Guillermo Heredia base safely in 9 of his last 15 plate appearances...in his last 4 games (9/17-c), Heredia is 6-for-12 (.500) with 3 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run, 3 RBI and 3 walks.

Mitch Haniger has reached base safely (via hit or BB) in 30 of his last 32 games, dating back to Aug. 18.

Edwin Díaz has made 39 appearances at Safeco Field this season...only 4 pitchers in club history have made at least 40 appearances at home in a single season: David Aardsma (42, 2009), J.J. Putz (42, 2007; and 41, 2006) and Sean Green (40, 2008).

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their final homestand of the season with the second of 3 games vs. the Oakland Athletics (0-1)...on this homestand, will also host the Texas Rangers for 4 games beginning Thursday...went 6-4 on the final road trip of the season, going 3-1 at Los Angeles-AL, 2-1 at Houston and 1-2 at Texas...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN** Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners have lost 2 straight, but have won 6 of their last 11 and 7 of their last 14... are 20-21 in their last 41 games since Aug. 9...are 30-40 in their last 70 games since July 4 after winning a season-high 8 straight games, spanning June 25 - July 3...the Mariners are 45-47 in their last 92 games since June 10...Seattle is 71-60 in its last 131 games (4/28-c) and 76-63 over its last 139 games (4/20-c)... Seattle is 24-27 during the day and 61-44 at night...Seattle is 41-34 at Safeco Field, 44-37 on the road

- Strikeouts the Mariners pitching staff has recorded 1,266 strikeouts this season, 5th-most in franchise history...has only recorded more strikeouts in 2016 (1,318), 2014 (1,317), 2013 (1,297) and 2015 (1,283). **Daily Double** - **Mitch Haniger** has 20 doubles since the All-Star Break, T5th-most in the Majors (also: Alex
- Bregman-HOU, Randal Grichuk-TOR), behind Matt Chapman-OAK (25), Justin Turner-LAD (23), Mookie Betts-BOS (21) and Joey Wendle-TB (21)...Haniger is the 12th Mariners player in club history (done 16x) with at least 20 doubles after the All-Star Break and the first since Jose Lopez in 2009 (24).
- Exist to Assist Mitch Haniger has 12 outfield assists this season, tied with Andrew Benintendi-BOS and Billy Hamilton-CIN for the Major League lead...each of Haniger's 12 outfield assists came as a right fielder, s by any right fielder in the Majors...Haniger's 12 outfield assists are the most by a Mariners player since Ichiro Suzuki also had 12 outfield assists in 2004.
- Four Score the Mariners are 62-19 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 23-52 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- Get Through 8 the Mariners are 1 of 2 Major League clubs with a 1.000 winning percentage (74-0) when leading after 8 innings this season, joining Oakland (77-0).

 Division Rivals the Mariners are in the midst of playing their final 17 games (6-5) vs. AL West foes...Seattle is 37-32 (.536) vs. the AL West this season (9-8 vs. OAK, 10-9 vs. HOU, 11-8 vs. LAA and 7-8 vs. TEX).

- apiece (Mike Leake-30, Marco Gonzales-28, Félix Hernández-27, James Paxton-27 & Wade LeB-lanc-26)...four clubs (Cleveland, Colorado, Houston & Philadelphia) have 4 pitchers with 25+ starts each.
- At Home Mike Leake is 1-1 with a 2.88 ERA (8 ER, 25.0 IP) over his last 4 home starts, July 25-current... during this stretch he has recorded 4 consecutive quality starts.

THE CANÓ SHOW...Robinson Canó has an active 6 game hitting streak (9/18-c), including 5 multi-hit contests, batting .609 (14x23) with 4 runs, 5 doubles, 2 home runs and 8 RBI in that span...since Sept. 4, Canó is batting .388 (26x67) with 10 runs, 7 doubles, 4 home runs, 17 RBI, 1 HBP, 6 walks, a .446 on-base percentage and a .672 slugging percentage (1.118 OPS) in 18 games...he has 8 extra-base hits (6 2B, 2 HR) in his last 9 games (9/15-c).

