## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (8-8) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (5-7)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won two straight after a four-game losing streak... have lost five of the last eight games after winning four in a row...are 6-2 in the Coliseum and 2-6 in all other ballparks...are tied for fourth place in the American League West with Texas...last year, the A's were 5-9 after 14 games and were 6½ games out of first...this is the A's 52nd season in Oakland where they have won 16 AL West titles, three AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18), Atlanta Braves (18) and Los Angeles Dodgers (17) have more division titles than the A's... since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (7) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...this is the Athletics franchise 119th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

**FINISHING FOUR:** The A's will complete its third 4-game series of the season today...took three of four from both the Angels (March 28-31) & Boston (April 1-4)...over last nine 4-game sets since last June, Oakland is 7-0-2 including 4-game sweeps over Texas (July 23-26) & Detroit (June 25-28, 2018).

**BEAST VS. THE EAST:** Oakland is 5-2 against the American League East this season; 3-1 vs. Boston & 2-1 vs. Baltimore...since the start of the 2018 season, Oakland is 26-13 vs. the Eastern division, including 7-2 against Baltimore...the mark since the start of last season includes a 12-7 road record.

**HOMER HAPPY:** Seattle hit a season-best five home runs last night and have hit 12 home runs over the last four games...before this stretch, collected only three homers over the previous five games...Oakland is 2nd in the Majors with 27 home runs, behind only Seattle (34).

**BACKSTOP POP:** Josh Phegley extended his hitting streak on Tuesday to a career-best 6 games with his third multi-hit effort in his last four games. During the streak, he is hitting .429 (9-for-21) with 7 runs, 2 doubles, 2 home runs and 5 RBI...he has scored a run in each of his last four games (6 total).

**BACK ON TRACK:** The A's have recorded 11+ hits in four straight games after being limited to 13 total hits during the first two games of this road trip... over the last four games, the club is hitting .320 (49-for-153) with 35 runs, 8 doubles, 12 home runs and 33 RBI with a .975 OPS.

**A HELPING HAND:** Ramón Laureano has 13 outfield assists in 63 career games, including 4 in 15 games this season...the MLB leaders in outfield assist last season had 12 (A. Benintendi, B. Hamilton, M. Haniger)...Oakland's single-season record for outfield assists is 17 by Tony Armas in 1980.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-4 on their longest road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Houston (0-3), Baltimore (2-1) and Texas (three games)... went 6-2 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (3-1) and Boston (3-1) and are 6-4 at home (went 0-2 against Seattle in Tokyo as the home team)...are unbeaten over their last 17 series in Oakland (15 wins, two splits), which is the longest series unbeaten streak in Coliseum history...are 38-14 (.731) in the Coliseum over that stretch...have not lost a series in the Coliseum since they were swept by Houston last year, June 12-14...last year, the A's went 50-31 (.617) at home compared to 47-34 (.580) on the road...had the fourth best home record in the AL but tied for the third best road record in the majors...it was the sixth best road record in Oakland history.

**18 GAMES IN 18 DAYS:** The A's are 8-6 in this stretch where they are scheduled to play 18 games in 18 days from March 28 to April 14...that is the A's longest stretch of the season without a day off...also played two games against Seattle in Japan to start the season and the A's 16 games played are two more than the Mariners, three more than any other team and six more than the team with the fewest games played (Minnesota, 8).

**STARTING PITCHING:** Brett Anderson & Frankie Montas have allowed just five runs in 12.2 innings...the back-to-back quality starts were the first consecutive since six startright March 28-April 2...before their starts, the A's starting pitchers were 0-3 with a 10.91 ERA (19 er in 15.2 ip) in four games on the road trip after going 6-0 with a 1.16 ERA and .163 opponents batting average in eight games on the last homestand...tossed six innings or fewer in each of the first 14 games, the longest such season-opening streak in Oakland history (previous: 12 in 1995)...are averaging 5.02 innings per start...last year, A's starters tossed 824.1 innings, which was the fewest in Athletics history in a non-strike season (5.09 innings per start).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's committed two errors Monday after making just one miscue over the previous eight games...have five errors for the season and the A's .991 fielding percentage is fourth best in the Major Leagues...A's outfielders have five assists...the most outfield assists in the AL.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's have faced a lefty starting pitcher in eight of the first 16 games, which is the most in majors...are 5-3 in those games compared to 3-5 when the opposition starts a right-hander...44 of Oakland's 78 runs this year have come on home runs (56.4%)...are 2-3 in one-run games and the five one-run decisions are tied for the most in the majors...have lost twice when leading after seven innings...went 70-2 when leading after seven last year... the A's have used five different first basemen this year (Canha, Morales, Olson, Pinder, Profar) after using just three all last year (Canha, Olson, Pinder).

