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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (11-12) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (10-12)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight and four of the last five games after winning a season-high tying four in a row...are 11-12 overall and have not been more than two games over .500 or two games under .500 all year...are 7-5 in the Coliseum and 4-7 in all other ballparks...remain in fourth place in the American League West for the fifth consecutive day and have been in fourth or lower for 12 of 26 days this year...are 1-4 in this 13-day stretch from April 13-25 where they are scheduled to play just nine games...went 10-6 over a stretch of 16 games in 16 days from March 20-April 12.

A'S ON EASTER: The A's have a 13-17 record on Easter since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 10-12 at home and 3-5 on the road...this will be the first Easter meeting between Oakland and Toronto...the A's have played once on Easter over the previous four seasons, a 7-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) last year.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have lost the first two games of this three-game series with Toronto, which marks the first time they have lost a series in the Coliseum since June 12-14, 2018 against Houston...had gone 15-0-3 over their previous 18 series in the Coliseum, which was the longest series unbeaten streak in Oakland history...went 39-15 (.722) in Oakland during the streak...are 1-3 on this eight-game homestand against Houston (1-1), Toronto (0-2) and Texas (three games)...went 6-2 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (3-1) and Boston (3-1) and are 7-7 at home...went 4-5 on the first road trip to Houston (0-3), Baltimore (3-1) and Texas (1-1)...last year, the A's went 50-31 (.617) at home compared to 47-34 (.580) on the road...had the fourth best home record in the AL but tied for the third best road record in the majors...it was the sixth best road record in Oakland history.

OFFENSE: The A's were held to one run for the third time in the last four games yesterday and are now batting .168 (20-for-119) with five runs scored in four games on the homestand...are hitting .215 (97-for-452) with 46 runs (3.29 per game) and 16 home runs in 14 games at home after hitting .288 with 60 runs scored (6.67 per game) and 21 home runs in nine games on the first road trip...are averaging the fewest runs per game at home in the American League and have the third lowest batting average and OPS (.650)...overall, the A's rank second in the AL in runs (106) and home runs (37) and fifth in extra base hits (70).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered just once in four games on the homestand but have 37 for the season, which is second most in the American League (Seattle, 53)...it is also the most in Athletics history over the first 23 games of the season (previous: 35 in 2002)...had their Athletics record streak of seven consecutive games with two or more home runs snapped last Tuesday...broke the previous mark of six, done five times (last: Sept. 18-23, 2013)...56 of the A's 106 runs this year have come on home runs (52.8%)...the A's are 0-6 when going homerless and 6-1 when holding the opposition homerless.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: A's outfielders have seven assists, which is tied with Chicago for the most outfield assists in the American League...the A's have committed seven errors in the last 10 games after making three over the first 13 contests...have a .988 fielding percentage, which ranks fourth in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 6.45 ERA (75 er in 104.2 ip) over the last 12 games after logging a 2.94 ERA over the first 11 contests...have surrendered 20 home runs over the last 12 games after yielding eight over the first 11...lead the American League in shutouts (3)...are averaging the second fewest strikeouts per nine innings in the majors (7.53).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-6 with a 7.67 ERA (54 er in 63.1 ip) and .292 (77-for-264) opponents batting average over the last 13 games after going 6-1 with a 2.30 ERA and .181 opponents batting average over the first 10 contests...starters have 10 of the A's 11 wins, which is tied with Seattle and Tampa Bay for the most wins by starters in the majors...have tossed fewer than seven innings in all 23 games, which is the longest season-opening streak in Oakland history...tossed fewer than seven innings in each of the final 36 games last year, which was already the longest such streak in Oakland history...the longest outing by an A's starter this year is 6.2 innings by Brett Anderson on April 9 at Baltimore...Anderson is the last A's starter to pitch seven or more innings (7.0 on Aug. 21, 2018 vs. Texas)...starters are averaging 5.13 innings per start...last year, A's starters tossed 824.1 innings, which was the fewest in Athletics history in a non-strike season (5.09 innings per start).

