OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-24) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (21-23)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight and three of the last five games to fall to five games under .500 at 19-24...that is one short of the season high of six (15-21 on May 5)...the A's .442 winning percentage is fourth lowest in the American League...are in fifth place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by a season-high 8½ games...have been in last or tied for last every day dating back to April 30...have spent two days in second this year, 11 days in third, four days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, six days tied for fourth and 13 days in fifth...are 5-5 over the last 10 games...however, are 9-16 (.360) since the rain out in Texas on April 13 after starting the year 10-8 (.556).

EXTRA INNINGS: The A's played their fourth extra inning game in the last eight games last night...scored a run in the top of the 10th before the Mariners came back with two in the bottom of the 10th...it marks the third time this year the A's had the lead in extra innings only to go on to lose the game...no other Athletics team since at least 1906 has lost more than two such games in one season...are now 2-4 in extra innings for the season and the six games are second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 8)

WALK-OFFS AND LAST AT BAT: Five of the A's last eight games have been decided on walk-offs...have three wins and two losses in those five games...for the season, the A's have four walk-off wins and five walk-off losses...the five losses match Oakland's season total from last year...lead the majors in walk-off games (9) and losses and are tied for the lead in wins...are 4-8 in games decided in the last at bat...the 12 games are tied for the most in the majors as are the eight losses.

SCORING MARGIN: Eight of the A's last nine games and 22 of 43 for the season have been decided by two runs or fewer...Oakland is 10-12 in those games and the games (22) and losses are second most in the American League...only Seattle (12-14) has more games and losses...each of the A's last three wins have been one-run victories and Oakland is now 7-7 in one-run games...have the second most one-run games and one-run wins in the AL to Seattle (9-8) and are tied for the third most losses.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this nine-game road trip to Seattle (0-1), Detroit (four games) and Cleveland (three games) and have now lost 10 of their last 11 road games...are 5-14 (.263) on the road for the season, which is tied with Texas and Kansas City for the second worst road record in the majors (Miami, 4-14)...this is the third of four straight nine-game road trips to start the year, which are the A's longest road trips of the season...went 1-8 on the last road trip to Toronto (0-3), Boston (0-3) and Pittsburgh (1-2)...it was their worst road trip of eight or more games since going 1-9 against Boston, Baltimore and Chicago from June 2-12, 2011...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Cincinnati (2-1) and Cleveland (2-1) and are 14-10 (.583) at home.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's have compiled a 5.44 ERA (101 er in 167.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.46 at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Texas, 5.73), but the home ERA is fourth lowest in the American League...are batting .250 (172-for-689) and are averaging 5.32 runs per game on the road (101 runs in 19 games) compared to .227 and 3.75 runs per game at home...are averaging the fourth most runs per game on the road in the AL but the third fewest at home...have hit 30 home runs in 19 games on the road, 26 in 24 games at home.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-5 with a 3.24 ERA (28 er in 77.2 ip) and .221 (64-for-289) opponents batting average over the last 14 games after going 6-7 with a 6.95 ERA and .295 opponents average over the previous 18 contests...have 14 of the A's 19 wins, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...last year, starters had just 52 of the A's 97 wins (53.6%)...have one of three complete games in the AL (Cleveland, Texas)...the A's used an "opener" for the first time this year on Saturday against Cleveland and won...went 4-5 when using an opener last year...the no-hitter by Fiers a week ago today marked the first time an A's starter pitched more than seven innings since Aug. 15, 2018 (Anderson, 7.2)...it snapped a streak of 77 consecutive games of seven innings or fewer (tied for second longest in Oakland history), 146 consecutive games of eight innings or fewer (third longest) and 146 consecutive games without a complete game (fourth longest).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.50 ERA (42 er in 108.0 ip) in 11 games in May after posting a 4.89 ERA in April...have the fourth lowest May ERA in the American League and are tied for the second fewest home runs (11)...the

no-hitter by Fiers a week ago tonight against Cincinnati was the A's fourth shutout of the season, which is tied for second most in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .213 (121-for-569) over the last 16 games and are now batting .237 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest OPS (.716) and slugging percentage (.400) but the third most walks (156)...the A's had two pinch walks last night and are now 7-for-23 (.304) with six walks in the pinch for the season...lead the AL in pinch walks, rank second in hits and third in batting.