**ROSTER NOTES:** The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.48 years, which was the oldest A's Opening Day roster since 2004 (30.16)...following the roster moves of March 27 and 28, the average age is now 30.20... only four players have played for Oakland in each of the last five seasons (Canha, Dull, Phegley, Semien) and of those four, only Semien has been on each of the A's last five Opening Day rosters...the A's have no rookies on the Opening Day roster for the second consecutive season and third time in the last six years (also 2014).

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's currently have seven players on the injured list (Bassitt, Cotton, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea, Martini, Olson)...four of those players are on the 60-day IL (Cotton, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea) and Bassitt is currently on a rehab assignment...Oakland used the disabled list 26 times last year, which was second most in Oakland history to the record of 27 set in 2016...it marked the fourth consecutive season and eighth time in the last 12 years the A's have used the IL at least 20 times...have had at least four players on the IL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. ORIOLES:** The A's have won two straight (and two out of three) this season after winning the season series last year, 5-1...won two of three in Baltimore and swept a three-game series in Oakland...over the previous seven seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered years and the Orioles in odd numbered years...have a 26-26 record against Baltimore over the last eight years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 270-267 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 136-135 in Oakland and 134-132 in Baltimore...are 67-58 at Camden Yards...are 1006-947 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...the only other of the other seven original American League franchises that the A's have a winning record against is the Twins/Senators (1009-1007).

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Over the last two games, Oakland is hitting .471 (8-for-17) with 1 double, 2 home runs and 14 RBI with runners in scoring position...**Chad Pinder** is hitting .407 (11-for-27) with 7 runs, 1 double, 3 home runs, 7 RBI with a .448 on-base percentage, .778 slugging mark and a 1.226 OPS in his last 10 games...**Khris Davis** is tied for the Major League lead with seven home runs and has 140 home runs over the last four years, which is 16 more than any other player (Stanton, 124)...**Liam Hendriks** allowed a run in his first outing but has not surrendered a run in seven appearances since then (8.0 ip)...**Ramón Laureano** is 11-for-37 (.297) with two home runs and seven RBI over his last 10 games after going 2-for-17 (.118) over his first five contests...leads the Majors in outfield assists (4)...now has 13 over the last two years, which is second most among ML outfielders, despite him not making his ML debut until Aug. 3, 2018...**Marcus Semien** has reached base safely via hit or walk in 15 of his 16 games this season, including reaching base in his last eight games.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1993 Rickey Henderson's eighth inning home run was the 200th of his career...in 1994 Henderson collects his 231<sup>st</sup> double in an A's uniform, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland career record...Henderson would finish his A's career with 289 doubles...in 2012 Jonny Gomes is hit by a pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12<sup>th</sup> inning to force in the winning run in a 5-4 win over Kansas City...it is the first of 14 "walk-off" wins for the A's in 2012.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Aaron Brooks (1-1, 4.09 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...allowed five runs in five innings for the loss in his last start at Houston after tossing six scoreless innings for the win in his first start on April 1 against Boston...was one of three inactive players for the season-opening two-game series against Seattle in Tokyo and did not make the trip to Japan...begins his fourth season in the majors...pitched for Kansas City in 2014-15 and Oakland in 2015 and 2018.

**FIRST START:** He combined with Buchter, Hendriks, Wendelken and Rodney on a four-hit shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Boston on April 1 in Oakland...tossed six innings and allowed two of the hits while walking one...it was his first big league win since Oct. 2, 2015 at Seattle...allowed only one baserunner past first base (Bogaerts) and he was thrown out by Laureano at the plate trying to score from second.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Houston last Saturday...shut out the Astros on four hits over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 13.2 innings dating back to Oct. 2, 2015...the streak ended on a Gurriel RBI double in the fourth and he allowed four more runs in the fifth on a pair of two-run homers by Springer and Brantley...Miley and four Astros relievers combined to blank the A's on six hits.