THE EAST AND THE WEST: The A's are 6-4 (.600) against American League East teams compared to 5-8 (.385) against AL West competition...have yet to play the Central or the National League...have outscored Eastern division teams 55-46 (+9 run differential) but have been outscored by the West 65-51 (-14 run differential)...are hitting .264 (91-for-345) with 55 runs (5.50 per game) and 21 home runs in 10 games against the East, .231 with 51 runs (3.92 per game) and 16 home runs in 13 games against the West...last year, the A's went 38-38 (.500) against the West and 59-27 (.686) against all other teams...that included a 21-11 (.656) record against the East, which was the second best record by any team against the East and the A's best record against the East since 2006.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-3 (.571) in day games, 7-9 (.438) at night...have faced a left-handed starting pitcher 10 times, which is tied with San Francisco for the most in the majors...are 7-3 when the opposition starts a left-hander compared to 4-8 against right-handers...have lost three times this year when leading after seven innings...had just two such losses all last year.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list eight times this year...currently have seven players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea, Martini, Olson), four of which are on the 60-day IL (Cotton, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea)...Oakland used the disabled list 26 times last year, which was second most in Oakland history to the record of 27 set in 2016...it marked the fourth consecutive season and eighth time in the last 12 years the A's have used the IL at least 20 times...have had at least four players on the IL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

CONTRACT STATUS: After Khris Davis agreed to terms on a two-year contract extension Thursday, the A's now have four players under contract beyond the 2019 season...Joakim Soria and Mike Fiers are signed through 2020, Davis is signed through 2021 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023...Yusmeiro Petit has a club option for 2020.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's have lost the first two meetings of 2019 and have not been swept in a three-game series by Toronto in the Coliseum since Aug. 30-Sept. 1, 1993...the only time the A's have gone winless in Oakland against Toronto for the entire season was in 1982 when they were 0-6...won the season series last year, 7-0...swept a three-game series in Oakland and a four-game series in Toronto...it was one of four times in franchise history the A's went undefeated in a season series of seven or more games (12-0 vs. New York in 1990; 7-0 vs. Baltimore in 2004; 7-0 in Detroit in 2018)...won the season series last year for the first time since 2014...are 224-197 all-time against the Blue Jays, including 113-98 in Oakland, 112-96 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 71-64 (.526) in Rogers Centre.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis has hit an American League leading 10 home runs...now has 143 home runs over the last four seasons, which is 19 more than any other player...**Ramón Laureano** ranks second among Major League outfielders with five assists...now has 14 assists in 69 games in the outfield over the last two years, which is tied with Teoscar Hernandez for the most among ML outfielders, despite him not making his ML debut until Aug. 3, 2018...**Blake Treinen** has not allowed a run in six home games (7.2 ip) and now has a streak of 26.0 consecutive scoreless innings at home dating back to last year...it is the longest home scoreless streak by an A's reliever since Dennis Eckersley had a 26.1 inning streak from June 6-Aug. 2, 1987.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1956** Art Ditmar tosses a one-hitter in the A's 15-1 win over the Chicago White Sox...in **1958** Frank House scores two runs as a pinch hitter in an eight-run 8th inning as the A's defeat Cleveland, 9-4...the two runs scored by a pinch hitter ties a major league record...in **1981** Steve McCatty goes the distance in the A's 4-3, 10 inning win over Minnesota...Tony Armas drives in the winning run with a RBI single...in **2002** Greg Myers hits a pinch hit three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth to give manager Art Howe his 900th career victory in a 6-5 win over Anaheim...in **2018** Sean Manaea tosses the seventh no-hitter in Oakland history and the 12th in Athletics history in a 3-0 win over Boston...he walks two and strikes out 10.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brett Anderson (3-0, 2.63 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...picked up the win in each of his first three starts and is tied for third in the American League in wins...the only other time in his career he won at least his first two starts in a season was in 2012 when he won his first four starts after missing the first 4½ months of the season following "Tommy John" surgery...was one of three inactive players for the season-opening two-game series against Seattle in Tokyo...begins his 11th season in the majors...has pitched for Oakland (2009-13, 18), Colorado (2014), Los Angeles-NL (2015-16), Chicago-NL (2017) and Toronto (2017).

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 4-0 with a 3.50 ERA (14 er in 36.0 ip) and .243 (34-for-140) opponents batting average over his last seven starts dating back to Sept. 19, 2018...the winning streak matches his career high (fourth time, previous: Aug. 21-Sept. 8, 2012)...has not lost since Sept. 13, 2018 at Baltimore.

