OAKLAND ATHLETICS (8-6) VS. MILWAUKEE BREWERS (6-8)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four straight and seven of the last eight games after starting the spring 1-5...are now 8-6 overall...have six more games in Arizona before leaving for Japan next Thursday...are scheduled to play 23 games this spring (have three in the Bay Area against San Francisco after the trip to Japan), plus two exhibition games in Tokyo...the 23 games will be the fewest by an A's team during the spring since 1980 when they had 20...went 14-16-2 (.469) last spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League...it marked the third consecutive year Oakland has finished with a losing record during the spring and it is the third time in Oakland history the A's have posted a losing record in at least three consecutive springs...also did it in three straight years from 2009-11 and four straight from 1974-77...this is the A's 51st Spring Training in Arizona, their fifth since returning to Mesa in 2015 after a 36-year absence...after training in Bradenton, Florida in 1968, the A's came west to Arizona in 1969 and trained in Mesa from 1969-78...moved to Scottsdale in 1979 and then spent 33 seasons at Phoenix Municipal Stadium from 1982-2014.

THIS AND THAT: The pitching staff has allowed 26 runs in the last nine games after yielding 17 runs on Feb. 26 against Los Angeles (AL)...has a 2.93 ERA (26 er in 80.0 ip) over the last nine games after compiling a 9.48 ERA over the first five...has surrendered just 12 home runs, which is second fewest in the Cactus League (CLE, 8)...are tied for the third fewest walks (47) but have the third highest opponents batting average (.286)...the A's have hit seven home runs over the last four games after tallying seven over the first 10...the offense has the lowest OPS in the CL (.715) and the second lowest batting average (.237), on-base percentage (.310) and slugging percentage (.405)...are second in fewest strikeouts (102), tied for second in fewest runs (63) and third in fewest home runs (14)

A's vs. BREWERS: This is the only meeting between the A's and Brewers this spring...Oakland lost two of three last spring, winning the first game at Maryvale on March 9, 2-0...then lost 4-3 at Maryvale on March 21 and dropped a 10-5 decision at Hohokam on March 24...the A's are 5-2-2 against the Brewers over the previous four springs.

IN CAMP: The A's optioned five players and reassigned 13 non-roster invitees last weekend and now have 45 players in camp plus two on the 60-day disabled list (Gossett, Manaea)...the active total includes 35 players on the 40-man roster, which is full, and 10 non-roster invitees...the breakdown includes 25 pitchers, four catchers, nine infielders and seven outfielders.

COACHING STAFF: Manager Bob Melvin, beginning his eighth full season with the A's, returns his entire coaching staff...returning will be bench coach Ryan Christenson, hitting coach Darren Bush, pitching coach Scott Emerson, assistant hitting coach Mike Aldrete, first base coach Al Pedrique, third base coach Matt Williams, bullpen coach Marcus Jensen and quality control coach Mark Kotsay.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have three players under contract beyond the 2019 season...Joakim Soria and Mike Fiers are signed through 2020 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023...Yusmeiro Petit has a club option for 2020.

HOW THE A'S WERE BUILT: Of the 35 players on the 40-man roster remaining in camp, five were drafted by the A's (Chapman, 1st round in 2014; Dull, 32nd in 2012; Olson, compensation following 1st round in 2012; Pinder, competitive balance round B in 2013; Trivino, 11th in 2013)...seven were signed as free agents (B. Anderson, Estrada, Grossman Herrmann, Martini, Petit, Soria) and one was claimed off waivers (Triggs)...the other 22 were all acquired in trades.

OFF SEASON MOVES: The A's signed four free agents prior to the start of camp: Marco Estrada, Mike Fiers (re-signed with Oakland after he was non-tendered following the season), Chris Herrmann and Joakim Soria...the A's also acquired two players via trade, including Tanner Anderson (Pittsburgh, Nov. 20) and Jurickson Profar (Texas in three team trade, Dec. 21)...after pitchers and catchers reported, the A's signed Brett Anderson on Feb. 13 and Robbie Grossman on Feb. 15.

MINOR LEAGUE DATES: Position players reported yesterday and the first full squad workout is scheduled for today...games begin on Thursday, March 14 and minor league camp breaks on March 30.

