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## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (30-30) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (29-32)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's won last night, snapping a five-game losing streak (all at home), after going unbeaten over their previous 11 games (10 wins and a suspended game)...are now 30-30 overall and are in third place in the American League West, 11 games behind Houston...the games behind are a season high...are one game behind Texas and Boston for the second AL Wild Card spot...Tampa Bay is 5.0 games ahead of Texas and Boston for the first Wild Card spot...started the season 10-8, went 5-13 over an 18-game stretch from April 14 to May 5 and are 15-9 (.625) since then...the mark since May 6 is fourth best in the AL...have spent eight days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 20 days in third, five days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

*OPENING STATEMENT:* The A's will use an "opener" for the third time this year today...went 1-1 over the first two games...last used it at home against the Angels last week...both times RHP Liam Hendriks was the opener...did it nine times last year, all in September, and the A's were 4-5 in those games...the openers (Hendriks eight times, Trivino once) compiled a 1.86 ERA while the long men (Mengden four times, Bassitt three times, Fiers and Cahill once) combined for a 3.55 ERA...Hendriks tossed 1.2 innings in the first opener game but the opener pitched exactly 1.0 innings in each of the final eight games...the long man averaged 3.7 innings per game, with a high of 5.0 by Daniel Mengden on Sept. 12 at Baltimore.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered in a season-high 13 consecutive games and have 29 home runs over that span (have not homered in the May 19 suspended game but homered in each of the previous three games before that)...have 43 home runs over the last 19 games and 94 for the season, which is fifth most in the American League...their 38 home runs since May 16 are the most in the Majors.

*OFFENSE*: The A's have gone 29-for-142 (.204) with 111 runs, fiv doubles, and seven home runs over their last four games after hitting .283 with 89 runs (6.8 per game), 32 doubles, two triples and 31 home runs over the previous 13 contests...are tied for fourth in the American League in hit by pitches (28) and have the fourth fewest strikeouts (470)...have the third fewest stolen bases (21)...A's pinch hitters are 8-for-32 (.250) with two home runs, six RBI and six walks...rank second in the AL in pinch walks, third in home runs and plate appearances (40), and tied for fourth in hits and RBI...Oakland's number eight hitters are batting a combined .295 (65-for-220), which is the second best mark in the majors...have the second best OPS (.890) in the American League.

STARTING PITCHING: Frankie Montas picked up his seventh win last night, allowing just two runs in six innings pitched...A's starters are now 1-0 with a 3.75 ERA over the last two games...Brett Anderson took the loss Saturday night to snap an eight-game winning streak by A's starting pitchers...it was the first loss by an A's starter since May 14 (also Anderson)...starters went 0-1 with a 5.82 ERA (11 er in 17.0 ip) from May 28-June 1 after going 8-0 with a 2.73 ERA over the previous 11 contests...overall, starters are third in the American League in wins (23) and opponents batting average (.238), fourth in OPS (.718) and slugging percentage (.407), fifth in ERA (4.19) and innings pitched (326.1), and sixth in on-base percentage (.310)...have a 3.43 ERA (68 er in 178.2 ip) over the last 31 games dating back to April 28 after posting a 5.12 ERA over the first 29 contests...used an "opener" for the second time this year on Wednesday and lost...are 1-1 in games in those games this season after going 4-5 last year.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed five errors in the last five games to snap a season-high eight-game errorless streak...have made just 10 errors over the last 26 contests...have committed 31 errors for the season, which includes 11 by second basemen, seven by pitchers and 13 by all other positions...have a .986 fielding percentage, which is fourth best in the American League...opponents have 41 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors to New York-NL (49).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have won each of their last four road games... would be an eight-game winning streak if they win the suspended game from May 19...have lost each of the last five home games, which is their longest home losing streak of the season...went 4-5 on their nine-game homestand against Seattle (3-0), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Houston (0-3)...had not had a losing homestand since May 22-31, 2018 when they went 4-6 against Seattle, Arizona and Tampa Bay (excludes Tokyo)...have a record of 50-24

(.676) in Oakland dating back to June 16, 2018...are 18-15 (.545) at home this year compared to 12-15 (.444) on the road...went 6-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (0-2), Detroit (3-0) and Cleveland (3-0) after going 1-8 on the previous trip to Toronto (0-3), Boston (0-3), and Pittsburgh (1-2)...continue a season-long 10-game road trip today to Los Angeles-AL (three games, 1-0), Texas (four games) and Tampa Bay (three games).