COMING IN HOT...Mitch Haniger has hit safely in 42 of his last 49 games, dating back to July 31...during that span, he's batting .330 (67x203) with 35 runs, 20 doubles, 2 triples, 8 home runs, 23 RBI, 2 HBP, 17 walks, a .384 on-base percentage and a .567 slugging percentage (.950 OPS)... Haniger ranks 2nd the Major Leagues in hits since July 31, while also ranking 3rd in doubles, 5th in extra-base hits, 9th in batting, 12th in OPS and T13th in runs...Mitch has hit safely in 11 of his last 12 games (9/11-c), batting .388 (19x49) with 12 runs scored, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs, 6 RBI and 4 walks.

90/90...Mitch Haniger has scored 87 runs and recorded 91 RBI this season...with 3 more runs scored, Haniger would become only the 13th player (done previously 28x) in club history to score at least 90 runs and record at least 90 RBI in a single season...he would join Bret Boone (2x, 2001 & 2003), Jay Buhner (3x, 1993, 1996 1997), Mike Cameron (2001), **Robinson Canó** (2016), **Nelson Cruz** (3x, 2015, 2016, 2017), Ken Griffey Jr. (6x, 1993, 1994, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999), Raúl Ibañez (2006) Edgar Martinez (4x, 1995, 1996, 1997 & 2000), Tino Martinez (1995), John Olerud (2001), Álex Rodríguez (4x, 1996, 1998, 1999, 2000) and Richie Sexson (2005).

DEE-LIGHTFUL...over the last 2 seasons, Dee Gordon has hit safely in 14 of his last 16 games vs. the Athletics, batting .397 (27x68) with 11 runs scored, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs, 11 RBI, 1 walk and 8 stolen bases...during this stretch his .397 average is the highest in the Majors (min. 50 PA), ranking ahead of C.J. Cron-TB (.388/26x67) and teammate Jean Segura (.375/42x112).

BULLPEN BULLIES ... dating back to Sept. 5, the Mariners bullpen is 5-4 with 4 saves and a 2.32 ERA (17 ER, 66.0 IP) in 17 games...as a team they have limited opponents to a .208 (49x236) opponents average, while walking 15 and striking out 61...during this stretch, the Mariners bullpen leads the American League in ERA (2.32), WHIP (0.97) and strikeout to walk ratio (4.07), while also ranking T1st in fewest walks allowed (15), 2nd in opponents batting average (.208), opponents on-base percentage (.265) and BABIP (.233)... Alex Colomé (7.0 IP), Matt Festa (6.0 IP), Zach Duke (4.1 IP) and Justin Grimm (3.0 IP) each have active scoreless innings streaks of at least 3.0 innings.

SAVE ME...Edwin Díaz has recorded 56 of 58 (96.6%) of Seattle's team saves this season...his 96.6% of team saves is currently the highest mark ever by a closer since saves became an official stat in 1969 (min. 50 team saves in season)...he ranks ahead of John Smoltz-ATL in 2002 (96.5%, 55 of 57), Fernando Rodney-TB in 2012 (96.0%, 48 of 50), Rod Beck-SF in 1993 (96.0%, 48 of 50) and Eric Gagne-LAD in 2003 (94.8%, 55 of 58).

THE EDWIN DÍAZ REPORT...in 71 games this season, Edwin Díaz is 56-for-60 (93.3%) in save opportunities with a 2.02 ERA (16 ER, 71.1 IP) with 120 strikeouts and 16 walks...he has limited opposing batters to a .161 (40x249) average against with a 0.79 WHIP (16 BB, 40 H, 71.1 IP)...here are some notes on Díaz's standout season:

- Leads the Major Leagues with 56 saves...Craig Kimbrel-BOS is 2nd with 42.
 Is the 14th pitcher (done 17x) in Major League history to record at least 50 saves in a season.
 Ranks 2nd among Major League relievers with 120 strikeouts...Josh Hader-MIL is 1st with 138.
 Is 27-for-30 (90.0%) in one-run save opportunities with a 0.89 ERA (3 ER, 30.1 IP) with 55 strikeouts and 5 walks...the Mariners are 30-0 this season when he enters with a one-run lead.