A's SPRING BROADCASTS: The A's will broadcast all Spring Training games on KTRB 860 AM...Ken Korach, Vince Cotroneo and Ray Fosse will call the action

for most games...Coco Crisp will join the broadcast tomorrow and Donny Baarns will fill in on selected games...the father and son duo of Vince and Dom Cotroneo will team up on Monday, March 11 at Colorado...NBCSCA will air two spring training games against San Francisco tomorrow and March 24...Glen Kuiper joins Ray Fosse in the broadcast booth for those telecasts...NBCSBA will air the A's vs. Giants games on March 25 and 26.

A's IN JAPAN: The A's leave for Japan next Thursday and will open the regular season at the Tokyo Dome with a two-game series against the Seattle Mariners on March 20 and 21...will also play the Nippon Ham Fighters in exhibition games on March 17 and 18...the two regular season games against the Mariners will start at 2:35 am PDT and will air on ESPN...this will mark the third time the A's have opened the regular season in Japan...split a two-game series with Boston in 2008 (lost 6-5 on March 25, won 5-1 on March 26) and split a two-game series with Seattle in 2012 (lost 3-1 on March 22 and won 4-1 on March 29)...there are two players in the A's camp that were on the A's Opening Day roster in Japan in 2012, but both of those players have played for other clubs since then (Blevins, Pennington)...the Tokyo Dome is third ballpark in which Oakland has played a home game...in addition to the Coliseum, the A's played six games in Las Vegas at Cashman Field in 1996.

ATHLETICS BATTING NOTES

#1 FRANKLIN BARRETO: Is 2-for-11 (.182) over his last four games after hitting safely in six straight (8-for-14, .571)...ranks fourth in the Cactus League in on-base percentage (.433), fifth in batting (.370) and OPS (1.026) and tied for fifth in hits (10)...has appeared in six games at second base, three in left field, two in center field and one at shortstop...had six stints with Oakland in 2018 and batted .233 with five home runs and 16 RBI in 32 games.

#8 ERIC CAMPBELL (NR): Singled in the second inning Wednesday night at Seattle after starting the spring 0-for-12...signed to a minor league contract, Nov. 13...spent the entire 2018 season at New Orleans in the Miami organization and batted .313 with six home runs and 68 RBI in 95 games...had a .420 on-base percentage, which ranked second in the PCL and sixth in the minors.

20 MARK CANHA: Hit his first home run of the spring Wednesday night at Seattle and also walked three times...has appeared in five games at first base, two at designated hitter and one in center field...started games at five different positions for the A's last year and batted .249 with a career-high 17 home runs and 52 RBI in 122 games...hit 13 of his 17 home runs against lefties.

#26 MATT CHAPMAN: Has hit safely in each of his last three games (4-for-8, .500) and has reached base safely in all five...earned the American League Gold Glove for third baseman last year, the Platinum Glove for all AL fielders and was named Defensive Player of the Year by Wilson...hit .278 with 24 home runs and 68 RBI in 145 games.

#2 CHRIS DAVIS: Made his first appearance of the spring yesterday and went 0-for-2 with a strikeout in a start at designated hitter...hit a Major League leading and career-high 48 home runs and ranked second with a career-high 123 RBI last year...became the 22nd player in ML history with at least three straight seasons of 40 home runs and 100 RBI, the second Athletic (Jimmie Foxx).

#11 DUSTIN FOWLER: Is 3-for-13 (.231) over his last five games after hitting safely in five straight (5-for-14, .357)...has appeared in seven games in center field, seven in right field and one in left field...batted .224 with six home runs and 23 RBI in 69 games over two stints with Oakland last year...made 45 starts, all in games started by a right-handed pitcher.

#17 ROBBIE GROSSMAN: Is 4-for-13 (.308) over his last three games after going 2-for-12 (.167) over his first five contests...has appeared exclusively in left field on defense...was signed as a free agent, Feb. 15...batted .273 in a career-high 129 games with Minnesota last year...added a .367 on-base percentage, which was 10th best in the AL among players with at least 450 PA.

#3 NICK HUNDLEY (NR): Is 1-for-8 (.125) over his last four games after going 4-for-9 (.444) over his first four contests...spent the entire 2018 season with San Francisco and batted .241 with 10 home runs and 31 RBI in 96 games...hit .280 with seven of his 10 home runs against left-handed pitchers compared to .213 against right-handers.

