OAKLAND ATHLETICS (3-5) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (4-3-1)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won back-to-back games after losing four straight and five of the first six...have allowed 11 runs in the last three games after yielding 17 on Tuesday...have a 7.13 ERA, which is second highest in the majors to the Angels (7.13)...have the third lowest batting average (.243), on-base percentage (.318) and slugging percentage (.393) in the Cactus League (.243) and the fourth fewest runs scored (39)...are tied with the Angels for the most errors (9)...this is the A's 51st Spring Training in Arizona, their fifth since returning to Mesa in 2015 after a 36-year absence...after training in Bradenton, Florida in 1968, the A's came west to Arizona in 1969 and trained in Mesa from 1969-78...moved to Scottsdale in 1979 and then spent 33 seasons at Phoenix Municipal Stadium from 1982-2014...with the rainout Feb. 21, the A's are now scheduled to play 23 games this spring plus two exhibition games in Japan...the 23 games will be the fewest by an A's team during the spring since 1980 when they had 20...the total includes 20 games in Arizona and three in the Bay Area against the Giants (March 24-26)...went 14-16-2 (.469) last spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League...it marked the third consecutive year Oakland has finished with a losing record during the spring and it is the third time in Oakland history the A's have posted a losing record in at least three consecutive springs...also did it in three straight years from 2009-11 and four straight from 1974-77...the A's defense turned 39 double plays, which was second most in the majors (Atlanta, 42)...committed 24 errors, which tied for fourth fewest in the CL...the offense ranked third in the CL in fewest strikeouts (25), but were fourth in lowest on-base percentage (.325) and fewest doubles (59) and fifth in lowest batting average (.261)...hit 44 home runs, which were the most by an A's team during the spring since 2004 when they had 50...the pitching staff has compiled a 3.82 ERA (83 er in 195.2 ip) over the last 22 games after posting a 7.45 ERA over the first 10 contests...surrendered 38 home runs, which tied for fourth fewest in the CL, but issued 114 walks, which tied for second most.

A's vs. INDIANS: This is the only meeting between the A's and Indians this spring...split two games last spring, losing 16-8 at Goodyear on Feb. 27 and winning 7-3 in Mesa on March 16...have lost six of their last eight spring games to Cleveland, including four straight at Goodyear...have not defeated the Indians at Goodyear since March 19, 2014.

IN CAMP: The A's have 63 players in camp plus two on the 60-day disabled list (Gossett, Manaea)...the active total includes 40 players on the 40-man roster, which is full, and 23 non-roster invitees...the breakdown includes 37 pitchers, six catchers, 11 infielders and nine outfielders.

COACHING STAFF: Manager Bob Melvin, beginning his eighth full season with the A's, returns his entire coaching staff...returning will be bench coach Ryan Christenson, hitting coach Darren Bush, pitching coach Scott Emerson, assistant hitting coach Mike Aldrete, first base coach Al Pedrique, third base coach Matt Williams, bullpen coach Marcus Jensen and quality control coach Mark Kotsay.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have three players under contract beyond the 2019 season...Joakim Soria and Mike Fiers are signed through 2020 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023...Yusmeiro Petit has a club option for 2020.

HOW THE A'S WERE BUILT: Of the 40 players on the 40-man roster, six were drafted by the A's (Bolt, 4th round in 2015; Chapman, 1st round in 2014; Dull, 32nd in 2012; Olson, compensation following 1st round in 2012; Pinder, competitive balance round B in 2013; Trivino, 11th in 2013)...one was signed as a non-drafted agent (Barrera), seven were signed as free agents (Anderson, Estrada, Grossman Herrmann, Martini, Petit, Soria) and one was claimed off waivers (Triggs)...the other 25 were all acquired in trades.

OFF SEASON MOVES: The A's signed four free agents prior to the start of camp: Marco Estrada, Mike Fiers (re-signed with Oakland after he was non-tendered following the season), Chris Herrmann and Joakim Soria...the A's also acquired two players via trade, including Tanner Anderson (Pittsburgh, Nov. 20) and Jurickson Profar (Texas in three team trade, Dec. 21)...after pitchers and catchers reported, the A's signed Brett Anderson on Feb. 13 and Robbie Grossman on Feb. 15.

