LEADING OFF: Today the Angels play the third game (1-1) of their final road trip to Oakland (Sept. 18-20; 1-1) & Houston (Sept. 21-23)...Halos are 9-8 in 'rubber' games this season...Angels were shutout for 10th time of 2018 last night...**LAA has won eight of last** 12 road games...LAA is 9-8 this month & 26-29 since break...Angels have spent last 83 days in 4th place ... Club is 21-21-7 thru 49 series.

KNOW THIS: Mike Trout's .380 (19/50) clip this month leads MLB (min. 35 AB) ... Angels' 199 HRs hit this season are second-most in team history (236 HRs in 2000)...95 HRs on road are fourth-most in team annals (club record is 106 in 2000)...<u>Tuesday's grand slam by</u> Kaleb Cowart was first for Angels this season - leaves SF Giants as lone MLB club without a slam in 2018.

IMMEDIATE DIVIDENDS: Ty Buttrey, acquired July 30th via Ian Kinsler trade with Boston, has opened his MLB career posting a 0.59 ERA (15. 1 IP – 1 ER) with four saves (4 BB/19 K) in 14 appearances... Has joined Minnie Rojas (1966) as only Angels with four saves through first 14 MLB games.

UP-RISING: Justin Upton set the franchise record for HR by a left fielder (30), breaking Garret Anderson's previous mark of 29...Upton is the first Halo outfielder (other than Mike Trout) with a 30-homer campaign since Vlad Guerrero in 2006 (33 HR).

BEING EXTRA: Mike Trout's 504 career extra-base hits rank sixth in MLB for a player by age-26 season (Alex Rodriguez has most - 569).

HEY BABE: Shohei Ohtani and Babe Ruth (1919) are only players in MLB history with 10 pitching appearances and 20 HRs in a season.

HI, MY NAME IS... Last night, INF Sherman Johnson became the 60th player (35 pitchers-16 starters) to appear in 2018 to extend the single-season franchise mark (MLB record for players used is 64 by 2014 Texas Rangers)...16 players have made MLB debuts in 2018 breaking team record of 12 (1996 & 1975)...37 players on LAA's active roster.

RISING SON: With 20 HRs, Shohei Ohtani passed Kenji Johjima (18 HR w/ Seattle in 144 games in 2006) for most rookie HRs by a Japanese native...Ohtani & Hideki Matsui (5 times) are only Japanese players with 20+ HRs in a season...Seventh Japanese rookie with 40 extra-base hits (most is 59 XBH by **Matsui** in 2003).

HALO HARDWARE: Angels' 2018 team awards went to Mike Trout for Team MVP honors (7th straight season, Co-MVP in 2017 with A. Simmons) & Andrew Heaney for the Nick Adenhart Award as team's top hurler (each award voted on by teammates).

TROUT & TY: Trout's 63.8 career WAR is currently ahead of Ty Cobb (63.4) for tops all time by a position player through age-26 season.

CLOSING IN: Trout is one stolen base shy of second career 30 HR/25 SB campaign (also, 2012)...Would be only player in franchise history with multiple 30/25 seasons (Bobby Bonds in 1977)...Leads MLB with 115 walks, one shy of matching his club record set in 2016.

SHO OFF: Over his last 18 games, Shohei Ohtani is batting .361 (22/61) with 17 runs, four doubles, a triple, six home runs, 10 BB, 15 RBI and three SBs in span...Has raised average from .276 to .292 in span...Reached 20 HRs in 91 non-pitching games, second-fastest LAA rookie to reach 20 HRs (Wally Joyner hit 20 by 82nd game in 1986) & eighth rookie in club history to reach 20 HRs (first since Mike Trout in 2012)...Ohtani is lone MLB player in 2018 with multiple games of two HRs and a stolen base (ESPN STATS)...First Halo since T. Salmon in 2000 to win A.L. Player of Week honors twice in a season...First player in MLB history with 20+ HR & 50+ pitching Ks in same season.

HEAN MACHINE: Andrew Heaney has set career highs in wins (9), starts (28), strikeouts (165) and innings pitched (170.0)...First Halo to reach 165+ Ks since 2015 (Garrett Richards; 176) and has four 10+ strikeout games this season.

