## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (22-25) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (25-20)

MONDAY, MAY 20, 2019 — PROGRESSIVE FIELD — 6:10 P.M. EDT LHP BRETT ANDERSON (4-3, 4.41) VS. RHP CARLOS CARRASCO (4-3, 4.18) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (KTRB 860 AM/KHTK 1140 AM) — A'S CAST ON TUNEIN

ABOUT THE A'S: Won the first three games of the Detroit series and led 5-3 in the fourth game before the game was suspended in the bottom of the seventh inning...started the season 10-8, went 5-13 over an 18-game stretch from April 14 to May 5 and are 7-4 since then...are 22-25 overall and are tied for fourth in the American League West...trail first place Houston by nine games, which is one game short of the season high of 10 (May 15)...however are just ½ game behind second place Los Angeles and Texas...have spent two days in second this year, 11 days in third, five days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

SUSPENDED GAME: Yesterday's game at Detroit was suspended in the bottom of the seventh inning with no outs and the A's leading 5-3 after scoring twice in the top of the seventh...it will be resumed when the Tigers come to Oakland on Sept. 6...all stats in that game are currently reflected in the season stats and anything that occurs when the game resumes on Sept. 6 will count as happening on May 19...according to retrosheet, it was the third suspended game in Oakland history...the previous two were suspended because of curfew, both times in the Coliseum...on Aug. 10, 1972 the A's and White Sox were tied 3-3 after 17 innings...the game resumed the next day and Oakland scored twice in the 19th for a 5-3 win...on April 6, 1998, the start of the A's vs. Indians game was delayed 1:46 by rain and also had an ingame delay of 1:44 before it was suspended at 1:22 am with the A's trailing 6-5 after eight innings...after a day off, the game was completed April 8 and Oakland lost 6-5...it was the last curfew suspended Major League game... the span of May 19 to Sept. 6 for the conclusion of a suspended game is the longest since a Baltimore vs. Chicago (AL) game was suspended on April 28, 2008 due to weather and completed on Aug. 25.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 5-1 against American League Central teams...have outscored the Central 43-19 in seven games and are batting .262 (64-for-244) with 12 home runs and an average of 6.14 runs per game... the pitching staff has a 2.71 ERA (19 er in 63.0 ip) and .213 (47-for-221) opponents batting average...are now 57-20 (.741) against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016...following this three-game series with Cleveland, the A's will play each of their next 15 games against the AL West.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed seven innings or more in seven of the last 21 games dating back to April 26 and are 5-7 with a 3.32 ERA (46 er in 124.2 ip) and .219 (101-for-462) opponents batting average over that span...tossed fewer than seven innings in each of the first 27 games and were 12-8 with a 5.02 ERA and .252 opponents batting average over that span...overall, starters have 17 of the A's 22 wins and are tied for fourth in the American League in wins.

*PITCHING:* The A's have compiled a 3.32 ERA (55 er in 149.0 ip) in 16 games in May after posting a 4.89 ERA in April...have the fifth lowest May ERA in the American League...are tied for the second fewest home runs (16) and have the third lowest opponents batting average (.212).

*OFFENSE:* The A's hit .303 (43-for-142) with nine home runs and 33 runs scored in the four games at Detroit after batting .216 with 11 home runs and 32 runs scored over the previous 10 contests...are hitting .242 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...A's pinch hitters are 7-for-27 (.259) with six walks...lead the AL in pinch walks and plate appearances (35), are tied for second in hits and rank fifth in batting.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 14 home runs in six games on the road trip after hitting just 15 home runs over the previous 23 games...have nine players with at least five home runs, which is the most in the majors (Minnesota and Seattle, 8)...have two five-homer games on the trip and four for the season, which marks the third time in Athletics history the A's had at least four games with five or more home runs (7 in 1996, 4 in 1999)...are 1-15 when going homerless, which is the third worst record in the majors (Houston, 0-7; Seattle, 0-8)...are 2-15 when getting out-homered, which is tied for second worst in the American League (Houston, 1-9).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this road trip to Seattle (0-2), Detroit (3-0) and Cleveland (three games)...however, are 4-11 over their last 15 road games and are 8-15 (.348) for the season, which is the third worst road record in the American League...went 1-8 on the last road trip to Toronto (0-3), Boston (0-3) and Pittsburgh (1-2), which was their worst road trip of eight or more games since going 1-9 against Boston, Baltimore and Chicago from June 2-12, 2011...return home following the game Wednesday and begin a nine-game homestand against Seattle (three games), Los Angeles-AL (three

