OAKLAND ATHLETICS (11-8) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (13-13-4)

SUNDAY, MARCH 24, 2019 – OAKLAND COLISEUM – 1:07 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's resume Spring Training after opening the regular season by losing two games to Seattle in Tokyo on Wednesday and Thursday... had a win and a tie in two exhibition games with Nippon Ham in Japan that do not count in the spring statistics...are 10-3 over the last 13 games after starting the spring 1-5...are 11-8 (.578) overall, which is the third best record among Cactus League teams and sixth best in the majors...are scheduled to play just 22 games, which are the fewest by an A's team during the spring since 1980 when they had 20...had two games cancelled because of rain during the spring for the first time since 2003...have snapped their streak of three consecutive springs with a losing record and need one more win to clinch their first winning record during the spring since going 22-11-2 in 2015...this is the A's 51st Spring Training in Arizona, their fifth since returning to Mesa in 2015 after a 36-year absence...after training in Bradenton, Florida in 1968, the A's came west to Arizona in 1969 and trained in Mesa from 1969-78...moved to Scottsdale in 1979 and then spent 33 seasons at Phoenix Municipal Stadium from 1982-2014.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have allowed 38 runs in the last five spring games after surrendering 26 runs over the previous nine contests...have a 5.69 ERA overall, which is third highest among Cactus League teams...have the second highest opponents batting average (.289)...the A's are batting .313 (43-for-137) with 27 runs scored over the last four spring games...however, are hitting .251 overall, which is second lowest in the CL...have the third lowest OPS (.747), fourth lowest on-base percentage (.322) and fifth lowest slugging percentage (.425)...since 1991 (the earliest year spring stats are available), the A's lowest batting average during the spring is .256 in 2011 and the lowest on-base percentage is .325 last year.

A's vs. GIANTS: This is the third of five meetings between the A's and Giants this spring...the A's have won the first two games, winning 5-1 in Scottsdale on March 7 and 5-4 at Hohokam on March 10...will also meet in San Francisco on Monday and Tuesday night...the A's went 2-3 against San Francisco last year, winning 8-3 at Scottsdale on March 17 and losing 6-5 at Mesa on March 12...lost in Oakland 5-1 on March 25 and split two games in San Francisco, winning 9-2 in 10 innings on March 26 and losing 3-0 on March 27... have a seven-game winning streak at Scottsdale and have not lost there since March 21, 2014...Oakland is now 23-12 over its last 35 spring games against the Giants.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 37 players on the roster for the Bay Bridge Series, which includes 28 players from the 40-man roster, three non-roster invitees (Blevins, Campbell, Pennington) and six players from the minor league camp (Beck, Merrill, Romero, Schlitter, Taylor, Wang)...prior to the resumption of the regular season on Thursday, the A's must reduce their active roster to 25.

NUMBER CHANGES: Robbie Grossman has switched to #8 and Cliff Pennington will wear #15...Mike Aldrete returns to #17 and Mark Kotsay is #7.

COACHING STAFF: Manager Bob Melvin, beginning his eighth full season with the A's, returns his entire coaching staff...returning will be bench coach Ryan Christenson, hitting coach Darren Bush, pitching coach Scott Emerson, assistant hitting coach Mike Aldrete, first base coach Al Pedrique, third base coach Matt Williams, bullpen coach Marcus Jensen and quality control coach Mark Kotsay.

OFF SEASON MOVES: The A's signed four free agents prior to the start of camp: Marco Estrada, Mike Fiers (re-signed with Oakland after he was non-tendered following the season), Chris Herrmann and Joakim Soria...the A's also acquired two players via trade, including Tanner Anderson (Pittsburgh, Nov. 20) and Jurickson Profar (Texas in three team trade, Dec. 21)...after pitchers and catchers reported, the A's signed Brett Anderson on Feb. 13 and Robbie Grossman on Feb. 15.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have three players under contract beyond the 2019 season...Joakim Soria and Mike Fiers are signed through 2020 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023...Yusmeiro Petit has a club option for 2020.

A'S SPRING BROADCASTS: The A's will broadcast all Spring Training games on KTRB 860 AM...Ken Korach and Vince Cotroneo will call the action for the remaining games with Ray Fosse returning to the booth on March 25 and 26...NBCSCA will broadcast the game today, with Glen Kuiper and Ray Fosse in the broadcast booth...NBCSBA will air the A's vs. Giants games on March 25 and 26.

