GAME #162 (79-82) HOME GAME #81 (41-39)

LEADING OFF: THE ANGELS THANK ALL MEMBERS OF THE MEDIA FOR THEIR TIRELESS COVERAGE OF THE TEAM ... Today the Halos play Game #162, the sixth game (4-1) of the final home stand vs. Texas (3-0) & Oakland (1-1)...LAA has won four of last five games...<u>Halos</u> will fall under .500 for a third consecutive season, first time for franchise since 1992-1994...Also first time with three consecutive full losing seasons since 1975-77...LAA is 13-13 this month & 30-34 since break...**Angels** have spent last 93 days in 4th place...<u>Club is 22-</u> 23-7 thru 52 series.

QUICK HIT: If Angels win today, they would finish 80-82 for the second straight season...Only other instance LAA finished with same mark in back-to-back seasons came in 1987 & 1988 (75-87).

KNOW THIS: Angels' .987 team fielding percentage is currently best in club history...Club record is .986 done five times previously including last season...76 errors on season match fewest in team annals...1994 Halos had 76 miscues in a strike-shortened season.

**LEADING MEN**: Mike Scioscia is in his 19th consecutive season with the Angels...Of the four major sports, only **Greg Popovich** (entering his 23<sup>rd</sup> season) has more uninterrupted tenure with current team... Scioscia (1,649 wins) ranks  $18^{th}$  on all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17th; 1,769)...The 1,649 wins rank second all-time by a inger with one team (lone team managed), trailing only Walter Alston (2,040 with Dodgers).

NOW YOU KNOW: Mike Trout has his sixth career 100-run season, just seventh player all-time (third in A.L.) to own six seasons of 100+ runs prior to age-27 season joining Alex Rodriguez (7). Albert Puiols (6), Hank Aaron (6), Mickey Mantle (6), Mel Ott (6) & Bill Dahlen (6).

EVERYDAY JOSE: Jose Alvarez's 76 appearances are tied with Francisco Rodriguez (2008) & Joe Smith (2014) for second-most appearances by Halo pitcher in a single season (Scot Shields owns record with 78 in 2005)...Since 2016, Alvarez's 204 games pitched rank tied for fourth in A.L. (169 IP).

FREE STUFF: Mike Trout has tied Troy Glaus for the franchise record vith 30 multi-walk games in a season...Since **Trout's** first big league season in 2012, he leads A.L. with 147 such games.

POWER POINT: Angels' 212 HRs (5th in A.L.) hit are second-most in team history (236 HRs in 2000)...112 HRs at home are third-most alltime (team record is 130 HR at home in 2000).

THIS N' THAT: LAA is 25-15 in one-run games this season... Trout has six HRs and 11 RBI his last 11 games...In month of September (23 games), he is batting .333 (25/75) with three doubles, eight home runs, 16 RBI and 17 walks...<u>Taylor Cole has a 0.95 ERA in last 28.1 relief innings (3 ER)</u>...On Sept. 20 at **Oakland, Francisco Arcia** became the first player in MLB history to catch (innings 1-7), pitch (innings 8-9) & homer (9th inning) in same game...On Monday night, Jose Briceno connected for a pinch-hit walk-off HR to lead off the 11th (3rd walk-off HR for **LAA** in '18), just the fifth pinch-hit walk-off HR in team history, first since **Scott Spiezio** in 2000 (just the third such HR in extra frames, first since **Daryl Sconiers** on April 30, 1983) – *ELIAS*.

HEAN MACHINE: Andrew Heaney set career highs in wins (9), starts (30), strikeouts (180) & innings pitched (180.0)...First Halo to reach 180+ Ks since 2013 (C.J. Wilson; 188)...Just third Angels lefty with 5+ games of 10-or-more strikeouts in a season (joins Frank Tanana in 1975-1977 & Chuck Finley in 1996)...2018 Nick Adenhart Award recipient (top pitcher as voted by teammates) & Angels' Roberto Clemente Award honoree.

FOLLOW THE LEADER: Trout leads MLB in OBP (.460), OPS (1.090), OPS+ (199), offensive WAR (9.2) and intentional walks (25)...Leads A.L. in walks (122) and ranks second in A.L. in slugging pct. (.630), AB per HR (12.1), runs created (152) & WAR (10.2).