FISH FACTS: Mike Trout has now posted 35+ HRs three times passing Troy Glaus (twice) for most in team annals...He is just second A.L. with seven seasons of 60+ extra-base hits by age 26 season or-younger (Alex Rodriguez)...Has tied team record reaching base 4+ times on 16 occasions this season to equal mark set by Brian Downing in 1987 (STATS LLC)...Trout & Willie Mays are only players with three seasons of 30 HR/20 SB prior to their age-27 campaign...Vying to be fifth player all-time (first in A.L.) with 120 walks, 30 HRs and 25 stolen bases: Barry Bonds (6 seasons), Jeff Bagwell (2 seasons), Chipper Jones (1999) and Bobby Abreu (2004).

PUJOLS SURGERIES: Albert Pujols underwent a procedure to remove <u>a bone spur from his right elbow Sept. 12th</u>...Also had an arthroscopic debridement of his left knee August 30^{th} ...**Pujols** ranks 23^{rd} all-time with 3,082 hits and sixth all-time with 633 HRs...<u>One of four players</u> with 3,000 hits & 600 HR (Mays, Aaron & ARod).

GOLD STANDARD: Three-time Gold Glover Andrelton Simmons leads MLB shortstops with 220 putouts and has fourth-fewest errors (9) in junior circuit among shortstops (min. 100 GS)...Leads MLB with a 17.9 Ultimate Zone Rating in 2018 (UZR) - FanGraphs...Since 2015, his 97 defensive runs saved (DRS) also lead MLB... Thru 919 career games, Simmons' defensive WAR is 23.1 – best by any shortstop in MLB history ... Simmons' 110 double plays lead MLB shortstops and his 4.18 range factor per game ranks second among A.L. shortstops.

GLOVE STORY: With 71 errors this season, Angels are on pace to break club record for fewest miscues in a full campaign (80 set last season)...Fewest in a strike-shortened season is 76 in 1994...Club ranks fourth in A.L. with .987 fielding pct...<u>Halos lead MLB turning</u> 163 double plays (team record is 203 in 1985)...Catchers own a 40.0 caught stealing pct. (30 of 75), tops in A.L...**Mike Trout** is only CF in MLB (min. 100 G) with a 1.000 fielding pct...<u>Kole Calhoun's 27 OF</u> assists since 2016 rank third in A.L.

LEADING MEN: Mike Scioscia is in his 19th consecutive season with the Angels...Of the four major sports, only Greg Popovich (entering his 23rd season) has more uninterrupted tenure with current team.

BULLPEN BITS: 3.73 bullpen ERA ranks sixth in A.L...Halo relie lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 22.6 % to score (56 of 248)...Bullpen has logged 587.0 IP, second in A.L. to TB... Since 2016, Jose Alvarez's 201 games pitched rank second in A.L. (166.1 IP)...Over last two seasons (2017-18), Alvarez is tied for A.L. eads with 137 games pitched (**B. Parker** ranks fifth in span; 136 G).

THIS N' THAT: LAA had a club-record 15 players on D.L. simultaneously twice this season...Halos sent 25 different players to D.L., most in MLB this season...Angels are one of seven teams in A.L. with a positive run differential (+28)...Andrelton Simmons leads MLB in PA per SO at 15.00 (570 PA/38 K) – also ranks second in MLB batting .292 (52/178) with two strikes...Mike Scioscia (1.645 wins) ranks 18th on all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17th; 1,769).

HOT HALOS: Justin Upton has four HRs and a triples his last seven games...<u>As a reliever this season</u>, **Taylor Cole** owns a 1.27 ERA (28.1 IP – 4 ER) and 28 strikeouts...Since July 7th, has allowed two earned runs in 23 IP (0.78 ERA)...Andrelton Simmons has six multi-hit efforts last 12 games and 13 RBI his last 19 contests (batting .329 last 19 G; 25/76)...Mike Trout is hitting .357 (35/98) with 22 runs, nine HR, 17 RBI & 22 BB his last 29 games

@ OAKLAND: Angels are 13-8 in last 21 games vs. A's...Halos lead 2018 series 8-7...LAA has won four consecutive season series vs. A's (2014-17)...Justin Upton is hitting .315 vs. A's this season (17/54; 5 2B, 3 HR, 12 RBI)... Mike Trout has a .389 (14/36) clip at the Coliseum this season (three doubles, two home runs and six RBI).

