OAKLAND ATHLETICS (23-25) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (25-21)

TUESDAY, MAY 21, 2019 — PROGRESSIVE FIELD — 6:10 P.M. EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Won last night in Cleveland and won the first three games of the Detroit series and led 5-3 in the fourth game before the game was suspended in the bottom of the seventh inning...started the season 10-8, went 5-13 over an 18-game stretch from April 14 to May 5 and are 8-4 since then...are 23-25 overall and are third in the American League West...trail first place Houston by nine games...however are just ½ game behind second place Texas...have spent two days in second this year, 12 days in third, five days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 6-1 against American League Central teams...have outscored the Central 49-23 in eight games and are batting .268 (75-for-280) with 15 home runs and an average of 7.00 runs per game...the pitching staff has a 2.88 ERA (23 er in 72.0 ip) and .215 (55-for-256) opponents batting average...are now 58-20 (.744) against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016...following this three-game series with Cleveland, the A's will play each of their next 15 games against the AL West.

CLEVELAND CLUBBER: Matt Chapman is hitting .471 (16x34) with 10 runs, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs, 7 RBI and a 1.556 OPS in nine career games against Cleveland...his .471 average is the 2nd best against the Indians among active players (min. 30 AB) behind Gerardo Parra (.500/19x38)...his average against Cleveland is his highest against any team.

SETTING THE TABLE: Stephen Piscotty has reached base safely in 20 straight games via hit, walk or hit by pitch...the current streak is the longest by an A's player since Matt Chapman (30, July 11-Aug. 17, 2018)...Piscotty's streak is the second longest of his career behind a 22-game mark May 31-June 26, 2018...club record is held by Mark McGwire (61, 9/16/95-6/18/96).

THE SPARK: Robbie Grossman has a .369 on-base percentage in his last 31 games since April 7...in that stretch, he has reached base via hit or walk 41 times (22 hits, 19 walks) in 111 PA, which is tied for the 5th-most on the team behind Marcus Semien (59 in 172 PA), Matt Chapman (56 in 159 PA), Stephen Piscotty (51 in 161 PA), Ramon Laureano (42 in 140 PA) and tied with Jurickson Profar (41 in 134 PA) despite having fewer plate appearances.

STARTING THINGS UP: Oakland's starters have posted a 2.96 ERA (39 ER, 118.2 IP) with 95 strikeouts in the last 20 games since April 28...the 2.96 ERA in that stretch is tied for the lowest in the AL with Minnesota (2.96)...A's starting pitchers have tossed seven innings or more in seven of the last 22 games since April 26...tossed fewer than seven innings in each of the first 27 games and were 12-8 with a 5.02 ERA over that span...overall, starters have 18 of the A's 23 wins and are tied for third in the American League in wins.

BACK ON TRACK: Jurickson Profar is 6-for-12 in his last three games and since May 5 is hitting .264 (14x53) with 8 runs, 2 doubles, 4 home runs, 11 RBI with a .528 slugging percentage and .856 OPS in 14 games...in his first 30 games of the season, he hit .171 (19-for-111).

OFFENSE: The A's hit .303 (54-for-178) with 12 home runs and 39 runs scored in the last five games after batting .216 with 11 home runs and 32 runs scored over the previous 10 contests...since the start of this road trip on May 13, Oakland has collected 31 extra-base hits (12 2B, 2 3B, 17 HR) in 7 games...began the season with 36 home runs in the first 19 games, before hitting just 15 home runs in 23 games from April 16-May 12...despite the temporary drop in power, Oakland still ranks 6th in the AL in home runs.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 17 home runs in seven games on the road trip after hitting just 15 home runs over the previous 23 games...have nine players with at least five home runs, which is the most in the majors (Minnesota, Houston and Seattle, 8)...have two five-homer games on the trip and four for the season, which marks the third time in Athletics history the A's had at least four games with five or more home runs (7 in 1996, 4 in 1999)...are 1-15 when going homerless, which is the third worst record in the majors (Houston, 0-7; Seattle, 0-8)...are 2-15 when getting out-homered, which is tied for second worst in the American League (Houston, 1-9).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-2 on this road trip to Seattle (0-2), Detroit (3-0) and Cleveland (1-0)...however, are 5-11 over their last 16 road games and are 9-15 (.375) for the season, which is the fourth worst road record in the American League...went 1-8 on the last road trip to Toronto (0-3), Boston (0-3) and Pittsburgh (1-2), which was their worst road trip of eight or

