OAKLAND ATHLETICS (29-29) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (39-20)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost four straight after going unbeaten over their previous 11 games (10 wins and a suspended game)...are now 29-29 overall and are in third place in the American League West, 9½ games behind Houston...the games behind are one short of the season high of 10 on May 15...are one game behind Texas for the second AL Wild Card spot...started the season 10-8, went 5-13 over an 18-game stretch from April 14 to May 5 and are 14-8 (.636) since then...the mark since May 6 is fourth best in the AL...have spent eight days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 17 days in third, five days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered in a season-high 11 consecutive games and have 24 home runs over that span (have not homered in the May 19 suspended game but homered in each of the previous three games before that)...have 38 home runs over the last 17 games and 89 for the season, which is fifth most in the American League...the 89 home runs are the most in Athletics history after 59 games (87 in 2000 and 2017)...will also have the most after 60 games (88 in 2000 and 2017).

OFFENSE: The A's are 11-for-63 (.175) with three runs, two doubles and two home runs over the first two games of the Houston series after hitting .283 with 89 runs (6.8 per game), 32 doubles, two triples and 31 home runs over the previous 13 contests...are tied for second in the American League in hit by pitches (27) and have the fourth fewest strikeouts (446)...have the third fewest stolen bases (20)...A's pinch hitters are 8-for-31 (.258) with two home runs, six RBI and six walks...rank second in the AL in pinch walks, tied for second in home runs and plate appearances (39) and tied for fourth in hits and RBI...Oakland's number eight hitters are batting a combined .294 (62-for-211), which is the second best mark in the majors...have the third best OPS (.885).

STARTING PITCHING: Brett Anderson took the loss last night to snap an eightgame winning streak by A's starting pitchers...it was the first loss by an A's starter since May 14 (also Anderson)...starters are now 0-1 with a 5.82 ERA (11 er in 17.0 ip) over the last four games after going 8-0 with a 2.73 ERA over the previous 11 contests...overall, starters are tied for third in the American League in wins (22), rank fourth in opponents batting average (.238), OPS (.721) and slugging percentage (.409) and fifth in ERA (4.21), innings pitched (314.1) and on-base percentage (.312)...have a 3.40 ERA (63 er in 166.2 ip) over the last 29 games dating back to April 28 after posting a 5.12 ERA over the first 29 contests...used an "opener" for the second time this year on Wednesday and lost...are 1-1 in games in those games this season after going 4-5 last year.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed three errors in the last three games to snap a season-high eight-game errorless streak...have made just eight errors over the last 24 contests...have committed 29 errors for the season, which includes 10 by second basemen, seven by pitchers and 12 by all other positions...have a .987 fielding percentage, which is fourth best in the American League...opponents have 38 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors to New York-NL (48).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have lost each of the last four games, which is their longest home losing streak of the season...are 4-4 on this nine-game homestand against Seattle (3-0), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Houston (0-2)... have not had a losing homestand since May 22-31, 2018 when they went 4-6 against Seattle, Arizona and Tampa Bay (excludes Tokyo)...have a record of 50-23 (.685) in Oakland dating back to June 16, 2018...are 18-14 (.563) at home this year compared to 11-15 (.423) on the road...went 6-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (0-2), Detroit (3-0) and Cleveland (3-0) after going 1-8 on the previous trip...leave following the game today for a season-long 10-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games), Texas (four games) and Tampa Bay (three games) that begins on Tuesday.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .232 (245-for-1058) and are averaging 4.09 runs per game at home (131 runs in 32 games) compared to .259 with an average of 5.74 runs per game on the road...are averaging the fourth fewest runs per game at home in the American League and the third most on the road...have compiled a 3.75 ERA (125 er in 300.0 ip) at home compared to 4.71 on the road...have the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 8-9 in one-run games and the 17 games are tied for second most in the American League...are 13-15 in games decided by two runs or fewer and the 28 games are also tied for second most...are 2-5 in extra inning games...the losses are the most in the majors and the seven games are tied with Detroit for the most in the American League...allowed five runs in the 11th inning Wednesday and have surrendered a Major League leading 16 runs in extra innings (17.2 ip, 7.64 ERA)... allowed just eight runs in extra innings all last year (38.1 ip, 1.88 ERA)...are 4-10 in games decided in the last at bat...the losses are tied with Kansas City for the most in the majors...also lead the majors with five walk-off losses, which matches the A's season total from last year...have four walk-off wins, which is tied with the White Sox for the most in the AL.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 4-4 in this stretch of 16 consecutive games against American League West competition that runs from May 24 to June 9...are now 12-14 (.462) in divisional play compared to 17-15 (.531) against all other teams...have a 4.67 ERA (122 er in 235.1 ip) against the West, 3.78 (126 er in 299.2) against everyone else.

