OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-18) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (13-17)

WEDNESDAY, MAY 1, 2019 — FENWAY PARK — 1:05 P.M. EDT RHP MIKE FIERS (2-2, 7.03) VS. RHP HECTOR VELÁZQUEZ (0-2, 3.86) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (KTRB 860 AM/KHTK 1140 AM) — A'S CAST ON TUNEIN

ABOUT THE A'S: Have a season-high five-game losing streak...have not lost more than four in a row since Aug. 28-Sept. 5, 2017 when they dropped eight straight...have also lost eight of the last 11 games and are a season-low four games under .500 at 14-18...it marks the first time the A's have been more than two games under .500 since April 16 of last year when they were 7-10... are now 4-10 over the last 14 games after starting the year 10-8...are 10-6 (.625) in the Coliseum and 4-12 (.250) in all other ballparks...are tied for fourth place in the American League West and are five games out of first place...that ties the season high (last on April 11)...have spent two days in second this year, 11 days in third, four days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and three days in fifth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed two errors Monday night, which led to six unearned runs...those were the A's most unearned runs in a game since Aug. 28, 2009 against Los Angeles-AL when they had seven...had been charged with just four unearned runs over the first 30 games...now have made 16 errors in the last 19 games after committing just three over the first 13 contests...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is tied for the third most in the American League...allowed a season-high tying three stolen bases Monday night and opponents have 24 for the season, which is tied for second most in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's extended their road losing streak to six games last night...it marks the first time they have lost more than four straight road games in one season since an eight-game losing streak from Aug. 23-Sept. 12, 2017...are 0-5 on this nine-game road trip to Toronto (0-3), Boston (0-2) and Pittsburgh (three games) and are now 4-10 (.286) on the road for the season...that is tied for the second worst road record in the American League...this is the second of four straight nine-game road trips to start the year, which are the A's longest road trips of the season...have a 10-8 record at home after going 4-4 on the last homestand against Houston (1-1), Toronto (0-3) and Texas (3-0).

CLOSE AND NOT CLOSE: The A's lost 5-1 last night and are now 7-9 in games decided by four or more runs...the 16 games are tied for most in the majors...are 4-6 in one-run games and the 10 one-run games are tied for sixth most in the majors...two of the A's four losses on the trip have been walk-off losses...have three walk-off losses for the season, which is tied with Texas for the most in the majors...are 1-6 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied with Kansas City for the most last at bat losses in the majors.

IN APRIL: The A's had a losing record in April for the second time in the last three years as they finished 11-15 following yesterday's 5-1 loss to Boston... also went 11-14 in 2017...have lost more than 14 games in April just twice in Oakland history (17 in 1994 and 2001)...the A's .423 winning percentage was third worst in the American League in April...had a 4.89 ERA (124 er in 228.0 ip) and have not logged an ERA above 4.74 in April since posting a 5.38 ERA in 2001...have surrendered 34 home runs, which is second most in April in Athletics history (36 in 1996)...have 213 strikeouts, which is second most in April in Athletics history (220 in 2014)...the offense has hit 35 home runs, which are their most in April since 2002 when they hit an Athletics record 42 home runs in April.

MOTHER MAY I: In 2018, the Athletics went 15-14 in the month of May...A's pitchers finished the month with a 3.54 ERA (105 er, 266.2 ip), including 219 strikeouts and 91 walks...A's batters hit just .211 with a .647 OPS, including 34 home runs, and 104 runs scored, good for a season-worst 3.59 runs per game (not couting three games in March).

PITCHING: The A's have a 5.44 ERA (116 er in 192.0 ip) over the last 22 games after logging a 2.90 ERA over the first 10 contests...A's starting pitchers are 6-10 with a 6.26 ERA (76 er in 109.1 ip) and .290 (131-for-452) opponents batting average over the last 22 games after going 6-1 with a 2.30 ERA and .181 opponents batting average over the first 10 contests...starters have 12 of the A's 14 wins, which is tied for second most in the American League (Minnesota, 13)...last year, starters had just 52 of the A's 97 wins (53.6%)... starters tossed 7.0 innings twice in the three-game series at Toronto (Bassitt on Sunday, Fiers on Friday) after logging 6.2 innings or fewer in each of the first 27 games ...have now tossed seven innings or fewer in each of the last 73 games dating back to Aug. 17, 2018...the last A's starter to toss more than seven innings is Brett Anderson on Aug. 15, 2018 (7.2).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .159 (26-for-164) with 12 runs scored over the first five games of the road trip...are now batting .205 (85-for-415) with 44 runs scored (3.38 per game) over the last 14 games after hitting .310 with 58 runs scored (8.3 per game) over the previous seven contests...overall, rank fourth in the American League in runs scored (145) and have the fourth fewest strikeouts (232).