more games since going 1-9 against Boston, Baltimore and Chicago from June 2-12, 2011...return home following the game Wednesday and begin a nine-game homestand against Seattle (three games), Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Houston (three games) on Friday...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Cincinnati (2-1) and Cleveland (2-1) and are 14-10 (.583) at home.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .258 (232-for-900) and are averaging 5.72 runs per game on the road (143 runs in 25 games) compared to .227 and 3.75 runs per game at home...are averaging the fourth most runs per game on the road in the American League but the third fewest at home...have hit 42 home runs in 25 games on the road, 26 in 24 games at home...have compiled a 4.89 ERA (118 er in 217.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.46 at home...have the fourth highest road ERA in the AL and the fourth lowest home ERA.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's faced a left-handed starting pitcher in each of the final three games in Detroit...are 10-5 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 13-20 (.394) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is third best in the American League and the mark vs. righties is the fourth worst...the opponent has started a lefty in 15 games, which is tied with Baltimore for the second most in AL...are batting .266 with an .827 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .235 with a .703 OPS against right-handers...have the third best batting average and OPS against lefties in the AL and lead the majors in home runs off lefties (26)...have the fifth lowest batting average and fifth lowest OPS against righties.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have completed 48 games this year and 25 of those have been decided by two runs or fewer...Oakland is 12-13 in those games...the 25 games are second most in the American League as are the 13 losses...are 7-8 in one-run games...rank second in the AL in one-run games (15) and tied for second in losses...are 2-4 in extra innings and the six games are tied for second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 8)...in three of those games, the A's had the lead in extra innings only to go on to lose the game...no other Athletics team since at least 1906 has lost more than two such games in one season...have four walk-off wins and five walk-off losses and the losses match Oakland's season total from last year...lead the majors in walk-off games (9) and losses and are tied for the lead in wins...are 4-8 in games decided in the last at bat...the losses are tied for the most in the majors and the 12 games are tied for second most.

A's vs. INDIANS: The A's lead the season series 3-1 after winning two of three in Oakland earlier this month...have won five of the last six games and 10 of the last 13...have won nine of the last 11 games in Oakland but have lost seven of the last 11 in Cleveland...won the season series last year 4-2 and have won four of the previous five season series...are 21-15 against Cleveland dating back to the start of the 2014 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 281-242 against the Indians...that breaks down to 150-106 in Oakland and 131-136 in Cleveland...including 47-67 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 916-1035 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman has hit safely in each of his nine career games against Cleveland and is 16-for-34 (.471) with 10 runs, five doubles, a triple, four home runs, seven RBI and four walks...**Josh Phegley** is batting .348 (23-for-66) with all five of his home runs and 24 of his 27 RBI on the road...leads the American League in road RBI...his 27 RBI are the most among AL catchers...**Marcus Semien** has committed just one error and leads AL shortstops with a .995 fielding percentage.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1930 Max Bishop walks five times in the first game of a doubleheader against New York and adds three more in the second game...in 1974 Reggie Jackson becomes the first Oakland Athletic to reach 200 homers when he hits a two-run homer in the seventh inning of the A's 8-1 win at Minnesota...in 1995 the A's tie a club record by turning six double plays, but still lose at Chicago, 6-4...in 1997 Jose Canseco doubles in the seventh inning of the A's 7-3 win at Texas for his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform...he becomes the ninth Oakland player to reach 1000 hits.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (2-1, 1.93 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 17 and is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...has allowed one run or fewer in three of his five starts and his 1.93 ERA and is third lowest in the American League among pitchers with 30 or more innings pitched (Sam Gaviglio, TOR 1.76 & Glasnow, TB 1.86)...using the same minimum, he has the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.179), fifth lowest on-base percentage (.244) and sixth lowest OPS (.603).

