OAKLAND ATHLETICS (15-20) VS. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (15-15)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's lost last night after snapping a season-high six-game losing streak last with a 14-1 win over the Pirates on Friday...the 13-run victory is the largest of the season and the largest since they beat the Angels 21-3 on Sept. 20, 2018...were swept at Boston to start the week after being swept at Toronto last weekend...have been swept five times this year, which is the most in the majors...the six-game losing streak was the A's longest losing streak since Aug. 28-Sept. 5, 2017 when they dropped eight straight...are now 15-20 (.429) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...have not been more than five games under .500 since finishing the 2017 season 75-87...are now 5-12 over the last 17 games after starting the year 10-8...are 10-6 (.625) in the Coliseum and 5-14 (.263) in all other ballparks...are in fifth place in the AL West for the fourth consecutive day and are 5 games out of first place...that matches the season high of five (last on May 3)...have spent two days in second this year, 11 days in third, four days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and seven days in fifth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-7 on this nine-game road trip to Toronto (0-3), Boston (0-3) and Pittsburgh (1-1)...snapped a season-high seven-game road losing streak Friday night...that is Oakland's longest road losing streak since they dropped eight straight from Aug. 23-Sept. 12, 2017...are 5-12 (.294) on the road for the season, which is the third worst road record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...this is the second of four straight nine-game road trips to start the year, which are the A's longest road trips of the season...return home following the game Sunday for a six-game homestand against Cincinnati (three games) and Cleveland (three games)...went 4-4 on the last homestand against Houston (1-1), Toronto (0-3) and Texas (3-0) and are 10-8 at home.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's continue interleague play with the finale of this three-game series against Pittsburgh...will also travel to St. Louis (June 25-26), Chicago (Aug. 5-7) and San Francisco (Aug. 13-14) and host Cincinnati (May 7-9), Milwaukee (July 30-Aug. 1), St. Louis (Aug. 3-4) and San Francisco (Aug. 24-25)...went 12-8 (.600) against the National League last year, which tied for the eighth best interleague record in the majors...finished with a winning record against the NL for the first time since 2015 and the 13th time in 22 seasons of interleague play...are 218-189 (.536) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 2-for-5 with a walk this year as Kendry Morales had an at bat after coming in to pitch on April 20 against Toronto...Brett Anderson went 2-for-3 Friday night in Pittsburgh...was the first multi-hit performance of his career...pitchers went 3-for-21 (.143) with a run, a RBI and six strikeouts last year...they are batting .087 (36-for-413) with four doubles, 12 RBI, 13 walks and 193 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is second lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .080)...the last home run by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...that is the longest active pitcher homerless drought by any team...Odom also had the last triple on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

OFFENSE: The A's were hitting .167 (33-for-198) with two home runs and 15 runs scored over the first six games of the road trip prior to Friday night's 14-run, 16-hit outburst...scored four runs on 10 hits last night...are now 59-for-277 (.213) with four home runs and 33 runs scored on the trip...are now batting .223 (118-for-528) with nine home runs and 65 runs scored (4.06 per game) over the last 16 games after hitting .259 with 36 home runs and 101 runs scored (5.3 per game) over the first 19 contests...are hitting .242 for the season, which is 10th in the American League...have the third fewest stolen bases (10) but have the fourth fewest strikeouts (256)...the A's are one of two teams without a sacrifice hit (Detroit) and now have a streak of 79 consecutive games without a sacrifice hit, which is the longest in Athletics history and third longest in Major League history (95, Toronto in 2002-03; 81, Boston in 2017-18)...the A's last sacrifice hit came on Aug. 12, 2018 at Los Angeles-AL (Pinder).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.47 ERA (127 er in 209.0 ip) over the last 24 games after posting a 2.94 ERA over the first 11 contests...have a 5.59 ERA (90 er in 145.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.82 at home...have the highest road ERA in the majors...overall, are tied for third in the American League in most hit batters (17) and rank tied for fifth in wild pitches (16)...are tied for the second most stolen bases allowed (25).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-11 with a 5.99 ERA (83 er in 124.2 ip) and .283 (145-for-512) opponents batting average over the last 25 games dating back to April 5 after going 6-1 with a 2.30 ERA and .181 opponents average over the first 10 contests...starters have 13 of the A's 15 wins, which is tied for second most in the American League (Minnesota, 15)...starters tossed 7.0 innings twice in the three-game series at Toronto last weekend (Fiers on Friday, Bassitt on Sunday) after logging 6.2 innings or fewer in each of the first 27 games...have now tossed seven innings or fewer in each of the last 76 games dating back to Aug. 17, 2018...the last A's starter to toss more than seven innings is Brett Anderson on Aug. 15, 2018 (7.2).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed eight errors in the last seven games, which has led to seven unearned runs...made 13 errors over the first 28 contests, leading to four unearned runs.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are batting .271 with an .828 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .234 with a .692 OPS against right-handers...have the second best batting average and third best OPS against lefties in the AL...have the fourth lowest OPS and batting average against righties...lead the AL in home runs off lefties (16).