HOME AND AWAY: Allowed two runs in the first inning of his last home start on April 4 against Boston to snap his home scoreless streak to 34.1 innings...that is the longest home scoreless streak in Oakland history, breaking the previous record of 33.0 set by Matt Keough (Sept. 5, 1979-April 16, 1980)...it is also the longest Athletics home scoreless streak since at least 1908...it marked the first time he allowed a run in the Coliseum since May 7, 2018...is now 4-0 with a 0.68 ERA (3 er in 39.2 ip) and .162 (22-for-136) opponents batting average over his last six home starts...was 2-1 with a 2.01 ERA and .191 opponents batting average in five starts at home last year compared to 2-4 with a 6.06 ERA and .335 opponent average in 12 starts on the road...surrendered one home run in 31.1 innings at home, nine in 49.0 innings on the road...is now 16-12 with a 3.44 ERA (100 er in 262.0 ip) in 46 career games in the Coliseum, 33-40 with a 4.32 ERA (280 er in 583.1 ip) in 115 games in all other ballparks.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win over Los Angeles (AL) March 30 in Oakland...tossed six scoreless innings and allowed just three hits while walking two...allowed just three base runners to advance into scoring position.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 7-3 win over Boston April 4 in Oakland...allowed two runs in the first inning on bases loaded walks to Bogaerts and Holt, and one more in the third on a solo home run to Martinez...the A's then scored three times in the bottom of the third to tie the game and three more runs in the fourth to take the lead for good.

THIRD START: He extended his season-opening winning streak to three games in the A's 13-2 win at Baltimore April 9...blanked the Orioles on four hits and a walk over the first six innings...had a 6-0 lead when he allowed a two-out, two-run double to Pedro Severino in the bottom of the seventh.

LAST START: He had his first no decision of the season in the A's 8-7 loss at Texas a week ago today...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed two in the bottom of the first when Andrus had a RBI triple and later stole home...did not allow a hit over the next three innings and had a 7-2 lead when he allowed a RBI ground out to Pence in the fifth...left after six innings with a 7-3 lead but the pen allowed a run in the seventh and four more in the eighth (Soria blown save).

ANDERSON vs. TORONTO: Is 0-1 with a 2.57 ERA (7.0 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 2 hr) in two career starts...had a no decision in his only start last year, a 3-1 A's win at Toronto on May 18...tossed just one inning and did not allow a run, despite surrendering two hits...left the game early with a strained left shoulder...the loss came in a start for the A's in a 3-1 loss in Oakland on Aug. 16, 2010...allowed a solo home run to Bautista in the fourth and a two-run home run to Encarnacion in the fifth...Marcum tossed a one-hitter for the Blue Jays, allowing a Jackson home run in the seventh.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 2-0 with a 2.87 ERA and .241 opponents batting average in four Spring Training starts...did not allow a run in two of those games...also started the exhibition game against Nippon Ham in Tokyo on March 18 and had a no decision in a 6-6 tie (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 2 so).

2018 RECAP: Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract March 19 and began the season at Triple-A Nashville before he was selected on May 2...went 4-5 with a 4.48 ERA in 17 starts with Oakland in a season that was interrupted by two stints on the disabled list...was out from May 19 to July 7 with a strained left shoulder and Aug. 28 to Sept. 12 with a strained left forearm...walked just 13 batters in 80.1 innings for an average of 1.46 walks per nine innings...that was a career low and was second lowest in the American League among pitchers with 80 or more innings pitched (Kluber, CLE 1.46)...struck out just 47 but his 3.62 strikeout-to-walk ratio was a career high...his starts and innings pitched were his most since 2015 when he made 31 starts and tossed 180.1 innings with the Dodgers

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Had a 1-2 record, a 6.08 ERA and .356 opponents batting average in six starts at the All-Star Break last year...then went 3-3 with a 3.81 ERA and .251 opponents average in 11 starts after the break...issued eight free passes in 23.2 innings before the break (3.04 per nine innings) and then walked just five batters in 56.2 innings after the break (0.79 per nine innings)...has a 22-30 career record before the break, 27-22 after the break.

