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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (29-30) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (29-31)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost five straight after going unbeaten over their previous 11 games (10 wins and a suspended game)...are now 29-30 overall and are in third place in the American League West, 11 games behind Houston...the games behind are a season high...are two games behind Texas for the second AL Wild Card spot...started the season 10-8, went 5-13 over an 18-game stretch from April 14 to May 5 and are 14-9 (.609) since then...the mark since May 6 is fourth best in the AL...have spent eight days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 19 days in third, five days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered in a season-high 12 consecutive games and have 28 home runs over that span (have not homered in the May 19 suspended game but homered in each of the previous three games before that)...have 42 home runs over the last 18 games and 93 for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...the 93 home runs are the most in Athletics history after 60 games (88 in 2000 and 2017).

OFFENSE: The A's went 21-for-108 (.194) with seven runs, three doubles and six home runs over the three-game series against Houston after hitting .283 with 89 runs (6.8 per game), 32 doubles, two triples and 31 home runs over the previous 13 contests...are tied for fourth in the American League in hit by pitches (27) and have the fourth fewest strikeouts (461)...have the third fewest stolen bases (20)...A's pinch hitters are 8-for-32 (.250) with two home runs, six RBI and six walks...rank second in the AL in pinch walks, tied for second in home runs, second in plate appearances (40), and tied for fourth in hits and RBI...Oakland's number eight hitters are batting a combined .296 (64-for-216), which is the second best mark in the majors...have the third best OPS (.897).

STARTING PITCHING: Brett Anderson took the loss Saturday night to snap an eight-game winning streak by A's starting pitchers...it was the first loss by an A's starter since May 14 (also Anderson)...starters are now 0-1 with a 5.49 ERA (14 er in 23.0 ip) over the last five games after going 8-0 with a 2.73 ERA over the previous 11 contests...overall, starters are tied for third in the American League in wins (22), rank third in opponents batting average (.238), fourth in OPS (.719) and slugging percentage (.408), and fifth in ERA (4.21), innings pitched (320.1), and on-base percentage (.311)...have a 3.44 ERA (66 er in 172.2 ip) over the last 30 games dating back to April 28 after posting a 5.12 ERA over the first 29 contests...used an "opener" for the second time this year on Wednesday and lost...are 1-1 in games in those games this season after going 4-5 last year.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last four games to snap a season-high eight-game errorless streak...have made just 10 errors over the last 25 contests...have committed 31 errors for the season, which includes 11 by second basemen, seven by pitchers and 13 by all other positions...have a .986 fielding percentage, which is fourth best in the American League...opponents have 41 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors to New York-NL (48).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have lost each of the last five games, which is their longest home losing streak of the season...went 4-5 on their nine-game homestand against Seattle (3-0), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Houston (0-3)...had not had a losing homestand since May 22-31, 2018 when they went 4-6 against Seattle, Arizona and Tampa Bay (excludes Tokyo)...have a record of 50-24 (.676) in Oakland dating back to June 16, 2018...are 18-15 (.545) at home this year compared to 11-15 (.423) on the road...went 6-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (0-2), Detroit (3-0) and Cleveland (3-0) after going 1-8 on the previous trip...begin a season-long 10-game road trip today to Los Angeles-AL (three games), Texas (four games) and Tampa Bay (three games).

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .231 (255-for-1103) and are averaging 4.09 runs per game at home (135 runs in 33 games) compared to .259 with an average of 5.74 runs per game on the road...have compiled a 3.78 ERA (131 er in 312.0 ip) at home compared to 4.71 on the road...have the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 8-9 in one-run games and the 17 games are tied for second most in the American League...are 13-16 in games decided by two runs or fewer and the 29 games are second most...are 2-6 in extra inning games...the losses are the most in the majors and the seven games are the most in the American League...allowed five runs in the 11th inning Wednesday and have surrendered a Major League

leading 18 runs in extra innings (20.2 ip, 7.84 ERA)...allowed just eight runs in extra innings all last year (38.1 ip, 1.88 ERA)...are 4-10 in games decided in the last at bat...the losses are tied with Kansas City for the most in the majors...also lead the majors with five walk-off losses, which matches the A's season total from last year...have four walk-off wins, which is tied with the White Sox for the most in the AL.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 4-5 in this stretch of 16 consecutive games against American League West competition that runs from May 24 to June 9...are now 12-15 (.444) in divisional play compared to 17-15 (.531) against all other teams...have a 4.66 ERA (128 er in 247.1 ip) against the West, 3.78 (126 er in 299.2) against everyone else.