GOLDFISH? Mike Trout is in contention for his first career Rawlings Gold Glove®...He is only MLB centerfielder with a 1.000 fielding pct. (min. 120 G), leads A.L. CF'ers with eight defensive runs saved, a .940 zone rating and four double plays... Trout's seven outfield assists rank fourth in junior circuit among centerfielders.

ABOUT BARRIA: Rookie Jaime Barria ranks second among MLB rookies in wins (10; min. 15 GS)...Third (min. 75 IP) among A.L. rookies in ERA (3.41) & second in batting average against (.242; min. 15 GS)...First Halo pitcher to record 10+ wins in first MLB season since Jose Arredondo (10 wins in 2008)

<u>UP-RISING</u>: Justin Upton has set the franchise record for HRs by a left fielder (30), breaking Garret Anderson's (29) previous mark Upton is the first Halo outfielder (other than Mike Trout) with a 30homer campaign since Vlad Guerrero in 2006 (33 HR).

CLOSING IN: Trout is one stolen base shy of second career 30 HR/25 SB campaign (also, 2012)...Would be only player in franchise history with multiple 30/25 seasons (Bobby Bonds in 1977).

<u>HI, MY NAME IS...</u> 60 players (35 pitchers-16 starters) have appeared in 2018 to set the Club's single-season franchise mark (MLB record for players used is 64 by 2014 Texas Rangers)...16 players have made MLB debuts in 2018 breaking team record of 12 (1996 & 1975)...37 players on LAA's active roster...LAA had a clubrecord 15 players on D.L. simultaneously twice this season...Halos sent 25 different players to D.L., most in MLB this season.

POWER & SPEED: Shohei Ohtani joined Ronald Acuña Jr. as only rookies in 2018 to have 20 HRs & 10 stolen bases...Just third Angels' rookie with 20 HRs & 10 SBs joining Devon White (1987) & Mike Trout (2012)...Joined Ichiro Suzuki (2005) & Tadahito Iguchi (2005 and 2006) as only Japanese players to hit 15+ HRs with 10+ SBs.

SHO OFF: Shohei Ohtani and Babe Ruth (1919) are only players in MLB history with 10 pitching appearances and 20 HRs in a seaso Ohtani's 22 HRs match his professional career-high set in 2016 with Nippon-Ham Fighters...Has passed Kenji Johjima (18 HR w/ Seattle in 144 games in 2006) for most rookie HRs by a Japanese native. Ohtani & Hideki Matsui (5 times) are only Japanese players with 20+ HRs in a season...Reached 20 HRs in 91 non-pitching games, second-fastest LAA rookie to reach 20 HRs (Wally Joyner hit 20 by 82<sup>nd</sup> game in 1986) & eighth rookie in club history to reach 20 HRs (first since **Mike Trout** in 2012)...**First Halo since T. Salmon in 2000** to win A.L. Player of Week honors twice in a season...First player in MLB history with 20+ HR & 50+ pitching Ks in same season

FISH FACTS: Trout's 64.3 career WAR is currently ahead of Ty Cobb (63.4) for tops all time by a position player through age-26 season.. With a 10.1 WAR for 2018, he is on pace to finish with a 10+ WAR for third time in career (2012 & 2016 - 10.5 WAR each season)... Only players with more than three seasons with 10+ WAR all-time are Babe Ruth (9 times), Willie Mays (6 times) & Rogers Hornsby (6 times)...His 507 career extra-base hits rank sixth in MLB for a player by age-26 season (Alex Rodriguez has most - 569)...Joe Medwick is fifth (509 XBH)...Trout has now posted 35+ HRs three times passing Troy Glaus (twice) for most in team annals...Just second A.L. player with seven seasons of 60+ extra-base hits by age 26 season-oryounger (Alex Rodriguez)...Has tied team record reaching base 4+ times on 16 occasions this season to equal mark set by Brian Downing in 1987 (STATS LLC)...Trout & Willie Mays are only players with three seasons of 30 HR/20 SB prior to their age-27 campaign...Vying to be fifth player all-time (first in A.L.) with 120 walks, 30 HRs & 25 stolen bases: Barry Bonds (6 seasons), Jeff Bagwell (2 seasons), Chipper Jones (1999) & Bobby Abreu (2004).

