hurler (each award voted on by teammates).

**TROUT & TY:** Trout's 63.7 career WAR is currently ahead of Ty Cobb (63.4) for tops all time by a position player through age-26 season.

**CLOSING IN:** Trout is two stolen bases shy of second career 30 HR/25 SB campaign (also, 2012)...Would be only player in franchise history with multiple 30/25 seasons (Bobby Bonds in 1977)...**Leads MLB with 115 walks, one shy of his club record (116 BB) set in 2016.**

**SHO OFF:** Over his last 17 games, Shohei Ohtani is batting .362 (21/58) with 17 runs, four doubles, a triple, six home runs, 10 BB, 15 RBI and three SBs in span...**Has raised average from .276 to .291 in span...**Reached 20 HRs in 91 non-pitching games, second-fastest LAA rookie to reach 20 HRs (Wally Joyner hit 20 by 82<sup>nd</sup> game in 1986) & eighth rookie in club history to reach 20 HRs (first since Mike Trout in 2012)...**Ohtani is lone MLB player in 2018 with multiple games of two HRs and a stolen base (ESPN STATS)...First Halo since T. Salmon in 2000 to win A.L. Player of Week honors twice in a season...**First player in MLB history with 20+ HR & 50+ pitching Ks in same season.

**FISH FACTS:** Mike Trout has now posted 35+ HRs three times passing Troy Glaus (twice) for most in team annals...Trout is just second A.L. player with seven seasons of 60+ extra-base hits by age 26 season-or-younger (Alex Rodriguez)...**Has tied team record reaching base 4+ times on 16 occasions this season to equal mark set by Brian Downing in 1987 (STATS LLC)...Trout and Willie Mays are only players with three seasons of 30 HR/20 SB prior to their age-27 campaign...**Vying to be fifth player all-time (first in A.L.) with 120 walks, 30 HRs and 25 stolen bases: Barry Bonds (6 seasons), Jeff Bagwell (2 seasons), Chipper Jones (1999) and Bobby Abreu (2004).

**PUIJOLS SURGERIES:** Albert Pujols underwent a procedure to remove a bone spur from his right elbow Sept. 12<sup>th</sup>...Also had an arthroscopic debridement of his left knee August 30<sup>th</sup>...Pujols ranks 23<sup>rd</sup> all-time with 3,082 hits and sixth all-time with 633 HRs...**One of four players with 3,000 hits & 600 HR (Mays, Aaron & ARod).**

**GOLD STANDARD:** Three-time Gold Glover Andrelton Simmons leads MLB shortstops with 220 putouts and has fourth-fewest errors (9) in junior circuit among shortstops (min. 100 GS)...**Leads MLB with a 17.9 Ultimate Zone Rating in 2018 (UZR) – FanGraphs...**Since 2015, his 97 defensive runs saved (DRS) also lead MLB...**Thru 918 career games, Simmons' defensive WAR is 25.3 – best by any shortstop in MLB history...**Simmons' 110 double plays lead MLB shortstops and his 4.34 range factor per game leads A.L. shortstops.

**GLOVE STORY:** With 70 errors this season, Angels are on pace to break club record for fewest miscues in a full campaign (80 set last season)...Fewest in a strike-shortened season is 76 in 1994...**Club ranks fourth in A.L. with .987 fielding pct. Halos lead MLB turning 163 double plays (team record is 203 in 1985)**...Catchers own a 40.5 caught stealing pct. (30 of 74), tops in A.L...**Mike Trout is only CF in MLB (min. 100 G) with a 1.000 fielding pct. Kole Calhoun's 27 OF assists since 2016 rank third in A.L.**

**HEAN MACHINE:** Andrew Heaney has set career highs in wins (9), starts (28), strikeouts (165) and innings pitched (170.0)...**First Halo to reach 165+ Ks since 2015 (Garrett Richards; 176) and has four 10+ strikeout games this season.**

**LEADING MEN:** Mike Scioscia is in his 19<sup>th</sup> consecutive season with the Angels...Of the four major sports, only Greg Popovich (entering his 23<sup>rd</sup> season) has more uninterrupted tenure with current team.