THE SEASON RESUMES: The A's resume the regular season on Thursday when they open a four-game series against the Los Angeles Angels...have the Coliseum opener on Thursday, March 28 at 1:07, followed by a 7:07 game on Friday, 6:07 on Saturday and 1:07 on Sunday...will play 18 games in 18 days from March 28 to April 14...that is the A's longest stretch of the season without a scheduled day off.

REGULAR SEASON NOTES: The A's have started the season 0-2 for the second time in the last three years (also 2016)...have not started the season 0-3 since 1996...the A's had no rookies on the Opening Day roster for the second consecutive season and third time in the last six years...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.48 years, which is the oldest A's Opening Day roster since 2004 (30.16)...at the age of 42 years and 2 days, Fernando Rodney is the oldest Athletic on an Opening Day roster since Bobo Newsom of the Philadelphia A's in 1953 (45 years, 246 days)...the A's began the season with five players on the injured list for the fourth consecutive year.

ATHLETICS BATTING NOTES

#91 AUSTIN BECK (MC): Was brought up from minor league camp for the three games with San Francisco...is 1-for-7 (.143) with a RBI in three spring training games...hit .296 with 29 doubles and 60 RBI in 123 games with Single-A Beloit last year.

#1 FRANKLIN BARRETO: Ranks third in the Cactus League in on-base percentage (.459), fourth in batting (.375), fifth in OPS (1.053) and eighth in slugging (.594)...has appeared in seven games at second base, four in center field, three in left field and one at shortstop...has a .359 (42-for-117) average over the last three springs...appeared in one game against Seattle on Thursday and pinch ran...had six stints with Oakland in 2018 and batted .233 with five home runs and 16 RBI in 32 games.

#8 ERIC CAMPBELL (NR): Is 3-for-7 (.429) with five walks over his last five games after going 0-for-12 with no walks over his first 11 contests...signed to a minor league contract, Nov. 13...spent the entire 2018 season at New Orleans in the Miami organization and batted .313 with a .420 on-base percentage, which ranked second in the PCL and sixth in the minors.

#20 MARK CANHA: Is 6-for-18 (.333) with three walks and six RBI over his last six games after going 2-for-14 (.143) with one walk and no RBI over his first seven contests...has appeared in five games at first base, three at designated hitter, two in center field, one in left field and one in right field...appeared in one game against Seattle on Thursday and went 0-for-1 with a walk...started games at five different positions for the A's last year and batted .249 with a career-high 17 home runs and 52 RBI in 122 games.

#26 MATT CHAPMAN: Reached base safely in all eight plate appearances in two games against Nippon Ham (5-for-5, three walks)...homed and drove in three runs on Opening Day against Seattle on Wednesday...earned the American League Gold Glove for third baseman last year, the Platinum Glove for all AL fielders and was named Defensive Player of the Year by Wilson.

#2 KHRIS DAVIS: Went 3-for-9 with a home run and five RBI in two exhibition games against Nippon Ham and 2-for-9 (.222) with a home run and four RBI in two regular season games against Seattle...hit a Major League leading and career-high 48 home runs and ranked second with a career-high 123 RBI last year.

#8 ROBBIE GROSSMAN: Has hit safely in each of his last seven spring games (7-for-22, .318) after going 2-for-12 (.167) over his first five contests...has appeared exclusively in left field on defense...pinch hit in each of the two regular season games against Seattle...was signed as a free agent, Feb. 15...batted .273 in a career-high 129 games with Minnesota last year.

#3 NICK HUNDLEY: Is 3-for-15 (.200) over his last seven games after going 4-for-9 (.444) over his first four contests...was the A's Opening Day starter at catcher and went 0-for-4 in two games against the Mariners...spent the entire 2018 season with San Francisco and batted .241 with 10 home runs and 31 RBI in 96 games.

#22 RAMON LAUREANO: Is 5-for-14 (.357) over his last five games after going 3-for-19 (.158) over his first eight contests...six of his eight hits are for extra bases (four doubles, two home runs)...ranks 10th in the Cactus League in slugging (.545)...has appeared exclusively in center field on defense...was the A's Opening Day starter in center field and went 2-for-10 (.200) in two games against Seattle...made his Major League debut with Oakland last year and hit .288 with five home runs and 19 RBI in 48 games.

