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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-15) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (13-14)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two in a row to begin the current nine-game road trip...swept a three-game series from Texas to close out the last homestand for their first series sweep of the season...the sweep of the Rangers snapped a three-game losing streak as the A's were swept by the Blue Jays last weekend...are now 14-15 for the season...have not been more than two games over .500 or two games under .500 all year...are 10-6 (.625) in the Coliseum and 4-9 (.308) in all other ballparks...are in fourth place in the American League West...have spent two days in second this year, 11 days in third, four days tied for third, 11 days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and three days in fifth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue a nine-game road trip to Toronto (three games, 0-2), Boston (three games) and Pittsburgh (three games) today...will finish the season series with Toronto and Boston on this trip before playing any of the American League Central teams, New York or Tampa Bay...this is the second of four straight nine-game road trips to start the year, which are the A's longest road trips of the season...went 4-5 on the first road trip to Houston (0-3), Baltimore (3-1) and Texas (1-1)...have a 10-8 record at home after going 4-4 on the last homestand against Houston (1-1), Toronto (0-3) and Texas (3-0)...last year, the A's went 50-31 (.617) at home compared to 47-34 (.580) on the road...had the fourth best home record in the AL but tied for the third best road record in the majors...it was the sixth best road record in Oakland history.

CLOSE AND NOT CLOSE: The A's had their first walk-off win of the season Wednesday, a 6-5 victory over Texas...it was also their first last at bat win of the year...it was Oakland's ninth one-run game, which is tied with Kansas City, Houston, and Boston for second most in the American League (Seattle, 12)...14 of the A's 29 games have been decided by four runs or more and the 14 games are second to Baltimore (15) for the most in the AL...are 4-5 in one-run games and 7-7 in games decided by four runs or more.

PITCHING: Before Friday night, A's pitchers had struck out nine or more batters in each of the previous seven games, which was the longest such streak by an A's team since strikeouts became an official statistic in the American League in 1913...struck out nine again yesterday afternoon...had 74 strikeouts in 63.0 innings over that span (10.6 per nine innings)...the A's have a 5.77 ERA (101 er in 157.2 ip) over the last 18 games after logging a 2.94 ERA over the first 11 contests...have surrendered 27 home runs over the last 18 games after yielding eight over the first 11...lead the AL in shutouts (3).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-8 with a 6.77 ERA (70 er in 93.0 ip) and .297 (114-for-384) opponents batting average over the last 19 games dating back to April 5 after going 6-1 with a 2.30 ERA and .181 opponents batting average over the first 10 contests...starters have 12 of the A's 14 wins and Oakland is tied for the Major League lead in wins by a starting pitcher (PHI)...last year, starters had just 52 of the A's 97 wins (53.6%)... have tossed fewer than seven innings in all but one of the team's 29 games... snapped a 27-game streak of starts pitching fewer than seven innings last night, which was the longest season-opening streak in Oakland history... tossed fewer than seven innings in each of the final 36 games last year, which was already the longest such streak in Oakland history...the longest outing by an A's starter this year is 7.0 innings by Mike Fiers Friday night... starters are averaging 5.09 innings per start...last year, A's starters tossed 824.1 innings, which was the fewest in Athletics history in a non-strike season (5.09 innings per start).

OFFENSE: The A's hit .314 (32-for-102) with 23 runs scored in the three game series against Texas but are batting .233 with an average of 4.06 runs per game at home...are hitting .265 (103-for-389) with 63 runs scored in 11 games on the road (5.73 per game)...are fifth in the American League in road batting average and runs per game and fifth in OPS (.837)...have the fourth lowest home batting average and runs per game, and the third lowest OPS (.695)...overall, the A's rank tied for fourth in the AL in runs (136), and fifth in home runs (42).

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit just five home runs in eight games on the last homestand...now have 20 home runs in 18 games at home compared to 22 in 11 games on the road...last year, the A's hit an American League record tying 136 home runs on the road...have hit 34 home runs in April, which exceeds their April home run total from last year...have not hit more than 33 home runs in April since 2006 when they had 34...have 42 home runs overall,

which is second most in Athletics history over the first 28 games of the season (43 in 2002)...the A's are 0-8 when going homerless and 7-1 when holding the opposition homerless...are 1-8 when getting out-homered, which is the worst record in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 11 errors in the last 16 games after making three over the first 13 contests...have a .986 fielding percentage for the season, which is fifth best in the American League...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is tied for the third most in the AL.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 8-3 (.727) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 6-12 (.333) against right-handers...the .333 winning percentage against righties is third worst in the AL...the A's are batting .262 with an .823 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .239 with a .706 OPS against right-handers.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list eight times this year... currently have seven players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea, Martini, Olson), four of which are on the 60-day IL (Cotton, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea)...Oakland used the disabled list 26 times last year, which was second most in Oakland history to the record of 27 set in 2016... it marked the fourth consecutive season and eighth time in the last 12 years the A's have used the IL at least 20 times...have had at least four players on the IL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