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed seven runs this year, all over the first three innings of a game...has a 4.20 ERA (7 er in 15.0 ip) and .224 (13-for-58) opponents batting average in innings one through three, a 0.00 ERA (17.2 ip) and .136 (8-for-59) opponents average from the fourth inning on...last year, he did not allow a run in the first inning (7.0 ip) and had a 1.73 ERA over innings 1-3...logged a 4.57 ERA and surrendered all four of his home runs from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held the opposition to a .073 (3-for-41) batting average with runners on base...opponents are 1-for-16 (.063) with runners in scoring position including 0-for-7 with RISP and two outs...held the opposition to a .205 average with runners in scoring position last year...has allowed five home runs over his first four starts, four of which have been hit by left-handers...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number seven (0-for-12) hitter.

RUN SUPPORT: Received 17 runs of support in his last start...had seven runs of support over his first four starts this year and 13 runs of support in seven starts all last year...has two runs of support or fewer in three of his five starts this year...last year, he received two runs of support or fewer in five of his seven starts and his RSA as a starter was 3.19...has received two runs of support or fewer in 27 of his 35 career starts and his career RSA as a starter is 3.31 (74 rs in 201.1 ip).

NIGHT AND DAY: Picked up the win in his last start Thursday afternoon at Detroit for the first career win in a day game...had started his career 0-9 with 17 career outings during the day...is 1-1 with a 1.59 ERA (4 er in 22.2 ip) in three starts during the day this year compared to 1-0 with a 2.70 ERA (3 er in 10.0 ip) in two starts at night.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Took the loss May 9 against Cincinnati to snap the first winning streak of his career, a three-game streak dating back to last year...went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 11 games (seven starts) dating back to June 27, 2018...the loss was his first since June 22, 2018 at Chicago (AL)...is now 4-1 with a 2.25 ERA (16 er in 64.0 ip) over his last 13 games after going 2-14 with a 4.11 ERA over his first 32 career appearances.

TRANSACTIONS: Made the trip to Japan but was one of three inactive players for the two-game series against the Mariners...was placed on the 10-day injured list March 27 retroactive to March 25 with a right lower leg contusion...made three rehab starts with Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas April 16.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Texas last April 22 in Oakland...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits...walked four and struck out seven...retired the side in order just once...was relieved by Dull to start the sixth with the A's leading 2-0.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss at Toronto April 28...allowed a leadoff home run to Sogard in the bottom of the first but then shut out the Blue Jays on two hits and no walks the rest of the way...the A's tied the game with a run in the third and he was relieved by Wendelken to start the eighth with the scored tied 1-1.

THIRD START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Pittsburgh May 4...Oakland scored three times in the first inning but he allowed a leadoff home run to Bell in the second and two-run home run to Bell in the third...the A's added a run in the fifth and he was relieved by Hendriks to start the sixth with a 4-3 lead...Wendelken allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save and loss.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-0 A's loss to Cincinnati May 9 in Oakland...allowed three runs in 7.2 innings but Roark (6.0 ip) and three Reds relievers combined to shutout the A's on six hits...allowed a two-run home run to Dietrich in the first and a solo home run to Suarez in the third.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 17-3 win at Detroit on Thursday...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings, did not allow a run, walked two and yielded four hits...now has a 12.2-inning scoreless streak...allowed just two base runners as far as second base...retired each of the final seven batters of 14 of the final 15.

BASSITT vs. CLEVELAND: Is 0-1 with a 3.38 ERA (13.1 ip, 13 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 9 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, both starts in 2015...the no decision came in the A's 5-4 win at Cleveland July 11...the A's scored a run in the first and he shutout the Indians on three hits and a hit batter over the first five innings...allowed a RBI single to Brantley in the sixth but the A's scored once in the seventh to take a 2-1 lead...allowed a RBI single to Perez in the bottom of the seventh and left after 6.1 innings with the scored tied 2-2...then took the loss in a 3-1 decision in Oakland on July 30...allowed three runs in the first inning on an error and a two-run home run by Santana...then retired 18 of the final 21 batters he faced, blanking the Indians on two hits and a walk over his final six innings...Carrasco tossed a two-hitter for Cleveland.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA and .242 opponents batting average on a three start rehab assignment...struck out 16 batters in 11.0 innings and walked two...his first assignment came with Stockton on April 4 against Rancho Cucamonga...retired all nine batters he faced, the first five by strikeout...moved to Las Vegas for a start on April 9 in a 10-2 win against Sacramento...allowed just one run in three innings of work, a bases loaded walk to Michael Reed in the first inning...then had a no decision in a 6-5 loss to Fresno on April 14...allowed five runs on five hits in five innings of work.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (10.0 ip, 13 h, 6 t, 6 er, 1 bb, 12 so, 2 hr) in four spring training appearances, including one start...allowed a .310 opponents batting average but issued just one walk in 10.2 innings while striking out 12...also pitched in relief in the exhibition game against Nippon Ham in Tokyo on March 18 (1.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 1 so).

