LEADING OFF: Halos play the fourth game (3-0) of the final home stand vs. Texas (3-0) & Oakland (Sept. 28-30)...Angels completed eighth sweep of season with Wednesday's win over Texas...Halos need to sweep this series to avoid third consecutive sub-.500 season (would be first time for franchise since 1992-1994)...Would be first time with three consecutive full losing seasons since 1975-77...LAA is 12-12 this month & 29-33 since break...Angels have spent last 91 days in 4th place...Club is 22-23-7 thru 52 series.

ABOUT BARRIA: Rookie Jaime Barria makes his final outing of season, his 26th start of campaign...Has allowed three-or-fewer runs in 20 of 25 starts...In last 11 outings, is 5-2 with a 3.19 ERA (53.2 IP – 19 FR)...Ranks second among MLB rookies in wins (10; min. 15 GS)... Third (min. 75 IP) among A.L. rookies in ERA (3.54) & second in batting average against (.247; min. 15 GS)...First Halo pitcher to record 10+ wins in first MLB season since Jose Arredondo (10 wins in 2008)...Last with 11 wins in first season was Jered Weaver in 2006.

EVERYDAY JOSE: Jose Alvarez's 76 appearances are tied with Francisco Rodriguez (2008) & Joe Smith (2014) for second-most appearances by Halo pitcher in a single season (Scot Shields owns record with 78 in 2005)...Since 2016, Alvarez's 204 games pitched rank tied for second in A.L. (169 IP).

<u>KNOW THIS:</u> Shohei Ohtani's 22 HRs match his professional career-high set in 2016 with **Nippon-Ham Fighters...Trout** needs one more run for sixth 100-run season of career...**Ohtani** needs one more SB to record the third 20 HR/10 SB rookie season in franchise history: **Devon White** in 1987 & **Trout** in 2012.

<u>FREE STUFF</u>: Mike Trout has tied Troy Glaus for the franchise record with 30 multi-walk games in a season...Since **Trout's** first big league season in 2012, he leads A.L. with 147 such games.

POWER POINT: Angels' 210 HRs (5th in A.L.) hit are second-most in team history (236 HRs in 2000)...110 HRs at home are third-most all-time (team record is 130 HR at home in 2000).

THIS N' THAT: Wednesday's win moved LAA to 25-15 in one-run games this season...Trout has reached base safely in 40 of last 44 games...In month of September (20 games), he is batting .338 (23/68) with three doubles, seven home runs, 14 RBI and 16 walks... On Sept. 20 at Oakland, Francisco Arcia became the first player in MLB history to catch (innings 1-7), pitch (innings 8-9) & homer (9th inning) in same game...On Monday night, Jose Briceno connected for a pinch-hit walk-off HR to lead off the 11th (3rd walk-off HR for LAA in '18), just the fifth pinch-hit walk-off HR in team history, first since Scott Spiezio in 2000 (just the third such HR in extra frames, first since Daryl Sconiers on April 30, 1983) – ELIAS.

HEAN MACHINE: Andrew Heaney set career highs in wins (9), starts (30), strikeouts (180) & innings pitched (180.0)...First Halo to reach 180+ Ks since 2013 (C.J. Wilson; 188)...Just third Angels lefty with 5+ games of 10-or-more strikeouts in a season (joins Frank Tanana in 1975-1977 & Chuck Finley in 1996)...2018 Nick Adenhart Award recipient (top pitcher as voted by teammates) & Angels' Roberto Clemente Award honoree.

FOLLOW THE LEADER: Trout leads MLB in OBP (.462), OPS (1.090), adjusted OPS (199), offensive WAR (9.1) and intentional walks (24)... Leads A.L. in walks (121) & ranks second in A.L. in slugging pct. (.629), runs created (150), AB per HR (12.1) & WAR (10.0).

GOLDFISH? Mike Trout is in contention for his first career Rawlings Gold Glove®...He is only MLB centerfielder with a 1.000 fielding pct. (min. 120 G), leads A.L. Cf'ers with eight defensive runs saved, a .940 zone rating and four double plays...Trout's seven outfield assists rank fourth in junior circuit among centerfielders.

<u>UP-RISING</u>: Justin Upton has set the franchise record for HRs by a left fielder (30), breaking **Garret Anderson's** (29) previous mark... **Upton** is the first Halo outfielder (other than **Mike Trout**) with a 30-homer campaign since **Vlad Guerrero** in 2006 (33 HR).