games) and Houston (three games) on Friday...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Cincinnati (2-1) and Cleveland (2-1) and are 14-10 (.583) at home.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .256 (221-for-864) and are averaging 5.71 runs per game on the road (137 runs in 24 games) compared to .227 and 3.75 runs per game at home...are averaging the fourth most runs per game on the road in the American League but the third fewest at home... have hit 39 home runs in 24 games on the road, 26 in 24 games at home... have compiled a 4.93 ERA (114 er in 208.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.46 at home... have the fourth highest road ERA in the AL and the fourth lowest home ERA

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's faced a left-handed starting pitcher in each of the final three games in Detroit...are 10-5 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 12-20 (.375) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is third best in the American League and the mark vs. righties is tied for third worst...the opponent has started a lefty in 16 games, which is tied with the Angels for the most in the AL...are batting .266 with an .826 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .233 with a .693 OPS against right-handers...have the third best batting average and OPS against lefties in the AL and lead the majors in home runs off lefties (26)... have the fourth lowest batting average and fifth lowest OPS against righties.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have completed 47 games this year and 24 of those have been decided by two runs or fewer...Oakland is 11-13 in those games... the 24 games are second most in the American League as are the 13 losses... are 7-8 in one-run games...rank second in the AL in one-run games (15) and tied for second in losses...are 2-4 in extra innings and the six games are tied for second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 8)...in three of those games, the A's had the lead in extra innings only to go on to lose the game...no other Athletics team since at least 1906 has lost more than two such games in one season...have four walk-off wins and five walk-off losses and the losses match Oakland's season total from last year...lead the majors in walk-off games (9) and losses and are tied for the lead in wins...are 4-8 in games decided in the last at bat...the losses are tied for the most in the majors and the 12 games are tied for second most.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list nine times this year... currently have six players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea, Martini), four of which are on the 60-day IL (Cotton, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea)...Cotton and Martini are currently on a rehab assignment... have had at least four players on the IL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. INDIANS:** The A's lead the season series 2-1 after winning two of three in Oakland earlier this month...have won four the last five games and nine of the last 12...have won nine of the last 11 games in Oakland but have lost seven of the last 10 in Cleveland...won the season series last year 4-2 and have won four of the previous five season series...are 20-15 against Cleveland dating back to the start of the 2014 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 280-242 against the Indians...that breaks down to 150-106 in Oakland and 130-136 in Cleveland...including 46-67 at Progressive Field... all-time, the A's are 915-1035 against the Indians.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** has hit safely in each of his eight career games against Cleveland and is 14-for-29 (.483) with nine runs, five doubles, a triple, three home runs, four RBI and four walks...**Josh Phegley** is batting .355 (22-for-62) with all five of his home runs and 23 of his 26 RBI on the road... is tied for the American League lead in road RBI...his 26 RBI are the most among AL catchers...**Marcus Semien** has committed just one error and leads AL shortstops with a .995 fielding percentage.

#### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1977** Wayne Gross has five RBI and Earl Williams drives in four as the A's defeat Seattle **14**-5...in **2005** Keith Ginter has one hit in one official at bat but drives in five runs on a three-run home run and two sacrifice flies in the A's 8-4 win at San Francisco...in **2011** Mark Ellis singles in the second inning off San Francisco's Ryan Vogelsong for his **1000**<sup>th</sup> career hit to become the **12**<sup>th</sup> player in Oakland history to collect **1000** hits.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brett Anderson (4-3, 4.41 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...went 3-0 with a 2.63 ERA and .222 opponents batting average over his first four starts but is 1-3 with a 6.12 ERA (17 er in 25.0 ip) and .287 (29-for-101) opponents average in five starts since then...his four wins match his total from each of the previous two seasons...has not won more than four games since going 10-9 for the Dodgers in 2015.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Allowed three home runs in his last start after yielding just one over his first eight starts...the home runs matched his career high and were his most since April 13, 2013 against Detroit...has surrendered four home runs in 49.0 innings and his average of 0.73 home runs per nine innings is ninth lowest in the American League...has struck out just 27 batters and his average of 4.96 strikeouts per nine innings is the lowest mark in the majors (Urena, MIA 5.81)...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.35 is second lowest in the majors (Keller, KC 1.14).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 3-1 with a 3.23 ERA (11 er in 30.2 ip) and .217 (25-for-115) opponents batting average in five starts at night, 1-2 with a 6.38 ERA (13 er in 18.1 ip) and .316 (24-for-76) opponents average in four starts during the day.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 15 of his 25 runs over the first two innings of his starts and has a 7.00 ERA (14 er in 18.0 ip) in innings 1-2...has a 2.90 ERA (10 er in 31.0 ip) from the third inning on

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received at least six runs of support in four of his nine starts...his season run support average of 8.08 (44 rs in 49.0 ip) is third highest in the American League.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Was one of three inactive pitchers for the opening series in Japan...was slotted in as the A's third starter when the club returned home and made his first start March 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings to extend his home scoreless streak to an Oakland record 34.1 innings...broke the previous record of 33.0 set by Matt Keough (Sept. 5, 1979-April 16, 1980)...it is also the longest Athletics home scoreless streak since at least 1908...the streak ended in the first inning of his next start April 4 against Boston, marking the first time he allowed a run in the Coliseum since May 7, 2018...tossed a season-high 101 pitches and allowed three runs in 5.1 innings for the win...then tossed a season-high 6.2 innings and defeated the Orioles 13-2 at Baltimore on April 9 for his third win in his third start...the only other time in his career he won at least his first two starts in a season was in 2012 when he won his first four starts after missing the first 4% months of the season following "Tommy John" surgery...was 3-0 with a 2.50 ERA over his first three starts through April 9...then went 0-2 with a 6.92 ERA over his next three starts through April 27...had his first no decision April 14 at Texas...allowed three runs in 6.0 innings and left with a 7-3 lead but the pen allowed a run in the seventh and four more in the eighth (Soria blown save)...was charged with his first loss of the season April 21 games Toronto when he lasted a season-low 2.2 innings following an ankle injury...it snapped a career-high tying four-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 19, 2018 (fourth time)...went 4-0 with a 3.50 ERA and .243 opponents average during the streak, which spanned seven starts...made his next scheduled start April 27 at Toronto but allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high 10 hits for his second consecutive loss...finished April 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA and .307 opponents batting average in five starts...snapped his two-game losing streak May 3 at Pittsburgh when he picked up his 50th career win in the A's 14-1 victory...walked a season-high five and had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 13-inning win over Cincinnati May 8 in Oakland...did not strike out a batter for the sixth time in his career as a starter.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss at Seattle last Tuesday...struck out a season-high five but also surrendered a career-high tying three home runs...allowed solo home runs to Vogelbach and Beckham in the second but the A's tied the game with a two-run fifth...he then allowed a two-run home run to Haniger in the bottom of the fifth for the loss.