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit a season-high tying five home runs last night but lost...have now lost three of their last six games when hitting five or more home runs dating back to 2017...all five home runs were solo shots, marking the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have hit five or more solo home runs in a game (previous: May 22, 1996 vs. New York-AL)...are 2-2 in those games...are 1-14 when going homerless, which is the third worst record in the majors (Houston, 0-7; Seattle, 0-6)...are 2-14 when getting out-homered, which is second worst in the American League (Houston, 1-9).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 14-for-22 (63.6%) in stolen bases attempts, which is the second lowest percentage in the American League (Houston 60.7%)...the 14 stolen bases are tied for third fewest...A's catchers have tossed out 5-of-13 (38.5%) attempted base stealers over the last four games...however, opponents have stolen 34 bases for the season, which is the most in the majors...the A's have just one pickoff, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's faced a left-handed starting pitcher last night for the first time since April 29 against Boston (Rodriguez)...have faced a lefty in just two of the last 18 games but have lost both of those games...for the season, Oakland is 8-5 (.615) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 11-19 (.367) against right-handers...the record against lefties is fourth best in the American League but the mark against righties is tied with Kansas City for second worst (Toronto, 9-19)...the 13 games against lefties are tied for second most...are batting .262 with an .818 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .229 with a .682 OPS against right-handers...have the third best batting average and OPS against lefties in the AL...have the fourth lowest batting average and OPS against righties...lead the AL in home runs off lefties (20).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list nine times this year...currently have six players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea, Martini), four of which are on the 60-day IL (Cotton, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea)...Martini is currently on a rehab assignment...have had at least four players on the IL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's are 0-3 against the Mariners...lost the first game in Seattle last night after being swept in a two-game series in Tokyo to open the season...two of the three games this year and 10 of the last 20 have been decided by one run...all three games this year and 15 of the last 21 have been decided by two runs or fewer...have lost each of the previous six season series after going 9-10 against Seattle last year...the last time Oakland lost six consecutive season series to one team was 1993-98 to Boston...went 5-5 in Oakland and 4-5 in Seattle...are 46-71 (.393) against Seattle dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the second worst record by any American League team against the Mariners (TB, 13-26/.333)...all-time, the A's are 350-295 against the Mariners...that includes 189-132 in Oakland, 160-160 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 84-96 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Chris Davis hit two home runs last night to snap a 20-game homerless streak, which was his longest as an Athletic...has three multi-homer games this year and 19 with the A's, which is fourth most in Oakland history...**Marcus Semien** has committed just one error and leads American League shortstops with a .994 fielding percentage.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1941** the A's walk 19 times against St. Louis but lose 10-5...in **1988** Bob Welch tosses a five hit shutout as the A's win at Baltimore, 8-0...in **1995** Geronimo Berroa and Terry Steinbach have four RBI each in the A's 12-3 win at Minnesota...the A's hit five home runs, including two by Berroa.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brett Anderson (4-2, 4.19 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...went 3-0 with a 2.63 ERA and .222 opponents batting average over his first four starts but is 1-2 with a 6.16 ERA (13 er in 19.0 ip) and .295 (23-for-78) opponents average in four starts since then...his four wins match his total from each of the previous two seasons...has not won more than four games since going 10-9 for the Dodgers in 2015.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has allowed just one home run in 43.0 innings (Martinez, April 4 vs. Boston) and his average of 0.21 home runs per nine innings is the lowest mark in the majors...has a six-start, 34.0-innings pitched, 156-batters faced homerless streak...has struck out just 22 batters and his average of 4.60 strikeouts per nine innings is also the lowest mark in the majors...also has the lowest strikeout-to-walk ratio (1.16).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-0 with a 2.55 ERA (7 er in 24.2 ip) and .207 (19-for-92) opponents batting average in four starts at night, 1-2 with a 6.38 ERA (13 er in 18.1 ip) and .316 (24-for-76) opponents average in four starts during the day.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 12 of his 21 runs over the first two innings of his starts and has a 6.75 ERA (12 er in 16.0 ip) in innings 1-2...has a 2.67 ERA (8 er in 27.0 ip) from the third inning on