#22 RAMON LAUREANO: Had his second two-hit game of the spring Thursday night at San Francisco...has appeared exclusively in center field on defense...spent the first four months of 2018 with Nashville where he batted .297 with 14 home runs and 35 RBI in 64 games...was recalled by Oakland Aug. 3 and hit .288 with five home runs and 19 RBI in 48 games in his ML debut.

#12 SEAN MURPHY (NR): Homered in his first game of the spring but is 0-for-11 in 10 games since then...spent most of the 2018 season at Double-A Midland where he hit .288 with eight home runs and 43 RBI in 68 games...also had three games at Triple-Nashville and two with the A's affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League and hit a career-high .285 in 73 games overall.

#64 SHELDON NEUSE (NR): Had his second triple Wednesday night at Seattle, which is tied for the Cactus League lead...made his Triple-A debut in 2018 and spent the entire season at Nashville...batted .263 with five home runs and 55 RBI in 135 games...was batting .224 with a .588 OPS in 84 games at the All-Star Break...then hit .321 with a .774 OPS in 49 games after the break.

#28 MATT OLSON: Went 1-for-2 in his first game but is 2-for-21 (.095) in seven games since then...has appeared exclusively at first base...played in all 162 games last year and batted .247 with 29 home runs and 84 RBI in his first full season in the majors...also won the American League Gold Glove Award for first basemen...led AL first baseman in home runs.

#7 CLIFF PENNINGTON (NR): Had his second two-hit game of the spring Wednesday night at Seattle...has appeared in five games at third base, three at second base and three at shortstop...signed a minor league contract Feb. 15...hit .138 with 16 games with Cincinnati last year and a combined .211 with a home run and 14 RBI in 17 games with Louisville and Round Rock.

#19 JOSH PHEGLEY: Hit his first home run yesterday against San Diego and is 3-for-7 (.429) over his last two games after going 4-for-15 (.267) over his first six...spent most of the first two months of the 2018 season at Triple-A Nashville, where he batted .235 with three home runs and 18 RBI in 36 games...spent the final four months with Oakland and hit .204 with two home runs and 15 RBI in 39 contests with the A's.

#18 CHAD PINDER: Had two doubles yesterday against San Diego and is tied for the Major League lead with five this spring...is tied for third in the Cactus League in extra base hits (6), ranks fourth in OPS (1.033) and fifth in slugging (.640)...has appeared in four games at third base, three at designated hitter, two in left field, one at second base and one at shortstop...batted .258 with 13 HR and 27 RBI in 110 games last year in a season interrupted by two stints on the DL...became the first player in Oakland history to start at least one game at seven positions.

#25 STEPHEN PISCOTTY: Is 2-for-14 (.143) over his last five games after going 3-for-6 (.500) over his first three...has appeared exclusively in right field...batted .267 with 41 doubles, 27 home runs and 88 RBI in 151 games in his first season with Oakland last year...had career highs in doubles, home runs, RBI, extra base hits (68) and total bases (268).

#23 JURICKSON PROFAR: Is 4-for-12 (.333) with a home run and five RBI over his last four games after going 1-for-10 (.100) over his first four games...has appeared exclusively at second base...was acquired from Texas Dec. 21 in a three-team, seven-player trade...had career highs in nearly every offensive category last year as he batted .254 with 20 home runs and 77 RBI in 146 games.

#10 MARCUS SEMIEN: Is 3-for-7 (.429) over his last two games after going 0-for-9 over his previous four contests...has appeared exclusively at shortstop...batted .255 with 15 home runs and 70 RBI in 159 games last year...had career highs in runs (89), hits (161), doubles (35), walks (61) and steals (14) and matched his high in games...had his fourth consecutive season with 10 or more homers and 10 or more steals.

#53 RHP TANNER ANDERSON: Is scheduled to make his fourth appearance and first start of the spring...has not allowed a run in two of his three outings...was acquired from the Pittsburgh Pirates Nov. 20 for a player to be named later (Wilkin Ramos on Dec. 1)...made his Major League debut with Pittsburgh last year and went 1-0 with a 6.35 ERA in six relief appearances over three stints with the Pirates.
