OAKLAND ATHLETICS (15-19) VS. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (14-15)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's snapped a season-high six-game losing streak last night with a 14-1 win over the Pirates...the 13-run victory is the largest of the season and the largest since they beat the Angels 21-3 on Sept. 20, 2018...were swept at Boston to start the week after being swept at Toronto last weekend...have been swept five times this year, which is the most in the majors...the six-game losing streak was the A's longest losing streak since Aug. 28-Sept. 5, 2017 when they dropped eight straight...are now 15-19 (.441) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...have not been more than five games under .500 since finishing the 2017 season 75-87...are now 5-11 over the last 16 games after starting the year 10-8...are 10-6 (.625) in the Coliseum and 5-13 (.278) in all other ballparks...are in fifth place in the AL West for the third consecutive day and are 4 games out of first place...that is 1 game short of the season high of five (last on May 1)...have spent two days in second this year, 11 days in third, four days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and six days in fifth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-6 on this nine-game road trip to Toronto (0-3), Boston (0-3) and Pittsburgh (1-0) and snapped a season-high seven-game road losing streak last night...that is Oakland's longest road losing streak since they dropped eight straight from Aug. 23-Sept. 12, 2017...are 5-11 (.313) on the road for the season, which is the fourth worst road record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...this is the second of four straight nine-game road trips to start the year, which are the A's longest road trips of the season...return home following the game Sunday for a six-game homestand against Cincinnati (three games) and Cleveland (three games)...went 4-4 on the last homestand against Houston (1-1), Toronto (0-3) and Texas (3-0) and are 10-8 at home.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's begin interleague play with this three-game series against Pittsburgh...will also travel to St. Louis (June 25-26), Chicago (Aug. 5-7) and San Francisco (Aug. 13-14) and host Cincinnati (May 7-9), Milwaukee (July 30-Aug. 1), St. Louis (Aug. 3-4) and San Francisco (Aug. 24-25)...went 12-8 (.600) against the National League last year, which tied for the eighth best interleague record in the majors...finished with a winning record against the NL for the first time since 2015 and the 13th time in 22 seasons of interleague play...are 218-187 (.538) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 2-for-3 with a walk this year as Kendrys Morales had an at bat after coming in to pitch on April 20 against Toronto...Brett Anderson went 2-for-3 last night in Pittsburgh...was the first multi-hit performance of his career...pitchers went 3-for-21 (.143) with a run, a RBI and six strikeouts last year...they are batting .088 (36-for-411) with four doubles, 12 RBI, 13 walks and 191 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is second lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .080)...the last home run by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...that is the longest active pitcher homerless drought by any team...Odom also had the last triple on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

OFFENSE: The A's were hitting .167 (33-for-198) with two home runs and 15 runs scored over the first six games of the road trip prior to last night's 14-run, 16-hit outburst...are now 49-for-241 (.203) with four home runs and 29 runs scored on the trip...are now batting .220 (108-for-492) with nine home runs and 61 runs scored (4.07 per game) over the last 15 games after hitting .259 with 36 home runs and 101 runs scored (5.3 per game) over the first 19 contests...are hitting .242 for the season, which is ninth in the American League...have the third fewest stolen bases (10) but have the fourth fewest strikeouts (248)...the A's are one of two teams without a sacrifice hit (Detroit) and now have a streak of 78 consecutive games without a sacrifice hit, which is the longest in Athletics history and third longest in Major League history (95, Toronto in 2002-03; 81, Boston in 2017-18)...the A's last sacrifice hit came on Aug. 12, 2018 at Los Angeles-AL (Pinder).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.42 ERA (121 er in 201.0 ip) over the last 23 games after posting a 2.94 ERA over the first 11 contests...have a 5.52 ERA (84 er in 137.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.82 at home...have the highest road ERA in the majors...overall, are tied for third in the American League in

most hit batters (17) and rank tied for fourth in wild pitches (16)...have allowed the second most stolen bases (25).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-11 with a 6.02 ERA (80 er in 119.2 ip) and .291 (140-for-492) opponents batting average over the last 24 games dating back to April 5 after going 6-1 with a 2.30 ERA and .181 opponents average over the first 10 contests...starters have 13 of the A's 15 wins, which is tied for second most in the American League (Minnesota, 15)...starters tossed 7.0 innings twice in the three-game series at Toronto last weekend (Fiers on Friday, Bassitt on Sunday) after logging 6.2 innings or fewer in each of the first 27 games...have now tossed seven innings or fewer in each of the last 75 games dating back to Aug. 17, 2018...the last A's starter to toss more than seven innings is Brett Anderson on Aug. 15, 2018 (7.2).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed eight errors in the last six games, which has led to seven unearned runs...made 13 errors over the first 28 contests, leading to four unearned runs...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is tied for fourth most in the American League.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 8-4 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 7-15 (.318) against right-handers...are batting .271 with an .832 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .232 with a .688 OPS against right-handers...have the second best batting average and OPS against lefties in the AL...have the fourth lowest OPS and batting average against righties...lead the AL in home runs off lefties (16).