AS YOU KNOW...Nelson Cruz has hit at least 35 home runs and recorded at least 90 runs for the 5th consecutive season (2014-current)...<u>BUT DID YOU KNOW?</u>...dating back to 1920, Cruz's 5 straight seasons with at least 35 home runs and 90 RBI is currently the 8th-longest in MLB history?...Cruz trails only Álex Rodríguez, SEA-TEX-NYY (11, 1998-2008), Rafael Palmeiro, BAL-TEX (9, 1995-2003), Sammy Sosa, CHI (9, 1995-2003), Jimmie Foxx, PHI-BOS (9, 1932-1940), Adam Dunn, CIN-ARI-WAS (7, 2004-10), Babe Ruth, NYY (7, 1926-1932) and Willie Mays, SF (6, 1961-1966).

ABOUT LEAKE.

- 30-year-old right-hander is making his 31st start of the season, 36th Mariners start, 267th career appearance (264th career start) and 8th career start against the A's tonight.
- A native of San Diego, CA, graduated from Fallbrook (CA) High School.
- Played in 3 seasons (2007-09) at Arizona State University...went 16-1 with a 1.71 ERA (27 ER, 142.0 IP) with 162 strikeouts and 24 walks in 19 games (18 starts) in his junior season (2009), earning Baseball America First-Team All-American, Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year and First-Team All-Pac-12.
- Selected by Oakland in 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft...did not sign.
- Selected and signed by Cincinnati out of the 1st round (8th over-all pick) in the 2009 MLB Draft.
- Is 13-15 with a 4.20 ERA (99 ER, 212.1 IP) in 36 career GS in Sept.

LAST OUTING...took the loss and the Astros shut out the Marners on Sept. 18...allowed 5 runs on 6 hits and struck out 3 batters over 6.1 innings...4 runs scored in the 3rd inning as the first 3 batters reached; with 2 outs, a hit by Marwin Gonzalez that was originally ruled a double was overturned on replay to be a 2-run home run.

7TH HEAVEN...has made 30 starts this season, marking his 7th consecutive season of 30+ starts...he enters tonight's start with 34 walks... Leake is on pace to become the 2nd pitcher in the live ball era with at least 7 straight seasons of 30+ starts and 50-or-fewer walks...Greg Maddux had 13 consecutive seasons with 30+ starts and 50-or-fewer walks from 1996-2008... Roy Halladay (2006-11) and Fritz Peterson (1969-74) each had 6 such consecutive seasons

DURABLE...with 7 consecutive seasons with 30+ starts, is 1 of 3 pitchers to have made at least 30 starts in every season from 2012-18, joining Max Scherzer and Jon Lester...is 1 of 17 active pitchers to record at least 7 seasons with 30-or-more starts.

INNINGS EATER...since 2013, 6 pitchers have tossed at least 185.0 innings in 5-or-more seasons: Max Scherzer (6 seasons), Corey Kluber (5), Jose Quintana (5), Jeff Samardzija (5), Julio Teheran (5) and Justin Verlander (5)...Leake is twothirds of an inning shy of becoming the 7th pitcher with 5+ seasons of 185.0+ innings since 2013...Cole Hamels (183.2 IP) could join this group this season.

STAYING GROUNDED ... is ranked 3rd in the American League with a ground ball rate of 49.8%, trailing only Dallas Keuchel-HOU (54.4%) and Kyle Gibson-MIN (50.6%)...opponents have grounded into 24 double plays with Leake on the mound this season, most in the AL (2nd-most in the Majors).

<u>LEADERBOARD</u>...among AL leaders, ranks 2nd in walks per batter faced (.044), 3rd in walks per 9.0 innings (1.66/34 BB, 184.1 IP), T10th in quality starts (18), 11th in innings pitched (184.1), 13th in home runs per 9.0 innings (1.12), 16th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.44/117 K, 34 BB) and 19th in ERA (4.10/84 ER, 184.1 IP).

QUALITY AND QUANTITY...15 of his last 21 starts (5/22-c) have been quality starts, including 4 outings of 8.0 innings while allowing 2-or-fewer earned runs...his 42.0 innings pitched in June were tied with Jacob deGrom-NYM for most in the Majors...among ML starters, only Jacob deGrom-NYM (43.2 IP in August) and James Paxton (43.0 IP in May) have tossed more innings in a single calendar month this season.

