OAKLAND ATHLETICS (7-8) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (5-6)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won last night, snapping a four-game losing streak...have lost five of the last seven games after winning four in a row...are 6-2 in the Coliseum and 1-6 in all other ballparks...are tied for fourth place in the American League West with Texas...last year, the A's were 5-9 after 14 games and were 6½ games out of first...this is the A's 52nd season in Oakland where they have won 16 AL West titles, three AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18), Atlanta Braves (18) and Los Angeles Dodgers (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (7) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...this is the Athletics franchise 119th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

BACK ON TRACK: The A's have recorded 11+ hits in three straight games after being limited to 13 total hits during the first two games of this road trip...over the last three games, the club is hitting .316 (36-for-114) with 25 runs, 5 doubles, 7 home runs and 23 RBI with a .907 OPS.

SEEING ORANGE: Robbie Grossman is hitting .348 (23-for-66) with 14 runs, 7 doubles, 1 home run and 9 RBI with a .403 on-base percentage and a .500 slugging mark in his career against the Orioles...his .348 average is the 6th-best among active players (min. 65 AB) behind Randal Grichuk (.380), Miguel Cabrera (.366), Andrelton Simmons (.361), Nelson Cruz (.353) and Josh Reddick (.349)...at Oriole Park, he's hitting .400 (10-for-25) with a 1.044 OPS.

A HELPING HAND: Ramón Laureano has 13 outfield assists in 62 career games, including 4 in 14 games this season...the Major League leaders in outfield assist last season had 12 (Andrew Benintendi, Billy Hamilton, Mitch Haniger)...the Oakland A's single-season record for outfield assists belongs to Tony Armas (17 in 158 games) in 1980.

BACKSTOP POP: Josh Phegley extended his hitting streak to a career-best 6 games last night with his third multi-hit effort in his last four games. During the streak, he is hitting .429 (9-for-21) with 7 runs, 2 doubles, 2 home runs and 5 RBI...he has scored a run in each of his last four games (6 total).

EIGHT IS GREAT: The A's number eight hitters in the lineup are hitting a combined .358 (19-for-53) with 12 runs, 1 double, 5 home runs, 14 RBI and a 1.074 OPS...the A's #8 hitters lead the Majors in batting average (.358), hits (19), RBI (14) and are tied for 1st in home runs (4).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-4 on their longest road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Houston (0-3), Baltimore (1-1) and Texas (three games)...went 6-2 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (3-1) and Boston (3-1) and are 6-4 at home (went 0-2 against Seattle in Tokyo as the home team)...are unbeaten over their last 17 series in Oakland (15 wins, two splits), which is the longest series unbeaten streak in Coliseum history...are 38-14 (.731) in the Coliseum over that stretch...have not lost a series in the Coliseum since they were swept by Houston last year, June 12-14...last year, the A's went 50-31 (.617) at home compared to 47-34 (.580) on the road...had the fourth best home record in the AL but tied for the third best road record in the majors...it was the sixth best road record in Oakland history.

18 GAMES IN 18 DAYS: The A's are 7-6 in this stretch where they are scheduled to play 18 games in 18 days from March 28 to April 14...that is the A's longest stretch of the season without a day off...also played two games against Seattle in Japan to start the season and the A's 14 games played are two more than the Mariners, three more than any other team and six more than the team with the fewest games played (Minnesota, 8).

STARTING PITCHING: Brett Anderson allowed just two runs in 6.2 innings, the A's first quality start since April 2nd...his start yesterday was the longest by an A's starter this year...before his start, the A's starting pitchers were 0-3 with a 10.91 ERA (19 er in 15.2 ip) and .416 (32-for-77) opponents batting average in four games on the road trip after going 6-0 with a 1.16 ERA and .163 opponents batting average in eight games on the last homestand...tossed six innings or fewer in each of the first 14 games, the longest such season-opening streak in Oakland history (previous: 12 in 1995)...are averaging 5.02 innings per start...last year, A's starters tossed 824.1 innings, which was the fewest in Athletics history in a non-strike season (5.09 innings per start).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed two errors Monday after making just one miscue over the previous eight games...have five errors for the season and the A's .991 fielding percentage is fourth best in the Major Leagues...A's outfielders have five assists...the most outfield assists in the AL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have faced a lefty starting pitcher in eight of the first 15 games, which is the most in majors...are 5-3 in those games compared to 2-5 when the opposition starts a right-hander...36 of Oakland's 68 runs this year have come on home runs (52.9%)...are 2-3 in one-run games and the five one-run decisions are tied for the most in the majors...have lost twice when leading after seven innings...went 70-2 when leading after seven last year...the A's have used five different first basemen this year (Canha, Morales, Olson, Pinder, Profar) after using just three all last year (Canha, Olson, Pinder)