GOLD STANDARD: Three-time Gold Glover Andrelton Simmons leads MLB shortstops with 228 putouts...Leads MLB with a 19.0 Ultimate Zone Rating in 2018 (UZR) – FanGraphs...Since 2015, his 95 defensive runs saved (DRS) rank second in MLB... Thru 925 career games, Simmons' defensive WAR is 23.3 - best by any shortstop in MLB history...Simmons' 114 double plays lead MLB shortstops & his 4.32 range factor per nine innings leads A.L. shortstops.

GLOVE STORY: With 76 errors this season, Angels are on pace to break club record for fewest miscues in a full campaign (80 set last season)...Fewest in a strike-shortened season is 76 in 1994...Club ranks tied for second in A.L. with .987 fielding pct...Halos lead MLB turning 173 double plays...Catchers own a 41.8 caught stealing pct. (33 of 79), tops in A.L...Mike Trout is only CF in MLB (min. 100 G) with a 1.000 fielding pct...Kole Calhoun's 27 OF assists since 2016

BULLPEN BITS: Halo relievers rank second in MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 25% to score (67 of 268)...Bullpen has logged 626 IP, third-most in A.L...Over last two seasons (2017-18), Jose Alvarez ranks third in A.L. with 140 games pitched.

Vs. OAKLAND: Angels are 30-17 at home vs. Oakland since 2014 (4-4 this season)...Halos outscored 38-12 in last series (Sept. 9-11 at Oakland)...2018 season series is tied 9-9...LAA has won last four season series vs. A's (2014-17)...Mike Trout is batting .333 (19/57) with three doubles, five home runs, 11 nine RBI and 16 runs scored vs. Oakland this season.

# THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

### September 30

(1984) On the last day of the season, Mike Witt became the 13th player in MLB history to throw a perfect game (only perfect game in Angels' history) as he defeated Texas, 1-0, with 10 strikeouts...It remains just one of five ever 1-0 perfect game scores.

October 1
(2000) On the last game of the season, **Darin Erstad** collected his ML leading 240th hit, the highest total in the ML since Wade Boggs in 1985 and 12th highest mark in a season in ML history; (2006) Angels finished with a attendance club record of 3,406,790, the...The record surpassed the 2005 mark of 3 404 686 WINS & LOSSES

