OAKLAND ATHLETICS (24-25) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (25-22)

WEDNESDAY, MAY 22, 2019 — PROGRESSIVE FIELD — 1:10 P.M. EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won the first two games in Cleveland and won the first three games of the Detroit series and led 5-3 in the fourth game before the game was suspended in the bottom of the seventh inning...started the season 10-8, went 5-13 over an 18-game stretch from April 14 to May 5 and are 9-4 since then...are 24-25 overall and are third in the American League West...trail first place Houston by nine games...however are just ½ game behind second place Texas...have spent two days in second this year, 13 days in third, five days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 7-1 against American League Central teams...have outscored the Central 54-26 in nine games and are batting .262 (82-for-313) with 17 home runs and an average of 6.75 runs per game...the pitching staff has a 2.89 ERA (26 er in 81.0 ip) and .206 (59-for-286) opponents batting average...are now 59-20 (.747) against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016...following this three-game series with Cleveland, the A's will play each of their next 15 games against the AL West.

STREAKING: Oakland has won five straight completed games and are just two games out of playoff position behind Cleveland who holds the second Wild Card slot...the five game winning streak is the longest active streak in the Majors...the streak is the longest for the A's since a 6-game streak Sept. 5-12, 2018...had five six-game win streaks last year.

LENGTHY RELIEF: Oakland's bullpen tossed 5.1 shutout frames in last night's 5-3 win...it was the 11th time this season that the pen has had to cover 5.0+ innings...in bullpen outings of 5.0+ frames, have posted a 3.07 ERA (24 ER, 70.1 IP) with 73 strikeouts...in the last four such outings, have a 1.03 ERA (3 ER, 26.1 IP) with 24 strikeouts.

CLEVELAND CLUBBER: Matt Chapman is hitting .436 (17x39) with 10 runs, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs, 8 RBI and a 1.437 OPS in 10 career games against Cleveland...his .436 average is the 2nd best against the Indians among active players (min. 35 AB) behind Gerardo Parra (.500/19x38)...his average against Cleveland is his highest against any team (min. 15 games).

SETTING THE TABLE: Stephen Piscotty has reached base safely in 21 straight games via hit, walk or hit by pitch...the current streak is the longest by an A's player since Matt Chapman (30, July 11-Aug. 17, 2018)...Piscotty's streak is the second longest of his career behind a 22-game mark May 31-June 26, 2018...club record is held by Mark McGwire (61, 9/16/95-6/18/96).

STARTING THINGS UP: Oakland's starters have posted a 3.09 ERA (42 ER, 122.1 IP) with 101 strikeouts in the last 21 games since April 28...the 3.09 ERA in that stretch is the 2nd-lowest in the AL with Minnesota (3.02)...A's starting pitchers have tossed seven innings or more in seven of the last 23 games since April 26...tossed fewer than seven innings in each of the first 27 games and were 12-8 with a 5.02 ERA over that span...overall, starters have 18 of the A's 24 wins and are fourth in the American League in wins.

BACK ON TRACK: Jurickson Profar is 7-for-13 in his last four games and since May 5 is hitting .278 (15x54) with 9 runs, 2 doubles, 5 home runs, 12 RBI with a .593 slugging percentage and .964 OPS in 15 games...in his first 30 games of the season, he hit .171 (19-for-111).

