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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-25) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (18-23)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight after winning four of five and are now a season-high tying six games under .500 at 19-25 (also 15-21 on May 5)...have not been more than six games under .500 since finishing the 2017 season 75-87...the A's .432 winning percentage is fourth lowest in the American League...are in fifth place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by a season-high 10 games...have been in last or tied for last every day dating back to April 30...have spent two days in second this year, 11 days in third, four days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, six days tied for fourth and 15 days in fifth...are 9-17 (.346) since the rain out in Texas on April 13 after starting the year 10-8 (.556).

SCORING MARGIN: Four of the A's last five games have been decided by one run and nine of the last 10 games have been decided by two runs or fewer...23 of the A's 44 games for the season have been decided by two runs or fewer, which is second most in the American League (Seattle, 27)...are 10-13 in those games and the losses are also second most (Seattle, 14)...each of the A's last three wins have been one-run wins and Oakland is 7-8 in one-run games for the season...the losses are tied for second most in the AL, the games (15) rank second and the wins are tied for third.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's won two of three from Cleveland last week-end in their first games against an American League Central team this year...are scheduled to play each of their next seven games against the Central as the A's travel to Cleveland for a three-game series following this four-game set with Detroit...are now 54-20 (.730) against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016.

FOUR-GAME SERIES: This series with Detroit is the A's fourth four-game series of the season...have won three of four in each of the previous three four-game series (Los Angeles, March 28-31; Boston, April 1-4; Baltimore, April 8-11)...are now 8-0-2 over their last 10 four-game series dating back to June 7-10, 2018.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on this nine-game road trip to Seattle (0-2), Detroit (four games) and Cleveland (three games) and have now lost 11 of their last 12 road games...are 5-15 (.250) on the road for the season, which is the second worst road record in the majors (Miami, 4-14)...this is the third of four straight nine-game road trips to start the year, which are the A's longest road trips of the season...went 1-8 on the last road trip to Toronto (0-3), Boston (0-3) and Pittsburgh (1-2), which was their worst road trip of eight or more games since going 1-9 against Boston, Baltimore and Chicago from June 2-12, 2011...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Cincinnati (2-1) and Cleveland (2-1) and are 14-10 (.583) at home.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's have compiled a 5.40 ERA (105 er in 175.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.46 at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Texas, 5.79), but the home ERA is fourth lowest in the American League...are batting .247 (178-for-722) and are averaging 5.20 runs per game on the road (104 runs in 20 games) compared to .227 and 3.75 runs per game at home...are averaging the fifth most runs per game on the road in the AL but the third fewest at home...have hit 30 home runs in 20 games on the road, 26 in 24 games at home.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.57 ERA (46 er in 116.0 ip) in 12 games in May after posting a 4.89 ERA in April...have the fifth lowest May ERA in the American League...A's starting pitchers are 2-6 with a 3.44 ERA (32 er in 83.2 ip) and .224 (70-for-312) opponents batting average over the last 15 games after going 6-7 with a 6.95 ERA and .295 opponents average over the previous 18 contests...have one of three complete games in the AL (Cleveland, Texas)...the A's used an "opener" for the first time this year on Saturday against Cleveland and won...went 4-5 when using an opener last year.

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .211 (127-for-602) over the last 17 games and are now batting .236 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have the fifth lowest OPS (.711), on-base percentage (.314) and slugging percentage (.396) but the fourth most walks (159)...A's pinch hitters are 7-for-25 (.280) with six walks...lead the AL in pinch walks, rank second in hits and fourth in batting...the A's are 1-15 when going homerless, which is the third worst record in the majors (Houston, 0-7; Seattle, 0-6)...are 2-15 when getting out-homered, which is second worst in the American League (Houston, 1-9).