GOING FOR DISTANCE...his 4 starts of at least 8.0 innings pitched and 2 or fewer runs allowed (5/27 vs. MIN, 6/7 at TB, 6/23 at BOS & 8/15 at OAK) are T3rd-most in the Majors (3 others), trailing only Jacob deGrom-NYM (6) and Kevin Gausman-BAL/ATL (5).

GIVE 'EM A CHANCE...has exited 20 of his 30 starts with a lead (14 games) or a tie score (6 games)...in 3 of his other 10 starts, exited trailing 1-3 after 6.0 IP, 0-3 in the 6th inning and 2-3 after 6.0 IP...the Mariners are 19-11 in his 30 starts this season.

HELLO, SEATTLE....since making his Mariners debut on Sept. 1, 2017, is 13-11 with a 3.87 ERA (93 ER, 216.1 IP) in 35 starts (22 quality starts)...during that span, Leake leads Mariners starters in games started, innings pitched and quality starts and trails only Marco Gonzales (14) for most wins...in 25 of his 35 Mariners starts, Leake has gone at least 5.0 innings and allowed 3 or fewer earned runs...the Mariners are 22-13 in Leake starts.

CAREER...has appeared in 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2010-15), San Francisco (2015), St. Louis (2016-17) and Seattle (2017-c)...has a career record of 93-87 with a 4.00 ERA (724 ER, 1630.2 IP) with 1,102 strikeouts and 376 walks in 268 career games (263 starts)...made his Major League debut in a start on April 11, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL with Cincinnati...selected by Oakland in the 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft but did not sign... selected and signed by Cincinnati in the 1st round (8th overall pick) of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Arizona State University.