IN APRIL: The A's went 11-15 (.423) in April, which was the third worst record in the American League...it marked the second time in the last three years Oakland had a losing record in April...the 15 losses were third most in April in Oakland history (17 in 1994 and 2001)...compiled a 4.89 ERA, which was the highest April ERA by an A's team since 2001 (5.38)...yielded 34 home runs, which was two short of the record of 36 in 1996...struck out 213, which was seven short of the record of 220 in 2014...the offense hit 35 home runs, which tied for third most in April in Oakland history and was the most since 2002 (42).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list nine times this year...currently have eight players on the IL (Canha, Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea, Martini, Olson), four of which are on the 60-day IL (Cotton, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea)...Olson is currently on a rehab assignment...have had at least four players on the IL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. PIRATES: The A's and Pirates are meeting for the first time since 2016 when Pittsburgh swept a three-game series in Oakland, July 1-3...are squaring off at PNC Park for the first time since 2013 when Oakland won two of three, July 8-10...the A's win Friday night snapped a four-game losing streak to Pittsburgh after winning each of the first 11 meetings...are 12-5 all-time, including 6-3 in Oakland and 6-2 in Pittsburgh.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is tied for the Major League lead among third basemen with nine home runs (Arenado, COL), is second with a 1.014 OPS (Rendon, WAS), and ranks first in putouts (39)...**Josh Phegley** leads Major League catchers with 21 RBI this season...**Khris Davis** ranks tied for fourth in the AL in home runs (10) and now has 143 over the last four seasons, which is 18 more than any other player.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1939** Sam Chapman hits for the cycle and then homers in his first two at bats the following day...in **1949** Bobby Shantz tosses nine hitless innings of relief in the A's 5-4 win over Detroit...Wally Moses hits a two-run home run in the 13th inning after Shantz allows a run in the top of the inning...in **2000** the A's score 16 runs at Texas but lose 17-16, setting an AL record for runs scored in a loss...all 18 starters in the game score at least one run, an AL first...in **2018** Khris Davis hits a two-run walk-off home run in the bottom of the 12th to defeat Baltimore 2-0...it is the first time in franchise history a player hit an extra-inning walk-off home run to break a scoreless tie.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (4-2, 2.97 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...has won four of his first six starts and is tied for fifth in the American League in wins...the four wins are one short of his career high of five from last year...the A's are 4-2 in his starting assignments and are 11-6 (.647) when he starts in his career...was on the Opening Day roster and was available in the bullpen for the two games against Seattle in Japan but did not pitch.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents have grounded into seven double plays with him on the mound, which is the tied for most in the majors...has a .160 (8-for-50) opponents batting average the first time through the line up, .302 (16-for-53) the second time and .333 (9-for-27) the third time...has walked just two batters to lead off an inning...three of the four home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has yielded a .367 (11-for-30) average with runners in scoring position...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number eight hitter (0-for-11) and the nine hitter is 1-for-11 (.091).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Went 2-1 with a 2.65 ERA in three interleague starts last year compared to 3-3 with a 4.31 ERA in 10 games against American League competition...is now 2-1 with a 5.59 ERA (12 er in 19.1 ip) in six career interleague appearances, including three starts.