A's IN MAY: The A's went 15-10 (.600) in May, which was the fourth best record in the American League (pending the outcome of the May 19 suspended game)...it marked the second consecutive season Oakland finished May with a winning record and it is currently their best May since going 18-9 (.667) in 2001...set Oakland records for slugging percentage (.467) and extra base hits (101) in May and tied for the second most home runs (45)...the slugging percentage was the highest by an A's team in May since 1932 (.478) and the extra base hits were the most since 1941 (103)...ranked fourth in the AL in slugging percentage, tied for fourth in triples (5) and home runs, fifth in extra base hits and OPS (.795) and tied for fifth in doubles (51)...the pitching staff ranked second in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.376), fourth in opponents batting average (.225) and fifth in ERA (3.62) and OPS (.682)...the batting average was the A's lowest in May since 1990 (.223)... struck out 207 batters, which was second fewest in the AL but fourth most in Oakland history.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 10 times this year...currently have five players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea) and all but Estrada are on the 60-day IL...Cotton began a rehab assignment May 17 but that was halted May 29 with a strained right hamstring... have had at least five players on the DL every day dating back to April 26, 2018.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 1-6 against Houston...are 1-3 in Oakland and 0-3 in Houston...have lost seven of the last eight games and 18 of the last 25...have dropped nine of the last 12 in Oakland...lost the season series for the fourth consecutive season last year as they went 7-12 against Houston...went 2-7 in Oakland, which was their worst home mark ever against the Astros, and 5-5 in Houston...are 30-53 (.361) against the Astros over the last five years after winning each of their first four season series against Houston (31-13, .705)...are 61-66 all-time, including 32-32 in Oakland and 29-34 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Buchter has not allowed a run in 14 of 15 games since being recalled from Las Vegas April 29 and has a 0.90 ERA (1 er in 10.0 ip) over that span... **Matt Chapman** has homered four times in the last seven games and has 15 for the season, which is tied for sixth in the American League...leads the AL in home runs by a third baseman (15) and is tied for the lead in home runs at home (11) and go-ahead home runs (8)...*Ramón Laureano* has a 14-game hitting streak (20-for-56, .357), which is a career high and the longest active hitting streak in the majors...*Josh Phegley* leads all Major League catchers with 33 RBI...*Marcus Semien* has committed just one error and leads ML shortstops with a .996 fielding percentage...has a careerhigh 42-game errorless streak, which is tied for fourth longest in Athletics history by a shortstop.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1967**, reliever Lew Krausse has the game-winning two-run single and picks up the win in the A's 6-4, 13-inning win at Chicago...in **1977** Mike Norris tosses a four-hit shutout as the A's defeat the Mariners in Seattle, 1-0...Jim Tyrone's double in the fourth inning drives in the only run of the game...in **1982** Mike Norris tosses a four-hit shutout as the A's defeat Boston 5-0.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (3-1, 3.27 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 17 and is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...picked up his third win of the season in his last start...had just four wins over his first four seasons (40 games, 30 starts)...went 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA over his first five starts this year but is 1-0 with an 8.31 ERA (8 er in 8.2 ip) in two starts since then.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .200 opponents batting average, which is sixth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched...however, 17 of the 30 hits he has allowed have been for extra bases (eight doubles, one triple, eight home runs) and he has a .427 opponents slugging percentage...has held the opposition to a .125 (7-for-56) batting average with runners on base...opponents are 3-for-26 (.115) with runners in scoring position including 0-for-10 with RISP and two outs...held the opposition to a .205 average with RISP last year...opponents are batting .134 (11-for-82) with two strikes but five of the hits are home runs...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number seven hitter (0-for-16).