NON-ROSTER INVITEES: The Athletics have 23 non-roster invitees in Major League camp...the players include LHP Tyler Alexander, LHP Jerry Blevins, RHP Parker Bridwell, RHP Jake Buchanan, INF Eric Campbell, LHP Kyle Crockett, RHP Parker Dunshee, RHP Kyle Finnegan, C Jonah Heim, C Nick Hundley, INF Corban Joseph, LHP Dean Kiekhefer, LHP Kyle Lobstein, LHP Jesus Luzardo, C Sean Murphy, IF Sheldon Neuse, INF Cliff Pennington, LHP A.J. Puk, RHP Miguel Romero, RHP Norge Ruiz, RHP Brian Schlitter, C Beau Taylor and LHP Wei-Chung Wang...13 of the 23 non-roster players have Major League experience (Blevins, Bridwell, Buchanan, Campbell, Crockett, Hundley, Joseph, Kiekhefer, Lobstein, Pennington, Schlitter, Taylor, Wang).

A's TOP PROSPECTS: Five of the A's top 10 prospects according to *Baseball America* are in major league camp this spring: Jesus Luzardo (#1), A.J. Puk (#2), Sean Murphy (#3), Jorge Mateo (#9) and Sheldon Neuse (#10)...the others are Tyler Murray (#4), Austin Beck (#5), Lazaro Armenteros (#6), Jameson Hannah (#7) and Eli White (#8), who was traded to Texas in the Jurickson Profar deal.

MINOR LEAGUE DATES: Minor League mini camp is underway...pitchers and catchers report today with the first workout scheduled for tomorrow...position players report Friday, March 8 with the first workout scheduled for March 9...games begin on Thursday, March 14 and minor league camp breaks on March 30.

A's MEDIA ALERTS: The A's Media Relations Department will provide frequent updates through its media-only Twitter account...for clubhouse hours, interview times and other media alerts, please follow @AsMediaAlerts...player transactions and other relevant game information will be posted at @AthleticsPR.

A's SPRING BROADCASTS: The A's will broadcast all Spring Training games on KTRB 860 AM...Ken Korach, Vince Cotroneo and Ray Fosse will call the action for most games...Coco Crisp will join the broadcast on Mar. 10 and Donny Baarns will fill in on selected games...the father and son duo of Vince and Dom Cotroneo will team up on March 11...NBCSCA will air two spring training games against San Francisco on March 10 and 24...Glen Kuiper joins Ray Fosse in the broadcast booth for those telecasts...NBCSBA will air the A's vs. Giants games on March 7 and 25...two remaining games (Mar. 3 and Mar. 6) will air on MLB Network on a tape delayed basis.

A's IN JAPAN: The A's will open the regular season at the Tokyo Dome in Japan with a two-game series against the Seattle Mariners on March 20 and 21...the club will fly to Japan on Thurs., March 14 and will play the Nippon Ham Fighters in exhibition games on March 17 and 18...the two regular season games against the Mariners will start at 2:35 am PDT and will air on ESPN...this will mark the third time the A's have opened the regular season in Japan...split a two-game series with Boston in 2008 and Seattle in 2012.

ATHLETICS BATTING NOTES

#79 LUIS BARRERA: Is one of four Athletics to appear in all eight games this spring (Bolt, Campbell, Neuse)...is 2-for-6 (.333) over his last five games after going 0-for-3 over his first three...combined to hit .296 with 26 doubles, 11 triples, three home runs, 64 RBI and 23 stolen bases in 124 games with Single-A Stockton and Double-A Midland last year...tied for seventh in all of minor league baseball in triples.

#1 FRANKLIN BARRETO: Leads the Cactus League in batting (.500) and is tied for the lead in runs (6), hits (8) and doubles (3)...is also tied for second in extra base hits (4) and total bases (14), ranks third in on-base percentage (.556) and fifth in slugging (.875) and OPS (1.431)...has struck out just twice in 18 plate appearances...has a six-game hitting streak (8-for-14, .571)...has appeared in three games at second base, two in left field, one in center field and one at shortstop...had six stints with Oakland in 2018 and batted .233 with five home runs and 16 RBI in 32 games.

#72 SKYE BOLT: Is one of four Athletics to appear in all eight games this spring (Barrera, Campbell, Neuse)...began the 2018 season at Double-A Midland but also had a 46-game stay with Single-A Stockton from April 23 to June 16...combined with both clubs to hit .260 with 19 home runs and 69 RBI in 124 games...was named an A's Organization All-Star by milb.com.

#20 MARK CANHA: Has appeared in three games a first base, one in center field and one at designated hitter...started games at five different positions for the A's last year and batted .249 with a career-high 17 home runs and 52 RBI in 122 games...hit 13 of his 17 home runs against left-handed pitchers, which tied for second most in the American League.

#26 MATT CHAPMAN: Went 0-for-2 with a walk in his first game of the spring Wednesday against the Dodgers...then started at third base yesterday against the Rockies (0-for-2, walk)...earned the American League Gold Glove for third baseman last year, the Platinum Glove for all AL fielders and was named Defensive Player of the Year by Wilson...hit .278 with 24 home runs and 68 RBI in 145 games.