WITH THE BAT: Had his first at bats as a professional last year and went 0-for-5 with five strikeouts in two games.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed one earned run in each of the first four innings and has a 1.50 ERA (4 er in 24.0 ip) over innings 1-4...has a 6.75 ERA (7 er in 9.1 ip) from the fifth inning on...last year, he allowed 14 of his 34 runs in the first inning (8.18 ERA).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-0 with a 2.50 ERA (5 er in 18.0 ip) and .227 (15-for-66) opponents batting average in three starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 3.52 ERA (6 er in 16.1 ip) and .281 (18-for-64) opponents average in three starts on the road...has surrendered three of his four home runs on the road.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Was the losing pitcher in his last start, snapping his winning streak at a career-high tying three games (also May 27-June 8, 2018)...went 3-0 with a 3.50 ERA and .224 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned three starts from April 10-23.

THIS AND THAT: Went 3-2 with a 3.29 ERA in five starts in April...tied for fifth in the American League in wins in April...has allowed four home runs in 33.1 innings this year after yielding five in 65.0 innings last year...has received 10 runs of support twice this year and two runs of support or fewer three times

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) March 31 in Oakland...tossed six innings and allowed just one run on three hits...allowed a leadoff double to Calhoun, hit Trout and then retired 16 consecutive batters before Calhoun homered with two outs in the sixth...was relieved by Trivino after allowing a double to Bour to start the seventh inning.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss at Houston April 5...allowed a Bregman RBI single in the third but the A's came back to tie the game in the fourth...surrendered a lead off home run to Correa in the bottom of the fourth to give Houston the lead for good.

THIRD START: He picked up his second victory of the season in the A's 10-3 win at Baltimore on April 10...retired each of the first 12 batters he faced and had a 7-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Mancini in the fifth...also allowed a two-run home run to Ruiz that inning...was relieved by Wenderdelken to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 10-3.

FOURTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Houston on April 17 in Oakland...did not allow a hit until Gurriel singled with one out in the fifth...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Brantley in the sixth...the A's came back with a run in the bottom of the sixth and he was relieved by Trivino with one out and a runner on first in the seventh.

FIFTH START: He extended his winning streak to three games in the A's 11-5 victory over Texas April 23 in Oakland...tossed a career-high 107 pitches...allowed a RBI double to Mazaara in the first and a RBI single to Cabrera in the second...the score was tied at 2-2 when the A's scored six times in the fourth inning...allowed another run in the sixth on a Forysthe sacrifice fly and was relieved by Petit after 5.2 innings with the A's leading 10-3.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Boston last Monday...surrendered a career-high tying seven runs in 4.1 innings but only one of the runs was earned...the six unearned runs tied for second most in Oakland history and were the most since Brett Anderson also had six on May 15, 2009 vs. Detroit...had a 4-0 lead when his own error and a Profar error led to six unearned runs in the third...also allowed a RBI single to Chavis in the fifth.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-0 with two saves and a 0.56 ERA in five games, including two starts...the ERA was the lowest in the majors and his .190 opponents batting average was second lowest in the Cactus League...led the A's in innings pitched (16.0) and strikeouts (16) and tied for the team lead in wins and saves...did not allow a home run...also pitched in relief in the exhibition game against Nippon Ham on March 17 (1.0 ip).

2018 RECAP: Went 5-4 with a 3.88 ERA in 13 games, including 11 starts, over four stints with Oakland...was 5-2 with a 3.35 ERA in eight starts during his first stint from May 27 to July 9 and 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five games over his final three stints...surrendered just five home runs in 65.0 innings after yielding 10 home runs in 32.0 innings in 2017...struck out 43 batters (5.95 per nine innings) after fanning 56 in 47.0 innings (10.72 per nine innings) over his first two seasons.