#81 KEVIN MERRELL (MC): Was brought up from minor league camp for the three games with San Francisco...is 3-for-5 (.600) with a walk in six spring training games...batted a combined .291 in 71 games with three teams in the A's farm system last year.

#15 CLIFF PENNINGTON (NR): Is 4-for-9 (.444) with two walks over his last five games...has appeared in five games at third base, five at shortstop and four at second base...signed a minor league contract Feb. 15...hit .138 in 16 games with Cincinnati last year and a combined .211 with a home run and 14 RBI in 17 games with Louisville and Round Rock.

#19 JOSH PHEGLEY: Is 5-for-13 (.385) with three runs, two doubles, two home runs and four RBI over his last four games after going 4-for-15 (.267) over his first six...went 0-for-4 in two regular season games against Seattle...spent the final four months of the 2018 season with Oakland and hit .204 with two home runs and 15 RBI in 39 contests with the A's.

#18 CHAD PINDER: Has hit safely in each of his last five spring games and is 7-for-16 (.438) with four doubles, two home runs and six RBI over that span...is tied for third in the Cactus League in doubles (7) and tied for fourth in extra base hits (9)...also doubled in each of the two games against Seattle in Japan and was 3-for-10 in two starts in left field...has struck out just once 34 spring training plate appearances...has appeared in four games at third base, three at designated hitter, three in left field, two at shortstop and one at second base...last year, he became the first player in Oakland history to start at least one game at seven different positions.

#25 STEPHEN PISCOTTY: Is 3-for-18 (.167) over his last seven games after going 3-for-6 (.500) over his first three...has appeared exclusively in right field...hit safely in both exhibition games against Nippon Ham (2-for-7, hr, 2 rbi, bb) and both regular season games against Seattle (2-for-8, hr, rbi, 2 bb)...batted .267 with 41 doubles, 27 home runs and 88 RBI in 151 games in his first season with Oakland last year.

#23 JURICKSON PROFAR: Is 1-for-11 over his last four games after going 4-for-12 (.333) with five RBI over his previous four contests...has appeared exclusively at second base...hit safely in each of the two regular season games against Seattle (2-for-10, .200)...was acquired from Texas Dec. 21 in a three-team, seven-player trade...had career highs in nearly every offensive category last year, batting .254 with 20 home runs and 77 RBI in 146 games.

#10 MARCUS SEMIEN: Is 8-for-20 (.400) with five runs, two doubles, a triple and a home run over his last six spring games...has appeared exclusively at shortstop...went 4-for-8 (.500) with two RBI and two walks in two games against Seattle...batted .255 with 15 home runs and 70 RBI in 159 games last year.

#46 BEAU TAYLOR (MC): Was a non-roster invitee this spring before he was reassigned to minor league camp March 3...went 1-for-5 (.200) in six games...spent the 2018 season at Triple-A Nashville and batted .248 with three home runs and 39 RBI in 90 games before going 1-for-5 (.200) in seven games in his Major League debut with Oakland in September.

#30 LHP BRETT ANDERSON: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the spring...also started the exhibition game against Nippon Ham on March 18 and had a no decision in a 6-6 tie (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 0 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...did not allow a run in his first start but has allowed at least two in each of his last two...began the 2018 season at Triple-A Nashville before he was selected by Oakland on May 2...went 4-5 with a 4.48 ERA in 17 starts with the A's in a season that was interrupted by two stints on the disabled list...was out from May 19 to July 7 with a strained left shoulder and Aug. 28 to Sept. 12 with a strained left forearm.

#47 RHP FRANKIE MONTAS: Has not allowed an earned run in three of his four spring appearances...his 0.69 ERA is the lowest in the majors this spring...also pitched in relief in the exhibition game against Nippon Ham on March 17 (1.0 ip)...went 5-4 with a 3.88 ERA in 13 games, including 11 starts, over four stints with Oakland last year...was 5-2 with a 3.35 ERA in eight starts during his first stint from May 27 to July 9 and 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five games over his final three stints...was also 4-5 with a 4.65 ERA in 15 games, all starts, with Triple-A Nashville.