#2 CHRIS DAVIS: Is the only Athletics non-pitcher that has yet to play in a game...hit a Major League leading and career-high 48 home runs and ranked second with a career-high 123 RBI last year...became the 22nd player in ML history with at least three straight seasons of 40 home runs and 100 RBI, the second Athletic (Jimmie Foxx).

#11 DUSTIN FOWLER: Has hit safely in each of his last four games (4-for-12, .333) after going 0-for-4 over his first three...batted .224 with six home runs and 23 RBI in 69 games over two stints with Oakland last year...made 45 starts, all in games started by a right-handed pitcher.

#17 ROBBIE GROSSMAN: Was signed as a free agent, Feb. 15...batted .273 with five home runs and a career-high 48 RBI in a career-high 129 games with Minnesota last year...added 60 walks for a .367 on-base percentage, which was 10th best in the American League among players with at least 450 plate appearances.

#5 CHRIS HERRMANN: Had two hits and two RBI Thursday at Chicago (NL) after going 0-for-6 over his first four games...was signed as a free agent, Dec. 11...started the 2018 season at Triple-A Tacoma before joining Seattle May 27...batted .237 with seven RBI in 36 games with the Mariners...added 10 walks for a .322 on-base percentage.

#22 RAMON LAUREANO: Had two hits, including his first home run, Thursday at Chicago (NL) after going 1-for-10 over his first four games...spent the first four months of the 2018 season with Triple-A Nashville where he batted .297 with a career-high 14 home runs and 35 RBI in 64 games...was recalled by Oakland Aug. 3 and hit .288 with five home runs and 19 RBI in 48 games in his Major League debut.

#13 JORGE MATEO: Is 0-for-3 over his last two games but has three walks...spent the entire 2018 season at Nashville in his Triple-A debut and batted .230 with three home runs and 45 RBI in 131 games...led all of the minors with 16 triples and ranked fifth in the Pacific Coast League in steals (25).

#28 MATT OLSON: Started the spring 0-for-12 before delivering a two-run single in the fourth inning yesterday against Colorado...played in all 162 games last year and batted .247 with 29 home runs and 84 RBI in his first full season in the majors...also won the American League Gold Glove Award for first basemen...hit all 29 of his home runs as a first baseman, which led AL first basemen and ranked third in the majors.

#19 JOSH PHEGLEY: Went 3-for-4 Thursday at Chicago (NL) after going 1-for-5 (.200) over his first three games...spent most of the first two months of the 2018 season at Triple-A Nashville, where he batted .235 with three home runs and 18 RBI in 36 games...spent the final four months with Oakland and hit .204 with two home runs and 15 RBI in 39 contests with the A's.

#18 CHAD PINDER: Is tied for the Cactus League lead in doubles (3)...has appeared in four games at third base and two at designated hitter...batted .258 with 13 home runs and 27 RBI in 110 games last year in a season interrupted by two stints on the disabled list...became the first player in Oakland history to start at least one game at seven different positions.

#25 STEPHEN PISCOTTY: Hit his first home run of the spring a week ago today against Chicago (AL) and had two hits and two RBI Tuesday against Los Angeles (AL)...batted .267 with 41 doubles, 27 home runs and 88 RBI in 151 games in his first season with Oakland last year...had career highs in doubles, home runs, RBI, extra base hits (68) and total bases (268).

#23 JURICKSON PROFAR: Went 2-for-3 with his first home run of the spring yesterday against Colorado after going 1-for-10 (.100) over his first four games...was acquired from Texas Dec. 21 in a three-team, seven-player trade...had career highs in nearly every offensive category last year as he batted .254 with 20 home runs and 77 RBI in 146 games...was one of just five players in the AL with at least 35 doubles, 20 home runs, 75 RBI and 10 steals.

#10 MARCUS SEMIEN: Batted .255 with 15 home runs and 70 RBI in 159 games last year...had career highs in runs (89), hits (161), doubles (35), walks (61) and stolen bases (14) and matched his high in games...had his fourth consecutive season with 10 or more home runs and 10 or more stolen bases.

#58 RHP PAUL BLACKBURN: Pitched in relief in his last outing after starting on Feb. 21 against Seattle in Mesa in the game that was rained out (1.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er)...was limited to just six starts with Oakland last year due to two stints on the disabled list...began the season on the DL with a strained right forearm, went 2-3 with a 7.16 ERA in six starts from June 7 to July 6 and then missed the remainder of the season with right elbow lateral epicondylitis.
