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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-8) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (6-7)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four straight after losing the first four games of this road trip...are 10-8 and T3rd in the AL West, four games behind first place Seattle...last year, the A's were 8-10 after 18 games and trailed first place Los Angeles by 5½ games...are 6-2 in the Coliseum and 4-6 in all other ballparks.

STREAKING: The A's have won a season-best tying four straight games (also: March 30-April 2)...Oakland had five winning streaks of 5+ games last season (last: 6, Sept. 5-12)...had four six-game winning streaks, a season high.

FEELS LIKE HOME: The A's have won five straight games at Globe Life Park and are 8-3 over the last 11 games here...the club record for consecutive wins by the A's at this park is six (4 times, last: Sept. 13, 2013-April 30-2014)...during the streak, Oakland is hitting .321 (62x193) with 49 runs, 12 doubles, 4 triples, 13 home runs and 48 RBI with a 1.021 OPS.

THE BIG ELEPHANT IN THE ROOM: Khris Davis has hit 29 home runs in 57 career games against Texas, .509 homers per game...the next best mark all-time (min. 50 games) is Mark McGwire with a .402 HR/G rate (43 HR, 107 G) vs. Detroit...Davis' .382 HR/G rate against Seattle ranks as the 7th-best all time during the live-ball era (since 1920)...Babe Ruth's best rate was .343 against Detroit (123 HR, 359 games).

MORE ABOUT KHRIS: Khris Davis has 5 home runs in his last 3 games...the club record for most home runs in 3-game span belongs to Gus Zernial (6, May 13-16, 1951)...the most home runs over a 4-game span: Zernial (5/13-17, 1951)...the most in 5-game span belongs to Geronimo Berroa (7, Aug. 12-16, 1996) and Zernial in 1951.

COMEBACK KIDS: Oakland has come from behind to win each of the last two games, including a 5-run comeback last night...Oakland has three comeback wins this season after collecting 42 comeback wins last season...of the last nine A's wins over the Rangers, four have been comebacks, including an 8-run comeback on July 24, 2018 (trailed 2-10, won 13-10).

HALT CONSTRUCTION, PLEASE?: Khris Davis has 16 home runs at Globe Life Park, which ranks T7th-most all time by a visiting player behind Jason Giambi (20), David Ortiz (19), Tino Martinez (19), Carlos Delgado (19), Tim Salmon (18) and Troy Glaus (18)...he has homered in 7 of his last 8 games at Globe Life Park (8 total). In those eight games, he has 19 RBI.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have tied a club record with six straight multi-homer games (six times, last: Sept. 18-23, 2013)...have hit 19 home runs over that stretch...hit a season-high five home runs on April 10 & 11; it marks the second time in Athletics history the A's have hit at least five home runs in back-to-back games (June 27-28, 1987)...have hit 19 home runs in eight games on the road trip after tallying 15 home runs over the first 10 games...last year, the A's hit an American League record tying 136 home runs on the road...have 34 home runs overall, which are second most in the majors to Seattle (37) and the most in Athletics history over the first 18 games...53 of the A's 94 runs this year have come on home runs (56.4%).

OFFENSE: The A's have reached double figures in hits in six consecutive games for the first time since an 8-game streak April 3-11, 2013...are batting .314 (71-for-226) with 51 runs scored (8.5 per game), 12 doubles and 19 home runs (.619 slugging percentage) over that span...are now hitting .297 (97-for-327) with 60 runs scored over the last nine games after batting .215 with 34 runs over the first nine contests.

18 GAMES IN 18 DAYS, THEN 8 IN 11: This three-game series with Texas concludes a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 18 games in 18 days from March 28 to April 14...that is the A's longest stretch of the season without a day off...are 10-6 over the first 16 games of the stretch...have Monday and Thursday off next week and are scheduled to play eight games over an 11-day stretch from April 15-25...have played 18 games, which is two more than the Mariners, three more than the Dodgers, Padres and Giants.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-4 on their longest road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Houston (0-3), Baltimore (3-1) and Texas (1-0)...return home following the game Sunday for an eight-game homestand against Houston (two games), Toronto (three games) and Texas (three games)...went 6-2 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (3-1) and Boston (3-1) and are 6-4 at home (went 0-2 against Seattle in Tokyo as the home team)...are unbeaten over their last 17 series in Oakland (15 wins, two splits), which is the

