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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-14) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (12-14)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost last night to snap a three-game winning streak...swept a three-game series from Texas to close out the last homestand for their first series sweep of the season...the sweep of the Rangers snapped a three-game losing streak as the A's were swept by the Blue Jays last weekend...are now 14-14 for the season, which matches the A's record after 28 games last year... have not been more than two games over .500 or two games under .500 all year...are 10-6 (.625) in the Coliseum and 4-8 (.333) in all other ballparks...are in third place in the American League West...have spent two days in second this year, 11 days in third, four days tied for third, 10 days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and three days in fifth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue a nine-game road trip to Toronto (three games, 0-1), Boston (three games) and Pittsburgh (three games) today...will finish the season series with Toronto and Boston on this trip before playing any of the American League Central teams, New York or Tampa Bay...this is the second of four straight nine-game road trips to start the year, which are the A's longest road trips of the season...went 4-5 on the first road trip to Houston (0-3), Baltimore (3-1) and Texas (1-1)...have a 10-8 record at home after going 4-4 on the last homestand against Houston (1-1), Toronto (0-3) and Texas (3-0)...last year, the A's went 50-31 (.617) at home compared to 47-34 (.580) on the road...had the fourth best home record in the AL but tied for the third best road record in the majors...it was the sixth best road record in Oakland history.

CLOSE AND NOT CLOSE: The A's had their first walk-off win of the season Wednesday, a 6-5 victory over Texas...it was also their first last at bat win of the year...it was Oakland's ninth one-run game, which is tied with Kansas City for second most in the American League (Seattle, 12)...13 of the A's 28 games have been decided by four runs or more and the 13 games are second to Baltimore (14) for the most in the AL...are 4-5 in one-run games and 7-6 in games decided by four runs or more.

PITCHING: Before last night, A's pitchers had struck out nine or more batters in each of the previous seven games, which was the longest such streak by an A's team since strikeouts became an official statistic in the American League in 1913...had 74 strikeouts in 63.0 innings over that span (10.6 per nine innings)...the A's have a 5.65 ERA (94 er in 149.2 ip) over the last 17 games after logging a 2.94 ERA over the first 11 contests...have surrendered 27 home runs over the last 17 games after yielding eight over the first 11...lead the AL in shutouts (3).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-7 with a 6.50 ERA (64 er in 88.2 ip) and .287 (104-for-362) opponents batting average over the last 18 games dating back to April 5 after going 6-1 with a 2.30 ERA and .181 opponents batting average over the first 10 contests...starters have 12 of the A's 14 wins and Oakland leads the majors in wins by a starting pitcher...last year, starters had just 52 of the A's 97 wins (53.6%)...have tossed fewer than seven innings in all but one of the team's 28 games...snapped a 27-game streak of starts pitching fewer than seven innings last night, which was the longest season-opening streak in Oakland history...tossed fewer than seven innings in each of the final 36 games last year, which was already the longest such streak in Oakland history...the longest outing by an A's starter this year is 7.0 innings by Mike Fiers last night, on April 26, 2019...starters are averaging 5.12 innings per start...last year, A's starters tossed 824.1 innings, which was the fewest in Athletics history in a non-strike season (5.09 innings per start).

OFFENSE: The A's hit .314 (32-for-102) with 23 runs scored in the three game series against Texas but are batting .233 with an average of 4.06 runs per game at home...are hitting .277 (99-for-358) with 62 runs scored in 10 games on the road (6.20 per game)...are fourth in the American League in road batting average and runs per game and fifth in OPS (.837)...have the third lowest home batting average and OPS (.695) and fourth fewest runs per game...overall, the A's rank third in the AL in runs (135), and tied for third in home runs (42).

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit just five home runs in eight games on the last homestand...now have 20 home runs in 18 games at home compared to 22 in 10 games on the road...last year, the A's hit an American League record tying 136 home runs on the road...have hit 34 home runs in April, which exceeds their April home run total from last year...have not hit more than 33 home runs in April since 2006 when they had 34...have 42 home runs overall, which is second most in Athletics history over the first 28 games of the season (43 in 2002)...the A's are 0-7 when going homerless and 7-1 when hold-

ing the opposition homerless...are 1-8 when getting out-homered, which is the worst record in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 10 errors in the last 15 games after making three over the first 13 contests...have a .987 fielding percentage for the season, which is third best in the American League...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is tied for the third most in the AL.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 8-3 (.727) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 6-11 (.353) against right-handers...the 11 games against left-handed starters are the most in the majors and the .727 winning percentage is third best behind Houston (6-1) and San Diego (4-1)...the .353 winning percentage against righties is third worst in the AL...the A's are batting .262 with an .823 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .244 with a .718 OPS against right-handers.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list eight times this year...currently have seven players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea, Martini, Olson), four of which are on the 60-day IL (Cotton, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea)...Oakland used the disabled list 26 times last year, which was second most in Oakland history to the record of 27 set in 2016...it marked the fourth consecutive season and eighth time in the last 12 years the A's have used the IL at least 20 times...have had at least four players on the IL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

