OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-7) VS. COLORADO ROCKIES (6-10-2)

ABOUT THE A'S: Swept a split squad yesterday and are now 9-2 over the last 11 games after starting the spring 1-5...are 10-7 overall, which is tied for the fourth best record in the Cactus League...have three games remaining in Arizona before leaving for Japan on Thursday...are scheduled to play 23 games this spring (have three in the Bay Area against San Francisco after the trip to Japan), plus two exhibition games in Tokyo...the 23 games will be the fewest by an A's team during the spring since 1980 when they had 20...have not had a winning record during the spring since going 22-11-2 in 2015...went 14-16-2 (.469) last spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League...it marked the third consecutive year Oakland has finished with a losing record during the spring and it is the third time in Oakland history the A's have posted a losing record in at least three consecutive springs...also did it in three straight years from 2009-11 and four straight from 1974-77...this is the A's 51st Spring Training in Arizona, their fifth since returning to Mesa in 2015 after a 36-year absence...after training in Bradenton, Florida in 1968, the A's came west to Arizona in 1969 and trained in Mesa from 1969-78...moved to Scottsdale in 1979 and then spent 33 seasons at Phoenix Municipal Stadium from 1982-2014.

THIS AND THAT: The A's pitching staff has compiled a 3.87 ERA (46 er in 107.0 ip) over the last 12 games after posting a 9.48 ERA over the first five contests...have surrendered 17 home runs, which is tied for third fewest in the Cactus League...have the third highest opponents batting average (.281)...the A's rank second to last in the CL in runs (77), strikeouts (126), batting average (.242), on-base percentage (.315), slugging percentage (.410) and OPS (.726) and are tied for the third fewest home runs (17)...since 1991 (the earliest year spring stats are available), the A's lowest batting average during the spring is .256 in 2011 and the lowest on-base percentage is .325 in 2018.

A's vs. ROCKIES: This is the second and final meeting between the A's and Rockies this spring...Oakland won the first game at Hohokam on March 1, 6-3...the A's lost the only game last spring on March 22 in Mesa by a score of 4-2...are now 1-3 against Colorado over the last three springs after winning eight of 10 games prior to that.

IN CAMP: After optioning three players and reassigning four to the minor league camp yesterday, the A's now have 38 players in camp plus two on the 60-day disabled list (Gossett, Manaea)...the active total includes 32 players on the 40-man roster, which is full, and six non-roster invitees...the breakdown includes 19 pitchers, four catchers, eight infielders and seven outfielders...the A's must reduce the active 40-man roster to 28 players by Opening Day in Tokyo and must designate three players as inactive for the two-game series against Seattle.

COACHING STAFF: Manager Bob Melvin, beginning his eighth full season with the A's, returns his entire coaching staff...returning will be bench coach Ryan Christenson, hitting coach Darren Bush, pitching coach Scott Emerson, assistant hitting coach Mike Aldrete, first base coach Al Pedrique, third base coach Matt Williams, bullpen coach Marcus Jensen and quality control coach Mark Kotsay.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have three players under contract beyond the 2019 season...Joakim Soria and Mike Fiers are signed through 2020 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023...Yusmeiro Petit has a club option for 2020.

OFF SEASON MOVES: The A's signed four free agents prior to the start of camp: Marco Estrada, Mike Fiers (re-signed with Oakland after he was non-tendered following the season), Chris Herrmann and Joakim Soria...the A's also acquired two players via trade, including Tanner Anderson (Pittsburgh, Nov. 20) and Jurickson Profar (Texas in three team trade, Dec. 21)...after pitchers and catchers reported, the A's signed Brett Anderson on Feb. 13 and Robbie Grossman on Feb. 15.

MINOR LEAGUE DATES: Minor league camp is underway with the first full squad workout taking place last Saturday...games begin on Thursday and minor league camp breaks on March 30.

A'S SPRING BROADCASTS: The A's will broadcast all Spring Training games on KTRB 860 AM...Ken Korach, Vince Cotroneo and Ray Fosse will call the action for most games and Donny Baarns will fill in on selected games...the father and son duo of Vince and Dom Cotroneo will team up today at Colorado...NBCSCA has one remaining broadcast on March 24 in Oakland against San

Francisco...Glen Kuiper joins Ray Fosse in the broadcast booth for that telecast...NBCSBA will air the A's vs. Giants games on March 25 and 26.