OFFENSE: The A's hit .289 (61-for-211) with 14 home runs and 44 runs scored in the last six games after batting .216 with 11 home runs and 32 runs scored over the previous 10 contests...since the start of this road trip on May 13, Oakland has collected 36 extra-base hits (15 2B, 2 3B, 19 HR) in 8 games...began the season with 36 home runs in the first 19 games, before hitting just 15 home runs in 23 games from April 16-May 12...despite the temporary drop in power, Oakland still ranks 6th in the AL in home runs.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 19 home runs in eight games on the road trip after hitting just 15 home runs over the previous 23 games...have nine players with at least five home runs, which is tied for the most in the majors with Minnesota...have two five-homer games on the trip and four for the season, which marks the third time in Athletics history the A's had at least four games with five or more home runs (7 in 1996, 4 in 1999)...are 1-15 when going homerless, which is the third worst record in the majors (Houston, 0-7; Seattle, 0-8)...are 2-15 when getting out-homered, which is tied for second worst in the American League (Houston, 1-9).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-2 on this road trip to Seattle (0-2), Detroit (3-0) and Cleveland (2-0)...however, are 6-11 over their last 17 road games and are 10-15 (.400) for the season, which is the fifth worst road record in the American League...went 1-8 on the last road trip to Toronto (0-3), Boston (0-3) and Pittsburgh (1-2), which was their worst road trip of eight or more games since going 1-9 against Boston, Baltimore and Chicago from June 2-12, 2011...return home following the game Wednesday and begin a nine-game homestand against Seattle (three games), Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Houston (three games) on Friday...went 4-2 on the last homestand vs. Cincinnati (2-1) and Cleveland (2-1) and are 14-10 (.583) at home.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .256 (239-for-933) and are averaging 5.69 runs per game on the road (148 runs in 26 games) compared to .227 and 3.75 runs per game at home...are averaging the fifth most runs per game on the road in the American League but the third fewest at home...have hit 44 home runs in 26 games on the road, 26 in 24 games at home...have compiled a 4.82 ERA (121 er in 226.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.46 at home...have sixth highest road ERA in AL and the fourth lowest home ERA.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's faced a left-handed starting pitcher in each of the final three games in Detroit...are 10-5 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 14-20 (.412) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League and the mark vs. righties is the fifth worst...the opponent has started a lefty in 15 games, which is tied with Baltimore for the second most in AL...are batting .266 with an .827 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .234 with a .706 OPS against right-handers...have the third best batting average and OPS against lefties in the AL and lead the majors in home runs off lefties (26)...have the fifth lowest batting average and fifth lowest OPS against righties.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have completed 49 games this year and 26 of those have been decided by two runs or fewer...Oakland is 13-13 in those games...the 26 games are second most in the American League as are the 13 losses...are 7-8 in one-run games...rank second in the AL in one-run games (15) and tied for second in losses...are 2-4 in extra innings and the six games are tied for second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 8)...in three of those games, the A's had the lead in extra innings only to go on to lose the game...no other Athletics team since at least 1906 has lost more than two such games in one season...have four walk-off wins and five walk-off losses and the losses match Oakland's season total from last year...lead the majors in walk-off games (9) and losses and are tied for the lead in wins...are 4-8 in games decided in the last at bat...the losses are tied for the most in the majors and the 12 games are tied for second most.

A's vs. INDIANS: The A's lead the season series 4-1 after winning two of three in Oakland earlier this month...have won six of the last seven games and 11 of the last 14...have won nine of the last 11 games in Oakland but have lost seven of the last 12 in Cleveland...won the season series last year 4-2 and have won four of the previous five season series...are 22-15 against Cleveland dating back to the start of the 2014 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 282-242 against the Indians...that breaks down to 150-106 in Oakland and 132-136 in Cleveland...including 48-67 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 917-1035 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Phegley is batting .338 (23-for-68) with all five of his home runs and 25 of his 28 RBI on the road...leads the American League in road RBI...his 28 RBI are the most among AL catchers...**Marcus Semien** has committed just one error and leads AL shortstops with a .995 fielding percentage.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1968** Jim Nash homers, pitches a five hit-shutout and strikes out 10 in the A's 2-0 win over Cleveland...the home run is the 5000th in the history of the A's franchise...in **1996** Geronimo Berroa hits three solo home runs and is 4 for 4 in the A's 5-1 win at New York...he would add another three-homer game later in the season to tie a major league record with two three-homer games...in **1997** George Williams, Matt Stairs and Mark McGwire deliver consecutive pinch hit singles in the A's 10-7 loss at Texas, tying the major league record for consecutive pinch hits in an inning...in **2004** Reggie Jackson becomes the third player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor him by retiring number 9.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (5-2, 2.67 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...has allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his nine starts and has a 2.67 ERA, which ranks seventh in the American League...picked up his fifth win of the season in his last start, which is tied for ninth in the AL and matches his career high from last year...has 52 strikeouts, which surpasses his career high of 43 from last year...the A's are 6-3 (.667) in his starting assignments and are 13-7 (.650) when he starts in his career.