SMALL BALL: The A's are one of two teams without a sacrifice hit (Detroit) and now have a streak of 76 consecutive games without a sacrifice hit, which is the longest in Athletics history and third longest in Major League history (95, Toronto in 2002-03; 81, Boston in 2017-18)...the A's last sacrifice hit came on Aug. 12, 2018 at Los Angeles-AL (Pinder)...are one of three teams without a bunt hit (Boston, Los Angeles-AL)...have 10 stolen bases, which is third fewest in the American League...have the lowest stolen base percentage in the AL (10-for-17, 58.8%)

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered just twice on the trip...now have seven home runs in the last 13 games after hitting 36 over the first 19 contests... are 0-10 when going homerless and are one of three teams in the majors that has not won a game when hitting no home runs (Houston, Seattle)... are 1-10 when getting out-homered, which is the worst record in the AL and second worst in the majors (Miami, 1-15).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 8-4 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 6-14 (.300) against right-handers... the mark against righties is the worst in the majors...are batting .272 with an .830 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .225 with a .677 OPS against right-handers...have the fourth best batting average and OPS against lefties in the AL...have the third lowest OPS and batting average against righties...lead the AL in home runs off lefties (15).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's placed Mark Canha on the injured list Monday and have now used the IL nine times this year...currently have eight players on the IL (Canha, Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea, Martini, Olson), four of which are on the 60-day IL (Cotton, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea)... have had at least four players on the IL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RED SOX: The season series is tied, 3-3...lost the first two meetings in Boston after winning three of four games in Oakland April 1-4...need to win today to clinch a season series victory for the third consecutive year (went 4-2 last year and 4-3 in 2017)...the last time the Athletics won three or more consecutive season series from the Red Sox was 1925-32 when they won eight straight...are now 11-8 (.579) against the Red Sox over the last three years...have won nine of the last 12 games in the Coliseum but have lost 11 of the last 14 at Fenway...are 247-299 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 150-123 in Oakland, 96-175 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 889-1080 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League third basemen in home runs (8), total chances (96) and putouts (36)...*Khris Davis* ranks tied for second in the America League in home runs (10) and now has 143 over the last four seasons, which is 19 more than any other player...*Marcus Semien* has four multiple hit games in his last six games (8-for-24, .333) and 12 for the season, which is tied for third in the AL...is also tied for fourth in hits (38) and tied for sixth in runs (21).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1925** Jimmie Foxx makes his major league debut at the age of 17 with a pinch hit single...in **1991** Rickey Henderson become's baseball's all-time stolen base leader with his 939th career steal...he steals third base with a 1-0 count on Jose Canseco in the fourth inning...the steal comes against the New York Yankees, with whom he stole 326 bases...in **1992** Rickey Henderson steals the 1000th base of his career at Detroit, one year after breaking Lou Brock's all-time record...in **1993** Rickey Henderson's third inning single is his 1356th hit as an Athletic which passes Bert Campaneris for first place on the all-time Oakland hit list.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (2-2, 7.03 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season, which will tie him for the Major League lead...has compiled a 7.03 ERA, which is highest in the American League...leads the AL in runs allowed (25), has the third highest opponents batting average (.295), is tied for fourth in hits (39) and has the fourth highest opponents on-base percentage (.354).

LAST FOUR/FIRST THREE: IS 0-1 with a 10.59 ERA (20 er in 17.0 ip) and .367 (29-for-79) opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 2-1 with a 3.00 ERA and .189 opponents average over his first three starts... has six home runs in 17.0 innings over his last four starts after surrendering one in 15.0 innings over his first three.

APRIL AND BEYOND: Finished April with a 1-1 record and a 7.83 ERA in five starts...the ERA was his highest in a month of 10 or more innings (previous: 7.44 in Aug. 2017)...it was third highest in the majors this year among pitchers with 20 or more innings in April...is now 5-9 with a 5.68 ERA in 25 career appearances in April...is 43-34 with a 3.57 ERA (259 er in 653.0 ip) from May through August.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .254 (18-for-71) average against righthanded hitters compared to .344 (21-for-61) against left-handers...opponents are 10-for-31 (.323) when leading off an inning...has a .34 (12-for-37) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...last year, he had a .172 opponents average with RISP, which was second lowest in the AL among qualifiers for the ERA title (Snell, TB .088).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA (11 er in 18.1 ip) and .268 (19-for-71) opponents batting average in four starts at home compared to 0-0 with a 9.22 ERA (14 er in 13.2 ip) and .328 (20-for-61) opponents average in three starts on the road...his first home loss came at the Tokyo Dome and his second came in his last start, snapping a six-game winning streak in the Coliseum...it was his first loss in Oakland since July 18, 2016 and he is now 6-3 with a 3.78 ERA (33 er in 78.2 ip) in 15 career appearances, 14 starts, in the Coliseum...last year, he went 5-2 with a 2.77 ERA in 12 starts at Comerica Park and 3-0 with a 2.91 ERA in six starts in the Coliseum...combined for an 8-2 record and a 2.81 ERA in 18 starts in his home ballparks compared to 4-6 with a 4.65 ERA in 13 games on the road...ranked fifth in the AL in home ERA and tied for 10th in wins.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-7 loss to Seattle on Opening Day, March 20 in Tokyo...it was his first career Opening Day start and he became the A's 12th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 14 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice)...Oakland scored single runs in each of the first two innings but he allowed five runs in the third on a Gordon RBI single and a Santana grand slam...the A's scored twice in the bottom third to narrow the gap to 5-4 and he was relieved by Hendriks to start the fourth.

