OAKLAND ATHLETICS (12-8) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (13-14-4)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's shut out the Giants yesterday 5-0 to clinch a winning record during the spring for the first time since going 22-11-2 in 2015...are 11-3 over the last 14 games after starting the spring 1-5...are 12-8 (.600) overall, which is tied with Kansas City for the best record among Cactus League teams and tied for third best in the majors...are scheduled to play just 22 games, which are the fewest by an A's team during the spring since 1980 when they had 20...had two games cancelled because of rain during the spring for the first time since 2003...this is the A's 51st Spring Training in Arizona, their fifth since returning to Mesa in 2015 after a 36-year absence... after training in Bradenton, Florida in 1968, the A's came west to Arizona in 1969 and trained in Mesa from 1969-78...moved to Scottsdale in 1979 and then spent 33 seasons at Phoenix Municipal Stadium from 1982-2014.

THIS AND THAT: The A's had four hits yesterday and are now batting .246 with a .317 on-base percentage...both of those marks are second lowest among Cactus League teams (Los Angeles-NL, .238 and .310)...since 1991 (the earliest year spring stats are available), the A's lowest batting average during the spring is .256 in 2011 and the lowest on-base percentage is .325 last year...have the fourth lowest OPS (.744) and fifth lowest slugging percentage (.427)...yesterday's shutout of San Francisco was the A's second of the spring and it marks the second consecutive season Oakland has two spring shutouts...however, have a 5.40 ERA overall, which is fifth highest among Cactus League teams...have the third highest opponents batting average (.281)...have a .980 fielding percentage, which is fifth best in the CL.

A's vs. GIANTS: This is the fourth of five scheduled meetings between the A's and Giants this spring...the A's have won the first three games, winning 5-1 in Scottsdale on March 7, 5-4 at Hohokam on March 10 and 5-0 in Oakland yesterday...will meet again here in San Francisco tomorrow night...the A's went 2-3 against San Francisco last year, winning 8-3 at Scottsdale on March 17 and losing 6-5 at Mesa on March 12...lost in Oakland 5-1 on March 25 and split two games in San Francisco, winning 9-2 in 10 innings on March 26 and losing 3-0 on March 27...have a seven-game winning streak at Scottsdale and have not lost there since March 21, 2014...Oakland is now 24-12 over its last 35 spring games against the Giants.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 37 players on the roster for the Bay Bridge Series, which includes 28 players from the 40-man roster, three non-roster invitees (Blevins, Campbell, Pennington) and six players from the minor league camp (Beck, Merrill, Romero, Schlitter, Taylor, Wang)...prior to the resumption of the regular season on Thursday, the A's must reduce their active roster to 25.

COACHING STAFF: Manager Bob Melvin, beginning his eighth full season with the A's, returns his entire coaching staff...returning will be bench coach Ryan Christenson, hitting coach Darren Bush, pitching coach Scott Emerson, assistant hitting coach Mike Aldrete, first base coach Al Pedrique, third base coach Matt Williams, bullpen coach Marcus Jensen and quality control coach Mark Kotsay.

OFF SEASON MOVES: The A's signed four free agents prior to the start of camp: Marco Estrada, Mike Fiers (re-signed with Oakland after he was non-tendered following the season), Chris Herrmann and Joakim Soria...the A's also acquired two players via trade, including Tanner Anderson (Pittsburgh, Nov. 20) and Jurickson Profar (Texas in three team trade, Dec. 21)...after pitchers and catchers reported, the A's signed Brett Anderson on Feb. 13 and Robbie Grossman on Feb. 15.

A's SPRING BROADCASTS: The A's will broadcast all Spring Training games on KTRB 860 AM...Ken Korach, Vince Cotroneo and Ray Fosse will call the action for the remaining games...NBCSBA will air the A's vs. Giants games tonight and tomorrow

THE SEASON RESUMES: The A's resume the regular season on Thursday when they open a four-game series against the Los Angeles Angels...the match-ups feature RHP Mike Fiers against RHP Trevor Cahill on Thursday at 1:07, RHP Marco Estrada against RHP Matt Harvey on Friday at 7:07, LHP Brett Anderson against RHP Felix Pena on Saturday at 6:07 and TBA vs. LHP Tyler Skaggs on Sunday at 1:07...will play 18 games in 18 days from March 28 to April 14...that is the A's longest stretch of the season without a scheduled day off.

REGULAR SEASON NOTES: The A's have started the season 0-2 for the second time in the last three years (also 2016)...have not started the season 0-3 since 1996...the A's had no rookies on the Opening Day roster for the second consecutive season and third time in the last six years...the average age on

the A's Opening Day roster was 29.48 years, which is the oldest A's Opening Day roster since 2004 (30.16)...at the age of 42 years and 2 days, Fernando Rodney is the oldest Athletic on an Opening Day roster since Bobo Newsom of the Philadelphia A's in 1953 (45 years, 246 days)...the A's began the season with five players on the injured list for the fourth consecutive year.

ATHLETICS BATTING NOTES

#1 FRANKLIN BARRETO: Ranks fourth in the Cactus League in on-base percentage (.447), fifth in batting (.364) and OPS (1.023) and eighth in slugging (.576)...has appeared in seven games at second base, five in center field, three in left field, one in right field and one at shortstop...has a .356 (42-for-118) average over the last three springs...appeared in one game against Seattle on Thursday and pinch ran...had six stints with Oakland in 2018 and batted .233 with five home runs and 16 RBI in 32 games.