CONTRACT STATUS: After Khris Davis agreed to terms on a two-year contract extension last week, the A's now have four players under contract beyond the 2019 season...Joakim Soria and Mike Fiers are signed through 2020, Davis is signed through 2021 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023...Yusmeiro Petit has a club option for 2020.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's were swept in a three-game series in Oakland last weekend after going 7-0 against the Blue Jays last year...it was the first time Oakland was swept in a three-game series by Toronto in the Coliseum since Aug. 30-Sept. 1, 1993...it is just the second time the A's have gone winless against the Blue Jays at home in one season (0-6 in 1982)...last year, the A's swept a three-game series in Oakland and a four-game series in Toronto...it was one of four times in franchise history the A's went undefeated in a season series of seven or more games (12-0 vs. New York in 1990; 7-0 vs. Baltimore in 2004; 7-0 in Detroit in 2018)...won the season series last year for the first time since 2014...are 224-199 all-time against the Blue Jays, including 113-99 in Oakland, 112-97 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 71-65 (.522) in Rogers Centre and are one of just two American League teams (besides Toronto) with a winning record in this ballpark (Boston, 136-104, .567).

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman hit his eighth home run on Wednesday, which is tied for fifth in the American League and is the most among Major League third basemen...**Khris Davis** is second in the AL in home runs (10) and is tied for fourth in RBI (22)...now has 143 home runs over the last four seasons, which is 19 more than any other player...**Ramón Laureano** is tied for second among ML outfielders with five assists...now has 14 assists in 74 games in the outfield over the last two years, which is tied for second most among ML outfielders, despite him not making his ML debut until Aug. 3, 2018...**Marcus Semien** ranks third in the AL in runs (21), fourth in hits (34), tied for fourth in multiple hit games (10) and tied for ninth in doubles (8)...**Blake Treinen** has not allowed a run in 10 of his 11 games and has a 0.68 ERA for the season, which is third lowest among AL relievers...is tied for eighth in strikeouts (17) and tied for fifth in saves (6).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1968** Jim "Catfish" Hunter records his first win in an Oakland uniform in the A's 6-3 victory at California...he would go on to win an Oakland record 131 games which does not include 30 wins while pitching for the Kansas City A's...in **1981** former Athletic Don Baylor, playing for the California Angels, hits into a triple play, the fourth in Oakland history...in **2002** the A's tie a franchise record by hitting four home runs in the third inning...Scott Hatteberg, Terrence Long, Carlos Pena and Frank Menechino connect for the home runs.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brett Anderson (3-1, 3.04 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...picked up the win in each of his first three starts and is tied for seventh in the American League in wins...was one of three inactive players for the season-opening two-game series against Seattle in Tokyo.

THIS AND THAT: Has surrendered just one home run in 26.2 innings and has a lower opponents slugging percentage (.320) than on-base percentage (.321)...all five of his extra base hits allowed (three doubles, one triple) have come against right-handed hitters...has not allowed a run in the second (5.0 ip), fourth (4.0 ip) and sixth (3.1 ip) innings...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his first start March 30 against Los Angeles (AL) to extend his home scoreless streak to an Oakland record 34.1 innings...broke the previous record of 33.0 set by Matt Keough (Sept. 5, 1979-April 16, 1980)...it is also the longest Athletics home scoreless streak since at least 1908...the streak ended in the first inning of his next start April 4 against Boston, marking the first time he allowed a run in the Coliseum since May 7, 2018...won each of his first three starts through April 9...the only other time in his career he won at least his first two starts in a season was in 2012 when he won his first four starts after missing the first 4½ months of the season following "Tommy John" surgery...was charged with his first loss April 21 games Toronto, snapping a career-high tying four-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 19, 2018 (fourth time)...went 4-0 with a 3.50 ERA and .243 opponents average during the streak, which spanned seven starts.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win over Los Angeles (AL) March 30 in Oakland...tossed six scoreless innings and allowed just three hits while walking two...allowed just three base runners to advance into scoring position.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 7-3 win over Boston April 4 in Oakland...allowed two runs in the first inning on bases loaded walks to Bogaerts and Holt, and one more in the third on a solo home run to Martinez...the A's then scored three times in the bottom of the third to tie the game and three more runs in the fourth to take the lead for good.

THIRD START: He extended his season-opening winning streak to three games in the A's 13-2 win at Baltimore April 9...blanked the Orioles on four hits and a walk over the first six innings...had a 6-0 lead when he allowed a two-out, two-run double to Pedro Severino in the bottom of the seventh.

FOURTH START: He had his first no decision of the season in the A's 8-7 loss at Texas April 14...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed two in the bottom of the first when Andrus had a RBI triple and later stole home...did not allow a hit over the next three innings and had a 7-2 lead when he allowed a RBI ground out to Pence in the fifth...left after six innings with a 7-3 lead but the pen allowed a run in the seventh and four more in the eighth (Soria blown save).