ROSTER NOTES: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.48 years, which was the oldest A's Opening Day roster since 2004 (30.16)...following the roster moves of March 27 and 28, the average age is now 30.20...only four players have played for Oakland in each of the last five seasons (Canha, Dull, Phegley, Semien) and of those four, only Semien has been on each of the A's last five Opening Day rosters...the A's have no rookies on the Opening Day roster for the second consecutive season and third time in the last six years (also 2014).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's currently have seven players on the injured list (Bassitt, Cotton, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea, Martini, Olson)...four of those players are on the 60-day IL (Cotton, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea) and Bassitt is currently on a rehab assignment...Oakland used the disabled list 26 times last year, which was second most in Oakland history to the record of 27 set in 2016...it marked the fourth consecutive season and eighth time in the last 12 years the A's have used the IL at least 20 times...have had at least four players on the IL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's have split the last two games this season after winning the season series last year, 5-1...won two of three in Baltimore and swept a three-game series in Oakland...over the previous seven seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered years and the Orioles in odd numbered years...have a 25-26 record against Baltimore over the last eight years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 269-267 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 136-135 in Oakland and 133-132 in Baltimore...are 66-58 at Camden Yards...are 1005-947 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...the only other of the other seven original American League franchises that the A's have a winning record against is the Twins/Senators (1009-1007).

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Chad Pinder is hitting .409 (9-for-22) with 5 runs, 1 double, 2 home runs, 6 RBI with a .458 on-base percentage, .727 slugging mark and a 1.186 OPS in his last 9 games...**Khris Davis** is tied for third in the American League with five home runs and has 138 home runs over the last four years, which is 14 more than any other player (Stanton, 124)...**Liam Hendriks** allowed a run in his first outing but has not surrendered a run in seven appearances since then (8.0 ip)...**Ramón Laureano** is 11-for-33 (.333) with two home runs and seven RBI over his last nine games after going 2-for-17 (.118) over his first five contests...leads the Majors in outfield assists (4)...now has 13 over the last two years, which is second most among ML outfielders, despite him not making his ML debut until Aug. 3, 2018...**Jurickson Profar** had a career-high tying 5 RBI (also: June 6, 2018 vs. Oakland) and a career-high tying 4 hits (also: Sept. 2, 2018 vs. Minnesota) last night...Marcus Semien has reached base safely via hit or walk in 14 of his 15 games this season, including reaching base in his last seven games.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1968** the Oakland A's play their first game, a 3-1 loss at Baltimore...John Donaldson collected the A's first hit, a second inning single, and Reggie Jackson hit the first home run, an eighth inning solo shot...in **1975** Mike Norris tossed a complete-game three-hit shutout in his Major League debut in the A's 9-0 win over Chicago...in **1990** Rickey Henderson draws his 1000th career walk in the fourth inning off Minnesota pitcher Roy Smith.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (1-1, 2.45 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...begins his fourth season in the majors and is on his second Opening Day roster (2017 with Oakland)...was available in the bullpen for the two games against Seattle in Japan but did not pitch.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) March 31 in Oakland...tossed six innings and allowed just one run on three hits...allowed a leadoff double to Calhoun, hit Trout and then retired 16 consecutive batters before Calhoun homered with two outs in the sixth...was relieved by Trivino after allowing a double to Bour to start the seventh inning.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss at Houston last Friday...allowed a Bregman RBI single in the third but the A's came back to tie the game in the fourth...surrendered a lead off home run to Correa in the bottom of the fourth to give Houston the lead for good.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-0 with two saves and a 0.56 ERA in five games, including two starts...the ERA was the lowest in the majors and his .190 opponents batting average was second lowest in the Cactus League...led the A's in innings pitched (16.0) and strikeouts (16) and tied for the team lead in wins and saves...did not allow a home run...also pitched in relief in the exhibition game against Nippon Ham on March 17 (1.0 ip).