MORE LEADERS: Has not allowed a home run in his last six starts and has surrendered just four home runs in 54.0 innings overall...his average of 0.67 home runs per nine innings is sixth lowest in the American League...has walked just 11 and his average of 1.83 walks per nine innings in sixth lowest...also ranks tied for second in opponents grounded into double plays (8), tied for fifth in unearned runs (6), fifth in fewest pitches per inning (15.2), ninth in run support (6.67) and 10th in winning percentage (.714) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.73)...has committed three errors, which is tied for the most among Major League pitchers (Alcantara, MIA) and are the most by an A's pitcher since 2014 (Gray and Kazmir, 3 each).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .184 (14-for-76) opponents batting average and no home runs allowed the first time through the line up. .277 (36-for-130) all four home runs after that...has issued 8 of his 11 walks the third time through the lineup...has walked just two batters to lead off an inning...three of the four home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...three have come on the road...opponents are hitting .183 (11-for-60) with two outs...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number eight hitter (0-for-18)...has yielded a .333 (16-for-48) average with runners in scoring position.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed just one run in the first inning this year for a 1.00 ERA (9.0 ip)...has a 1.75 ERA (7 er in 36.0 ip) over innings one through four and a 4.50 ERA (9 er in 18.0 ip) from the fifth inning on...last year, he allowed 14 of his 34 runs in the first inning (8.18 ERA).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-1 with a 3.71 ERA (7 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts on four days rest and 4-1 with a 2.19 ERA (9 er in 37.0 ip) in six starts on five days rest or more.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the Opening Day roster and was available in the bullpen for the two games against Seattle in Japan but did not pitch...was inserted into the fourth spot in the rotation when the season resumed and picked up the win in his first start March 31 against Los Angeles (AL)...took the loss in his second start on April 5 at Houston when he walked a season high three batters...then went 3-0 with a 3.50 ERA and .224 opponents average over this next three starts from April 10 to 23 to match the longest winning streak of his career (also May 27-June 8, 2018)...the first win came on April 10 at Baltimore when he retired the first 12 batters he faced...surrendered two home runs in the game, giving him four in his first three starts...has not allowed a home run in six games and 37.0 innings since then...allowed a run on three hits in 6.2 innings for the win in a 2-1 decision over Houston on April 17...did not allow a hit until Guriel singled with one out in the fifth...allowed a season-high nine hits but extended his winning streak to three games in an 11-5 win over Texas April 23...had his three-game winning streak snapped April 29 at Boston when he allowed a season-high seven runs in a season-low 4.1 innings...only one of the runs was earned and the six unearned runs tied for second most in Oakland history...they were the most since Brett Anderson also had six on May 15, 2009 vs. Detroit...finished April with a 3-2 record and a 3.29 ERA in five starts...tied for fifth in the American League in wins in April...left his start on May 10 against Cleveland with a 3-2 lead but Trivino blew the save in a game the A's would win 4-3 in 12 innings.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 win at Detroit last Friday...had career highs in strikeouts (10), innings pitched (8.2) and pitches (109)...did not walk a batter, which marked the 27th time in Oakland history a pitcher struck out 10 or more and did not issue a walk...it was the first since Jeff Samardzija on Sept. 17, 2014 vs. Texas (10 so)...retired each of the first 12 batters before Cabrera doubled to start the fifth...Cabrera later scored on a Harrison double and Montas also allowed a two-out RBI double to Cabrera in the ninth...was relieved by Trivino following the double and he struck out Rodriguez to end the game.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-0 with two saves and a 0.56 ERA (16.0 ip, 11 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 16 so) in five games, including two starts...the ERA was the lowest in the majors and his .190 opponents batting average was second lowest in the Cactus League...led the A's in innings pitched (16.0) and strikeouts (16) and tied for the team lead in wins and saves...did not allow a home run...also pitched in relief in the exhibition game against Nippon Ham on March 17 (1.0 ip).