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .231 (255-for-1103) and are averaging 4.09 runs per game at home (135 runs in 33 games) compared to .258 with an average of 5.68 runs per game on the road...have compiled a 3.78 ERA (131 er in 312.0 ip) at home compared to 4.61 on the road...have the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 8-9 in one-run games and the 17 games are third most in the American League...are 14-16 in games decided by two runs or fewer and the 30 games are tied for second most...are 2-6 in extra inning games...the losses are the most in the majors and the eight games are the most in the American League...allowed five runs in the 11th inning Wednesday and have surrendered a Major League leading 18 runs in extra innings (20.2 ip, 7.84 ERA)...allowed just eight runs in extra innings all last year (38.1 ip, 1.88 ERA)...are 4-10 in games decided in the last at bat...also lead the majors with five walk-off losses, which matches the A's season total from last year.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 5-5 in this stretch of 16 consecutive games against American League West competition that runs from May 24 to June 9...are now 13-15 (.464) in divisional play compared to 17-15 (.531) against all other teams...have a 4.56 ERA (130 er in 256.1 ip) against the West, 3.78 (126 er in 299.2) against everyone else.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 10 times this year...currently have five players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea) and all but Estrada are on the 60-day IL...Cotton began a rehab assignment May 17 but that was halted May 29 with a strained right hamstring... have had at least five players on the DL every day dating back to April 26, 2018.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 5-3...lost the last series at home 1-2 after winning three of four in the Coliseum in March...this is Oakland's first time visiting Angel Stadium this season...six of the Athletics' next 15 road games will be against the Angels...have eight more road games against Los Angeles-AL this season...lost the season series for the fifth consecutive year last season as they went 9-10 against the Angels...it is the Athletics (Kansas City and Oakland) longest season series losing streak against the Angels...went 5-5 in Oakland last year and 4-5 in Anaheim...are 36-48 (.429) against the Angels over the last six seasons...that breaks down to 27-27 in Oakland and 18-31 on the road...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 442-379 against the Angels...that includes 232-180 in at the Coliseum and 210-199 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 491-456 against the Angels.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ramón Laureano reached base in all four of his plate appearances last night, and has a 16-game hitting streak (23-for-63, .365), which is a career high and the longest active hitting streak in the majors...has raised his batting average from .228 to .264 during the streak...Matt Chapman has homered five times in the last nine games and has 16 for the season, which is tied for sixth in the American League...leads the AL in home runs by a third baseman (16), home runs at home (12), and is tied for the lead in go-ahead home runs (8, Springer, HOU).....Josh Phegley leads all Major League catchers with 33 RBI...Marcus Semien has committed just two error and leads Major League shortstops with a .992 fielding percentage... snapped a career-high 42-game errorless streak on Sunday, which was tied for fourth longest in Athletics history by a shortstop.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1983 Rickey Henderson homers off Cleveland's Bud Anderson in the second game of a double header for the 2000th home run in Oakland A's history...in 2004 Tim Hudson tosses a complete game eight-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win against Toronto, snapping the A's major league record tying streak of seven consecutive no decisions by a starter.

### TODAY'S OPENER: 48 RHP JOAKIM SORIA (1-4, 5.02 ERA)

Last Outing: 6/1 vs. Houston (ND, 1.0 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, so, hr)

- Is scheduled to make the first start of his 12-year career.
- Allowed two runs Turesday night bu 14 of his last 18 appearances have been scoreless, dating back to April 16 (7 er in 21.1 ip, 2.95 ERA)...was 0-2 with an 11.05 ERA in his first nine outings of the season.
- Allowed his first home run of the season Saturday night...had not allowed a home run in his 27.2 innings pitched which was the most among Major League relievers with no home runs (Yates, SD 26.0)
- Owns a 0.66 ERA (1 er, 13.2 ip) in 11 A's wins and a 9.00 ERA (15 er, 15.0 ip) in 15 Athletics losses.
- Is 4-3 with 12 saves in 14 opportunities with a 3.47 ERA (14 er, 36.1 ip) with 43 strikeouts in 38 career relief appearances vs. the Angels...his 38 games vs. the Angels is the most by a member of the A's bullpen.
- Has allowed a .196 batting average (10-for-51) to right-handed batters this season, compared to .245 (13-for-53) against lefties.
- So far this season, he has allowed a .455 batting average (5-for-11) to players batting first in the order...he is allowing a combined .409 (9-for-22) average to hitters one-through-three.
- He is yielding just a .159 batting average (11-for-69) when the bases are empty, compared to .343 (12-for-35) with runners on.
- Went 1-2 with a 2.70 ERA in 10 appearances (13.1 ip) during the month of May.
- Has a 1.17 career ERA in 16 games (15.1 ip) at Angel Stadium, including 18 strikeouts and seven walks.