RUN SUPPORT: Has received at least six runs of support in four of his eight starts...his season run support average of 8.58 (41 rs in 43.0 ip) is third highest in the American League.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Was one of three inactive pitchers for the opening series in Japan...was slotted in as the A's third starter when the club returned home and made his first start March 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings to extend his home scoreless streak to an Oakland record 34.1 innings...broke the previous record of 33.0 set by Matt Keough (Sept. 5, 1979-April 16, 1980)...it is also the longest Athletics home scoreless streak since at least 1908...struck out a season-high four against the Angels (also April 9 and May 3)...the home scoreless streak ended in the first inning of his next start April 4 against Boston, marking the first time he allowed a run in the Coliseum since May 7, 2018...tossed a season-high 101 pitches against the Red Sox and surrendered his only home run (Martinez)...allowed three runs in 5.1 innings for the win against Boston...then tossed a season-high 6.2 innings and defeated the Orioles 13-2 at Baltimore on April 9 for his third win in his third start...the only other time in his career he won at least his first two starts in a season was in 2012 when he won his first four starts after missing the first 4½ months of the season following "Tommy John" surgery...was 3-0 with a 2.50 ERA over his first three starts through April 9...then went 0-2 with a 6.92 ERA over his next three starts through April 27...had his first no decision April 14 at Texas...allowed three runs in 6.0 innings and left with a 7-3 lead but the pen allowed a run in the seventh and four more in the eighth (Soria blown save)...was charged with his first loss of the season April 21 games Toronto when he lasted a season-low 2.2 innings following an ankle injury...it snapped a career-high tying four-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 19, 2018 (fourth time)...went 4-0 with a 3.50 ERA and .243 opponents average during the streak, which spanned seven starts...made his next scheduled start April 27 at Toronto but allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high 10 hits for his second consecutive loss...finished April 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA and .307 opponents batting average in five starts...snapped his two-game losing streak May 3 at Pittsburgh when he picked up his 50th career win in the A's 14-1 victory.

LAST START: He had a no decision the A's 5-4, 13-inning win over Cincinnati last Wednesday in Oakland...did not strike out a batter for the sixth time in his career as a starter...walked a season-high five...allowed four runs in six innings of work, all in the second inning...yielded a RBI double to Farmer, a RBI ground out to Casali and RBI singles to Peraza and Senzel...left with the scored tied 4-4.

ANDERSON vs. SEATTLE: Is 8-4 with a 2.19 ERA (111.0 ip, 104 h, 33 r, 27 er, 23 bb, 85 so, 9 hr) in 19 career appearances, including 18 starts...the eight wins are his most against any team...the ERA is third lowest ever against the Mariners by a pitcher with at least 100 innings...is 3-2 with a 1.98 ERA (12 er in 54.2 ip) in 10 games at Safeco Field and 6-2 with a 2.40 ERA (15 er in 56.1 ip) in nine starts in his home ballparks...is 5-2 with a 2.28 ERA (13 er in 51.1 ip) in eight starts in the Coliseum...has not faced the Mariners this year...went 0-0 with a 3.86 ERA (16.1 ip, 17 h, 7 r, 7 er, 1 bb, 9 so) in three starts last year...the first no decision came in a 3-2 A's win at Seattle on May 2...allowed his only two runs in the third inning on a leadoff home run by Healy and a RBI single by Segura...retired 11 straight before allowing back-to-back singles to Haniger and Seager with one out in the seventh...was relieved by Dull with Oakland trailing 2-0 but the A's scored twice in the eighth to get him off the hook and once in the ninth for the win...also had a no decision in a 2-0, 12-inning loss in Oakland on Aug. 15...tossed 7.2 scoreless innings and allowed five hits without walking a batter...allowed three runners to advance into scoring position...Leake shutout the A's on two hits over the first eight innings...had another extra inning no decision in the A's 10-8 loss in 11 innings at Seattle Sept. 25...Oakland scored three times in the first inning, but he allowed a three-run home run to Cruz in the bottom of the first...the A's added three more in the second but he allowed a Gordon RBI ground out in the second and a lead off home run to Segura in the third...left after 2.1 innings with a 6-5 lead.