**BULLPEN BITS:** 3.70 bullpen ERA ranks sixth in A.L...**Halo relievers lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 22.6 % to score (56 of 248)**...Bullpen has logged 583.0 IP, second in A.L. to TB...**Since 2016, Jose Alvarez's 201 games pitched rank second in A.L. (166.1 IP)**...Over last two seasons (2017-18), Alvarez is tied for A.L. leads with 137 games pitched (B. Parker ranks fifth in span; 136 G).

**THIS N' THAT:** LAA had a club-record 15 players on D.L. simultaneously twice this season...**Halos sent 25 different players to D.L., most in MLB this season...**Angels are one of seven teams in A.L. with a positive run differential (+38)...**Andrelton Simmons leads MLB in PA per SO at 14.92 (567 PA/38 K) – also ranks second in MLB batting .295 (52/176) with two strikes...Mike Scioscia (1,645 wins) ranks 18<sup>th</sup> on all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17<sup>th</sup>; 1,769).**

**HOT HALOS:** Justin Upton is riding a six-game hit streak batting .364 (8/22; 4 HR, 3B)...**As a reliever this season, Taylor Cole owns a 1.27 ERA (28.1 IP – 4 ER) and 28 strikeouts...**Since July 7<sup>th</sup>, has allowed two earned runs in 23 IP (0.78 ERA)...**Andrelton Simmons has six multi-hit efforts last 11 games and 13 RBI his last 18 contests (batting .342 last 18 G; 25/73)...Mike Trout has reached base in 16 of last 18 G & hitting .367 (35/95) with 22 runs, nine HR, 17 RBI & 22 BB his last 28 games.**

**@ OAKLAND:** Angels are 13-7 in last 20 games vs. A's...**Halos lead 2018 series 8-6...**LAA has won four consecutive season series vs. A's (2014-17)...**Justin Upton is hitting .333 vs. A's this season (17/51; 5 2B, 3 HR, 12 RBI)...Mike Trout has a .424 (14/33) clip at the Coliseum this seasons with three doubles, two home runs and six RBI.**

**HOUSTON ON DECK:** Astros lead 2018 season series 9-6 (LAA is 4-2 at Minute Maid Park; 2-7 at Big A)...**Three matchups remain (all in Houston)...Halos have dropped nine of last 13 overall meetings...**Since 2016, LAA is 8-19 at the Big A against Astros...**Houston leads all-time series 64-52...In 15 games against Astros this season, Simmons has hit .316 (18/57) with a double, triple, 3 HR and 14 RBI.**

**THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY**

**September 19**

(1962) Jim Fregosi hit the first inside-the-park home run in franchise history in the Angels' 9-4 win vs. Baltimore; (1973) Frank Robinson sets a new Major League record after logging a homer in the 32<sup>nd</sup> different ballpark of his career as the Angels down the Rangers 6-2 at Arlington Stadium.

**September 20**

(2005) Bartolo Colon allows one unearned run over seven innings in a 2-1 win over Texas at Angel Stadium for his 20<sup>th</sup> victory of the season. He becomes the first Angel to notch 20 wins since Nolan Ryan in 1974.

**TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP FELIX PEÑA**

**3-4, 3.75 ERA**

*Pitching to a 2.08 ERA (26 IP – 6 ER) across last four starts*

- **IN THE ROTATION:** Making 18<sup>th</sup> appearance (16<sup>th</sup> start) of the season for Angels; Eighth start on the road in 2018...First 38 big league outings came in relief before making first start on June 19 vs. Arizona...Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake on June 15 for third stint of season with Angels.
- **NO PLACE LIKE...THE ROAD:** In his seven road starts this season, is 2-1 with a 2.21 ERA (40.2 IP – 10 ER); has pitched to a 5.27 ERA (41 IP – 24 ER) at Angel Stadium this year.
- **GOING DEEPER:** Set or equaled his career high in innings pitched in seven straight starts from Aug. 4 – Sept. 7...Has pitched at least six innings in each of last six starts, after never having reached six IP prior to that span.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Earned win in last start on Wednesday vs. Texas after tossing six scoreless innings and allowing six hits and one walk with three strikeouts.
- **12 K's:** Set career high in strikeouts with 12 on Aug. 21 at Arizona across six innings pitched...Marked fifth time in Angels history a pitcher recorded 12+ strikeouts in six-or-fewer innings, joining **Nolan Ryan, Kelvim Escobar, John Lackey and Zack Greinke**.
- **AS A STARTER:** In 15 games as a starter this season, is 3-4 with a 3.53 ERA (79 IP – 31 ER)...In first seven starts after joining Angels rotation, pitched to a 2.73 ERA (29.2 IP – 9 ER) and allowed three-or-fewer runs in all six outings, before yielding seven runs in the 1<sup>st</sup> inning of start on July 29 vs. Seattle...In last eight games, is 2-2 with a 2.76 ERA (49 IP – 15 ER).
- **RUN SUPPORT:** Angels scored seven runs of support in his last start on Wednesday vs. Texas, after scoring just 18 total runs of support (while he is in the game) across his previous 11 starts...Is averaging 2.53 runs of support per start this season.
- **VS. OAKLAND:** In two career games (one start) against the A's, is 0-0 with a 5.40 ERA (6.2 IP – 4 ER) and four strikeouts...Made Angels debut with relief appearance against A's on April 8 and allowed solo HR to **Matt Joyce** in his only inning of work...Did not factor in decision in start on Aug. 10 at Angel Stadium (5.2 IP, 5 H, 3 ER, 0 BB, 4 SO).
- **AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** Tonight marks first career appearance at the Coliseum.
- **NO-HIT BID:** Carried no hitter into 6<sup>th</sup> inning of start on Aug. 4 at Cleveland but was charged with loss after tossing 5.1 innings and allowing two earned runs on three hits with three walks and one strikeout; no-hit bid broken up on solo HR by **Leonys Martin** leading off 6<sup>th</sup>.
- **WIN ANNIVERSARY:** Earned first win as a starter on June 29 at Baltimore after working 5.1 scoreless innings...His only other Major League win came exactly one year earlier on June 29, 2017 in relief for Cubs at Washington.
- **FIRST HALF RECAP:** Finished the first with a 1-0 record and 3.42 ERA (26.1 IP – 10 ER) in seven games (five starts) for Angels.
- **WITH THE BEES:** In 10 games (nine starts) this season with Triple-A Salt Lake, is 1-2 with a 3.51 ERA (33.1 IP – 13 ER)...Recorded 38 strikeouts with 16 walks...Did not allow a run in last 10.2 innings pitched for Salt Lake before being called up by Angels on June 15...The first batter he has faced of each inning with Salt Lake batted .091 (3/33).
- **PREVIOUS HALOS STINTS:** Made Angels debut on April 8 vs. A's (1 IP, 2 H, 1 ER)...Made one appearance for LAA during second stint with team on May 17 vs. Tampa Bay (1.2 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, 2 SO).
- **DOMINICAN NATIVE:** Is a native of San Pedro de Macoris, Dominican Republic...Is one of five Dominican pitcher to start a game for the Angels and the first since **Ervin Santana** in 2012; the other three are **Bartolo Colon, Ramon Ortiz** and **Hector Carrasco**.
- **MAJOR LEAGUE EXPERIENCE:** Pitched parts of last two seasons with Cubs, appearing in 36 total games and going 1-0 with a 4.98 ERA (43.1 IP – 24 ER) and 52 strikeouts...Made Major League debut on Aug. 19, 2016 vs. Colorado.
- **MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS:** Was honored as a minor league All-Star in 2013 (Southern League), 2014 (Florida State League) and 2015 (Midwest League).
- **CAREER NOTES:** Originally signed by Cubs as an international free agent...Acquired by Angels from Cubs for cash considerations or a player to be named later on Oct. 9, 2017.