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 15 runs this year, 13 of which have come over the first four innings of the game...has a 4.22 ERA (13 er in 27.2 ip) and ..226 (24-for-106) opponents batting average in innings one through four, a 1.32 ERA (2 er in 13.2 ip) and .136 (6-for-44) opponents average from the fifth inning on...last year, he did not allow a run in the first inning (7.0 ip) and had a 1.73 ERA over innings 1-3...logged a 4.57 ERA and surrendered all four of his home runs from the fourth inning on.

NIGHT AND DAY: Has picked up the win in each of his last two starts in a day game after starting his career 0-9 over his first 17 outings during the day... is 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA (9 er in 27.2 ip) in four starts during the day this year compared to 1-0 with a 3.95 ERA (6 er in 13.2 ip) in three starts at night.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed eight home runs, which is a new career high... six of the home runs have been hit by left-handed hitters, which is tied for eighth most in the American League...six have been solo shots.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received 34 runs of support over his first seven starts and his season run support average is 7.40 (34 rs in 41.1 ip)...last year, he received two runs of support or fewer in five of his seven starts and his RSA as a starter was 3.19...has received two runs of support or fewer in 27 of his 37 career starts and his career RSA as a starter is 3.60 (84 rs in 210.0 ip).

PRE AND POST "TOMMY JOHN": Is 5-4 with a 3.13 ERA (31 er in 89.0 ip) and .211 (70-for-331) opponents batting average in 18 games (14 starts) since undergoing "Tommy John" surgery May 6, 2016...is averaging 8.90 strikeouts per nine innings (88 so in 89.0 ip)...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA, .263 opponents batting average and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Made the trip to Japan but was one of three inactive players for the two-game series against the Mariners...was placed on the 10-day injured list March 27 retroactive to March 25 with a right lower leg contu-sion...went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA in three rehab starts with Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas April 16...was recalled by Oakland the next day when Marco Estrada went on the injured list...made his first start April 22 against Texas and tossed 5.0 scoreless innings for the win...struck out a season-high nine in his second start April 28 at Toronto (also May 9 against Cincinnati)...however, had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss in 11 innings...left his third start on May 4 at Pittsburgh after five innings with a 4-3 lead but Wendelken allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save and loss...allowed a seasonhigh seven hits and took the loss on May 9 against Cincinnati to snap the first winning streak of his career, a three-game streak dating back to last year...went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 11 games (seven starts) dating back to June 27, 2018...the loss was his first since June 22, 2018 at Chicago (AL)...tossed a ca-reer-high tying 8.0 innings, did not allow a run, walked two and yielded four hits in a 17-3 win at Detroit on May 16...tossed a season-low 3.2 innings and walked a career-high six batters in a no decision at Cleveland May 21...is the first Major League pitcher since at least 1908 with a pitching line of 3.2 innings, three hits, three runs, three earned runs, six walks and six strikeouts.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-5 win over Los Angeles (AL) on Monday in Oakland...allowed a season-high five runs in 5.0 innings... yielded a RBI double to Calhoun in the second but the A's tied the game with a run in the third...surrendered two runs in the fourth on a Pujols home run and a Rengifo sacrifice fly...Oakland then built a 6-3 leading before he allowed a RBI double to Fletcher in the sixth...was relieved by Petit who allowed Fletcher to score.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA and .242 opponents batting average on a three start rehab assignment...struck out 16 batters in 11.0 innings and walked two...his first assignment came with Stockton on April 4 against Rancho Cucamonga...retired all nine batters he faced, the first five by strikeout...moved to Las Vegas for a start on April 9 in a 10-2 win against Sacramento...allowed just one run in three innings of work, a bases loaded walk to Michael Reed in the first inning...then had a no decision in a 6-5 loss to Fresno on April 14...allowed five runs on five hits in five innings of work.