2018 RECAP: Went 5-4 with a 3.88 ERA in 13 games, including 11 starts, over four stints with Oakland...was 5-2 with a 3.35 ERA in eight starts during his first stint from May 27 to July 9 and 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five games over his final three stints...surrendered just five home runs in 65.0 innings after yielding 10 home runs in 32.0 innings in 2017...struck out 43 batters (5.95 per nine innings) after fanning 56 in 47.0 innings (10.72 per nine innings) over his first two seasons.

2018 OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .290 opponents batting average, including .276 (35-for-127) against right-handed hitters compared to .305 (39-for-128) against left-handers...yielded 20 of his 28 extra base hits to lefties and had a .378 slugging percentage against righties compared to .523 against lefties...now has a .366 career opponents slugging percentage against righties, .591 against lefties...the opponents clean-up hitter went 3-for-27 (.111) against him.

THIS AND THAT: Allowed 14 of his 34 runs in the first inning for an 8.18 ERA...had a 3.00 ERA from the second inning on...was 2-3 with a 4.35 ERA in six games in Oakland, 3-1 with a 3.44 ERA in seven games on the road...was 2-1 with a 2.65 ERA in three interleague starts compared to 3-3 with a 4.31 ERA in 10 games against the American League...batted for the first time as a professional and went 0-for-5 with five strikeouts...the A's were 7-4 (.636) in his 11 starting assignments.

2018 HIGHLIGHTS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 27 and won each of his first three starts, posting a 1.25 ERA and .208 opponents batting average...the winning streak was the longest of his career...struck out a career-high tying seven batters in 6.0 innings in his first start on May 27 against Arizona and was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 victory...no-hit the Diamondbacks over the first five innings...combined with Pagán on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 16-0 win at Kansas City June 1...tossed a career-high eight innings and allowed seven of the hits...had his scoreless streak snapped at a career-high 15.0 innings June 8 against Kansas City...then went 2-2 with a 5.06 ERA and .330 opponents batting average over his next five starts from June 14 to July 9...allowed a career-high seven runs on a career-high 11 hits and a career-high tying four walks in a 7-3 loss to Houston on June 14...tossed a career-high 105 pitches and yielded just one run in 6.2 innings in a 12-4 win at San Diego June 20...tossed 3.0 innings June 26 at

Detroit, matching his shortest outing as a starter...yielded an Oakland record seven doubles July 1 against Cleveland...combined with Trivino and Treinen on a five-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Houston on July 9...tossed 6.0 innings and yielded three of the hits but was optioned to Nashville the next day...was recalled July 24 and went 0-1 with a 5.79 ERA in two starts before he was optioned back to the Sounds July 30...his third stint lasted one day on Aug. 30 when he allowed a career-high tying seven runs on eight hits in 6.0 innings in a 7-1 loss to Seattle Aug. 30...returned to Oakland Sept. 11 and made two appearances following his return, both in relief (1.1 ip, 1 h)...did not pitch after Sept. 19.