2018 RECAP: Had seven stints with Oakland in his return to the majors following "Tommy John" surgery in 2016...went 2-3 with a 3.02 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in 11 games, including seven starts...the ERA and opponents batting average were the lowest of his four seasons as was his .309 on-base percentage, .315 slugging percentage and .624 OPS...the two wins matched his career total entering the season as he was 2-11 over his first three seasons...struck out 41 batters in 47.2 innings for a career-best average of 7.74 strikeouts per nine innings...went 0-2 with a 2.78 ERA in five games at home and is now 2-8 despite a 2.65 ERA (28 er in 95.0 ip) in 18 career games in the Coliseum...also went 5-5 with a 4.30 ERA in 18 games, including 14 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...was 2-3 with a 6.10 ERA and .314 opponents batting average over his first 10 games (seven starts) through June 2...then went 3-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over his final eight games (seven starts) following his July 12 option from Oakland...surrendered six home runs in 81.2 innings, an average of 0.66 per nine innings...struck out 83, an average of 9.15 per nine innings, and walked 25 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.32...allowed a .271 opponents batting average, including .215 (29-for-135) against left-handed hitters compared to .313 (57-for-182) against right-handers...had a .573 OPS against lefties, .817 against righties.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Frankie Montas (5-2, 2.67 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...has allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his nine starts and has a 2.67 ERA, which ranks eighth in the American League...has five wins, which is tied for eighth in the AL and matches his career high from last year...has surrendered four home runs in 54.0 innings and his average of 0.67 home runs per nine innings is sixth lowest in the AL...has walked just 11 and his average of 1.83 walks per nine innings in seventh lowest...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 7-2 A's win at Detroit on Friday (8.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 0 bb, 10 so)...it marked the 27th time in Oakland history a pitcher struck out 10 or more and did not issue a walk...is 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA (16.1 ip, 21 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 16 so, 1 hr) in five career appearances, including two starts, against Cleveland...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 4-3 A's win in 12 innings on May 10 (6.0 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 7 so).

- The pen has 11 blown saves, which is the most in the majors.
- Has converted 8-of-19 (42.1%) save opportunities...has the second lowest save percentage in the Majors and is tied for the third fewest saves.
- Prior to Saturday, had not had a save since April 17 against Houston and the streak of 25 consecutive games without a save matched the longest by an A's team over the last 23 years (Sept. 21, 2004-April 16, 2005)...the longest streak in the post-Billy Ball era (1983-present) is a 26-game streak from April 9-May 6, 1994.
- Has allowed just 19 home runs in 176.2 innings for a rate of 0.97 home runs per nine innings, the fifth lowest mark in the American League (eighth in the majors).
- Ranks eighth in the AL in innings pitched (176.2)...has the third fewest wins (5) and tied for the most losses (10).
- First batters faced are hitting .259 with a .344 on-base percentage (37-for-143, 18 walks, 1 hbp) vs. the Oakland bullpen so far this season...the batting average is third highest and the OBP is fourth highest in the AL.
- Has allowed 23-of-66 (34.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL and seventh highest in the majors.

- Began the season as the A's fifth starter and went 2-3 with a 5.74 ERA in six starting assignments before pitching in relief of "opener" Liam Hendriks last Saturday (2.25 ERA, 1 er in 4.0 ip).
- His 4.0 innings of relief last Saturday against Cleveland were his most ever as a reliever and the most by an A's reliever this year.
- Has allowed 39 hits, nearly half of which have been for extra bases (nine doubles, 10 home runs)...has a .269 opponents batting average and .538 slugging percentage.