EXTRA INNINGS: The A's have played four extra inning games in the last nine games and are 2-4 in extra innings for the season...the six games are tied for second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 8)...lost in extra innings to Seattle on Monday after scoring a run in the top of the 10th...it marked the third time this year the A's had the lead in extra innings only to go on to lose the game...no other Athletics team since at least 1906 has lost more than two such games in one season.

WALK-OFFS AND LAST AT BAT: Five of the A's last nine games have been decided on walk-offs...overall, the A's have four walk-off wins and five walk-off losses and the losses match Oakland's season total from last year...lead the majors in walk-off games (9) and losses and are tied for the lead in wins...are 4-8 in games decided in the last at bat...the losses are the most in the majors and the 12 games are tied for second most.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have faced just two left-handed starting pitchers over the previous 19 games and lost both of those games...however, are 8-5 (.615) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher for the season compared to 11-20 (.355) against right-handers...the record against lefties is fourth best in the American League but the mark against righties is second worst (Toronto, 10-20)...the 13 games against lefties are tied for third most...are batting .257 with an .805 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .229 with a .680 OPS against right-handers...have the third best OPS against lefties in the AL and the fourth best batting average...have the fourth lowest batting average and OPS against righties...are tied for the AL lead in home runs off lefties (20).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list nine times this year...currently have six players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea, Martini), four of which are on the 60-day IL (Cotton, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea)...Martini is currently on a rehab assignment...have had at least four players on the IL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's have a 12-game winning streak against the Tigers, which is the longest in Athletics history (since 1901) against Detroit...it is tied for third longest in Oakland history (since 1968) against any team...have a seven-game winning streak at Comerica Park, which is tied for the Athletics second longest winning streak at any Detroit ballpark (8, Aug. 3, 2001-May 13, 2003)...won the season series last year, 7-0...it was the fourth time in Athletics history the A's went undefeated in a season series of seven or more games (12-0 vs. New York in 1990, 7-0 vs. Baltimore in 2004, 7-0 vs. Toronto in 2018)...went 3-0 in Oakland and 4-0 in Detroit...have won each of the last two season series and three of the last four and are 19-7 against Detroit dating back to 2015...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 264-247 against the Tigers...that includes 145-111 in Oakland, 117-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 41-28 (.594) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team in this ballpark...all-time, the A's are 932-1000 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis had his third two-homer game of the season on Monday and now has 12 home runs, which is tied for fourth in the American League...has 145 home runs over the last four years, which is 18 more than any other player...**Liam Hendriks** has not allowed a run in his last seven games (9.2 ip, 6 h, 2 bb, 11 so)...**Marcus Semien** has committed just one error and leads AL shortstops with a .994 fielding percentage.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1939** the first American League night game is played at Shibe Park but the A's lose to Cleveland 8-3 in 10 innings...in **1975** Vida Blue becomes the second Oakland Athletic to win 100 games as he fires a seven-hitter at Yankee Stadium in the A's 4-2 win...in **1986** Tony Phillips hits for the cycle in the A's 8-4 win at Baltimore...he has five hits, scores two runs and drives in four...it is the first cycle in Oakland history...in **1990** Jose Canseco, Mark McGwire and Ron Hassey hit consecutive homers in the fourth inning of the A's 7-6 win at Cleveland.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (1-1, 2.55 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 17 and is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...had a win and allowed one run on five hits over his first two starts...has a loss and has allowed six runs on 12 hits over his last two starts...made the trip to Japan but was one of three inactive players for the two-game series against the Mariners...was placed on the 10-day injured list March 27 retroactive to March 25 with a right lower leg contusion...made three rehab starts with Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas April 16.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in three of his four starts and his season run support average is 2.55 (7 rs in 24.2 ip)...last year, he received two runs of support or fewer in five of his seven starts and his RSA as a starter was 3.19...has received two runs of support or fewer in 27 of his 34 career starts and his career RSA as a starter is 2.65 (57 rs in 193.1 ip).