2018 WITH NASHVILLE: Was 4-5 with a 4.65 ERA in 15 games, all starts, with Triple-A Nashville...had a .255 opponents batting average, including .189 (18-for-95) against left-handed hitters compared to .290 (51-for-176) against right-handers...surrendered seven home runs, six to righties...had a .519 OPS against lefties, .816 against righties...opponents hit .314 with runners in scoring position but that dropped to .222 with RISP and two outs...allowed a .229 average and five walks (.280 on-base percentage) to batters lead off an inning...was 4-1 with a 3.12 ERA in six starts at home, 0-4 with a 6.99 ERA in six starts on the road...tossed 3.0 innings or fewer in each of his first three starts...allowed a season-high seven hits in 4.0 innings in an 8-6 loss to New Orleans April 28...went 0-3 with a 6.19 ERA in five starts in April and tossed four innings or fewer four times...then went 1-2 with a 3.24 ERA in four starts in May and tossed at least five innings in each start...was credited with his first win of the season May 4 against Memphis when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings of work...struck out a season-high 10 batters in 6.0 innings May 9 against Colorado Springs...tossed a complete game at Memphis on May 14 but was the losing pitcher in a 2-1 loss...allowed two runs on six hits in a season-high eight innings...matched his season high with seven hits in an 11-2 loss at Oklahoma City May 20...was 1-5 with a 4.39 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was promoted to Oakland May 27...was optioned back to Nashville July 10 and tossed 5.0 scoreless innings for his second win July 17 at Omaha...that was his only outing before returning to Oakland July 24 but he was optioned back to the Sounds July 30...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings Aug. 3 against Fresno for the win...then allowed a season-high eight runs on a season-high tying seven hits and a season-high three walks in 4.1 innings at Colorado Springs Aug. 9...however, ended up with a no decision in the Sounds 18-9 win...went 2-0 despite a 5.96 ERA in five starts in August.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Aaron Brooks (1-1, 4.09 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...took the loss in his last start at Houston last Saturday in a 6-0 decision (5.0 ip, 9 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 2 so) after tossing six scoreless innings for the win in his first start on April 1 against Boston...has faced the Orioles twice in his career, both times in relief at Camden Yards (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so, 9.00 ERA)...his last outing came last year on Sept. 12 in the A's 10-0 win (1.0 ip, 1 so)...went 2-1 with a 4.40 ERA and .273 opponents batting average in four games, including three starts, this spring...allowed six runs in 2.0 innings in his first outing but then allowed just one run in 12.1 innings over his final three appearances (0.73 ERA)...spent the entire 2018 season at Triple-A Colorado Springs in the Milwaukee Brewers organization before he was traded to Oakland Sept. 3 for cash considerations...pitched in three games for Oakland in September and did not allow a run in 2.2 innings.

- Pen allowed 6 runs Monday night after compiling 2.45 ERA (8 er in 29.1 ip) over previous eight games...posted 5.32 ERA over the first five contests...had 2.2 scoreless innings last night.
- First batters faced are hitting .327 with a .421 on-base percentage (16-for-49, 7 walks, 1 hbp) against the Oakland bullpen so far this season...the batting average is the fourth highest in the Majors and the OBP is the sixth highest.
- The A's bullpen compiled a 3.35 ERA last year, which was second lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...had the second lowest opponents batting average (.220), on-base percentage (.294), slugging percentage (.364) and OPS (.658) in the majors...the batting average was fifth lowest in Oakland history and the on-base percentage ranked seventh.
- Won 45 games, which were second most in Major League history by a bullpen to the Tampa Bay Rays 55 victories in 2018...had 641.1 innings pitched, which was second most in the majors (TB, 824.1) and third most in Major League history.
- Struck out 627, which was fourth in the AL and the most in A's history.

- Had a save and a 27.00 ERA in five spring training appearances...opponents were 9-for-18 (.500) with seven walks in 3.1 innings.
- Pitched 1.0 scoreless inning with one strikeout when he last faced Baltimore in 2017.

Last Year: Went 6-0 with a 2.75 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in 54 relief appearances in his first season with the A's...allowed just 2-of-30 (6.7%) inherited runners to score, which was the lowest percentage in the majors.

- Was 2-0 with a 1.35 ERA and .130 opponents batting average in a team-leading seven spring training appearances, including one start...the two wins tied for the team lead...did not allow a run in six of his seven outings.
- Threw 1.0 scoreless inning against Baltimore last season...has not allowed an earned run over his last seven appearances against the Orioles, dating back to Aug. 9, 2016 (8.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 0 er, 1 bb, 10 so).

Last Year: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 7.36 ERA in 13 relief appearances before he was outrighted off the 40-man roster July 2...returned to Oakland Sept. 1 and went 0-1 with a 1.38 ERA in 12 games, including eight starts as the opener.

- Posted a 10.13 ERA and .360 opponents batting average in six spring training appearances...allowed two runs in three of those outings.
- Did not allow a run in two of his three outings against Baltimore last season, but allowed three runs in 0.1 ip on May 4 (3.1 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 8.10 ERA).

Last Year: Pitched in a team-leading and career-high 74 games in his first season in Oakland and was 7-3 with a 3.00 ERA and .221 opponents average...the wins were also a career high and his ERA was second lowest to his 2.76 with the Angels in 2017.