2018 RECAP: Had seven stints with Oakland in his return to the majors following "Tommy John" surgery in 2016...went 2-3 with a 3.02 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in 11 games, including seven starts...the ERA and opponents batting average were the lowest of his four seasons as was his .309 on-base percentage, .315 slugging percentage and .624 OPS...the two wins matched his career total entering the season as he was 2-11 over his first three seasons...struck out 41 batters in 47.2 innings for a career-best average of 7.74 strikeouts per nine innings...went 0-2 with a 2.78 ERA in five games at home and is now 3-8 with a 2.97 ERA (33 er in 100.0 ip) in 19 career games in the Coliseum...also went 5-5 with a 4.30 ERA in 18 games, in-cluding 14 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...was 2-3 with a 6.10 ERA and .314 opponents batting average over his first 10 games (seven starts) through June 2...then went 3-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over his final eight games (seven starts) following his July 12 option from Oakland...surrendered six home runs in 81.2 innings, an average of 0.66 per nine innings...struck out 83, an average of 9.15 per nine innings, and walked 25 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.32...allowed a .271 opponents batting average, including .215 (29-for-135) against left-handed hitters compared to .313 (57-for-182) against right-handers...had a .573 OPS against lefties, .817 against righties.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Frankie Montas (6-2, 2.40 ERA): Ranks fifth in the American League in ERA (2.81), tied for eighth in wins (6) and ninth in opponents slugging percentage (.359)...has not allowed a home run in his last eight starts, 48.0 innings and 208 batters faced...is averaging 0.56 home runs per nine innings, which is the third lowest mark in the AL...is 2-0 with a 2.64 ERA and .226 opponents batting average over his last five starts...has 36 strikeouts in 30.2 innings over that span (10.57 per nine innings)...is 3-2 with a 2.25 ERA in six starts on the road compared to 3-0 with a 3.54 ERA in five starts at home... ranks third in the AL in road ERA...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-4 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) on Tuesday in Oakland (4.0 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 bb, 5 so)... is 1-0 with a 3.52 ERA (15.1 ip, 15 h, 6 r, 6 er, 6 bb, 14 so, 1 hr) in five career appearances, including two starts, against Los Angeles (AL)...is 1-0 with a 4.50 ERA (10.0 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 5 bb, 11 so) in two starts this year.

of his right foot May 17 and was transferred to the 60-day DL June 14...was reinstated from the DL Aug. 28 and pitched exclusively in relief following his return, logging a 5.74 ERA and .306 opponents batting average in 10 appearances...recorded his first save in his first outing following his return Aug. 28 at Detroit...pitched the final three innings of the A's 14-4 win, allowing three runs on five hits in 3.0 innings.

2012—Completed his rehab from "Tommy John" surgery in late August and made six starts before his regular season ended when he strained his right oblique Sept. 19...went 4-2 with a 2.57 ERA and .225 opponents batting average...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings...yielded a .148 average with runners in scoring position...was reinstated from the disabled list Aug. 20 and started the next day against Minnesota...allowed just one run in 7.0 innings for the win...it was his first start since June 5, 2011 at Boston...combined with Cook and Balfour on a two-hit shutout in his second start, a 3-0 win at Cleveland Aug. 27...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed both of the hits...allowed one run in each of his next two starts to become the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1918 to begin his season with four consecutive starts of one run or fewer...won each of his first four starts to become the first Oakland pitcher to start the season by winning at least his first four starts since Dave Stewart had six wins in his first six starts in 1990...the four-game winning streak matched the longest of his career (third time, last: Sept. 6 to Oct. 2, 2010)...had a 0.69 ERA, a .185 opponents batting average and three walks in 26.0 innings over his first four starts... left his final start Sept. 19 at Detroit after just 2.1 innings with the oblique injury...returned to start and win Game 3 of the ALDS against Detroit in Oakland...combined with Cook, Doolittle and Balfour on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed two of the hits (2 bb, 6 so)...combined for a 1-1 record and a 4.62 ERA during a six-start rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Sacramento...began his rehab assignment July 21 with Stockton, one year and seven days after having reconstructive surgery to the ulnar collateral ligament in his left elbow...was transferred to Sacramento July 26.