THIS AND THAT: The A's lost all three games in Boston by four or more runs...18 of the A's 34 games this year have been decided by four or more runs, which is the most such games in the majors...are 8-10 in those games...are 0-11 when going homerless and are one of three teams in the majors that has not won a game when hitting no home runs (Houston, Seattle)...are 1-11 when getting out-homered, which is the worst record in the majors...are tied with Cincinnati and Texas for the most walk-off losses in the majors (3) and have the second most last at bat losses (6).

IN APRIL: The A's went 11-15 (.423) in April, which was the third worst record in the American League...it marked the second time in the last three years Oakland had a losing record in April...the 15 losses were third most in April in Oakland history (17 in 1994 and 2001)...compiled a 4.89 ERA, which was the highest April ERA by an A's team since 2001 (5.38)...yielded 34 home runs, which was two short of the record of 36 in 1996...struck out 213, which was seven short of the record of 220 in 2014...the offense hit 35 home runs, which tied for third most in April in Oakland history and was the most since 2002 (42).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list nine times this year...currently have eight players on the IL (Canha, Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea, Martini, Olson), four of which are on the 60-day IL (Cotton, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea)...Olson is currently on a rehab assignment...have had at least four players on the IL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. PIRATES: The A's and Pirates are meeting for the first time since 2016 when Pittsburgh swept a three-game series in Oakland, July 1-3...are squaring off at PNC Park for the first time since 2013 when Oakland won two of three, July 8-10...the A's win last night snapped a four-game losing streak to Pittsburgh after winning each of the first 11 meetings...are 12-4 all-time, including 6-3 in Oakland and 6-1 in Pittsburgh.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Phegley set an A's record for RBI by a catcher last night (8) and he now leads Major League catchers with 21 RBI this season...**Matt Chapman** leads Major League third basemen in putouts (39) and is tied for the lead in home runs as a third baseman (Arenado, COL)...**Khris Davis** ranks tied for third in the AL in home runs (10) and now has 143 over the last four seasons, which is 18 more than any other player.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1935 Jimmie Foxx scores five runs in the A's 12-1 victory over Cleveland...in 1969 John "Blue Moon" Odom is 3 for 3 with a homer and six RBI in the second game of a doubleheader vs. Seattle and picks up the win in the A's 11-7 victory.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (1-0, 0.75 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 17 and is scheduled to make his third appearance and start of the season...has allowed just one run on five hits in 12.0 innings over his first two starts...made the trip to Japan but was one of three inactive players for the two-game series against the Mariners...was placed on the 10-day injured list March 27 retroactive to March 25 with a right lower leg contusion...made three rehab starts with Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas April 16.

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Has a win and a no decision in his first two starts this year and is now 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA (10 er in 43.1 ip) and .187 (29-for-155) opponents batting average over his last 10 games, including six starts, dating back to June 27, 2018...the winning streak is the first of his career...has not lost since June 22, 2018 at Chicago (AL)...was 2-14 with a 4.11 ERA over his first 32 career appearances.

INTERLEAGUE: Had a no decision in his only interleague appearance last year, a start in the A's 6-2 win over San Diego on July 3 (4.2 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...is now 0-2 with a 2.87 ERA (15.2 ip, 17 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 13 so, 1 hr) in three career interleague starts.

INTERLEAGUE: Had his only at bats as a professional on July 25, 2015 at San Francisco when he went 0-for-2 with a strikeout.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Texas last April 22 in Oakland...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits...walked four and struck out seven...retired the side in order just once...was relieved by Dull to start the sixth with the A's leading 2-0.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss at Toronto last Sunday...allowed a leadoff home run to Sogard in the bottom of the first but then shut out the Blue Jays on two hits and no walks the rest of the way...the A's tied the game with a run in the third and he was relieved by Wendelken to start the eighth with the score tied 1-1.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA and .242 opponents batting average on a three start rehab assignment...struck out 16 batters in 11.0 innings and walked two...his first assignment came with Stockton on April 4 against Rancho Cucamonga...retired all nine batters he faced, the first five by strikeout...moved to Las Vegas for a start on April 9 in a 10-2 win against Sacramento...allowed just one run in three innings of work, a bases loaded walk to Michael Reed in the first inning...then had a no decision in a 6-5 loss to Fresno on April 14...allowed five runs on five hits in five innings of work.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA in four spring training appearances, including one start...allowed a .310 opponents batting average but issued just one walk in 10.2 innings while striking out 12...also pitched in relief in the exhibition game against Nippon Ham in Tokyo on March 18 (1.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 1 so).

2018 RECAP: Had seven stints with Oakland in his return to the majors following "Tommy John" surgery in 2016...went 2-3 with a 3.02 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in 11 games, including seven starts...the ERA and

opponents batting average were the lowest of his four seasons as was his .309 on-base percentage, .315 slugging percentage and .624 OPS...the two wins matched his career total entering the season as he was 2-11 over his first three seasons...struck out 41 batters in 47.2 innings for a career-best average of 7.74 strikeouts per nine innings.