2018 RECAP: Went 5-4 with a 3.88 ERA in 13 games, including 11 starts, over four stints with Oakland...was 5-2 with a 3.35 ERA in eight starts during his first stint from May 27 to July 9 and 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five games over his final three stints...surrendered just five home runs in 65.0 innings after yielding 10 home runs in 32.0 innings in 2017...struck out 43 batters (5.95 per nine innings) after fanning 56 in 47.0 innings (10.72 per nine innings) over his first two seasons...allowed a .290 opponents batting average, including .276 (35-for-127) against right-handed hitters compared to .305 (39-for-128) against left-handers...yielded 20 of his 28 extra base hits to lefties and had a .378 slugging percentage against righties compared to .523 against lefties...also went 4-5 with a 4.65 ERA in 15 games, all starts, with Triple-A Nashville...had a .255 opponents batting average, including .189 (18-for-95) against left-handed hitters compared to .290 (51-for-176) against right-handers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Daniel Mengden (1-1, 3.65 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas last Sunday and is scheduled to make his third start of the season...took the loss in his first start but picked up the win in his last start last Saturday at Detroit, a 4-1 A's win (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...is 0-2 with a 5.89 ERA (18.1 ip, 19 h, 13 r, 12 er, 7 bb, 15 so, 4 hr) in four career appearances, including three starts, against Seattle...was 0-0 with a 7.36 ERA in two games, including one start, last year...was 1-2 with a 5.73 ERA in four games, including three starts, this spring when he was optioned to Las Vegas March 11...went 3-2 with a 2.77 ERA and .197 opponents batting average in seven games, including six starts, with the Aviators...struck out 44 batters in 39.0 innings (10.15 per nine innings)...at the time of his May 12 promotion, he was tied for second in the Pacific Coast League in strikeouts, ranked third in opponents batting average, fifth in ERA and seventh in innings pitched (39.0).

- The pen has 11 blown saves, which is the most in the majors.
- Has converted 9-of-20 (45.0%) save opportunities...has the second lowest save percentage in the Majors and is tied for the fifth fewest saves.
- Prior to Saturday, had not had a save since April 17 against Houston and the streak of 25 consecutive games without a save matched the longest by an A's team over the last 23 years (Sept. 21, 2004-April 16, 2005)...the longest streak in the post-Billy Ball era (1983-present) is a 26-game streak from April 9-May 6, 1994.
- Has allowed just 19 home runs in 182.0 innings for a rate of 0.94 home runs per nine innings, the fourth lowest mark in the American League (sixth in the majors).
- Ranks sixth in the AL in innings pitched (182.0)...has the third fewest wins (6) and tied for the most losses (10).
- First batters faced are hitting .252 with a .335 on-base percentage (37-for-147, 18 walks, 1 hbp) vs. the Oakland bullpen so far this season...the batting average is third highest and the OBP is fourth highest in the AL.
- Has allowed 23-of-69 (33.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL and seventh highest in the majors.

- Began the season as the A's fifth starter and went 2-3 with a 5.74 ERA in six starting assignments before pitching in relief of "opener" Liam Hendriks last Saturday (2.25 ERA, 1 er in 4.0 ip).
- His 4.0 innings of relief last Saturday against Cleveland were his most ever as a reliever and the most by an A's reliever this year.
- Has allowed 39 hits, nearly half of which have been for extra bases (nine doubles, 10 home runs)...has a .269 opponents batting average and .538 slugging percentage.
- Has a 4.05 ERA (9 er in 20.0 ip) in four games at home, a 8.27 ERA (15 er in 16.1 ip) in three games on the road.