2011—Was limited to just 13 starts and was 3-6 with a 4.00 ERA when he underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his left elbow July 14...went 2-1 with a 1.56 ERA over his first five starts and did not allow a home run in 34.2 innings...then went 1-5 with a 5.73 ERA over his final eight starts, yielding eight home runs in 48.2 innings...allowed a .270 opponents batting average, including a .252 against right-handed hitters and .303 against left-handers...his opponents average dropped to .221 with runners in scoring position...tied for seventh in the American League with five pickoffs...opponents were successful in just 5 of 12 (41.7%) stolen base attempts...tossed his second career complete game in his second start of the season but took the loss in a 2-1 decision at Minnesota April 8...matched his career high by tossing 9.0 innings May 5 against Cleveland, but had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 12-inning loss...allowed a career-high 10 runs on a career-high 11 hits in a 10-3 loss to New York May 31...allowed five runs on nine hits in 5.0 innings in his final start, a 6-3 loss at Boston June 5...was placed on the disabled list June 7 with left elbow soreness...received a Platelet Rich Plasma injection after he was examined by Dr. James Andrews at the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Fla. June 13...was examined again a month later and it was determined that his injury required surgery...Dr. Andrews performed successful reconstructive surgery to the ulnar collateral ligament in his left elbow, July 14.

2010—Lowered his ERA by more than a run from his rookie campaign of 2009 but two stints on the disabled list with elbow problems limited him to just 19 starts...was 7-6 with a 2.80 ERA after going 11-11 with a 4.06 ERA in his first season...opponents batted .257, including .225 with runners in scoring position...tied for eighth in the AL with four pickoffs...did not allow a run in his first two starts of the season April 8 against Seattle and April 13 at Seattle to become the first starting pitcher in Oakland history (among pitchers who began the season with the A's) to start the season with two consecutive scoreless outings...the last Athletics pitcher to do it was Alex Kellner of the 1953 Philadelphia A's, who started the season with back-to-back complete game shutouts...agreed to terms April 16 on a four-year contract through the 2013 season with club options for 2014 and 2015...had his season-opening scoreless streak snapped at 14.0 innings in his third start, an 8-3 loss to Baltimore...that was the third longest season-opening streak by a starter in Oakland history and the longest since Matt Keough set the record with a 16.0 inning streak in 1980...was 1-1 with a 2.35 ERA in four starts before going on the 15-day disabled list April 27 retroactive to April 25 with left elbow inflammation and a proximal medial forearm strain...was reinstated from the DL May 29...had a win and a 2.35 ERA in two starts before returning to the DL with left elbow inflammation June 4...was reinstated July 30 and went 5-5 with a 2.98 ERA in 13 starts following his return...finished the season with a career-high tying fourgame winning streak...walked a season-high three batters Sept. 11 against Boston, snapping a 22-start streak dating back to Aug. 19, 2009 where he walked two batters or fewer...that was the second longest streak by a starting pitcher in Oakland history...went 3-1 with a 2.23 ERA in six starts in September.

2009-Set an Oakland rookie record and led Major League rookies with 150 strikeouts...compiled an 11-11 record and 4.06 ERA in 30 starts...tied for third among American League rookies in games started, ranked fourth in innings pitched (175.1) and tied for fourth in wins...is one of four 21-year olds in Oakland history to win 10 or more games...went 8-4 with a 2.96 ERA over his final 17 starts, beginning June 29...was charged with 15 unearned runs, which tied for the most in the AL...also ranked tied for fifth in grounded into double plays (24), tied for seventh in shutouts (1) and pickoffs (4), eighth in walks per nine innings (2.31) and strikeout to walk ratio (3.33), and 10th in strikeouts per nine innings (7.70)...his season run support of 4.62 was eighth lowest in the AL...did not have a wild pitch and his 175.1 innings were the most in the majors among pitchers with no wild pitches...did not commit an error in 29 total chances, all assists...tied for the lead among AL pitchers in double plays (5) and tied for fourth in assists...was ranked number 7 on Baseball America's Top 100 Prospects lists entering the season...was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, a 5-4 A's loss to Seattle April 10...allowed five runs in 6.0 innings, with all five runs coming in the second inning...recorded his first Major League win May 20 at Tampa Bay when he yielded four runs on four hits and no walks in 6.0 innings in a 7-6 A's win...at the age of 21 years, 108 days, he became the sixth youngest pitcher in Oakland history to record his first ML win...tossed a complete game two-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Boston July 6 (2 bb, 9 so)...at the age of 21 years, 155 days he became the fifth youngest pitcher in Oakland history to toss a shutout and the youngest since Mike Norris July 4, 1976 against Kansas City...did not allow a run over his next two starts, including July 19 against Los Angeles when he retired each of the first 20 batters he faced before Bobby Abreu singled with two outs in the seventh inning to break up the perfect game...became the second rookie in Oakland history to take a perfect game into the seventh inning (Mike Norris, June 28, 1976)...had a career-high 23.0-inning scoreless streak from July 6 to 24...was named American League Rookie of the Month for September after going 4-0 with a 2.28 ERA in four starts...struck out a career-high 10 batters and tossed 6.0 shutout innings in a 2-1 win over Cleveland Sept. 18.