A'S IN JAPAN: The A's leave for Japan on Thursday and will open the regular season at the Tokyo Dome with a two-game series against the Seattle Mariners on March 20 and 21...will also play the Nippon Ham Fighters in exhibition games on March 17 and 18...the two regular season games against the Mariners will start at 2:35 am PDT and will air on ESPN...this will mark the third time the A's have opened the regular season in Japan...split a two-game series with Boston in 2008 (lost 6-5 on March 25, won 5-1 on March 26) and split a two-game series with Seattle in 2012 (lost 3-1 on March 22 and won 4-1 on March 29)...there are two players in the A's camp that were on the A's Opening Day roster in Japan in 2012, but both of those players have played for other clubs since then (Blevins, Pennington)...the Tokyo Dome is third ballpark in which Oakland has played a home game...in addition to the Coliseum, the A's played six games in Las Vegas at Cashman Field in 1996.

OPENING SERIES MATCH-UPS: A's manager Bob Melvin named RHP Mike Fiers as the A's Opening Day starter for March 20 against the Mariners in Tokyo...he will be followed by RHP Marco Estrada in game two...Fiers will be making his first career Opening Day start and will be the A's 12th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 14 years...the Mariners will counter with LHP Marco Gonzales on Wednesday and LHP Yusei Kikuchi on Thursday.

ATHLETICS BATTING NOTES

#1 FRANKLIN BARRETO: Is tied for second in the Cactus League in doubles (4), ranks third in batting (.387), tied for fourth in hits (12), fifth in on-base percentage (.457), tied for sixth in slugging (.613) and seventh in OPS (1.070)...has appeared in seven games at second base, three in left field, three in center field and one at shortstop...had six stints with Oakland in 2018 and batted .233 with five home runs and 16 RBI in 32 games.

#8 ERIC CAMPBELL (NR): Is 2-for-6 (.333) with five walks over his last four games after going 0-for-12 with no walks over his first 11 contests...signed to a minor league contract, Nov. 13...spent the entire 2018 season at New Orleans in the Miami organization and batted .313 with six home runs and 68 RBI in 95 games...had a .420 on-base percentage, which ranked second in the PCL and sixth in the minors.

#20 MARK CANHA: Is 4-for-12 (.333) with three walks over his last four games after going 2-for-14 (.143) with one walk over his first seven contests...has appeared in five games at first base, two at designated hitter, two in center field and one in left field...started games at five different positions for the A's last year and batted .249 with a career-high 17 home runs and 52 RBI in 122 games...hit 13 of his 17 home runs against lefties.

#26 MATT CHAPMAN: Is 0-for-5 over his last two games after reaching base safely in each of his first five...earned the American League Gold Glove for third baseman last year, the Platinum Glove for all AL fielders and was named Defensive Player of the Year by Wilson...hit .278 with 24 home runs and 68 RBI in 145 games.

#2 CHRIS DAVIS: Made his first appearance of the spring Friday and is 0-for-8 in three games...hit a Major League leading and career-high 48 home runs and ranked second with a career-high 123 RBI last year...became the 22nd player in ML history with at least three straight seasons of 40 home runs and 100 RBI, the second Athletic (Jimmie Foxx).

#11 DUSTIN FOWLER: Went 3-for-5 with a double yesterday at Chicago (AL) after going 3-for-15 (.200) over his previous six games...has appeared in eight games in right field, seven in center field and two in left field...batted .224 with six home runs and 23 RBI in 69 games over two stints with Oakland last year...made 45 starts, all in games started by a right-handed pitcher.

#17 ROBBIE GROSSMAN: Is 5-for-17 (.294) over his last five games after going 2-for-12 (.167) over his first five contests...has struck out just once in 32 plate appearances...has appeared exclusively in left field on defense...was signed as a free agent, Feb. 15...batted .273 in a career-high 129 games with Minnesota last year...added a .367 on-base percentage, which was 10th best in the American League among players with at least 450 plate appearances.

#3 NICK HUNDLEY (NR): Is 2-for-13 (.154) over his last six games after going 4-for-9 (.444) over his first four contests...spent the entire 2018 season with San Francisco and batted .241 with 10 home runs and 31 RBI in 96 games...hit .280 with seven of his 10 home runs against left-handed pitchers compared to .213 against right-handers.

#22 RAMON LAUREANO: Five of his six hits this spring are for extra bases (three doubles, two home runs)...has appeared exclusively in center field on defense...spent the first four months of 2018 with Nashville where he batted .297 with 14 home runs and 35 RBI in 64 games...was recalled by Oakland Aug. 3 and hit .288 with five home runs and 19 RBI in 48 games in his ML debut.