HOUSTON ON DECK: Astros lead 2018 season series 9-6 (LAA is 4-2 at Minute Maid Park; 2-7 at Big A)...Three matchups remain (all in Houston)...Halos have dropped nine of last 13 overall meetings Since 2016, LAA is 8-19 at the Big A against Astros...Houston leads all-time series 64-52...In 15 games against Astros this season, Simmons has hit .316 (18/57) with a double, triple, 3 HR and 14 RBI.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP MATT SHOEMAKER 2-1, 3.98 ERA

In last seven starts vs. A's, is 5-0 with a 2.38 ERA (41.2 IP – 11 ER)

- <u>WELCOME BACK SHOE</u>: Making fifth start of the season and fourth on the road...Fourth start since being reinstated from disabled list on September 3 at Texas.
- HOME SWEET HOME: In last 17 home starts, is 9-3 with a 2.91 ERA (108.1 IP 35 ER) with 119 strikeouts...In that span (since May 21, 2016), ranks fifth in A.L. in home ERA (min. 15 GS) behind Corey Kluber (2.19), Blake Snell (2.40), Justin Verlander (2.72) and Ryne Stanek (2.76).
- <u>COUNTING SHEEP:</u> Missed 134 games on disabled list this year after exiting season debut on March 31 at OAK with a right forearm strain.
- <u>100 GAME MILESTONE</u>: Today marks 99th career game (91st start)...Next start will mark 100th of career...Is one of nine players in Angels history to reach 40 wins within first 100 career games.
- MORE INJURY WOES: Last season, exited start vs. Yankees on June 14, 2017 with a right forearm strain and missed remainder of year on DL...In 2016, missed final month of the season after being struck on right side of head by a line drive off bat of Seattle's **Kyle Seager** on Sept. 4 at Safeco Field.
- LAST TIME OUT: Charged with loss in last start on Friday vs. Seattle after allowing three earned runs in 4.2 innings pitched.
- <u>WIN STREAK SNAPPED</u>: Angels had won each of his last six starts before dropping last start on Friday vs.
 SEA...The streak was tied for second longest in his career (longest is 10 games from Aug. 9, 2014 April 13, 2015).
- <u>SEASON DEBUT</u>: Did not factor in decision in season debut on March 31 at Oakland...Carried a shutout into the sixth inning before yielding three runs in the 6th frame...Was placed on DL following the start.
- <u>REHAB START:</u> Made one rehab appearance with Adv.-A Inland Empire on Wednesday vs. Lake Elsinore and pitched 4+ no-hit innings, allowing one run (unearned) with two walks and six strikeouts.
- <u>GOOD NIGHT SHOE:</u> Has a career record of 35-20 with a 3.71 ERA (426.2 IP 176 ER) in night games, compared with a 5-11 record and 4.51 ERA (107.2 IP 54 ER) in day games...Last season, was 6-0 with a 3.56 ERA (55.2 IP 22 ER) in night games, compared with a 0-3 record and 6.95 ERA (22 IP 17 ER) in day games.
- <u>TALE OF TWO HALVES:</u> Owns a 4.57 career ERA (335 IP 170 ER) in the first half of the season, compared with a 2.71 ERA (199.1 IP 60 ER) after the All-Star Break...Did not pitch after the Break last season
- <u>VS. OAKLAND:</u> In 13 career games (12 starts) against the A's, is 6-2 with a 3.61 ERA (67.1 IP 27 ER)...Earned win in season debut vs. A's on March 31 after tossing 5.2 innings and allowing three earned runs; carried shutout into sixth inning before allowing three runs in the frame...In last seven starts vs. Oakland, is 5-0 with a 2.38 ERA (41.2 IP 11 ER) and 35 strikeouts.
- <u>AT OAKLAND COLISEUM</u>: In seven career starts at the Coliseum, is 3-0 with a 3.43 ERA (39.1 IP 15 ER)...Was winning pitcher in first start of year at the ballpark on March 31...Has allowed just seven earned runs in his last 29.2 innings pitched at the ballpark (2.12 ERA in that span dating back to Sept. 1, 2015).
- 2017 RECAP: In 14 starts for the Angels last season, went 6-3 with a 4.52 ERA (77.2 IP 39 ER)...Led Angels pitching staff with 69 strikeouts at the time of season ending injury (June 14)...In last seven starts, was 5-1 with a 3.86 ERA (39.2 IP 17 ER), before suffering the right forearm strain in final start against the Yankees...Yielded 15 home runs last year across his 14 starts...24 of 41 runs allowed scored via HR.
- <u>CAREER NOTES</u>: Owns a 40-31 record and 3.87 ERA (534.1 IP 230 ER) with 476 strikeouts in 98 games (90 starts) across parts of six seasons for Angels...Has made Angels Opening Day roster each of last five years.