<u>CLOSING IN</u>: With next run, **Trout** will be just the seventh player all-time (3rd in A.L. history) with 6, 100-run campaigns prior to their age-27 season: **Alex Rodriguez** (7 seasons), **Albert Pujols** (6), **Hank Aaron** (6), **Mickey Mantle** (6), **Mel Ott** (6), **Bill Dahlen** (6)...<u>Trout is one stolen base shy of second career 30 HR/25 SB campaign (also, 2012)...Would be only player in franchise history with multiple 30/25 seasons (**Bobby Bonds** in **1977**).</u>

HI, MY NAME IS... 60 players (35 pitchers-16 starters) have appeared in 2018 to set the Club's single-season franchise mark (MLB record for players used is 64 by 2014 Texas Rangers)...16 players have made MLB debuts in 2018 breaking team record of 12 (1996 & 1975)...37 players on LAA's active roster...LAA had a clubrecord 15 players on D.L. simultaneously twice this season...Halos sent 25 different players to D.L., most in MLB this season.

SHO OFF: Shohei Ohtani and Babe Ruth (1919) are only players in MLB history with 10 pitching appearances and 20 HRs in a season... He reached 20 HRs in 91 non-pitching games, second-fastest LAA rookie to reach 20 HRs (Wally Joyner hit 20 by 82nd game in 1986) & eighth rookie in club history to reach 20 HRs (first since Mike Trout in 2012)...First Halo since T. Salmon in 2000 to win A.L. Player of Week honors twice in a season...First player in MLB history with 20+ HR & 50+ pitching Ks in same season...With 22 HRs, Ohtani has passed Kenji Johjima (18 HR w/ Seattle in 144 games in 2006) for most rookie HRs by a Japanese native...Ohtani & Hideki Matsui (5 times) are only Japanese players with 20+ HRs in a season.

FISH FACTS: Trout's 64.1 career WAR is currently ahead of Ty Cobb (63.4) for tops all time by a position player through age-26 season. With a 10.0 WAR for 2018, he is on pace to finish with a 10+ WAR for third time in career (2012 & 2016 - 10.5 WAR each season)...Only players with *more than* three seasons with 10+ WAR all-time are Babe Ruth (9 times), Willie Mays (6 times) & Rogers Hornsby (6 times)...His 506 career extra-base hits rank sixth in MLB for a player by age-26 season (Alex Rodriguez has most - 569)...Joe Medwick is fifth (509 XBH)...Trout has now posted 35+ HRs three times passing Troy Glaus (twice) for most in team annals...Just second A.L. player with seven seasons of 60+ extra-base hits by age 26 season-oryounger (Alex Rodriguez)...Has tied team record reaching base 4+ times on 16 occasions this season to equal mark set by Brian Downing in 1987 (STATS LLC)...Trout & Willie Mays are only players with three seasons of 30 HR/20 SB prior to their age-27 campaign...Vying to be fifth player all-time (first in A.L.) with 120 walks, 30 HRs & 25 stolen bases: Barry Bonds (6 seasons), Jeff Bagwell (2 seasons), Chipper Jones (1999) & Bobby Abreu (2004).

GOLD STANDARD: Three-time Gold Glover Andrelton Simmons leads MLB shortstops with 227 putouts...Leads MLB with a 19.0 Ultimate Zone Rating in 2018 (UZR) – FanGraphs...Since 2015, his 95 defensive runs saved (DRS) rank second in MLB...Thru 923 career games, Simmons' defensive WAR is 23.3 – best by any shortstop in MLB history...Simmons' 113 double plays lead MLB shortstops & his 4.32 range factor per nine innings leads A.L. shortstops.

GLOVE STORY: With 74 errors this season, Angels are on pace to break club record for fewest miscues in a full campaign (80 set last season)...Fewest in a strike-shortened season is 76 in 1994...Club ranks tied for third in A.L. with .987 fielding pct...Halos lead MLB turning 170 double plays...Catchers own a 40.3 caught stealing pct. (31 of 76), tops in A.L...Mike Trout is only CF in MLB (min. 100 G) with a 1.000 fielding pct...Kole Calhoun's 27 OF assists since 2016 rank third in A.L.