A'S IN MAY: The A's went 15-10 (.600) in May, which was the fourth best record in the American League (pending the outcome of the May 19 suspended game)...it marked the second consecutive season Oakland finished May with a winning record and it is currently their best May since going 18-9 (.667) in 2001...set Oakland records for slugging percentage (.467) and extra base hits (101) in May and tied for the second most home runs (45)...the slugging percentage was the highest by an A's team in May since 1932 (.478) and the extra base hits were the most since 1941 (103)...ranked fourth in the AL in slugging percentage, tied for fourth in triples (5) and home runs, fifth in extra base hits and OPS (.795) and tied for fifth in doubles (51)...the pitching staff ranked second in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.376), fourth in opponents batting average (.225) and fifth in ERA (3.62) and OPS (.682)...the batting average was the A's lowest in May since 1990 (.223)...struck out 207 batters, which was second fewest in the AL but fourth most in Oakland history.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 10 times this year...currently have five players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea) and all but Estrada are on the 60-day IL...Cotton began a rehab assignment May 17 but that was halted May 29 with a strained right hamstring...have had at least five players on the DL every day dating back to April 26, 2018.

A'S vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 4-3...lost the last series 1-2 after winning three of four in the Coliseum in March...this is Oakland's first time visiting Angel Stadium this season...seven of the A's next 16 road games will be against the Angels...have nine more road games against Los Angeles-AL this season...lost the season series for the fifth consecutive year last season as they went 9-10 against the Angels...it is the Athletics (Kansas City and Oakland) longest season series losing streak against the Angels...went 5-5 in Oakland last year and 4-5 in Anaheim...are 35-48 (.422) against the Angels over the last six seasons...that breaks down to 27-27 in Oakland and 17-31 on the road...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 441-379 against the Angels...that includes 232-180 in Oakland and 209-199 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 490-456 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman has homered five times in the last eight games and has 16 for the season, which is tied for sixth in the American League...leads the AL in home runs by a third baseman (16), home runs at home (12), and is tied for the lead in go-ahead home runs (8)...**Ramón Laureano** has a 16-game hitting streak (21-for-61, .344), which is a career high and the longest active hitting streak in the majors...**Josh Phegley** leads all Major League catchers with 33 RBI...**Marcus Semien** has committed just two error and is tied for the Major League lead among shortstops with a .992 fielding percentage...snapped a career-high 42-game errorless streak on Sunday, which was tied for fourth longest in Athletics history by a shortstop.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1971** the A's take a 3-0 lead into the bottom of the ninth at Washington before the Senators score three times to send the game into extra innings...the A's finally win with two runs in the top of the 21st inning to win the longest game (by innings) in Oakland history...in **1972** Catfish Hunter pitches a two-hit shutout in the first game of a double-header at Baltimore for his 100th career victory...in **2007** Mark Ellis hits for the cycle in the A's 5-4, 11-inning win over Boston...he completes the cycle with a single in the 10th inning and Eric Chavez wins the game with a walk-off home run in the 11th.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (6-2, 2.81 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks sixth in the American League in ERA (2.81), eighth in opponents slugging percentage (.359), tied for eighth in wins (6) and ninth in OPS (.658)...is also tied for third in opponent grounded into double plays (9), tied for eighth in unearned runs (6) and ranks 11th in run support (6.75).

THE LONG BALL: Has not allowed a home run in his last eight starts, 48.0 innings and 208 batters faced...allowed four home runs over his first three starts with the last coming on April 10 at Baltimore (Ruiz)...is averaging 0.56 home runs per nine innings, which is the fifth lowest mark in the American League...three of the four home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...three have come on the road.

LAST FIVE STARTS: Is 2-0 with a 2.64 ERA (9 er in 30.2 ip) and .226 (26-for-115) opponents batting average over his last five starts...has 36 strikeouts in 30.2 innings over that span (10.57 per nine innings)...the longest winning streak of his career is three games (twice, last: April 10-23, 2019).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-2 with a 2.25 ERA (9 er in 36.0 ip) in six starts on the road compared to 3-0 with a 3.54 ERA (11 er in 28.0 ip) in five starts at home...ranks third in the American League in road ERA.

THIS AND THAT: Has career highs in wins (6) and strikeouts (66) and has matched his high in games started (11)...his 64.0 innings pitched are one short of his career high of 65.0 from last year...the A's are 7-4 (.636) in his starting assignments and are 14-8 (.636) when he starts in his career...has allowed just one run in the first inning for a 0.82 ERA (11.0 ip)...opponents are hitting .119 (15-for-126) with two strikes...has yielded a .317 (19-for-60) average with runners in scoring position...has committed three errors, which is tied for the most among Major League pitchers and are the most by an A's pitcher since 2014 (Gray and Kazmir, 3 each).