DURING THE DAY: Is 0-1 with a 2.45 ERA (4 er in 14.2 ip) in two starts during the day...went 0-2 with a 3.18 ERA in three starts during the day last year and is now 0-9 with a 4.06 ERA (43 er in 95.1 ip) in 17 career outings during the day.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed seven runs this year, all over the first three innings of a game...has a 5.25 ERA (7 er in 13.0 ip) in innings one through three, a 0.00 ERA (12.0 ip) from the fourth inning on...has held the opposition to a .097 (3-for-31) batting average with runners on base...has allowed five home runs over his first four starts, four of which have been hit by left-handers...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number seven (0-for-9) or eight (0-for-9) hitter.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Took the loss in his last start last Thursday against Cincinnati to snap the first winning streak of his career, a three-game streak dating back to last year...went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 11 games (seven starts) dating back to June 27, 2018...the loss was his first since June 22, 2018 at Chicago (AL)...is now 3-1 with a 2.57 ERA (16 er in 56.0 ip) over his last 12 games after going 2-14 with a 4.11 ERA over his first 32 career appearances.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Texas last April 22 in Oakland...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits...walked four and struck out seven...retired the side in order just once...was relieved by Dull to start the sixth with the A's leading 2-0.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss at Toronto April 28...allowed a leadoff home run to Sogard in the bottom of the first but then shut out the Blue Jays on two hits and no walks the rest of the way...the A's tied the game with a run in the third and he was relieved by Wendelken to start the eighth with the score tied 1-1.

THIRD START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Pittsburgh May 4...Oakland scored three times in the first inning but he allowed a leadoff home run to Bell in the second and two-run home run to Bell in the third...the A's added a run in the fifth and he was relieved by Hendriks to start the sixth with a 4-3 lead...Wendelken allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save and loss.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-0 A's loss to Cincinnati a week ago today in Oakland...allowed three runs in 7.2 innings but Roark (6.0 ip) and three Reds relievers combined to shutout the A's on six hits...allowed a two-run home run to Dietrich in the first and a solo home run to Suarez in the third.

BASSITT vs. DETROIT: Is 2-2 with a 4.56 ERA (23.2 ip, 25 h, 12 r, 12 er, 13 bb, 17 so, 1 hr) in four career starts...is 2-1 with a 3.63 ERA (7 er in 17.1 ip) in three starts at Comerica Park and 0-1 with a 7.11 ERA (5 er in 6.1 ip) in one start at Guaranteed Rate Field...was the winning pitcher in his only start last year when he combined with Petit and Trevino on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Detroit on June 27...tossed six innings and allowed two of the hits but walked a career-high tying five...retired the side in just one inning, the fourth.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA and .242 opponents batting average on a three start rehab assignment...struck out 16 batters in 11.0 innings and walked two...his first assignment came with Stockton on April 4 against Rancho Cucamonga...retired all nine batters he faced, the first five by strikeout...moved to Las Vegas for a start on April 9 in a 10-2 win against Sacramento...allowed just one run in three innings of work, a bases loaded walk to Michael Reed in the first inning...then had a no decision in a 6-5 loss to Fresno on April 14...allowed five runs on five hits in five innings of work.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA in four spring training appearances, including one start...allowed a .310 opponents batting average but issued just one walk in 10.2 innings while striking out 12...also pitched in relief in the exhibition game against Nippon Ham in Tokyo on March 18 (1.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 1 so).

2018 RECAP: Had seven stints with Oakland in his return to the majors following "Tommy John" surgery in 2016...went 2-3 with a 3.02 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in 11 games, including seven starts...the ERA and opponents batting average were the lowest of his four seasons as was his .309 on-base percentage, .315 slugging percentage and .624 OPS...the two wins matched his career total entering the season as he was 2-11 over his first three seasons...struck out 41 batters in 47.2 innings for a career-best average of 7.74 strikeouts per nine innings.