LAST START: He was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 5-4 loss to Toronto last Sunday in Oakland...lasted just 2.2 innings following an ankle injury...blanked the Blue Jays on one hit over the first two innings before allowing two runs in the third inning on RBI singles by Hanson and Grichuk.

ANDERSON vs. TORONTO: Is 0-2 with a 3.72 ERA (9.2 ip, 13 h, 5 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 7 so, 2 hr) in three career starts...including a loss in his only start this year, a 5-4 A's loss in Oakland in his last start (see last start above)...had a no decision in his only start last year, a 3-1 A's win at Toronto on May 18...tossed just one inning and did not allow a run, despite surrendering two hits...left the game early with a strained left shoulder...his other start was a loss in a 3-1 decision in Oakland on Aug. 16, 2010...allowed a solo home run to Bautista in the fourth and a two-run home run to Encarnacion in the fifth...Marcum tossed a one-hitter for the Blue Jays, allowing a Jackson home run in the seventh.

2018 RECAP: Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract March 19 and began the season at Triple-A Nashville before he was selected on May 2...went 4-5 with a 4.48 ERA in 17 starts with Oakland in a season that was interrupted by two stints on the disabled list...was out from May 19 to July 7 with a strained left shoulder and Aug. 28 to Sept. 12 with a strained left forearm...walked just 13 batters in 80.1 innings for an average of 1.46 walks per nine innings...that was a career low and was second lowest in the American League among pitchers with 80 or more innings pitched (Kluber, CLE 1.46)...struck out just 47 but his 3.62 strikeout-to-walk ratio was a career high...his starts and innings pitched were his most since 2015 when he made 31 starts and tossed 180.1 innings with the Dodgers

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Had a 1-2 record, a 6.08 ERA and .356 opponents batting average in six starts at the All-Star Break last year...then went 3-3 with a 3.81 ERA and .251 opponents average in 11 starts after the break...issued eight free passes in 23.2 innings before the break (3.04 per nine innings) and then walked just five batters in 56.2 innings after the break (0.79 per nine innings)...has a 22-31 career record before the break, 27-22 after the break.

2018 OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .285 opponents batting average, including .257 (18-for-70) against left-handed hitters compared to .293 (72-for-246) against right-handers...surrendered nine of his 10 home runs to righties...yielded a .333 batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .280 when leading off an inning but he walked just three

2018 HOME AND AWAY: Was 2-1 with a 2.01 ERA and .191 opponents batting average in five starts at home compared to 2-4 with a 6.06 ERA and .335 opponent average in 12 starts on the road...surrendered one home run in 31.1 innings at home, nine in 49.0 innings on the road...is now 16-13 with a 3.47 ERA (102 er in 264.2 ip) in 47 career games in the Coliseum, 33-40 with a 4.32 ERA (280 er in 583.1 ip) in 115 games in all other ballparks.

NIGHT AND DAY: Went 1-1 with a 2.61 ERA in four starts during the day in 2018, 3-4 with a 5.13 ERA in 13 starts at night...is 18-17 with a 3.51 ERA (118 er in 302.2 ip) in 58 career games during the day, 31-36 with a 4.36 ERA (264 er in 545.1 ip) in 104 games at night.

DAYS REST: Was 0-2 with a 5.66 ERA in five starts on four days rest last year, 4-3 with a 4.07 ERA in 12 starts on five days rest or more...over the last three years, he is 3-3 with a 6.05 ERA (39 er in 58.0 ip) in 13 starts on four days rest, 8-7 with a 4.23 ERA (49 er in 104.1 ip) in 22 starts on five days rest or more.

THIS AND THAT: Was 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA in two interleague starts and is now 1-7 with a 5.93 ERA (36 er in 54.2 ip) in 11 career interleague starts...went 1-for-4 (.250) as a hitter and is now 8-for-79 (.101) with three doubles, five RBI and six walks in his career...tossed five innings or fewer in 10 of his 17 starts...walked one batter or fewer 14 times and received two runs of support or fewer 10 times.

2018 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 2-1 with a 2.78 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in seven starts...did not allow a home run in 32.1 innings...struck out 36 (10.02 per nine innings) and walked just six (1.67 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.0...his opponents batting average included a .223 (21-for-94) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .314 (11-for-35) against left-handers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (1-0, 0.00 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 17 and is scheduled to make his second appearance and start of the season...was the winning pitcher in his first start last Monday in Oakland, a 6-1 A's win over Texas (5.0 ip, 2 h, 4 bb, 7 so)...began the season on the 10-day injured list and made three rehab starts with Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas...was 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas April 16...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against Toronto, a start in the A's 9-3 loss at Rogers Centre on April 23, 2016 (5.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...was 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA and .310 opponents batting average in four spring training appearances, including one start...had seven stints with Oakland last year in his return to the majors following "Tommy John" surgery in 2016...went 2-3 with a 3.02 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in 11 games, including seven starts.