2018 OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .285 opponents batting average, including .257 (18-for-70) against left-handed hitters compared to .293 (72-for-246) against right-handers...surrendered nine of his 10 home runs to righties...yielded a .333 batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .280 when leading off an inning but he walked just three

DAYS REST: Was 0-2 with a 5.66 ERA in five starts on four days rest last year, 4-3 with a 4.07 ERA in 12 starts on five days rest or more...over the last three years, he is 3-3 with a 6.05 ERA (39 er in 58.0 ip) in 13 starts on four days rest, 8-6 with a 4.16 ERA (47 er in 101.2 ip) in 21 starts on five days rest or more.

NIGHT AND DAY: Went 1-1 with a 2.61 ERA in four starts during the day in 2018, 3-4 with a 5.13 ERA in 13 starts at night...is 18-16 with a 3.48 ERA (116 er in 300.0 ip) in 57 career games during the day, 31-36 with a 4.36 ERA (264 er in 545.1 ip) in 104 games at night.

THIS AND THAT: Was 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA in two interleague starts and is now 1-7 with a 5.93 ERA (36 er in 54.2 ip) in 11 career interleague starts...went 1-for-4 (.250) as a hitter and is now 8-for-79 (.101) with three doubles, five RBI and six walks in his career...tossed five innings or fewer in 10 of his 17 starts...walked one batter or fewer 14 times and received two runs of support or fewer 10 times.

2018 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 2-1 with a 2.78 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in seven starts...did not allow a home run in 32.1 innings...struck out 36 (10.02 per nine innings) and walked just six (1.67 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.0...his opponents batting average included a .223 (21-for-94) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .314 (11-for-35) against left-handers...yielded a .156 batting average and just one walk to batters leading off an inning (.182 on-base percentage)...was 1-1 with a 1.89 ERA in four starts when he was selected by Oakland May 2...returned on June 23 for a three-start rehab assignment and went 1-0 with a 4.05 ERA before he was reinstated from the DL July 8.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Chris Bassitt (2019 debut): Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas on Wednesday and is scheduled to make his first appearance and start of the season...began the season on the 10-day injured list and made three rehab starts with Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas...was 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas on Tuesday...had a no decision in his last start, a 9-8 loss to Fresno a week ago today in Las Vegas (5.0 ip, 5 h, 5 r, 3 er, 4 so)...is 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (7.0 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 7 er, 4 bb, 6 so, 1 hr) in three career appearances, including one start, against Texas...faced the Rangers once last year and it came in relief on Sept. 7 in an 8-4 A's win in Oakland (3.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...was 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA and .310 opponents batting average in four spring training appearances, including one start...went 2-3 with a 3.02 ERA and .221 opponents average in 11 games, including seven starts, in seven stints with the A's last year.

- The pen is third in the majors with 87.2 innings pitched...had 641.1 innings pitched last year, which was second most in the majors (TB, 824.1) and third most in Major League history.
- The A's bullpen was credited with their first win of the season April 12... last year, the pen won 45 games, which were second most in Major League history by a bullpen to the Tampa Bay Rays 55 victories in 2018.
- First batters faced are hitting .267 with a .360 on-base percentage (20-for-75, 10 walks, 1 hbp) against the Oakland bullpen so far this season...the batting average and OBP are sixth highest in the Majors.
- Has allowed 19-of-38 (50.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the highest in the Majors.

- Has allowed three of his seven inherited runners to score this year...allowed just two inherited runners to score all last year.
- Has a 9.00 career ERA in six outings against Toronto...three of the four hits he's allowed to Blue Jays hitters have been homers.

Last Year: Went 6-0 with a 2.75 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in 54 relief appearances in his first season with the A's...allowed just 2-of-30 (6.7%) inherited runners to score, which was the lowest percentage in the majors.

- Snapped an 8.0 scoreless inning streak with one run allowed Tuesday night...has now allowed a run in consecutive outings
- Opponents are 9-for-41 (.220) but he has issued seven walks in 12.1 innings.
- Is 0-1 with a 6.35 ERA in eight career outings against Toronto, including 11.1 innings pitched, 16 strikeouts, seven walks, and three homers allowed.
- Opponents are hitting .300 (9-for-30) off him at home, but he has not allowed a hit on the road (0-for-11).