2018 RECAP: Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract March 19 and began the season at Triple-A Nashville before he was selected on May 2...went 4-5 with a 4.48 ERA in 17 starts with Oakland in a season that was interrupted by two stints on the disabled list...was out from May 19 to July 7 with a strained left shoulder and Aug. 28 to Sept. 12 with a strained left forearm...walked just 13 batters in 80.1 innings for an average of 1.46 walks per nine innings...that was a career low and was second lowest in the American League among pitchers with 80 or more innings pitched (Kluber, CLE 1.46)...struck out just 47 but his 3.62 strikeout-to-walk ratio was a career high...his starts and innings pitched were his most since 2015 when he made 31 starts and tossed 180.1 innings with the Dodgers...had a 1-2 record, a 6.08 ERA and .356 opponents batting average in six starts at the All-Star Break last year...then went 3-3 with a 3.81 ERA and .251 opponents average in 11 starts after the break...issued eight free passes in 23.2 innings before the break (3.04 per nine innings) and then walked just five batters in 56.2 innings after the break (0.79 per nine innings)...has a 23-32 career record before the break, 27-22 after the break...allowed a .285 opponents batting average, including .257 (18-for-70) against left-handed hitters compared to .293 (72-for-246) against right-handers...surrendered nine of his 10 home runs to righties...yielded a .333 batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .280 when leading off an inning but he walked just three...went 2-1 with a 2.78 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in seven starts with Triple-A Nashville...did not allow a home run in 32.1 innings...struck out 36 (10.02 per nine innings) and walked just six (1.67 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.0...his opponents batting average included a .223 (21-for-94) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .314 (11-for-35) against left-handers.

THURSDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Chris Bassitt (1-1, 2.55 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 17 and is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...had a win and allowed one run on five hits over his first two starts...has a loss and has allowed six runs on 12 hits over his last two starts...has received two runs of support or fewer in three of his four starts this year and 27 of 34 in his career...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-0 A's loss to Cincinnati last Thursday in Oakland (72 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb 9 so)...is 2-2 with a 4.56 ERA (23.2 ip, 25 h, 12 r, 12 er, 13 bb, 17 so, 1 hr) in four career starts against Detroit...was the winning pitcher in his only start last year when he combined with Petit and Trevino on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Detroit on June 27 (6.0 ip, 2 h, 5 bb, 5 so)...had seven stints with Oakland last year in his return to the majors following "Tommy John" surgery in 2016...went 2-3 with a 3.02 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in 11 games, including seven starts.

- The pen was charged with its fifth blown save in its last eight games on Monday and now has 10 for the season, which is the most in the majors.
- Has converted 6-of-16 (37.5%) save opportunities...has the lowest save percentage in the Majors and tied for the second fewest saves.
- Has not had a save since April 17 against Houston and the streak of 22 consecutive games without a save is the longest by an A's team since a 24-game streak from Sept. 21, 2004-April 16, 2005.
- Has allowed just 16 home runs in 167.2 innings for a rate of 1.15 home runs per nine innings, the second lowest mark in the American League (fifth in the majors).
- Ranks third in the AL in innings pitched (167.2)...has the fourth fewest wins (5) and tied for the second most losses (10).
- First batters faced are hitting .248 with a .340 on-base percentage (33-for-133, 18 walks, 1 hbp) vs. the Oakland bullpen so far this season...the batting average and OBP are fourth highest in the AL.
- Has allowed 23-of-61 (37.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL and fifth highest in the majors.