longest series unbeaten streak in Coliseum history...are 38-14 (.731) in the Coliseum over that stretch...have not lost a series in the Coliseum since they were swept by Houston last year, June 12-14...last year, the A's went 50-31 (.617) at home compared to 47-34 (.580) on the road...had the fourth best home record in the AL but tied for the third best road record in the majors...it was the sixth best road record in Oakland history.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 6.03 ERA (46 er in 68.2 ip) and .272 (74-for-272) opponents batting average in eight games on the road trip after posting a 2.00 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in eight games on the last homestand...tossed three shutouts on the last homestand and are tied with Pittsburgh for the most shutouts in the majors (3).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-3 with a 7.55 ERA (33 er in 39.1 ip) in eight games on the road trip after going 6-0 with a 1.16 ERA...Brett Anderson tossed 6.2 innings on Tuesday at Baltimore to snap a season-opening 14-game streak of six innings or fewer by A's starters, which was the longest such streak in Oakland history...have tossed fewer than seven innings in all 18 games, which is the longest season-opening streak in Oakland history...tossed fewer than seven innings in the final 36 games last year, which was already the longest such streak in Oakland history...the last A's starter to pitch seven or more innings is Anderson on Aug. 21, 2018 (7.0 ip)...starters are averaging 5.22 innings per start...last year, A's starters tossed 824.1 innings, the fewest in Athletics history in a non-strike season (5.09 innings per start).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors over the first 18 games and have a .991 fielding percentage, 3rd-best in the AL...A's outfielders have five assists, which is the most in the AL and T2nd most in the majors.

LEFT-HANDED STARTERS: The A's have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in nine of the first 18 games, which is the most in the majors...are 6-3 in those games compared to 4-5 when the opposition starts a right-hander...are batting .271 with a .507 slugging percentage against lefties compared to .251 with a .442 slugging percentage against righties...have 13 home runs against lefties, which is the most in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-1 in day games, 6-7 at night...have lost twice when leading after seven innings...went 70-2 when leading after seven last year...are 10-0 when leading after eight inning...three of the A's eight losses have come in games decided in the last at bat...the A's have used five different first basemen this year (Canha, Morales, Olson, Pinder, Profar) after using just three all last year (Canha, Olson, Pinder).

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's won the season series last year 13-6 and have won each of the last two season series...the 13 wins matched the A's second most against the Rangers (15 in 2003)...went 7-3 in Oakland and 6-3 in Texas...have won four straight, 10 of the last 11 and 22 of the last 30 games...have a five-game winning streak in Globe Life Park and have won 15 of the last 18 games in Oakland...are 366-367 all-time against the Texas Rangers...including 193-173 in Oakland and 173-194 in Texas...are 106-106 at Globe Life Park...have all-time record of 463-449 vs. Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis has a Major League leading 10 home runs, which bests Reggie Jackson (1974), Bob Cerv (1958) and Mark McGwire (1992) for the most in Athletics history over the first 18 games of the season...**Ramón Laureano** is T1st in Majors in assists (4)...now has 13 over the last two years, which is tied for th-[e most among ML outfielders (Billy Hamilton), despite him not making his ML debut until Aug. 3, 2018...**Josh Phegley** has a career-high eight-game hitting streak and is 12-for-29 (.414) with nine runs, two doubles, three home runs and eight RBI during the streak...**Stephen Piscotty** has a 13-game hitting streak against Texas (20-for-50, .400).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1968** the Oakland A's win their first game, a 9-6 victory at Washington...Chuck Dobson pitches six innings for the win and Sal Bando homers and drives in four runs...in **1994** the A's draw 12 walks for the second consecutive game, tying what was then a club record for walks in a game...Mark McGwire walks in his first four at bats of the A's 8-7, 12 inning win...Oakland also collects 18 hits and strands 20 base runners.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Marco Estrada (0-1, 4.87 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season, which ties teammate Mike Fiers for the Major League lead...allowed six runs in his last start, a loss, after yielding six runs total over his first three starts, all no decisions...the A's are 0-4 in his starting assignments...left with the lead in two of those starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (Buchter, March 29 vs. Los Angeles-AL; Buchter, April 3 vs. Boston)...is in his 12th season in the majors and is with his fourth team...is on his seventh Opening Day roster...was signed by the A's as a free agent on Jan. 25, 2019.