**BROOKS vs. BALTIMORE:** Has faced the Orioles twice in his career, both times in relief at Camden Yards (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so, 9.00 ERA)...his last outing came last year on Sept. 12 in the A's 10-0 win (1.0 ip, 1 so)...retired the side in order in the ninth inning...also pitched on Aug. 4, 2015 in the A's 8-6, 13-inning loss (0.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 hr)...relieved Pomeranz after he allowed a one-out double in the bottom of the 13th and surrendered a walk-off home run to Machado.

**2018 RECAP:** Spent the entire season at Triple-A Colorado Springs in the Milwaukee Brewers organization before he was traded to Oakland Sept. 3 for cash considerations...pitched in three games for Oakland in September and did not allow a run in 2.2 innings...opponents went 1-for-8 (.125) with two walks and a strikeout...retired the side in order in the ninth inning in his first outing on Sept. 12 at Baltimore...it was his first Major League appearance since Oct. 2, 2015 at Seattle, also with the A's.

**2018 WITH COLORADO SPRINGS:** Went 9-4 with a 3.35 ERA in 26 games, 15 starts, with the Sky Sox...the ERA was his lowest as a professional...tied for seventh in the Pacific Coast League in wins...allowed eight home runs in 99.1 innings...did not hit a batter...was 4-3 with a 5.45 ERA and .295 opponents batting average over his first 15 games, including seven starts...then went 5-1 with a 2.14 ERA and .242 opponents average over his final 11 games, all starts, beginning June 23...allowed a .263 opponents batting average, including .246 (52-for-211) against right-handed hitters compared to .284 (48-for-169) against left-handers...surrendered six of his eight home runs to righties...seven were solo shots...yielded a .244 batting average with runners in scoring position but opponents were 4-for-7 (.571) with the bases loaded...was 4-2 with a 4.13 ERA in 11 relief appearances compared to 5-2 with a 3.11 ERA in 15 starts...stranded his only inherited runner...tossed at least two innings in seven of his 11 relief appearances...was 4-1 with a 1.80 ERA and .182 opponents batting average in 10 games on the road compared to 5-3 with a 4.20 ERA and .301 opponents average in 16 games at home...compiled a 7-1 record, a 2.37 ERA and .238 opponents batting average in 18 night games, a 2-3 record, a 6.56 ERA and .333 opponents average in eight day games...went 6-for-18 (.333) with two doubles and a RBI as a hitter.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Mike Fiers (2-1, 5.94 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his Major League leading fifth start of the season...has not allowed a run in two of his starts but has surrendered five runs or more in his other two...including his last start last Sunday at Houston when he was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-8 loss (1.2 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 2 so)...the 1.2 innings pitched matched the shortest start of his career...is 3-3 with a 6.16 ERA (49.2 ip, 53 h, 34 r, 34 er, 14 bb, 47 so, 12 hr) in nine career appearances, including eight starts, against Texas...is 3-0 with a 1.47 ERA (3 er in 18.1 ip) over his last three starts after going 0-3 with an 8.90 ERA over his first six games...was 0-0 with an 8.53 ERA in two Cactus League starts this spring...was acquired by the A's from Detroit last year on Aug. 6 and went 5-2 with a 3.74 ERA in 10 games, including nine starts, with Oakland...combined for a 12-8 record and a 3.56 ERA in 31 games, 30 starts, with the A's and Detroit.



## ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

### TEAM

0-4, 4.01 ERA (27 er in 60.2 ip)  
Saves/Opportunities: 3-for-6 (50.0%)

- Pen allowed 6 runs Monday night after compiling 2.45 ERA (8 er in 29.1 ip) over previous eight games...posted 5.32 ERA over the first five contests... had 2.2 scoreless innings on Tuesday and 3.0 last night.
- First batters faced are hitting .314 with a .417 on-base percentage (16-for-51, 8 walks, 1 hbp) against the Oakland bullpen so far this season... the batting average is the seventh highest in the Majors and the OBP is the sixth highest.
- The A's bullpen compiled a 3.35 ERA last year, which was second lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...had the second lowest opponents batting average (.220), on-base percentage (.294), slugging percentage (.364) and OPS (.658) in the majors...the batting average was fifth lowest in Oakland history and the on-base percentage ranked seventh.
- Won 45 games, which were second most in Major League history by a bullpen to the Tampa Bay Rays 55 victories in 2018...had 641.1 innings pitched, which was second most in the majors (TB, 824.1) and third most in Major League history.
- Struck out 627, which was fourth in the AL and the most in A's history.