### 33 RHP DANIEL MENGDEN (1-1, 3.05 ERA)

Last Outing: 5/29 vs. Los Angeles-AL (ND, 4.1 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 6 so)

OPENING STATEMENT: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his fifth appearance of the season...allowed four runs in 5.1 innings in his first start but has yielded just one run in each of his three games since then (3 er in 15.1 ip, 1.76 ERA)...was 1-2 with a 5.73 ERA in four games, including three starts, this spring when he was optioned to Las Vegas March 11...went 3-2 with a 2.77 ERA in seven games (six starts) with the Aviators.

*OPPONENTS BATTING:* Has allowed a .218 opponents batting average but has issued 14 walks in 20.1 innings (.333 on-base percentage)...has issued 11 of his 14 walks to lefties for a .417 on-base percentage (.244 against righties)...opponents are 2-for-21 (.095) with a walk (.136 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the opponents number three hitter is 0-for-10 against him.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Pitched in relief of the A's "opener" Liam Hendriks in his last outing a week ago today and had a no decision in the A's 12-7 loss in 11 innings (1 er in 4.1 ip, 2.08 ERA)...is 1-1 with a 3.31 ERA (6 er in 16.1 ip) in his three starting assignments and the A's are 2-1 (.667) in his starts...over the last two years, he is 7-7 with a 4.33 ERA (54 er in 112.1 ip) in his 20 starts and 1-0 with a 1.88 ERA (5 er in 24.0 ip) in his six relief appearances...the A's are 13-7 (.650) in his starting assignments over the last two years.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 0-0 with a 2.16 ERA (2 er in 8.1 ip) in two games against American League West teams after going 1-1 with a 3.65 ERA in two starts against AL Central teams...was 0-6 with a 6.70 ERA and .287 opponents batting average in 11 games against AL West competition last year, 7-0 with a 2.04 ERA and .188 opponents average in 11 games against all other teams...has one career win against an AL West team and it came on Oct. 1, 2017 at Texas...his loss to Cleveland in his first start this year snapped a ninegame winning streak in interdivision games...it was his first loss against a non AL West team since May 29, 2017 at Cleveland...is now 1-12 with a 5.90 ERA (73 er in 111.1 ip) in 23 career games against the West compared to 12-6 with a 3.41 ERA (53 er in 140.0 ip) in 24 games against the rest of baseball.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-3 loss to Cleveland on May 12 in Oakland...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Santana RBI double and a Luplow sacrifice fly...the A's came back with two in the third to tie the game and he blanked Cleveland on one hit over innings 2-5...was relieved by Bucther with one out in the sixth inning and runners on first and third and Buchter allowed a three-run home run to Perez.

**SECOND START:** He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 4-1 win at Detroit May 18...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a one out double to Rodriguez...he went to third on a ground out and scored on a wild pitch, but that was the only run Mengden would allow in seven innings of work.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 win over Seattle last Friday in Oakland...allowed just one run in 4.0 innings but walked a career-high tying five and threw 99 pitches...yielded his only run in the first inning on a Santana RBI single...stranded at least one runner in each of his four innings (nine total)...was relieved by Hendriks to start the fifth inning with the A's leading 4-1.

LAST APPEARANCE: He pitched in relief of Liam Hendriks in the A's 12-7 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in 11 innings a week ago today in Oakland...Hendriks allowed two runs in the first and Mengden started the second inning...tossed an A's season-high 4.1 innings of relief and allowed his only run in the fifth inning on a Goodwin RBI single.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Mike Fiers (4-3, 5.00 ERA): Is 2-0 with a 2.48 ERA and .139 opponents batting average over his last five starts...went 2-1 with a 3.00 ERA and .189 opponents batting average over his first three starts and was 0-2 with a 9.41 ERA and .358 opponents batting average in five starts in between (April 7-May 1)...was 2-1 with a 2.87 ERA and .161 opponents batting average in six starts in May...had the second lowest opponents batting average in the American League in May...had a no decision in his last start, a 3-2 A's loss to Houston last Friday in Oakland (6.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...is 4-4 with a 5.25 ERA (61.2 ip, 62 h, 37 r, 36 er, 19 bb, 46 so, 12 hr) in 11 career appearances, 10 starts, against Los Angeles...including 1-3 with a 10.72 ERA in five games in Angel Stadium...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year on March 28 in Oakland when he combined with Trivino, Soria and Treinen on a three-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win (6.0 ip, 1 h, 3 bb, 2 so).

### ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

7-14, 4.08 ERA (104 er in 229.2 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 12-for-24 (50.0%)

- The A's bullpen has converted six of its last eight save opportunities over the last 15 games and has a 3.84 ERA (25 er in 58.2 ip) over that span.