- ALL HANDS ON DECK...the Mariners have used a total of 53 different players this season...that's the 3rd-most players used in a single season in franchise history, trailing only the 61 players used in 2017 and the 54 used in 2016...Seattle has used 32 different pitchers (including 2 position players: Andrew Romine, 3 games, and Taylor Motter) this season; that's tied for second-most ever (1. 40 in 2017; T2. 32 in 2016)...all 38 players on the Mariners current active roster have already appeared in a game this season.
- NEED TO GET TO 4... Seattle lost 7-3 vs. the A's yesterday... was the 75th time this season the Mariners had scored 3 or fewer runs in a game, and Seattle fell to 23-52 in those games... 75 team games with 3 or fewer runs is the 5th-most in the AL, trailing only BAL (89), DET (80), LAA (79) and KC (76) and ranks 9th in MLB... Seattle's 23 wins when scoring 3 or fewer leads the Majors, ahead of the Cubs (22-50), Giants (21-66), Rockies (21-42) & A's (21-40).
- OUR LEADERS...Mariners leadoff hitters this season Dee Gordon (99 games), Mitch Haniger (40 games), Jean Segura (14 games), Guillermo Heredia (2 games) and Denard Span (1 game) have combined to hit .353 leading off a game this year, going 53-for-150 with 9 extra-base hits, including 2 home runs...the .353 average leads MLB.
- IN THE BLACK...at 85-71, the Mariners have clinched a winning season...2018 is just the third time in franchise history that Seattle never took the field with a record under .500...the Mariners were exactly .500 3 times this year (at 1-1, 3-3 & 4-4) but never fell under .500...the only other seasons the Mariners have been .500 or better on every day of the season were 1996 and 2001.
- FOR STARTERS...Matt Festa (1.0 IP on Sept. 19) was the 11th different starting pitcher used by the Mariners this season...the 11 starters used by the Mariners this season is tied (w/7 other teams) for 14th-most starters used this season...for Seattle, 5 guys (Mike Leake, Marco Gonzales, Félix Hernández, James Paxton, Wade LeBlanc) have combined for 138 starts, with each making at least 26, and Erasmo Ramírez has chipped in 10, with five other pitchers combining for 8 starts (Elías, 3; Bergman, 2; Festa, Miranda, Vincent, 1)...Seattle used a club-record tying 17 starters in 2017.
- THE ROTATION...Mike Leake (30 GS), Marco Gonzales (28 GS), Félix Hernández (27 GS), James Paxton (27 GS) and Wade LeBlanc (26 GS) have all made 25+ starts this season...2018 is just the fourth time in Seattle franchise history that the club has had five pitchers make at least 25 starts...this year joins 2006 (Hernández, Meche, Moyer, Piñeiro & Washburn), 2003 (Franklin, García, Meche, Moyer & Pineiro) and 1991 (DeLucia, Hanson, Holman, R. Johnson & Krueger).
- **DON'T WALK**...Mariners pitchers did not walk a Padres batter Sept. 11, marking the 22nd game this season in which Seattle hurlers did not issue a free pass...the Mariners 22 games issuing 0 walks are tops in the American League and 2nd-most in the Majors this season...they trail only the Dodgers (28), while ranking ahead of Washington (15), Oakland (15) and San Diego (13)...the 22 games with 0 walks issued by Mariners pitchers are the most in single-season club history, surpassing the previous mark of 17 such games set by the 2002 Mariners.
- GOOD TO BE HOME...Nelson Cruz has hit 20 home runs at Safeco Field this season, which is 2nd-most all-time at Safeco Field, trailing only Richie Sexson's 21 home runs at Safeco Field in 2005...Cruz, who hit 19 home runs at Safeco Field in 2017, is joined by Bret Boone (2001) and Edgar Martinez (2000) as the only other players to hit 19 home runs at Safeco Field in a single season...overall this season, Cruz's 20 home runs at home are T5th-most in the American League (also: Francisco Lindor-CLE & Giancarlo Stanton-NYY), trailing only J.D. Martinez-BOS (24), Khris Davis-OAK (23) and Joey Gallo-TEX (23).
- 40/100...Nelson Cruz has 36 home runs and 92 RBI this season in 156 team games; that puts him on pace for 37 home runs and 96 RBI...Cruz is the only player in baseball to have <u>averaged</u> more than 40 homers and 100 RBI over the past five seasons...since the start of the 2014 campaign, Cruz leads the Majors with 202 home runs (40.4 per year) and is 3rd (trailing Nolan Arenado, 557, & Edwin Encarnación, 543) with 517 RBI (103.4 per year)...he had at least 39 homers and 93 RBI in every season from 2014-2017.
- HOME AWAY FROM HOME...the Mariners finished their road slate at 44-37 (.543), and are currently tied for the 4th-most road wins in the Majors...the Mariners are tied with Chicago-NL (44-37/.543), Colorado (44-37/.543), Oakland (44-31/.587) and St. Louis (44-34/.564), while trailing Houston (52/22/.703), Boston (51-30/.630) and Atlanta (45-30/.600)...in Mariners club history, the 2018 club is also tied for the 5th-most road wins in a single season (also: 2000, 44-37/.543), trailing 2001 (59-22/.728), 2014 (46-35/.568), 2002 (45-36/.556) and 1997 (45-36/.556).
- <u>HOME ON THE ROAD</u>...Seattle finished its road schedule at 44-37 (see above)...Mariners have had a winning road record just 9 times in franchise history, last turning the trick in 2016 (also: 2014, 2003, 2002, 2001, 2000, 1997, 1996).
- MR. CONSISTENT...Mike Leake has made 30 starts this season, his 7th consecutive season of 30 or more starts...Leake should become just the second pitcher in the live ball era with at least 7 straight seasons of 30+ starts and 50 or fewer walks...Leake enters play tonight with 34 walks this year...only Greg Maddux (13 straight, 1996-2008) had more than 7 consecutive 30+ GS/50 or fewer walk seasons...Roy Halladay (2006-11) and Fritz Peterson (1969-74) each had 6 such seasons.
- THE OCHO...Edwin Díaz notched his 8th save vs. Houston this season on Sept 17; that matches the Mariners club record for most saves by a Mariners pitcher vs. any single opponent in a single season...Edwin also has 8 vs. Oakland this year (3 games remaining)... Fernando Rodney (8 vs. OAK in 2014) is the only other Mariners pitcher to record 8 saves vs. 1 opponent in a single season...the AL record is 10, shared by Neftalí Feliz-TEX vs. LAA (2010), Mariano Rivera-NYY vs. BAL (2004) and José Valverde-DET vs. KC (2011).