RHP Chris Bassitt (3-1, 3.27 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 17 and is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...picked up his third win of the season in his last start...had just four wins over his first four seasons (40 games, 30 starts) ... went 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA over his first five starts this year but is 1-0 with an 8.31 ERA in two starts since then...has held the opposition to a .125 batting average with runners on base...opponents are 3-for-26 (.115) with runners in scoring position including 0-for-10 with RISP and two outs...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 8-5 A's win over Los Angeles on Monday here in Oakland (5.0 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 3 so).. is 1-0 with a 2.81 ERA (16.0 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 5 er, 6 bb, 14 so, 2 hr) in three career appearances, including two starts, against Houston...went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA and .242 opponents batting average on a three start rehab assignment with Las Vegas.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (3-1, 3.27 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 17 and is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...picked up his third win of the season in his last start...had just four wins over his first four seasons (40 games, 30 starts)...went 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA over his first five starts this year but is 1-0 with an 8.31 ERA (8 er in 8.2 ip) in two starts since then.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .200 opponents batting average, which is sixth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched...however, 17 of the 30 hits he has allowed have been for extra bases (eight doubles, one triple, eight home runs) and he has a .427 opponents slugging percentage...has held the opposition to a .125 (7-for-56) batting average with runners on base...opponents are 3-for-26 (.115) with runners in scoring position including 0-for-10 with RISP and two outs...held the opposition to a .205 average with RISP last year...opponents are batting .134 (11-for-82) with two strikes but five of the hits are home runs...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number seven hitter (0-for-16).

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 15 runs this year, 13 of which have come over the first four innings of the game...has a 4.22 ERA (13 er in 27.2 ip) and .226 (24-for-106) opponents batting average in innings one through four, a 1.32 ERA (2 er in 13.2 ip) and .136 (6-for-44) opponents average from the fifth inning on...last year, he did not allow a run in the first inning (7.0 ip) and had a 1.73 ERA over innings 1-3...logged a 4.57 ERA and surrendered all four of his home runs from the fourth inning on.

NIGHT AND DAY: Has picked up the win in each of his last two starts in a day game after starting his career 0-9 over his first 17 outings during the day... is 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA (9 er in 27.2 ip) in four starts during the day this year compared to 1-0 with a 3.95 ERA (6 er in 13.2 ip) in three starts at night.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed eight home runs, which is a new career high... six of the home runs have been hit by left-handed hitters, which is tied for eighth most in the American League...six have been solo shots.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received 34 runs of support over his first seven starts and his season run support average is 7.40 (34 rs in 41.1 ip)...last year, he received two runs of support or fewer in five of his seven starts and his RSA as a starter was 3.19...has received two runs of support or fewer in 27 of his 37 career starts and his career RSA as a starter is 3.60 (84 rs in 210.0 ip).

