OAKLAND ATHLETICS (22-25) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (18-26)

SUNDAY, MAY 19, 2019 — COMERICA PARK — 1:10 P.M. EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight games after dropping three in a row...are 7-4 over the last 11 games...are 22-25 overall...are tied for 3rd place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 9½ games...have spent two days in second this year, 11 days in third, five days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, six days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth...are 12-17 (.414) since the rain out in Texas on April 13 after starting the year 10-8 (.556).

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 5-1 vs. the AL Central teams and are scheduled to play each of their next four games against the Central...travel to Cleveland for a three-game series following this four-game set with Detroit...are now 57-20 (.740) against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016.

POWER SPREAD: The A's are the only Major League team this season that features nine players with at least five home runs: Khris Davis (12), Matt Chapman (10), Mark Canha (5), Ramon Laureano (5), Josh Phegley (5), Stephen Piscotty (5), Jurickson Profar (5), Marcus Semien (5) and Chad Pinder (5)...Minnesota and Seattle feature eight such players.

THERE HERE GOES AGAIN: Robbie Grossman has a .368 on-base percentage in his last 29 games since April 7...in that stretch, he has reached base via hit or walk 39 times (21 hits, 18 walks) in 106 PA, which is tied for the 4th-most on the team behind Marcus Semien (55 in 163 PA), Matt Chapman (51 in 150 PA), Stephen Piscotty (48 in 152 PA) and tied with Khris Davis (39 in 118 PA) and Ramon Laureano (39 in 133 PA) despite having fewer plate appearances.

SWEEPING SUCCESS: The A's are looking for their first four-game sweep of the season after completing three of them last year against Toronto (May 17-20), Detroit (June 25-28) and Texas (July 23-26).

FEELS LIKE HOME: Mike Fiers has a lifetime record of 5-2 with a 2.58 ERA (23 ER, 80.1 IP) with 62 strikeouts in 14 career starts at Comerica Park, including a 2.30 ERA in his last 11 starts...the 2.58 ERA is the 2nd-best all time at Comerica Park behind Zack Greinke (2.55) with a minimum of 10 starts.

STARTING THINGS UP: Oakland's starters have posted a 2.93 ERA (35 ER, 107.1 IP) with 91 strikeouts in the last 18 games since April 28...they tossed 6.0+ innings in 11 of those 18 games, including each of the last three games (8.0, 8.2, 7.0)...have allowed two runs or less in 11 of those 18 starts...the 2.93 ERA in that stretch is tied for the lowest in the AL with Minnesota (2.93).

UNRULY VISITORS: Oakland has hit 39 home runs on the road, the 4th-most in the American League and fifth in the Majors...have hit 14 home runs during the first five games of this road trip, including a season-high tying five homers on Monday in Seattle and Thursday in Detroit...Khris Davis leads the club with seven road homers, while Josh Phegley has five.

SOUTHPAW SLUGGERS: Oakland is hitting .263 (114x433) with 22 doubles, 26 home runs, 63 RBI and an .825 OPS against left-handed pitchers this season...the 26 homers are lefties are the most in the Majors...the .825 OPS is the 3rd-best in the American League (5th in Majors)...Stephen Piscotty is leading the club against lefties, hitting .367 (18x49) with 4 doubles, 3 home runs, 10 RBI and a 1.040 OPS this season against left-handers.

COMING HOME ON THE ROAD: The A's are batting .253 (211-for-835) and are averaging 5.74 runs per game on the road (132 runs in 23 games) compared to .227 and 3.75 runs per game at home...are averaging the third most runs per game on the road in the AL and fourth most in the Majors behind Minnesota (6.82), Chicago-NL (6.536), and Seattle (5.88).

LEFT AND RIGHT COMPARISON: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher today for the third straight game of this series after facing just two lefties over the previous 20 games...when an opponent starts a lefty, are 10-5 (.667) for the season, which is the third best record in the American League...are 12-20 (.375) against right-handers, which is tied for third worst (Toronto, 11-22)...the 15 games against lefties are tied for second most...are batting .263 with an .825 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .232 with a .693 OPS against right-handers.