#20 MARK CANHA: Is 6-for-21 (.286) with three walks and six RBI over his last seven spring games after going 2-for-14 (.143) with one walk and no RBI over his first seven contests...has appeared in six games at first base, three at designated hitter, two in center field, one in left field and one in right field...appeared in one game against Seattle on Thursday and went 0-for-1 with a walk...started games at five different positions for the A's last year and batted .249 with a career-high 17 home runs and 52 RBI in 122 games.

#26 MATT CHAPMAN: Reached base safely in all eight plate appearances in two games against Nippon Ham (5-for-5, three walks)...homered and drove in three runs on Opening Day against Seattle last Wednesday...earned the American League Gold Glove for third baseman last year, the Platinum Glove for all AL fielders and was named Defensive Player of the Year by Wilson.

#2 KHRIS DAVIS: Went 3-for-9 with a home run and five RBI in two exhibition games against Nippon Ham and 2-for-9 (.222) with a home run and four RBI in two regular season games against Seattle...hit a Major League leading and careerhigh 48 home runs and ranked second with a career-high 123 RBI last year.

#8 ROBBIE GROSSMAN: Went 0-for-4 yesterday to snap a seven-game spring hitting streak (7-for-22, .318)...has appeared exclusively in left field on defense... pinch hit in each of the two regular season games against Seattle...was signed as a free agent, Feb. 15...batted .273 in a career-high 129 games with Minnesota last year.

#3 NICK HUNDLEY: Is 3-for-18 (.167) over his last eight spring games after going 4-for-9 (.444) over his first four contests...was the A's Opening Day starter at catcher and went 0-for-4 in two games against the Mariners...spent the entire 2018 season with San Francisco and batted .241 with 10 home runs and 31 RBI in 96 games.

#22 RAMON LAUREANO: Hit his team-leading third home run of the spring yesterday and seven of his nine hits are for extra bases (also has four doubles)...ranks sixth in the Cactus League in slugging (.611) and seventh in OPS (.953)...has appeared exclusively in center field on defense...was the A's Opening Day starter in center field and went 2-for-10 (.200) in two games against Seattle...made his Major League debut with Oakland last year and hit .288 with five home runs and 19 RBI in 48 games.

#19 JOSH PHEGLEY: Is 5-for-13 (.385) with three runs, two doubles, two home runs and four RBI over his last four games after going 4-for-15 (.267) over his first six... went 0-for-4 in two regular season games against Seattle...spent the final four months of the 2018 season with Oakland and hit .204 with two home runs and 15 RBI in 39 contests with the A's.

#18 CHAD PINDER: Is 7-for-17 (.412) with four doubles, two home runs and six RBI over his last six spring games...is tied for third in the Cactus League in doubles (7) and tied for fourth in extra base hits (9) despite playing in just 13 games... also doubled in each of the two games against Seattle in Japan and was 3-for-10 in two starts in left field...has struck out just once 35 spring training plate appearances...has appeared in five games at third base, three at designated hitter, three in left field, two at shortstop and one at second base...last year, he became the first player in Oakland history to start at least one game at seven different positions.

#25 STEPHEN PISCOTTY: Is 4-for-21 (.190) over his last eight spring games after going 3-for-6 (.500) over his first three...has appeared exclusively in right field... hit safely in both exhibition games against Nippon Ham (2-for-7, hr, 2 rbi, bb) and both regular season games against Seattle (2-for-8, hr, rbi, 2 bb)...batted .267 with 41 doubles, 27 home runs and 88 RBI in 151 games in his first season with Oakland last year.

#23 JURICKSON PROFAR: Is 2-for-14 (.143) over his last five spring games after going 4-for-12 (.333) with five RBI over his previous four contests...has appeared exclusively at second base...hit safely in each of the two regular season games against Seattle (2-for-10, .200)...was acquired from Texas Dec. 21 in a three-team, seven-player trade...had career highs in nearly every offensive category last year, batting .254 with 20 home runs and 77 RBI in 146 games.

#10 MARCUS SEMIEN: Is 9-for-23 (.391) with five runs, two doubles, a triple and a home run over his last seven spring games...has appeared exclusively at short-stop...went 4-for-8 (.500) with two RBI and two walks in two games against Seattle...batted .255 with 15 home runs and 70 RBI in 159 games last year.

#91 AUSTIN BECK (MC): Was brought up from minor league camp for the three games with San Francisco...is 1-for-7 (.143) with a RBI in eight spring training games...hit .296 with 29 doubles and 60 RBI in 123 games with Single-A Beloit last year...#8 ERIC CAMPBELL (NR): Is 3-for-7 (.429) with five walks over his last five games after going 0-for-12 with no walks over his first 11 contests...signed to a minor league contract, Nov. 13...spent the entire 2018 season at New Orleans in the Miami organization and batted .313 with a .420 on-base percentage, which ranked second in the PCL and sixth in the minors...#81 KEVIN MERRELL (MC): Was brought up from minor league camp for the three games with San Francisco...is 3-for-5 (.600) with a walk in 10 spring training games...batted a combined .291 in 71 games with three teams in the A's farm system last year...#15 CLIFF PENNING-TON (NR): Is 4-for-9 (.444) with two walks over his last six games...has appeared in six games at shortstop, five at third base and four at second base...signed a minor league contract Feb. 15...hit .138 in 16 games with Cincinnati last year and a combined .211 with a home run and 14 RBI in 17 games with Louisville and Round Rock...#46 BEAU TAYLOR (MC): Was a non-roster invitee this spring before he was reassigned to minor league camp March 3...went 1-for-5 (.200) in six games... spent the 2018 season at Triple-A Nashville and batted .248 with three home runs and 39 RBI in 90 games before going 1-for-5 (.200) in seven games in his Major League debut with Oakland in September.