#12 SEAN MURPHY (NR): Snapped a 0-for-12 streak with his ninth inning single Saturday against Milwaukee...spent most of the 2018 season at Double-A Midland where he hit .288 with eight home runs and 43 RBI in 68 games...also had three games at Triple-Nashville and two with the A's affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League and hit a career-high .285 in 73 games overall.

#28 MATT OLSON: Went 1-for-2 in his first game but is 2-for-25 (.080) in nine games since then...has appeared exclusively at first base...played in all 162 games last year and batted .247 with 29 home runs and 84 RBI in his first full season in the majors...also won the American League Gold Glove Award for first basemen...led AL first baseman in home runs.

#7 CLIFF PENNINGTON (NR): Is 3-for-7 (.429) with two walks over his last four games...has appeared in five games at third base, five at shortstop and three at second base...signed a minor league contract Feb. 15...hit .138 with 16 games with Cincinnati last year and a combined .211 with a home run and 14 RBI in 17 games with Louisville and Round Rock.

#19 JOSH PHEGLEY: Has homered in back-to-back games...is now 5-for-12 (.417) with three runs, two doubles, two home runs and four RBI over his last three games after going 4-for-15 (.267) over his first six...spent most of the first two months of the 2018 season at Triple-A Nashville, where he batted .235 with three home runs and 18 RBI in 36 games...spent the final four months with Oakland and hit .204 with two home runs and 15 RBI in 39 contests with the A's.

#18 CHAD PINDER: Has back-to-back two-double games and leads the majors with seven doubles this spring...is tied for the lead in extra base hits (8)...ranks fourth in the Cactus League in slugging (.690), fifth in OPS (1.096), tied for sixth in on-base percentage (.406), seventh in batting (.345) and tied for eighth in RBI (9)...has struck out just once 32 plate appearances...has appeared in four games at third base, three at designated hitter, three in left field, one at second base and one at shortstop...last year, he became the first player in Oakland history to start at least one game at seven different positions.

#25 STEPHEN PISCOTTY: Is 3-for-18 (.167) over his last seven games after going 3-for-6 (.500) over his first three...has appeared exclusively in right field...batted .267 with 41 doubles, 27 home runs and 88 RBI in 151 games in his first season with Oakland last year...had career highs in doubles, home runs, RBI, extra base hits (68) and total bases (268).

#23 JURICKSON PROFAR: Is 4-for-17 (.235) with a home run and five RBI over his last six games after going 1-for-10 (.100) over his first four games...has appeared exclusively at second base...was acquired from Texas Dec. 21 in a three-team, seven-player trade...had career highs in nearly every offensive category last year as he batted .254 with 20 home runs and 77 RBI in 146 games.

#10 MARCUS SEMIEN: Is 5-for-14 (.357) over his last four games after going 0-for-9 over his previous four contests...has appeared exclusively at shortstop...batted .255 with 15 home runs and 70 RBI in 159 games last year...had career highs in runs (89), hits (161), doubles (35), walks (61) and steals (14) and matched his high in games...had his fourth consecutive season with 10 or more homers and 10 or more steals.

#30 LHP BRETT ANDERSON: Is scheduled to make his third start of the spring...began the 2018 season at Triple-A Nashville before he was selected by Oakland on May 2...went 4-5 with a 4.48 ERA in 17 starts with the A's in a season that was interrupted by two stints on the disabled list...was out from May 19 to July 7 with a strained left shoulder and Aug. 28 to Sept. 12 with a strained left forearm.

#40 RHP CHRIS BASSITT: Tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in his last appearance after allowing three runs in 3.0 innings over his first two...had seven stints with Oakland last year in his return to the majors following "Tommy John" surgery in 2016...went 2-3 with a 3.02 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in 11 games, including seven starts...was also 5-5 with a 4.30 ERA in 18 games, including 14 starts, with Triple-A Nashville.

#16 RHP LIAM HENDRIKS: Allowed his first run yesterday at Chicago (AL) after starting the spring with four scoreless outings (4.0 ip)...opponents are 2-for-17 (.118) with no walks...was on the A's Opening Day roster last year and compiled a 7.36 ERA and .362 opponents batting average in 13 relief appearances before he was outrighted July 2...returned to Oakland Sept. 1 and was used primarily as the A's "opener" the rest of the season...was 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA and .188 opponents batting average in his eight starts and the A's were 4-4 in those games.