FOUR-GAME SERIES: This series with Detroit is the A's fourth four-game set of the season...have won three of four in each of the previous three four-game series (Los Angeles, March 28-31; Boston, April 1-4; Baltimore, April 8-11)...are 9-0-2 over their previous 11 four-game series since June 7-10, 2018.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have 14 home runs in the last five games after hitting nine over their previous 14 contests...the A's are 1-15 when going ho-

merless, which is the third worst record in the majors (Houston, 0-7; Seattle, 0-8)...are 2-15 when getting out-homered, which is second worst in the American League (Houston, 1-9).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this nine-game road trip to Seattle (0-2), Detroit (3-0) and Cleveland (three games) and have lost 11 of their last 15 road games...are 8-15 (.348) on the road for the season, which is the third worst road record in the American League (Kansas City, 5-16 & Texas, 7-15)...this is the third of four straight nine-game road trips to start the year, which are the A's longest road trips of the season...went 1-8 on the last road trip to Toronto (0-3), Boston (0-3) and Pittsburgh (1-2), which was their worst road trip of eight or more games since going 1-9 against Boston, Baltimore and Chicago from June 2-12, 2011...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Cincinnati (2-1) and Cleveland (2-1) and are 14-10 (.583) at home.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.27 ERA (52 er in 143.0 ip) in 15 games in May after posting a 4.89 ERA in April...have the fifth lowest May ERA in the American League...A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in six of the last 12 games and are 4-3 with a 2.62 ERA (22 er in 75.2 ip) and .189 (50-for-265) opponents batting average over that span...the A's used an "opener" for the first time this year last Saturday against Cleveland and won...went 4-5 when using an opener last year.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's have a positive run differential for the season (+13) despite being three games under .500...nine of the previous 12 games had been decided by two runs or fewer...are 10-13 (.435) in games decided by two runs or fewer...23 of the A's 47 games this year have been decided by two runs or fewer, which is second most in the American League (Seattle, 27)...are 10-13 in those games, including 7-8 in one-run games...also have the second most one-run games in the AL (Seattle, 18).

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's won the first three meetings of 2019 to extend their winning streak against the Tigers to 15 games...that is tied for the second longest in club history against any team...it is the A's longest against the Tigers...have a 10-game winning streak at Comerica Park, which is the Athletics longest winning streak at any Detroit ballpark (8, Aug. 3, 2001-May 13, 2003, also at Comerica) and is tied for the second longest at any road ballpark...won the season series last year, 7-0...it was the fourth time in Athletics history the A's went undefeated in a season series of seven or more games (12-0 vs. New York in 1990, 7-0 vs. Baltimore in 2004, 7-0 vs. Toronto in 2018)...went 3-0 in Oakland and 4-0 in Detroit...have won each of the previous two season series and three of the previous four and are 22-7 against Detroit dating back to 2015...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 267-247 against the Tigers...that includes 145-111 in Oakland, 120-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 44-28 (.606) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team in this ballpark...all-time, the A's are 935-1000 against the Tigers.

Josh Phegley is batting .367 (22-for-60) with all five of his home runs and 23 of his 26 RBI on the road...he leads American League catchers and ranks third in the majors in RBI (26)...**Marcus Semien** has committed just one error and leads AL shortstops with a .995 fielding percentage.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1971** Vida Blue tosses a three-hit shutout and Rick Monday and Reggie Jackson homer in the A's 3-0 win over Milwaukee...in **2004** Bobby Kielty homers twice and drives in four runs as the A's defeat Detroit, 6-2...in **2006** Dan Haren and Huston Street combine on a two-hit shutout as the A's defeat San Francisco, 1-0.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (3-3, 5.12 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season, which will tie him for the Major League lead (for non openers)...is 1-1 with a 2.08 ERA (6 er in 26.0 ip) and .151 (13-for-86) opponents batting average over his last four starts...went 2-1 with a 3.00 ERA and .189 opponents batting average over his first three starts and was 0-1 with a 16.20 ERA and .442 opponents batting average in three starts in between (April 7-20).

APRIL AND BEYOND: Is 1-1 with a 1.89 ERA (4 er in 19.0 ip) and .119 (7-for-59) opponents batting average in three starts in May after going 1-1 with a 7.83 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in five starts in April...his April ERA was his highest in a month of 10 or more innings (previous: 7.44 in Aug. 2017)...it was second highest in the majors this year among pitchers with 20 or more innings in April (Nova, CWS 8.42)...is now 5-9 with a 5.68 ERA in 25 career appearances in April...is 44-35 with a 3.52 ERA (263 er in 672.0 ip) from May through August.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .204 (20-for-98) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .280 (26-for-93) against left-handers...has a .317 (13-for-41) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position but that mark drops to .176 (3-for-17) with RISP and two outs.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-2 with a 3.62 ERA (11 er in 27.1 ip) and .194 (19-for-98) opponents batting average in five starts at home compared to 0-1 with a 6.85 ERA (18 er in 23.2 ip) and .290 (27-for-93) opponents average in five starts on the road...has surrendered six of his nine home runs on the road...is now 7-3 with a 3.39 ERA (33 er in 87.2 ip) in 16 career appearances, 15 starts, in the Coliseum.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA (14 er in 35.0 ip) and .188 (24-for-128) opponents batting average in six starts at night compared to 1-2 with an 8.44 ERA (15 er in 16.0 ip) and .349 (22-for-63) opponents average in four starts during the day.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 1-1 with a 7.84 ERA (18 er in 20.2 ip) in five starts against American League West competition compared to 2-2 with a 3.26 ERA (11 er in 30.1 ip) in five starts against all other teams...is now 10-14 with a 5.71 ERA (142 er in 223.2 ip) in 43 career appearances against the AL West, 47-44 with a 3.60 ERA (290 er in 725.1 ip) in 139 games against all other teams.