PRE AND POST "TOMMY JOHN": Is 5-4 with a 3.13 ERA (31 er in 89.0 ip) and .211 (70-for-331) opponents batting average in 18 games (14 starts) since undergoing "Tommy John" surgery May 6, 2016...is averaging 8.90 strikeouts per nine innings (88 so in 89.0 ip)...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA, .263 opponents batting average and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Made the trip to Japan but was one of three inactive players for the two-game series against the Mariners...was placed on the 10-day injured list March 27 retroactive to March 25 with a right lower leg contu-sion...went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA in three rehab starts with Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas April 16...was recalled by Oakland the next day when Marco Estrada went on the injured list...made his first start April 22 against Texas and tossed 5.0 scoreless innings for the win...struck out a season-high nine in his second start April 28 at Toronto (also May 9 against Cincinnati)...however, had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss in 11 innings...left his third start on May 4 at Pittsburgh after five innings with a 4-3 lead but Wendelken allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save and loss...allowed a seasonhigh seven hits and took the loss on May 9 against Cincinnati to snap the first winning streak of his career, a three-game streak dating back to last year...went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 11 games (seven starts) dating back to June 27, 2018...the loss was his first since June 22, 2018 at Chicago (AL)...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings, did not allow a run, walked two and yielded four hits in a 17-3 win at Detroit on May 16...tossed a season-low 3.2 innings and walked a career-high six batters in a no decision at Cleveland May 21...is the first Major League pitcher since at least 1908 with a pitching line of 3.2 innings, three hits, three runs, three earned runs, six walks and six strikeouts.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (4-3, 5.00 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his 14th start of the season, which will tie him for the most in the majors among non-openers...is 2-0 with a 2.48 ERA (9 er in 32.2 ip) and .139 (15-for-108) opponents batting average over his last five starts...that includes a start in the suspended game May 19 at Detroit, in which he is the pitcher of record with the A's leading 5-3 in the bottom of the seventh...went 2-1 with a 3.00 ERA and .189 opponents batting average over his first three starts and was 0-2 with a 9.41 ERA and .358 opponents batting average in five starts in between (April 7-May 1).

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 2-1 with a 2.87 ERA and .161 opponents batting average in six starts in May after going 1-1 with a 7.83 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in five starts in April...had the second lowest opponents batting average in the American League in May (Verlander, HOU .124)...his April ERA was his highest in a month of 10 or more innings (previous: 7.44 in Aug. 2017)...it was second highest in the majors this year among pitchers with 20 or more innings in April (Nova, CWS 8.42)...is now 5-9 with a 5.68 ERA in 25 career appearances in April...is 45-35 with a 3.53 ERA (271 er in 690.2 ip) from May through August.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 2-1 with a 6.21 ERA (23 er in 33.1 ip) in seven starts against American League West competition compared to 2-2 with a 3.47 ERA (14 er in 36.1 ip) in six starts against all other teams...is now 11-14 with a 5.60 ERA (147 er in 236.1 ip) in 45 career appearances against the AL West, 47-44 with a 3.61 ERA (293 er in 731.1 ip) in 140 games against all other teams.

NO-HITTER: Tossed his second career no-hitter May 7 in Oakland against Cincinnati to become the 34th pitcher in Major League history with multiple regular season no-hitters...is the seventh with a no-hitter for multiple teams (Ted Breitenstein, Jim Bunning, Randy Johnson, Hideo Nomo, Nolan Ryan, Cy Young)...was named American League Co-Player of the Week with George Springer May 13...it was his second career Player of the Week honor with the first coming Aug. 23, 2015 following his first no-hitter...this no-hitter was the 13th in Athletics history, including the eighth in Oakland history...it was the first since Sean Manaea last year on April 21...his other no-hitter also came in interleague play on Aug. 21, 2015 for Houston against Los Angeles (NL) and he has each of the last two out of six total interleague no-hitters... tossed 131 pitches, which were the most in a no-hitter since he threw 134 in his against the Dodgers...now has two career complete games, both nohitters...according to Stats, Inc., he is the first pitcher in ML history to have each of his first two career complete games be no-hitters...also according to Stats, his 6.81 ERA entering the game was the highest by any pitcher entering a start in which he threw a no-hitter (min. 25.0 ip).

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starter against Seattle on March 20 in Tokyo and was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-7 loss...it was his first career Opening Day start and he became the A's 12th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 14 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice)...put together wins in back-to-back starts on March 28 against Los Angeles and April 2 against Boston...did not allow a run in either outing, marking the second time in his career he had back-to-back starts without yielding a run...the other time was June 20-30, 2012 when he did it in three straight starts...combined with Trivino, Soria and Treinen on a three-hit shutout in a 4-0 win over the Angels... allowed just one hit in six innings, a one-out double by La Stella in the fifth... then combined with Buchter, Trivino and Treinen on a seven-hit shutout in a 1-0 win over the Red Sox...allowed five hits in six innings and did not walk a batter...that gave him a 2-1 record, a 3.00 ERA and a .189 opponents batting average over his first three starts...then allowed a season-high six runs in three consecutive starts from April 7-20 and went 0-1 with a 16.20 ERA