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER - RHP MATT SHOEMAKER

### 2-2, 4.82 ERA

Owns a 2.86 ERA (113.1 IP – 36 ER) across his last 18 home starts

- WELCOME BACK SHOE: Making seventh start of the season and third at home...Sixth start since being
  reinstated from disabled list on September 3 at Texas.
- 100 GAME MILESTONE: Last start on Tuesday marked 100<sup>th</sup> career game (92<sup>nd</sup> start)...Is one of nine players in Angels history to reach 40 wins within first 100 career games.
- HOME SWEET HOME: In last 18 home starts, is 9-3 with a 2.86 ERA (113.1 IP 36 ER) with 126 strikeouts...In that span (since May 21, 2016), ranks fourth in A.L. in home ERA (min. 15 GS) behind Corey Kluber (2.19), Blake Snell (2.38) and Justin Verlander (2.67).
- INJURY WOES: Was placed on disabled list after season debut (March 31 at OAK) with a right forearm strain (missed 134 games)...Last season, exited start vs. Yankees on June 14, 2017 with a right forearm strain and missed remainder of year on DL...In 2016, missed final month of the season after being struck on right side of head by a line drive off bat of Seattle's Kyle Seager on Sept. 4 at Safeco Field.
- <u>LAST TIME OUT:</u> Pitched five innings in last start on Tuesday vs. Texas and did not factor in decision after allowing one earned run on four hits with no walks and seven strikeouts
- <u>WIN STREAK SNAPPED:</u> Angels had won each of his last six starts before dropping two straight starts on Sept. 14 & 20...The streak was tied for second longest in his career (longest is 10 games from Aug. 9, 2014 April 13, 2015).
- <u>SEASON DEBUT:</u> Did not factor in decision in season debut on March 31 at Oakland...Carried a shutout into the sixth inning before yielding three runs in the 6<sup>th</sup> frame...Was placed on DL following the start.
- <u>REHAB START:</u> Made one rehab appearance with Adv.-A Inland Empire on Aug. 29 vs. Lake Elsinore and pitched 4+ no-hit innings, allowing one run (unearned) with two walks and six strikeouts.
- GOOD NIGHT SHOE: Has a career record of 35-20 with a 3.69 ERA (431.2 IP 177 ER) in night games, compared with a 5-12 record and 4.81 ERA (110.1 IP 59 ER) in day games...Last season, was 6-0 with a 3.56 ERA (55.2 IP 22 ER) in night games, compared with a 0-3 record and 6.95 ERA (22 IP 17 ER) in day games.
- TALE OF TWO HALVES: Owns a 4.57 career ERA (335 IP 170 ER) in the first half of the season, compared with a 2.87 ERA (207 IP 66 ER) after the All-Star Break...Did not pitch after the Break last season
- <u>VS. OAKLAND</u>: In 14 career games (13 starts) against the A's, is 6-3 with a 4.11 ERA (70 IP 32 ER)...The six wins are his most vs. any opponent...In two starts vs. A's this year, is 1-1 with a 8.64 ERA (8.1 IP 8 ER)...Earned win in season debut vs. A's on March 31 after tossing 5.2 innings and allowing three earned runs; carried shutout into sixth inning before allowing three runs in the frame...In last eight starts vs. Oakland, is 5-1 with a 3.25 ERA (44.1 IP 16 ER) and 39 strikeouts.
- AT ANGEL STADIUM: In 48 career regular season games (43 starts) at the Big A, is 19-15 with a 3.16 ERA (264.2 IP 93 ER) with 275 strikeouts...This season, is 0-1 with a 3.72 ERA (9.2 IP 4 ER) at home...As a starter, is 17-14 with a 3.20 ERA (253.1 IP 90 ER) with 264 strikeouts.
- 2017 RECAP: In 14 starts for the Angels last season, went 6-3 with a 4.52 ERA (77.2 IP 39 ER)...Led Angels pitching staff with 69 strikeouts at the time of season ending injury (June 14)...In last seven starts, was 5-1 with a 3.86 ERA (39.2 IP 17 ER), before suffering the right forearm strain in final start against the Yankees...Yielded 15 home runs last year across his 14 starts...24 of 41 runs allowed scored via HR.
- <u>CAREER NOTES</u>: Owns a 40-32 record and 3.92 ERA (542 IP 236 ER) with 487 strikeouts in 100 games (92 starts) across parts of six seasons for Angels...Has made Angels Opening Day roster each of last five years.

AGE: 29

- Has tied Francisco Rodriguez (2008) and Joe Smith (2014) for second most games pitched (76) in franchise history...**Scot Shields** holds club record with 78 in 2005.
- 76 appearances rank second in A.L. and are the most by a left-hander in Angels history (previous was 66 games by Mike Holtz in 1997.
- Recorded first save of season on Sept. 9 at Chicago (A.L.).
- Six wins this season are a new career-high.
- Has stranded 43 of 50 inherited runners this season...50 IR are second most in the American League...86% stranded rate is fourth best in the A.L.
- Has allowed seven ER against the Astros this year (6 games; 2.2 IP) and 12 ER against all other opponents (58.1 IP).
- 48 appearances before the All-Star Break are an Angels record.
- Matched season high with three strikeouts on May 27 at Yankee Stadium.
- Last Outing: 9/26 vs. TEX (W; 1 IP) Holds: 14 Saves/Opps: 1/4

# #38 JUSTIN ANDERSON (RHP)

- Charged with five runs in last two outings after allowing two runs in previous 10 G.
- Has not allowed a run in 14 of last 18 outings.

- Struck out all four batters faced on 8/10 vs. OAK...First Angels pitcher to do so (min. 4 BF) since Cory Rasmus (4 BF 4 SO) on Oct. 4, 2015 at TEX.

- Matched season-high with 1.2 scoreless innings on July 29 vs. Mariners.
- Made 34 first half appearances, going 2-2 with four saves, a 3.38 ERA (34.2 IP  $-\,13$ ER) and 45 strikeouts.
- Had streak of nine straight scoreless outings (9.1 IP) snapped June 6 vs. KC.
- Recorded first career win May 23 at TOR...Earned first career save May 14 vs. HOU.