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the Opening Day roster and was available in the bullpen for the two games against Seattle in Japan but did not pitch...was inserted into the fourth spot in the rotation when the season resumed and picked up the win in his first start March 31 against Los Angeles (AL)...took the loss in his second start on April 5 at Houston...then went 3-0 with a 3.50 ERA and .224 opponents average over his next three starts from April 10 to 23 to match the longest winning streak of his career (also May 27-June 8, 2018)...the first win came on April 10 at Baltimore when he retired the first 12 batters he faced...surrendered two home runs in the game, giving him four in his first three starts...has not allowed a home run since then...allowed a run on three hits in 6.2 innings for the win in a 2-1 decision over Houston on April 17...did not allow a hit until Gurriel singled with one out in the fifth...allowed a season-high nine hits but extended his winning streak to three games in an 11-5 win over Texas April 23...had his three-game winning streak snapped April 29 at Boston when he allowed a season-high seven runs in 4.1 innings...only one of the runs was earned and the six unearned runs tied for second most in Oakland history...they were the most since Brett Anderson also had six on May 15, 2009 vs. Detroit...finished April with a 3-2 record and a 3.29 ERA in five starts...tied for fifth in the American League in wins...then went 2-0 with a 2.64 ERA in five starts in May...tied for ninth in the AL in May ERA...left his start on May 10 against Cleveland with a 3-2 lead but Trivino blew the save in a game the A's would win 4-3 in 12 innings...had career highs in strikeouts (10), innings pitched (8.2) and pitches (109) in a 7-2 win at Detroit on May 17...did not walk a batter, which marked the 27th time in Oakland history a pitcher struck out 10 or more and did not issue a walk...it was the first since Jeff Samardzija on Sept. 17, 2014 vs. Texas (10 so).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) a week ago today in Oakland...walked a career-high five batters in a season-low 4.0 innings...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed four runs in the second on a two-run single by Fletcher and a two-run double by La Stella...left trailing 4-1 but Oakland came back to tie the game before Soria allowed two runs in the ninth for the loss.

2018 RECAP: Went 5-4 with a 3.88 ERA in 13 games, including 11 starts, over four stints with Oakland...was 5-2 with a 3.35 ERA in eight starts during his first stint from May 27 to July 9 and 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five games over his final three stints...surrendered just five home runs in 65.0 innings after yielding 10 home runs in 32.0 innings in 2017...struck out 43 batters (5.95 per nine innings) after fanning 56 in 47.0 innings (10.72 per nine innings) over his first two seasons...allowed a .290 opponents batting average, including .276 (35-for-127) against right-handed hitters compared to .305 (39-for-128) against left-handers...yielded 20 of his 28 extra base hits to lefties and had a .378 slugging percentage against righties compared to .523 against lefties...also went 4-5 with a 4.65 ERA in 15 games, all starts, with Triple-A Nashville...had a .255 opponents batting average, including .189 (18-for-95) against left-handed hitters compared to .290 (51-for-176) against right-handers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Daniel Mengden (1-1, 3.05 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his fifth appearance and fourth start of the season...allowed four runs in 5.1 innings in his first start but has yielded just one run in each of his three games since then (1.76 ERA)...has allowed a .218 opponents batting average but has issued 14 walks in 20.1 innings (.333 on-base percentage)...had a no decision in his last appearance last Wednesday against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland (4.1 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...pitched in relief of "opener" Liam Hendriks and had a no decision in the A's 12-7 loss in 11 innings...is 0-2 with a 7.54 ERA (22.2 ip, 28 h, 20 r, 19 er, 10 bb, 17 so, 4 hr) in five career appearances, including three starts, against the Angels...went 3-2 with a 2.77 ERA and .197 opponents batting average in seven games, including six starts, with the Aviators...struck out 44 batters in 39.0 innings (10.15 per nine innings).

- However, is 11-for-23 (47.8%) in save opportunities for the season...the 12 blown saves are the second most in the majors...the save percentage is second lowest in the American League and the saves are tied for third fewest.
- Has the fifth fewest home runs allowed in the AL (24)...has the third fewest wins (7) and the most losses (14).
- Has fifth highest on-base percentage against first batters faced (.327) but the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.331) among AL bullpens.

- Has allowed 40 hits, nearly half of which have been for extra bases (nine doubles, 10 home runs)...has a .268 opponents batting average and .530 slugging percentage.
- Has a 3.86 ERA (9 er in 21.0 ip) in five games at home, an 8.27 ERA (15 er in 16.1 ip) in three games on the road.
- Has not allowed a run in 2.2 innings over three relief appearances vs. the Angels in his career.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 29 for his second stint with the A's and has not allowed a run in 14 of 16 games since his return...has a 1.74 ERA (2 er in 10.1 ip) and .147 (5-for-34) opponents batting average over that span...logged a 7.04 ERA and .375 opponents average over his first 13 games before he was optioned to Las Vegas April 22.
- Is tied for first in the American League in games pitched (29).
- Has allowed a .143 (6-for-42) average against left-handed hitters, .458 (11-for-24) against right-handers.
- Has allowed two earned runs in 6.0 innings spanning 11 relief appearances in his career against the Angels.

Last Year: Went 6-0 with a 2.75 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in 54 relief appearances in his first season with the A's...allowed just 2-of-30 (6.7%) inherited runners to score, which was the lowest percentage in the majors.

- Has made two appearances as an opener this year...the first came in the A's 3-2 win over Cleveland on May 11 (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...is now 0-1 with a 3.38 ERA (4 er in 10.2 ip) and a .225 (9-for-40) opponents batting average in 10 career starts as an opener...the A's are 5-5 in those games.
- Has not allowed a run in 12 of his last 13 games and has a 1.04 ERA over that stretch (2 er in 17.1 ip).