### 52 LHP RYAN BUCHTER

Last Outing: 4/10 at Baltimore (ND, 1.0 ip, bb, so)  
Saves/Opportunities: 0-2  
Inherited Runners/Scored: 6/3 First Hitters: 3-6, 2 bb, hbp

- Worked a season-high 1.0 inning in three of his last five outings.
- Has allowed three of his six inherited runners to score this year...allowed just two inherited runners to score all last year.
- Begins his fifth season in the majors, his second with the A's...is on his fifth Opening Day roster.
- Had a save and a 27.00 ERA in five spring training appearances...opponents were 9-for-18 (.500) with seven walks in 3.1 innings.
- Pitched 1.0 scoreless inning with one strikeout when he last faced Baltimore in 2017.

*Last Year: Went 6-0 with a 2.75 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in 54 relief appearances in his first season with the A's...allowed just 2-of-30 (6.7%) inherited runners to score, which was the lowest percentage in the majors.*

### 16 RHP LIAM HENDRIKS

Saves/Opportunities: 0-0  
Inherited Runners/Scored: 3/2 First Hitters: 3-5, 3 bb

- Allowed a run in his first outing but has not surrendered a run in six appearances since then (8.0 ip).
- Begins his ninth season in the majors and is on his seventh Opening Day roster...it is his fourth straight with the A's.
- Was 2-0 with a 1.35 ERA and .130 opponents batting average in a team-leading seven spring training appearances, including one start...the two wins tied for the team lead...did not allow a run in six of his seven outings.
- Threw 1.0 scoreless inning against Baltimore last season...has not allowed an earned run over his last seven appearances against the Orioles, dating back to Aug. 9, 2016 (8.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 0 er, 1 bb, 10 so).

*Last Year: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 7.36 ERA in 13 relief appearances before he was outrighted off the 40-man roster July 2...returned to Oakland Sept. 1 and went 0-1 with a 1.38 ERA in 12 games, including eight starts as the opener.*

### 36 RHP YUSMEIRO PETIT

- Has allowed two runs across six outings this season (6.1 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 2.84 ERA).
- In his 12th season in the majors and is on his eighth Opening Day roster.
- Posted a 10.13 ERA and .360 opponents batting average in six spring training appearances...allowed two runs in three of those outings.
- Did not allow a run in two of his three outings against Baltimore last season, but allowed three runs in 0.1 ip on May 4 (3.1 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 8.10 ERA).

*Last Year: Pitched in a team-leading and career-high 74 games in his first season in Oakland and was 7-3 with a 3.00 ERA and .221 opponents average...the wins were also a career high and his ERA was second lowest to his 2.76 with the Angels in 2017.*

### 56 RHP FERNANDO RODNEY

Last Outing: 4/8 at Baltimore (ND, 0.2 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so)  
Saves/Opportunities: 0-0  
Inherited Runners/Scored: 4/3 First Hitters: 4-6, bb

- Made his 901st career appearance last Wednesday, moving him into sole possession of the 25th most pitching appearances in Major League history.
- Begins his 17th season in the majors and is with his 10th different team...is on his 13th Opening Day roster.
- Was 42 years and 2 days old at the start of the season, making him the oldest player on an Opening Day roster in Oakland history...the previous oldest was Doug Jones in 1999 (41 years, 285 days)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the oldest player on an Athletics Opening Day roster since Bobo Newsom of the Philadelphia A's in 1953 (45 years, 246 days).

- Joins Tommy John (1985), Rich Gossage (1993), and Jones (1999 and 2000) as the only players in Oakland history to appear in a game at age 42 or greater.
- Had an 8.44 ERA and .292 opponents batting average in six games this spring...walked six batters in 5.1 innings...did not allow a run over his last four outings (4.0 ip).
- Leads all active pitchers (min. 50.0 ip) with 21 saves and a 2.34 ERA (13 er in 50.0 ip) in his career against Baltimore...went 0-1 with two saves against the Orioles last season (4.2 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 0 bb, 6 so, 3.86 ERA).

*Last Year: Saved a team-leading 25 games for Minnesota before he was traded to Oakland Aug. 9...went 1-1 with a 3.92 ERA in 22 relief appearances with the A's and was 4-3 with 25 saves and a 3.36 ERA in 68 relief appearances overall.*