2018 OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .290 opponents batting average, including .276 (35-for-127) against right-handed hitters compared to .305 (39-for-128) against left-handers...yielded 20 of his 28 extra base hits to lefties and had a .378 slugging percentage against righties compared to .523 against lefties...now has a .366 career opponents slugging percentage against righties, .557 against lefties...the opponents clean-up hitter went 3-for-27 (.111) against him.

THIS AND THAT: Allowed 14 of his 34 runs in the first inning for an 8.18 ERA...had a 3.00 ERA from the second inning on...was 2-3 with a 4.35 ERA in six games in Oakland, 3-1 with a 3.44 ERA in seven games on the road...was 2-1 with a 2.65 ERA in three interleague starts compared to 3-3 with a 4.31 ERA in 10 games against the American League...batted for the first time as a professional and went 0-for-5 with five strikeouts...the A's were 7-4 (.636) in his 11 starting assignments.

2018 HIGHLIGHTS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 27 and won each of his first three starts, posting a 1.25 ERA and .208 opponents batting average...the winning streak was the longest of his career...struck out a career-high tying seven batters in 6.0 innings in his first start on May 27 against Arizona and was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 victory...no-hit the Diamondbacks over the first five innings...combined with Pagan on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 16-0 win at Kansas City June 1...tossed a career-high eight innings and allowed seven of the hits...had his scoreless streak snapped at a career-high 15.0 innings June 8 against Kansas City...combined with Trivino and Treinen on a five-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Houston on July 9...tossed 6.0 innings and yielded three of the hits but was optioned to Nashville the next day...was recalled July 24 and went 0-1 with a 5.79 ERA in two starts before he was optioned back to the Sounds July 30...his third stint lasted one day on Aug. 30...returned to Oakland Sept. 11 and made two appearances following his return, both in relief (1.1 ip, 1 h)...did not pitch after Sept. 19.

2018 WITH NASHVILLE: Was 4-5 with a 4.65 ERA in 15 games, all starts, with Triple-A Nashville...had a .255 opponents batting average, including .189 (18-for-95) against left-handed hitters compared to .290 (51-for-176) against right-handers...surrendered seven home runs, six to righties...had a .519 OPS against lefties, .816 against righties...opponents hit .314 with runners in scoring position but that dropped to .222 with RISP and two outs...allowed a .229 average and five walks (.280 on-base percentage) to batters lead off an inning...was 4-1 with a 3.12 ERA in six starts at home, 0-4 with a 6.99 ERA in six starts on the road.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Mike Fiers (2-3, 6.81 ERA): Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season, which will tie him for the Major League lead...has a 3.75 ERA over his last two starts after compiling a 9.41 ERA over his first six starts...allowed six runs in each of his previous three starts and was 0-1 with a 16.20 ERA and .442 opponents batting average over that span...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-3 A's loss in Boston (.50 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, hr, bb, hbp, 3 so)...is 3-4 with a 5.26 ERA in nine career outings (seven starts, two relief) against Pittsburgh, including 48 strikeouts and seven walks...last faced Pittsburgh on July 17, 2015 (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...is 1-1 with a career 5.56 ERA at PNC Park...last pitched at PNC on May 16, 2013...was acquired by the A's from Detroit Aug. 6 and went 5-2 with a 3.74 ERA in 10 games, including nine starts, with Oakland...was 7-6 with a 3.48 ERA in 21 starts with the Tigers and combined for a 12-8 record and a 3.56 ERA in 31 games, 30 starts.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas Monday for his second stint with the A's and pitched in three games since then (2.0 ip, h, 2 bb, 2 so)...was on the A's Opening Day roster and logged a 7.04 ERA in 13 games before he was optioned to Las Vegas April 22.
- Made one appearance for the Aviators and pitched 1.0 scoreless inning on April 26.
- Has allowed a .190 (4-for-21) average against left-handed hitters, .500 (9-for-18) against right-handers.
- Has allowed three of his nine inherited runners to score this year...allowed just two inherited runners to score all last year.
- Has pitched 2.2 scoreless innings in three career appearances against Pittsburgh (2.2 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 1 so).