SECOND START: He combined with Trivino, Soria and Treinen on a three-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win over Los Angeles on March 28 in Oakland...tossed six of the innings and allowed just one hit while walking three...the hit was a one-out double by La Stella in the fifth...allowed only one base runner as far as third base.

THIRD START: He combined with Buchter, Trivino and Treinen on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win over Boston on April 2 in Oakland...tossed six of the innings and allowed five of the hits...did not walk a batter...allowed only two baserunners past second base...did not allow a run in his previous start, marking just the second time in his career he did not allowed a run in two consecutive starts...the other time was June 20-30, 2012 when he did it in three straight starts.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 9-8 loss at Houston April 7... tossed 1.2 innings, which matched the shortest start of his career (June 2, 2013 at Philadelphia)...Oakland scored twice in the top of the first but he allowed five runs in the bottom of the first on RBI singles by Brantley and Correa and a three-run home run by Diaz...the A's came back with two in the second to make the score 5-4 but he walked Diaz with two outs and the bases loaded in the bottom of the second and was relieved by Wendelken... the A's came back to take an 8-6 lead to get him off the hook before the bullpen allowed three runs over the final two innings for the loss.

FIFTH START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 8-6 win at Texas on April 12...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Forsythe RBI double and a Mazara RBI ground out...Oakland got one of those runs back in the second, but he surrendered a solo home run to Cabrera in the fourth and a three-run home run to Andrus in the fifth...was relieved by Petit to start the sixth inning trailing 6-5, but the A's scored once in each of the final three innings for the win.

SIXTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss to Toronto April 20 in Oakland...retired the side in order in the first two innings before allowing

a RBI single to Sogard in the third...then allowed five runs in the fourth inning, highlighted by a three-run home run by Tellez and a solo home run by Drury...left after 3.1 innings trailing 5-0.

LAST START: He had his third no decision in his last four starts in the A's 4-2 loss at Toronto last Friday...tossed 7.0 innings to become the first A's starter this year to complete seven innings...allowed a leadoff home run to Sogard in the first and a Grichuk RBI single in the third...Stroman blanked Oakland on one hit over seven innings but the A's tied the game with a two-run eighth and he was relieved by Wendelken to start the bottom of the eighth.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 0-0 with an 8.53 ERA (6.1 ip, 11 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 7 so, 3 hr) in two Cactus League starts...pitched in simulated games on his other scheduled work days...opponents were 11-for-29 (.379)...is now 6-8 with a 6.03 ERA (67 er in 100.0 ip) in 38 games, including 26 starts, in his career during the spring.

2018 RECAP: Was acquired by the A's from Detroit Aug. 6 and went 5-2 with a 3.74 ERA in 10 games, including nine starts, with Oakland...was 7-6 with a 3.48 ERA in 21 starts with the Tigers and combined for a 12-8 record and a 3.56 ERA in 31 games, 30 starts...the A's went 8-1 (.889) in his starting assignments and his teams were 21-9 (.700)...had career highs in wins and winning percentage (.600) and matched his highs in games, games started and home runs allowed (32)...his ERA was his lowest in a season of 75 or more innings pitched as was his .296 opponents on-base percentage...walked just 37 batters in 172.0 innings for a career-low average of 1.94 walks per nine innings.. ranked fifth in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings and 10th in ERA...had a .172 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position, which was second lowest in the AL among qualifiers for the ERA title (Snell, TB .088)...tied for third in most home runs and tied for ninth in most extra base hits (67)...his .450 opponents slugging percentage was third highest among the 27 AL qualifiers...was 4-3 with a 4.78 ERA and .279 opponents batting average over his first nine starts through May 25...then went 8-5 with a 3.07 ERA and .237 opponents average over his final 22 games beginning May 30...his ERA from May 30 through the end of the season was third lowest in the AL.

LHP Brett Anderson (3-2, 4.35 ERA): Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...went 3-0 with a 2.50 ERA over his first three starts but is 0-2 with a 6.92 ERA over his last three starts, all A's losses...his three wins are tied for 10th in the American League...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-1 A's loss at Toronto last Saturday (4.1 ip, 10 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...is 2-1 with a 3.10 ERA (20.1 ip, 16 h, 9 r, 7 er, 12 bb, 12 so, 2 hr) in four career appearances, all starts, against Pittsburgh...last faced the Pirates on April 24, 2017 when he was the winning pitcher in a 14-3 Cubs win at Pittsburgh (6.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 1 er, 6 bb, 3 so)...is 1-7 with a 5.93 ERA and .341 opponents batting average in 11 career interleague starts...went 4-5 with a 4.48 ERA in 17 starts with Oakland last year in a season that was interrupted by two stints on the disabled list...was out from May 19 to July 7 with a strained left shoulder and Aug. 28 to Sept. 12 with a strained left forearm.