CONTRACT STATUS: After Khris Davis agreed to terms on a two-year contract extension last week, the A's now have four players under contract beyond the 2019 season...Joakim Soria and Mike Fiers are signed through 2020, Davis is signed through 2021 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023...Yusmeiro Petit has a club option for 2020.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's were swept in a three-game series in Oakland last weekend after going 7-0 against the Blue Jays last year...it was the first time Oakland was swept in a three-game series by Toronto in the Coliseum since Aug. 30-Sept. 1, 1993...it is just the second time the A's have gone winless against the Blue Jays at home in one season (0-6 in 1982)...last year, the A's swept a three-game series in Oakland and a four-game series in Toronto...it was one of four times in franchise history the A's went undefeated in a season series of seven or more games (12-0 vs. New York in 1990; 7-0 vs. Baltimore in 2004; 7-0 in Detroit in 2018)...won the season series last year for the first time since 2014...are 224-200 all-time against the Blue Jays, including 113-99 in Oakland, 112-98 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 71-66 (.518) in Rogers Centre and are one of just two American League teams (besides Toronto) with a winning record in this ballpark (Boston, 136-104, .567).

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman hit his eighth home run on Wednesday, which is tied for sixth in the American League and is the most among Major League third basemen...Khris Davis is second in the AL in home runs (10) and is tied for sixth in RBI (22)...now has 143 home runs over the last four seasons, which is 19 more than any other player...Ramón Laureano is tied for second among ML outfielders with five assists...now has 14 assists in 75 games in the outfield over the last two years, which is tied for second most among ML outfielders, despite him not making his ML debut until Aug. 3, 2018... Marcus Semien ranks third in the AL in runs (21), fifth in hits (34), tied for fourth in multiple hit games (10) and tied for ninth in doubles (8)...Blake Treinen has not allowed a run in 10 of his 11 games and has a 0.68 ERA for the season, which is second lowest among AL relievers...is tied for fifth in saves (6).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1987 Dennis Eckersley commits an error in the A's 7-1 win over Boston... he would not commit another error for eight years, setting what was then an American League record for pitchers with 470 consecutive errorless games...in 2002 Tim Hudson and Billy Koch combine on a three-hit shutout and Eric Chavez homers and drives in four runs in the A's 10-0 win over Chicago...in 2010 Cliff Pennington and Adam Rosales collect four hits each, marking the first time in Athletics history both middle infielders had at least four hits in the same game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (1-0, 0.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 17 and is scheduled to make his second appearance and start of the season...tossed five scoreless innings for the win in his first start last Monday in Oakland against Texas...made the trip to Japan but was one of three inactive players for the two-game series against the Mariners...was placed on the 10-day injured list March 27 retroactive to March 25 with a right lower leg contusion...made three rehab starts with Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas April 16.

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Picked up the win in his first start this year and is now 3-0 with a 2.23 ERA (9 er in 36.1 ip) and .202 (26-for-129) opponents batting average over his last nine games, including five starts, dating back to June 27, 2018...the winning streak is the first of his career...has not lost since June 22, 2018 at Chicago (AL).

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Texas last Monday in Oakland...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits... walked four and struck out an A's season-high seven...retired the side in order just once...was relieved by Dull to start the sixth with the A's leading 2-0.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA and .242 opponents batting average on a three start rehab assignment...struck out 16 batters in 11.0 innings and walked two...his first assignment came with Stockton on April 4 against Rancho Cucamonga...retired all nine batters he faced, the first five by strikeout...moved to Las Vegas for a start on April 9 in a 10-2 win against Sacramento...allowed just one run in three innings of work, a bases loaded walk to Michael Reed in the first inning...then had a no decision in a 6-5 loss to Fresno on April 14...allowed five runs on five hits in five innings of work.

2018 RECAP: Had seven stints with Oakland in his return to the majors following "Tommy John" surgery in 2016...went 2-3 with a 3.02 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in 11 games, including seven starts...the ERA and opponents batting average were the lowest of his four seasons as was his .309 on-base percentage, .315 slugging percentage and .624 OPS...the two wins matched his career total entering the season as he was 2-11 over his first three seasons...struck out 41 batters in 47.2 innings for a career-best average of 7.74 strikeouts per nine innings.

2018 OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a mark of .218 (19-for-87) against left-handed hitters compared to .223 (21-for-94)

against right-handers...surrendered three of his four home runs to righties... yielded a .195 batting average to batters leading off an inning but walked eight for a .340 on-base percentage...three of the four home runs he allowed were solo shots...opponents hit .205 with runners in scoring position...had a .189 opponents average with two outs and .137 with two strikes...the opponents four and five hitters were a combined 3-for-38 (.079).