<u>LEADING MEN</u>: Mike Scioscia is in his 19th consecutive season with the Angels...Of the four major sports, only **Greg Popovich** (entering his 23rd season) has more uninterrupted tenure with current team... Scioscia (1,648 wins) ranks 18th on all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17th; 1,769)...The 1,648 wins rank second all-time by a manger with one team (lone team managed), trailing only Walter Alston (2,040 with Dodgers).

<u>BULLPEN BITS</u>: Halo relievers rank second in MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 24.5% to score (64 of 261)... Bullpen has logged 616 IP, third-most in A.L...Over last two seasons (2017-18), Jose Alvarez ranks third in A.L. with 140 games pitched...<u>As a reliever this season, Taylor Cole owns a 1.44 ERA (31.1 IP – 5 ER) and 30 strikeouts</u>...Since July 7th, has allowed three earned runs in 26 IP (1.04 ERA).

Vs. OAKLAND: Angels are 29-16 at home vs. Oakland since 2014 (3-3 this season)...Halos outscored 38-12 in last series (Sept. 9-11 at Oakland)...2018 season series it tied 8-8...LAA has won last four season series vs. A's (2014-17)...Justin Upton is hitting .304 vs. A's this season (17/54; 5 2B, 3 HR, 12 RBI)...Mike Trout is batting .304 (17/56) with three doubles, four home runs, nine RBI and 14 runs scored vs. Oakland this season.

(2008) Angels set a club record with win #100 in a 7-0 blanking of Texas at Angel Stadium...Halos finish with the best record in baseball (100-62); (1961) Leon Wagner tied a then club record with eight RBI in a game vs. Washington; (1974) Nolan Ryan threw his third no hitter in a 4-0 win over Minnesota...In the effort, Ryan tied Clyde Wright's club

eight RBI in a game Vs. Washington; (1974) Nolan Ryan threw his third no hitter in a 4-0 win over Minnesota...In the effort, Ryan tied Clyde Wright's club record with his 22nd win; (2000) Troy Glaus posted his 45th HR at Texas, setting the A.L. record for HR by a third baseman; (2004) Vladimir Guerrero became second player in club history to post at least 120 runs and 120 RBI in the same season, joining Don Baylor who collected 139 RBI and 120 runs in his MVP campaign in 1979; (2009) Angels clinch their 3rd consecutive A.L. West crown with an 11-0 win...Ervin Santana

goes the distance in the shutout. September 29

(1970) Clyde Wright earned his 22nd win in a 9-2 victory over the White Sox...The 22 wins (tied with Nolan Ryan – 1974) stands as Angels' single-season record.

First Angels rookie to make 26+ starts in a season since Scott Schoeneweis (27) in 2000