2018 OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a mark of .218 (19-for-87) against left-handed hitters compared to .223 (21-for-94) against right-handers...surrendered three of his four home runs to righties...yielded a .195 batting average to batters leading off an inning but walked eight for a .340 on-base percentage...three of the four home runs he allowed were solo shots...opponents hit .205 with runners in scoring position...had a .189 opponents average with two outs and .137 with two strikes...the opponents four and five hitters were a combined 3-for-38 (.079).

2018 SPLITS: Was 2-3 with a 3.19 ERA and .236 opponents batting average in his seven starts, 0-0 with a 2.45 ERA and .162 opponents average in four relief appearances...did not allow a run in the first inning (7.0 ip) and had a 1.73 ERA over innings 1-3...logged a 4.57 ERA and surrendered all four of his home runs from the fourth inning on...went 0-2 with a 2.78 ERA in five games at home and is now 2-8 despite a 2.65 ERA (28 er in 95.0 ip) in 18 career games in the Coliseum.

2018 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 5-5 with a 4.30 ERA in 18 games, including 14 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...was 2-3 with a 6.10 ERA and .314 opponents batting average over his first 10 games (seven starts) through June 2...then went 3-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over his final eight games (seven starts) following his July 12 option from Oakland...surrendered six home runs in 81.2 innings, an average of 0.66 per nine innings...struck out 83, an average of 9.15 per nine innings, and walked 25 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.32...allowed a .271 opponents batting average, including .215 (29-for-135) against left-handed hitters compared to .313 (57-for-182) against right-handers...had a .573 OPS against lefties, .817 against righties.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Frankie Montas (4-2, 2.78 ERA): Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...has allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his eight starts and has a 2.78 ERA, which ranks eighth in the American League...has four wins, which are one short of his career high of five from last year...has 42 strikeouts, which are one short of his career high of 43 from last year...opponents have grounded into eight double plays with him on the mound, which is the second most in the American League...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's win in 12 innings over Cleveland last Friday in Oakland (6.0 ip, h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...is 1-2 with a 10.64 ERA (11.0 ip, 16 h, 13 r, 13 er, 9 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in four career appearances, including three starts, against Detroit...went 2-0 with two saves and a 0.56 ERA in five games, including two starts, during the spring...the ERA was the lowest in the majors and his .190 opponents average was second lowest in the Cactus League.

- The pen was charged with its fifth blown save in its last nine games on Monday and now has 10 for the season, which is the most in the majors.
- Has converted 6-of-16 (37.5%) save opportunities...has the lowest save percentage in the Majors and tied for the second fewest saves.
- Has not had a save since April 17 against Houston and the streak of 23 consecutive games without a save is the longest by an A's team since a 24-game streak from Sept. 21, 2004-April 16, 2005.
- Has allowed just 16 home runs in 169.2 innings for a rate of 0.85 home runs per nine innings, the second lowest mark in the American League (fourth in the majors).
- Ranks fourth in the AL in innings pitched (169.2)...has the fourth fewest wins (5) and tied for the second most losses (10).
- First batters faced are hitting .252 with a .342 on-base percentage (34-for-135, 18 walks, 1 hbp) vs. the Oakland bullpen so far this season...the batting average and OBP are fourth highest in the AL.
- Has allowed 23-of-61 (37.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL and fifth highest in the majors.

- Began the season as the A's fifth starter and went 2-3 with a 5.74 ERA in six starting assignments before pitching in relief of "opener" Liam Hendriks last Saturday (2.25 ERA, 1 er in 4.0 ip).
- His 4.0 innings of relief last Saturday against Cleveland were his most ever as a reliever and the most by an A's reliever this year.
- Has allowed 36 hits, half of which have been for extra bases (nine doubles, nine home runs)...has a .259 opponents batting average and .518 slugging percentage.
- Has a 4.05 ERA (9 er in 20.0 ip) in four games at home, a 7.04 ERA (12 er in 15.1 ip) in three games on the road.