2018 SPLITS: Was 2-3 with a 3.19 ERA and .236 opponents batting average in his seven starts, 0-0 with a 2.45 ERA and .162 opponents average in four relief appearances...did not allow a run in the first inning (7.0 ip) and had a 1.73 ERA over innings 1-3...logged a 4.57 ERA and surrendered all four of his home runs from the fourth inning on...went 0-2 with a 2.78 ERA in five games at home and is now 2-7 despite a 2.58 ERA (25 er in 87.1 ip) in 17 career games in the Coliseum...went 0-2 with a 3.18 ERA in three starts during the day and is now 0-8 with a 4.35 ERA (39 er in 80.2 ip) in 15 career outing during the day...received two runs of support or fewer in five of his seven starts and his RSA as a starter was 3.19...has received two runs of support or fewer in 25 of his 31 career starts and his career RSA as a starter is 2.69 (52 rs in 173.2 ip).

2018 HIGHLIGHTS: Was recalled for the first time April 20 but did not pitch before he was optioned back to Nashville April 26...also did not appear in a game during his second stint, which lasted one day on May 26...was recalled for a third time June 9 and started that day at Kansas City...allowed a run on three hits and a walk in a season-high 7.0 innings but was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss...it was his first Major League appearance since April 28, 2016 at Detroit as he had UCL reconstruction surgery on May 6, 2016...was optioned back to Nashville the next day...made two starts during his fourth stint June 14-22 and took the loss in each outing to extend his losing streak to a career-high nine games...that tied for the third longest losing streak in Oakland history and was the longest since Bob Welch also lost nine straight from Sept. 5, 1993-May 11, 1994...compiled a 5.56 ERA and .290 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 13 starts dating from Aug. 21, 2015 to June 22, 2018...stint number five began June 27 and he combined with Petit and Trivino on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Detroit that day...it was his first Major League victory since Aug. 4, 2015 against Baltimore...tossed six innings and allowed two of the hits but walked a career-high tying five...went $2\overline{-0}$ with a 2.59 ERA and .212 opponents batting average over his final eight games, including four starts...the winning streak was the first of his career...was 2-0 with a 2.87 ERA during his fifth stint before he was optioned to Nashville July 12...returned Aug. 26, allowing one run on four hits in 4.2 innings in a no decision at Minnesota that day, and was optioned back to Nashville the next day...was called back for his seventh and final stint Sept. 7 and pitched exclusively in relief following his return, all in games started by an opener...tossed three innings in three of the four games and had a 2.45 ERA and .162 opponents batting average in the four games.

2018 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 5-5 with a 4.30 ERA in 18 games, including 14 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...was 2-3 with a 6.10 ERA and .314 opponents batting average over his first 10 games (seven starts)through June 2...then went 3-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over his final eight games (seven starts) following his July 12 option from Oakland... surrendered six home runs in 81.2 innings, an average of 0.66 per nine innings...struck out 83, an average of 9.15 per nine innings, and walked 25 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.32...allowed a .271 opponents batting average, including .215 (29-for-135) against left-handed hitters compared to .313 (57-for-182) against right-handers...had a .573 OPS against lefties, .817 against righties...was 3-1 with a 2.18 ERA in 10 games at home, 2-4 with a 6.94 ERA in eight games on the road...surrendered five of his six home runs on the road...went 1-1 with a 1.59 ERA in four relief appearances, 4-4 with a 5.01 ERA in 14 starts...tossed at least four innings in all four of his relief appearances but tossed four innings or fewer in six of his 14 starts...allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 18 appearances.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Frankie Montas (4-1, 3.10 ERA): Has won four of his first five starts and is tied for second in the Majors in wins...is 3-0 with a 3.50 ERA and .224 opponents batting average over his last three starts...the winning streak matches the A's season high and equals his career high...has a .183 opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .292 against left-handers...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 11-5 A's win over Texas last Tuesday in Oakland (5.2 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...is 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (3.2 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 6 so) in two career appearances against Boston, both in relief in 2017 in Oakland...went 2-0 with two saves and a 0.56 ERA in five games, including two starts, during the spring...the ERA was the lowest in the majors and his .190 opponents average was second lowest in the Cactus League... went 5-4 with a 3.88 ERA in 13 games, including 11 starts, over four stints with Oakland last year.

- Has allowed 21-of-47 (44.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the majors.

- Ten of his 14 outings have been scoreless, including a seven-game scorless streak from April 10-23 (8.1 ip, 4 h, bb, 5 so).
- Opponents are 10-for-56 (.192) but eight of the 10 hits are for extra bases (three doubles, two triples, three home runs).
- Has a .130 (3-for-23) average against left-handed hitters compared to .241 (7-for-29) against right-handers.
- Had pitched 3.1 scoreless innings against Toronto this season before giving up two earned runs last night...had never allowed an earned run (two unearned) to the Blue Jays in eight career appearances including one start (16.0 ip, 10 h, 2 r, 0 er, 3 bb, 14 so) before last night.