2018 OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a mark of .218 (19-for-87) against left-handed hitters compared to .223 (21-for-94) against right-handers...surrendered three of his four home runs to righties...yielded a .195 batting average to batters leading off an inning but walked eight for a .340 on-base percentage...three of the four home runs he allowed were solo shots...opponents hit .205 with runners in scoring position...had a .189 opponents average with two outs and .137 with two strikes...the opponents four and five hitters were a combined 3-for-38 (.079).

2018 SPLITS: Was 2-3 with a 3.19 ERA and .236 opponents batting average in his seven starts, 0-0 with a 2.45 ERA and .162 opponents average in four relief appearances...did not allow a run in the first inning (7.0 ip) and had a 1.73 ERA over innings 1-3...logged a 4.57 ERA and surrendered all four of his home runs from the fourth inning on...went 0-2 with a 2.78 ERA in five games at home and is now 2-7 despite a 2.58 ERA (25 er in 87.1 ip) in 17 career games in the Coliseum...went 0-2 with a 3.18 ERA in three starts during the day and is now 0-8 with a 4.11 ERA (40 er in 87.2 ip) in 16 career outings during the day...received two runs of support or fewer in five of his seven starts and his RSA as a starter was 3.19...has received two runs of support or fewer in 26 of his 32 career starts and his career RSA as a starter is 2.64 (53 rs in 180.2 ip).

2018 HIGHLIGHTS: Was recalled for the first time April 20 but did not pitch before he was optioned back to Nashville April 26...also did not appear in a game during his second stint, which lasted one day on May 26...was recalled for a third time June 9 and started that day at Kansas City...allowed a run on three hits and a walk in a season-high 7.0 innings but was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss...it was his first Major League appearance since April 28, 2016 at Detroit as he had UCL reconstruction surgery on May 6, 2016...was optioned back to Nashville the next day...made two starts during his fourth stint June 14-22 and took the loss in each outing to extend his losing streak to a career-high nine games...that tied for the third longest losing streak in Oakland history and was the longest since Bob Welch also lost nine straight from Sept. 5, 1993-May 11, 1994...compiled a 5.56 ERA and .290 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 13 starts dating from Aug. 21, 2015 to June 22, 2018...stint number five began June 27 and he combined with Petit and Trivino on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Detroit that day...it was his first Major League victory since Aug. 4, 2015 against Baltimore...tossed six innings and allowed two of the hits but walked a career-high tying five...went 2-0 with a 2.59 ERA and .212 opponents batting average over his final eight games, including four starts...the winning streak was the first of his career...was 2-0 with a 2.87 ERA during his fifth stint before he was optioned to Nashville July 12...returned Aug. 26, allowing one run on four hits in 4.2 innings in a no decision at Minnesota that day, and was optioned back to Nashville the next day...was called back for his seventh and final stint Sept. 7 and pitched exclusively in relief following his return, all in games started by an opener...tossed three innings in three of the four games and had a 2.45 ERA and .162 opponents batting average in the four games.

2018 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 5-5 with a 4.30 ERA in 18 games, including 14 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...was 2-3 with a 6.10 ERA and .314 opponents batting average over his first 10 games (seven starts) through June 2...then went 3-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over his final eight games (seven starts) following his July 12 option from Oakland...surrendered six home runs in 81.2 innings, an average of 0.66 per nine innings...struck out 83, an average of 9.15 per nine innings, and walked 25 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.32...allowed a .271 opponents batting average, including .215 (29-for-135) against left-handed hitters compared to .313 (57-for-182) against right-handers...had a .573 OPS against lefties, .817 against righties...was 3-1 with a 2.18 ERA in 10 games at home, 2-4 with a 6.94 ERA in eight games on the road...surrendered five of his six home runs on the road...went 1-1 with a 1.59 ERA in four relief appearances, 4-4 with a 5.01 ERA in 14 starts...tossed at least four innings in all four of his relief appearances but tossed four innings or fewer in six of his 14 starts...allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 18 appearances.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Frankie Montas (4-2, 2.97 ERA): Has won four of his first six starts and is tied for fifth in the American League in wins...the four wins are one short of his career high of five from last year...opponents have grounded into seven double plays with him on the mound, which is the tied for most in the majors... has a 1.50 ERA over innings 1-4 and a 6.75 ERA from the fifth inning on...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 9-4 A's loss at Boston on Monday (4.1 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...has never faced Pittsburgh in his career...is 2-1 with a 5.59 ERA in six career interleague appearances, including three starts... is 0-for-5 with five strikeouts as a hitter...went 2-0 with two saves and a 0.56 ERA in five games, including two starts, during the spring...the ERA was the lowest in the majors and his .190 opponents average was second lowest in the Cactus League...went 5-4 with a 3.88 ERA in 13 games, including 11 starts, over four stints with Oakland last year.

- Made one appearance for the Aviators and pitched 1.0 scoreless inning on April 26.
- Has allowed a .158 (3-for-19) average against left-handed hitters, .563 (9-for-16) against right-handers.
- Has allowed three of his nine inherited runners to score this year...allowed just two inherited runners to score all last year.