- BACK IN THE BIGS: Is making 26th start of the season for Angels and 14th at home...Is the first Angels rookie to make 26+ starts in a season since Scott Schoeneweis (27) in 2000...Recalled from Adv.-A Inland Empire on July 23 for sixth stint of season with Angels (did not pitch for 66ers during stint with the team).
- <u>SCORELESS STREAKS</u>: Set career high with 12 consecutive scoreless innings pitched between Aug. 31 Sept. 10...Streak was snapped in second frame of last start on Sept. 10 vs. Texas...Had streak of 18 straight scoreless innings on the road snapped in last start.
- THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE THE ROAD: Pitched to a 2.47 ERA (62 IP 17 ER) on the road this season, compared with a 4.60 ERA (62.2 IP 32 ER) at Angel Stadium...His road ERA ranks fifth in the American League (min. 50 IP) this season.
- LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor in decision in last start on Saturday at Houston after working five innings and allowing one earned run on four hits with three walks and three strikeouts.
- THREE-OR-FEWER: Has allowed three-or-fewer runs in 15 of last 19 starts and in 20 of 25 starts on the season.
- WALKS UP: Has walked 32 batters across last 17 starts after walking nine in previous eight starts to begin the year.
- HOT AND COLD: In last 11 starts, is 5-2 with a 3.19 ERA (53.2 IP 19 ER)... During seven game period from June 12 July 23, was 0-6 with a 5.19 ERA (34.2 IP 20 ER) but allowed two-or-fewer earned runs in four of the seven games... In his first seven starts, Angels were 5-2 and he went 5-1 with a 2.48 ERA (36.1 IP 10 ER).
- ROOKIE RANKINGS: Ranks third among Major League rookies in wins and is sixth in innings pitched...Is fourth (min. 75 IP) among A.L. rookies in ERA and batting average against (.249)...Is the first Angels pitcher to record 10+ wins in his first Major League season since Jose Arredondo (10 wins in 2008); last Angels pitcher with 11 wins in first season was Jered Weaver in 2006
- VS. OAKLAND: Tonight marks first career appearance vs. Athletics...In 14 starts against the A.L. West this season, is 5-5 with a 3.03 ERA (71.1 IP 24 ER).
- AT ANGEL STADIUM: In 13 starts at Angel Stadium, is 4-6 with a 4.60 ERA (62.2 IP 32 ER)...Has won two of last five home starts after Angels lost his previous four...Pitched career-high seven innings on May 15 vs. Houston...Carried nohitter through 5.1 frames of start on May 3 vs. Orioles.
- GENERATION GAP: When they faced off on June 1 at Angel Stadium, the 23 years, 55 days difference in age (8456 total days) between Bartolo Colon (45 years, 8 days) and Jaime Barria (21 years, 318 days) was the largest in any Angels game in franchise history...They matched that record when they faced off again on Sept. 5 at Globe Life Park.
- STREAKING: Won four straight decisions between May 3 June 1, which is longest streak by any Angels pitcher in 2018.
- HALOS FROM PANAMA: Barria is the first Panama-born pitcher in Angels history...The only other player in franchise history who was born in Panama is Hall of Famer Rod Carew.
- <u>RECORD BREAKING FRAME</u>: During start on April 22 vs. San Francisco, tossed 49 pitches in a scoreless first inning, including a Major League record 21-pitch at-bat vs. <u>Brandon Belt</u> (previous record was 20 pitches seen by Houston's <u>Ricky Gutierrez</u> vs. Cleveland RHP <u>Bartolo Colon</u> on June 26, 1998...Became first pitcher to throw 49+ pitches in an inning without allowing a run since D-backs <u>Nick Bierbrodt</u> on June 13, 2001 vs. Cubs.
- BIG LEAGUE DEBUT: Made Major League debut with Angels on April 11 at Texas and earned the win after tossing five innings and allowing one run on one hit (HR by Ryan Rua) with three walks and three strikeouts.
- <u>STARTING WITH A START:</u> In Major League debut on April 11, became the first player to make his Major League debut as
 a starting pitcher for the Angels since **Matt Shoemaker** on Sept. 20, 2013 vs. Seattle...He also became the first player to
 earn a win in MLB debut as a starter since **Sean O'Sullivan** on June 16, 2009 at San Francisco.
- YOUTH WINS: Is the youngest player (21.267 on day of first win) to have earned a winning decision in the American League this season...Only A.L. player to win a game before his 22nd birthday this season (five total wins before July 18).
- <u>NO-HIT BID:</u> Had no-hit opportunity on May 3 vs. Baltimore, but missed out on the no-no after 5.1 innings when allowing a single to **Trey Mancini**...Recorded first quality start of career and first winning decision at Angel Stadium.
- <u>YOUNG ANGELS:</u> At 21 years, 267 days, Barria was the youngest Angels player to make his Major League debut since
 Mike Trout (19 years, 335 days) on July 8, 2011...He's the youngest pitcher to debut with Angels since Tyler Chatwood
 (21 years, 85 days) on June 19, 2011.
- WITH THE BEES: In four starts with Triple-A Salt Lake this season, is 0-0 with a 3.60 ERA (15 IP 6 ER) and 16 strikeouts.
- IN THE RANKINGS: Entered 2018 ranked by Baseball America as the #6 prospect in the Angels organization and was top pitching exclusive prospect (RHP/DH Shohei Ohtani was ranked #1)...He was also ranked #7 by MLB.com in Halos system.
- MINOR LEAGUE HONORS: Was selected to 2017 All-Star Futures Game at Marlins Park and pitched one scoreless inning
 in relief with one walk and two strikeouts for Team World...Named a 2017 California League Mid-Season All-Star and 2016
 Midwest League Mid-Season All-Star...Selected as Angels Organizational Player of the Month for May and June 2017.
- CAREER NOTES: Native of Panama City, Panama...Originally signed with Angels as international free agent, April 11, 2013.