SIX-GAME LOSING STREAK: Was charged with his first loss of the season in his last start after losing each of his final five decisions of 2018...now has a career-high six-game losing streak (previous: 5, four times)...has a 7.24 ERA (37 er in 46.0 ip) and .290 (56-for-193) opponents batting average during the streak, which spans 10 starts dating back to Aug. 26, 2018...has received just 14 runs of support (2.74 RSA)...his last win came on Aug. 20, 2018 against Baltimore.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has held left-handed hitters to a .108 (4-for-37) batting average...right-handers are batting .326 (14-for-43)...has seven of his 10 strikeouts against lefties but all four of his hits against lefties are for extra bases (two triples, two home runs)...last year, his opponents batting average included a mark of .231 (56-for-242) against left-handed hitters compared to .306 (99-for-324) against right-handers...his career splits are .217 (491-for-2264) against lefties, .255 (629-for-2462) against righties.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has surrendered 18 hits over his first four starts, but 10 of those are extra base hits (three doubles, two triples, five home runs)...T4th in the American League in home runs allowed and T4th in extra base hits...has a .225 opponents batting average but a .500 slugging percentage...last year, he led the majors with 49 doubles and ranked second with 80 extra base hits...was sixth in the AL with 29 home runs...has a .318 (7-for-22) opponents batting average with runners on base but that drops to .154 (2-for-13) with runners in scoring position...opponents are 2-for-20 (.100) with one walk (.143 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 12-inning loss to Seattle in Tokyo on March 21...allowed a two-run home run to Healy in the second and a solo home run to Haniger in the third...Oakland scored twice in the fifth to narrow the gap to 3-2 and he was relieved by Petit to start the sixth inning...the A's tied the game in the seventh to get him off the hook.

SECOND START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on March 29 in Oakland...shutout the Angels on two hits and two walks in six innings and the A's scored twice in the bottom of the sixth to give him a 2-0 lead...Soria then allowed four runs in the eighth inning, with Buchter being charged with the blown save, and Rodney surrendered two more runs in the ninth.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-3 loss to Boston on April 3 in Oakland...blanked the Red Sox on one hit over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to 12 innings...then allowed a two-out solo home run to Swihart in the fifth...had a 3-1 lead when he was relieved by Buchter with one out in the sixth inning and the bases loaded...Buchter allowed a two-run double to Moreland for the blown save and the Red Sox scored three times in the ninth for the win.

LAST START: He had his first decision of the season, a loss in the A's 12-4 loss at Baltimore on Monday...allowed a solo home run to Mancini in the first and three more runs in the second, highlighted by a Mullins two-run triple...Oakland scored twice in the second, but he surrendered two more runs in the fourth on a Villar two-run home run.

ESTRADA vs. TEXAS: Is 3-1 with a 3.40 ERA (39.2 ip, 31 h, 16 r, 15 er, 14 bb, 35 so, 6 hr) in seven career starts...is 2-1 with a 4.23 ERA (13 er in 27.2 ip) in five games at Globe Life Park and 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA (2 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts at Rogers Centre...was the winning pitcher in his only start last year, an 8-5 Toronto win at Texas on April 6...blanked the Rangers on two hits over the first five innings and had an 8-0 lead when he allowed his only run on a Choo home run in the sixth.

2018 RECAP: Went 7-14 with a 5.64 ERA in 28 starts with Toronto...the losses were a career high and tied for fifth most in the American League...his ERA was his highest in a season with 13 or more innings pitched as were his .274 opponents batting average, .331 on-base percentage, .521 slugging percentage and .852 OPS...struck out 103 in 143.2 innings for a career-low 6.45 strikeouts per nine innings...walked 50 and his 2.06 strikeout-to-walk ratio was his lowest since walking five and striking out 10 in his debut in 2008...the Blue Jays were 5-2 in his no decisions and had a 12-16 (.429) record in his starting assignments.

2018 LEAGUE LEADERS: Led the majors by allowing a career-high tying 49 doubles and ranked second with 80 extra base hits (Bundy, BAL with 84)...based on a minimum of 140 innings pitched, he had the third highest ERA and opponents slugging percentage in the AL and the fourth highest OPS...also tied for fifth in the AL in sacrifice flies (7), ranked sixth in home runs (29), tied for seventh in earned runs (90) and tied for eighth in lowest winning percentage (.333).