NO-HITTER: Tossed his second career no-hitter May 7 in Oakland against Cincinnati to become the 34th pitcher in Major League history with multiple regular season no-hitters...is the seventh with a no-hitter for multiple teams (Ted Breitenstein, Jim Bunning, Randy Johnson, Hideo Nomo, Nolan Ryan, Cy Young)...was named American League Co-Player of the Week with George Springer May 13...it was his second career Player of the Week honor with the first coming Aug. 23, 2015 following his first no-hitter...this no-hitter was the 13th in Athletics history, including the eighth in Oakland history...it was the first since Sean Manaea last year on April 21, 2018...his other no-hitter also came in interleague play on Aug. 21, 2015 for Houston against Los Angeles (NL) and he has each of the last two out of six total interleague no-hitters...tossed 131 pitches, which were the most in a no-hitter since he threw 134 in his against the Dodgers...now has two career complete games, both no-hitters...according to Stats, Inc., he is the first pitcher in ML history to have each of his first two career complete games be no-hitters...also according to Stats, his 6.81 ERA entering the game was the highest by any pitcher entering a start in which he threw a no-hitter (min. 25.0 ip).

THIS AND THAT: Has not allowed a run in three of his nine starts but has surrendered six runs three times...has walked two batters or fewer seven times...has received two runs of support or fewer in each of his last five starts and six this year...is 2-2 with two runs of support or fewer, 1-1 with three runs of support or more.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starter against Seattle on March 20 in Tokyo and was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-7 loss...it was his first career Opening Day start and he became the A's 12th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 14 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice)...put together wins in back-to-back starts on March 28 against Los Angeles and April 2 against Boston...did not allow a run in either outing, marking the second time in his career he had back-to-back starts without yielding a run...the other time was June 20-30, 2012 when he did it in three straight starts...combined with Trivino, Soria and Treinen on a three-hit shutout in a 4-0 win over the Angels...allowed just one hit in six innings, a one-out double by La Stella in the fifth...then combined with Buchter, Trivino and Treinen on a seven-hit shutout in a 1-0 win over the Red Sox...allowed five hits in six innings and did not walk a batter...that gave him a 2-1 record, a 3.00 ERA and a .189 opponents batting average over his first three starts...then allowed a season-high six runs in three consecutive starts from April 7-20 and went 0-1 with a 16.20 ERA and .442 opponents batting average...began that streak by tossing just 1.2 innings in a no decision at Houston April 7, matching the shortest start of his

career (June 2, 2013 at Philadelphia)...walked a season-high four...struck out a season-high six batters April 12 at Texas...yielded a season-high nine hits in just 3.1 innings in a 10-1 loss to Toronto on April 20...it was his first loss in the Coliseum since July 18, 2016 while pitching for Houston, snapping a six-game Coliseum winning streak...is now 1-1 with a 2.08 ERA (6 er in 26.0 ip) and .151 (13-for-86) opponents batting average over his last four starts dating back to April 26...tossed his second career no-hitter in the A's 2-0 win May 7 in Oakland against Cincinnati...walked two and struck out a season-high tying six...also tossed a season-high 131 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher since Mark Mulder had 132 in a three-hit shutout against Toronto on May 2, 2001...retired the first 11 before Winker reached base on an error with two outs in the fourth...set down the next seven before walking Suarez to start the seventh...Suarez was erased on a double play, Puig walked and Fiers then retired the final seven batters to complete the no-hitter.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at Seattle last Monday, his first start after his no-hitter...had his hitless streak broken up when Haniger homered to lead off the bottom of the first...however, that was the only run he would allow in five innings of work and he would yield just one more hit...was relieved by Petit to start the sixth with the A's leading 2-1 and Oakland built a 4-1 lead before Trivino allowed three runs in the eighth for the blown save.