2018 RECAP: Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract March 19 and began the season at Triple-A Nashville before he was selected on May 2... went 4-5 with a 4.48 ERA in 17 starts with Oakland in a season that was interrupted by two stints on the disabled list...was out from May 19 to July 7 with a strained left shoulder and Aug. 28 to Sept. 12 with a strained left forearm...walked just 13 batters in 80.1 innings for an average of 1.46 walks per nine innings...that was a career low and was second lowest in the American League among pitchers with 80 or more innings pitched (Kluber, CLE 1.46)... struck out just 47 but his 3.62 strikeout-to-walk ratio was a career high...his starts and innings pitched were his most since 2015 when he made 31 starts and tossed 180.1 innings with the Dodgers...had a 1-2 record, a 6.08 ERA and .356 opponents batting average in six starts at the All-Star Break last year... then went 3-3 with a 3.81 ERA and .251 opponents average in 11 starts after the break...issued eight free passes in 23.2 innings before the break (3.04 per nine innings) and then walked just five batters in 56.2 innings after the break (0.79 per nine innings)...has a 23-34 career record before the break, 27-22 after the break...allowed a .285 opponents batting average, including .257 (18-for-70) against left-handed hitters compared to .293 (72-for-246) against right-handers...surrendered nine of his 10 home runs to righties... yielded a .333 batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .280 when leading off an inning but he walked just three...went 2-1 with a 2.78 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in seven starts with Triple-A Nashville...did not allow a home run in 32.1 innings...struck out 36 (10.02 per nine innings) and walked just six (1.67 per nine innings) for a strikeoutto-walk ratio of 6.0...his opponents batting average included a .223 (21-for-94) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .314 (11-for-35) against left-handers.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (2-1, 1.93 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 17 and is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...has allowed one run or fewer in three of his five starts and his 1.93 ERA and is third lowest in the American League among pitchers with 30 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he has the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.179), fifth lowest on-base percentage (.244) and sixth lowest OPS (.603)...is now 4-1 with a 2.25 ERA over his last 13 games after going 2-14 with a 4.11 ERA over his first 32 career appearances...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 17-3 A's win at Detroit last Thursday (8.0 ip, 4 h, 0 r, 0 er, 2 bb, 7 so)... is 0-1 with a 3.38 ERA (13.1 ip, 13 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 9 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances against Cleveland, both starts in 2015...went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA and .242 opponents batting average on a three start rehab assignment with Las Vegas.

5-10, 4.11 ERA (79 er in 173.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 7-for-17 (41.2%)

- The pen has 11 blown saves, which is the most in the majors.
- Has converted 7-of-17 (41.2%) save opportunities...has the second lowest save percentage in the Majors and has the second fewest saves.
- Prior to Saturday, had not had a save since April 17 against Houston and the streak of 25 consecutive games without a save matched the longest by an A's team over the last 23 years (Sept. 21, 2004-April 16, 2005)...the longest streak in the post-Billy Ball era (1983-present) is a 26-game streak from April 9-May 6, 1994.
- Has allowed just 17 home runs in 173.0 innings for a rate of 0.88 home runs per nine innings, tied for the lowest mark in the American League (tied for third in the majors).
- Ranks eighth in the AL in innings pitched (173.0)...tied for third fewest wins (5) and tied for the most losses (10).
- First batters faced are hitting .266 with a .352 on-base percentage (37-for-139, 18 walks, 1 hbp) vs. the Oakland bullpen so far this season...the batting average is third highest and the OBP is fourth highest in the AL.
- Has allowed 23-of-62 (37.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL and fifth highest in the majors.

- Began the season as the A's fifth starter and went 2-3 with a 5.74 ERA in six starting assignments before pitching in relief of "opener" Liam Hendriks last Saturday (2.25 ERA, 1 er in 4.0 ip).
- His 4.0 innings of relief last Saturday against Cleveland were his most ever as a reliever and the most by an A's reliever this year.
- Has allowed 39 hits, nearly half of which have been for extra bases (nine doubles, 10 home runs)...has a .269 opponents batting average and .538 slugging percentage.
- Has a 4.05 ERA (9 er in 20.0 ip) in four games at home, a 8.27 ERA (15 er in 16.1 ip) in three games on the road.