2018 OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a mark of .231 (56-for-242) against left-handed hitters compared to .306 (99-for-324) against right-handers...yielded a .311 average with runners in scoring position...had a .252 opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup, .349 after that...held the number one hitter in the batting order to a .159 average but the three-hitter batted .417.

2018 SPLITS: Was 4-7 with a 4.72 ERA in 17 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 3-7 with a 7.17 ERA in 11 starts after the break...posted a mark of 4-4 and a 4.55 ERA in 11 starts on four days rest...was 3-10 with a 6.40 ERA in his other 17 starts...was 2-3 with a 4.40 ERA in eight starts during the day, 5-11 with a 6.17 ERA in 20 starts at night...compiled a 2-5 record and a 4.43 ERA in eight starts against AL West competition, 5-9 with a 6.18 ERA in 20 starts against all other teams...was 1-2 with an 8.78 ERA in four interleague starts.

2018 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed a season-high 7.0 innings and allowed three runs in his first start March 31 against New York (AL) but had a no decision in the Blue Jays 5-3 win...recorded his 1,000th career strikeout when he fanned Mitch Moreland to begin the second inning on April 26 against Boston...took the loss that day to begin a five-game losing streak that spanned seven starts through May 29 (5.89 ERA, .311 opponents batting average)...struck out Matt Duffy to end the first inning May 6 at Tampa Bay to become the 20th pitcher in Blue Jays with 500 career strikeouts...struck out a season-high nine in a 13-3 win over Baltimore on June 10...combined with three other pitchers on a three-hit shutout in a 2-0 win over Washington on June 16...tossed 6.2 innings and allowed all three of the hits while logging a season-high 109 pitches...had his best month in June when he was 2-1 with a 2.35 ERA and .207 opponents batting average in five starts...the ERA and opponents batting average were 10th lowest in the AL...lasted 0.1 innings on July 3 against New York (NL) before exiting the game with left hip soreness...it was the shortest start of his career...was placed on the 10-day disabled list July 10 with a left glute strain...was reinstated from the DL July 30...tossed 4.0 innings in a 10-1 loss at Oakland that day and did not strikeout a batter for the first time in his career as a starter...allowed one run on one hit in a season-high tying 7.0 innings in his next start Aug. 4 at Seattle...matched his season high with four walks Aug. 26 in an 8-3 loss to Philadelphia...that began a season-ending five-game losing streak.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Brett Anderson (3-0, 2.50 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...has picked up the win in each of his first three starts and is tied for second in the American League in wins...is 4-0 with a 3.60 ERA and .271 opponents batting average over his last six starts dating back to Sept. 19, 2018...the winning streak matches his career high...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 13-2 A's win at Baltimore last Tuesday (6.2 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...is 3-4 with a save and a 5.01 ERA (59.1 ip, 64 h, 37 r, 33 er, 26 bb, 52 so, 8 hr) in 13 games, including 10 starts, in his career against Texas...was 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA (13.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in two starts last year...was 2-0 with a 2.87 ERA and .241 opponents batting average in four Spring Training starts...last year, he was signed by the A's to a minor league contract March 19 and began the season at Triple-A Nashville before he was selected on May 2...went 4-5 with a 4.48 ERA in 17 starts with Oakland.

- The pen allowed just two runs over the last four games (12.1 ip) after yielding six runs in 4.0 innings Monday night.
- Has allowed just three home runs in 67.2 innings...the home runs are tied for second fewest in the American League.
- Is 5-for-8 (62.5%) in save opportunities...the blown saves are tied for third most in the American League.
- The pen leads the majors with 67.2 innings pitched...had 641.1 innings pitched last year, which was second most in the majors (TB, 824.1) and third most in Major League history
- The A's bullpen was credited with their first win of the season Friday...last year, the pen won 45 games, which were second most in Major League history by a bullpen to the Tampa Bay Rays 55 victories in 2018.
- First batters faced are hitting .276 with a .382 on-base percentage (16-for-58, 9 walks, 1 hbp) against the Oakland bullpen so far this season...the batting average is the eighth highest in the Majors and the OBP is the tenth highest.
- Has allowed 14-of-31 (45.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the highest percentage in the AL and fourth highest in the majors.
