OAKLAND ATHLETICS (30-31) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (30-32)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's lost last night and are now 1-6 over their last seven games following an 11-game unbeaten streak (10 wins and a suspended game)...are now 30-31 overall and are in third place in the American League West, 11 games behind Houston...the games behind are a season high...are two games behind Texas and Boston for the second AL Wild Card spot...Tampa Bay is 5.0 games ahead of Texas and Boston for the first Wild Card spot...started the season 10-8, went 5-13 over an 18-game stretch from April 14 to May 5 and are 15-10 (.600) since then...the mark since May 6 is fourth best in the AL...have spent eight days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 21 days in third, five days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 12-5 (.706) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 18-26 (.409) against right-handers...are batting .277 with an .850 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .237 with a .724 OPS against right-handers...have the third best batting average and OPS against lefties in the AL and rank tied for second in the majors in home runs off lefties (29)...have the fifth lowest batting average against righties in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: The A's did not hit a home run last night, snapping a season-high streak of 13 consecutive games with a home run...had 29 home runs over that span (have not homered in the May 19 suspended game but homered in each of the previous three games before that)...have 43 home runs over the last 20 games and 94 for the season, which is fifth most in the American League...their 38 home runs since May 16 are tied for the most in the Majors.

OFFENSE: The A's have gone 44-for-182 (.242) with 20 runs, 10 doubles, and seven home runs over their last five games after hitting .283 with 89 runs (6.8 per game), 32 doubles, two triples and 31 home runs over the previous 13 contests...are tied for fourth in the American League in hit by pitches (28) and have the fourth fewest strikeouts (483)...have the third fewest stolen bases (22)...A's pinch hitters are 8-for-33 (.242) with two home runs, six RBI and six walks...rank second in the AL in pinch walks, third in home runs, tied for second in plate appearances (41), tied for fourth in hits, and tied for fifth in RBI...Oakland's number eight hitters are batting a combined .302 (68-for-225), which is the best mark in the majors...have the best OPS (.905) in the American League.

STARTING PITCHING: Mike Fiers takes the mound tonight, having allowed three or fewer runs in each of his last seven starts...he is 2-1 with a 2.82 ERA during that stretch, including a no-hitter on May 7 at home against Cincinnati...Brett Anderson took the loss Saturday night to snap an eight-game winning streak by A's starting pitchers...it was the first loss by an A's starter since May 14 (also Anderson)...starters went 0-1 with a 5.82 ERA (11 er in 17.0 ip) from May 28-June 1 after going 8-0 with a 2.73 ERA over the previous 11 contests...overall, starters are third in the American League in wins (23) and opponents batting average (.238), fourth in OPS (.720) and slugging percentage (.410), fifth in ERA (4.21) and innings pitched (327.1), and seventh in on-base percentage (.310)...have a 3.46 ERA (69 er in 179.2 ip) over the last 32 games dating back to April 28 after posting a 5.12 ERA over the first 29 contests...used an "opener" for the third time this year yesterday and lost...are 1-2 in games in those games this season after going 4-5 last year.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last six games to snap a season-high eight-game errorless streak...have made just 10 errors over the last 27 contests...have committed 31 errors for the season, which includes 11 by second basemen, seven by pitchers, and 13 by all other positions...have a .986 fielding percentage, which is fourth best in the American League...opponents have 43 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors to New York-NL (49).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's lost last night, snapping a season-high-tying four-game win streak...would be an eight-game winning streak if they win the suspended game from May 19...have lost each of the last five home games, which is their longest home losing streak of the season...went 4-5 on their nine-game homestand against Seattle (3-0), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Houston (0-3)...had not had a losing homestand since May 22-31, 2018 when they went 4-6 against Seattle, Arizona and Tampa Bay (excludes Tokyo)...have a record of 50-24 (.676) in Oakland dating back to June 16, 2018...are 18-15 (.545) at home this year compared to 12-16 (.429) on the road...went 6-2 on

the last road trip to Seattle (0-2), Detroit (3-0) and Cleveland (3-0) after going 1-8 on the previous trip to Toronto (0-3), Boston (0-3), and Pittsburgh (1-2)...continue a season-long 10-game road trip today to Los Angeles-AL (three games, 1-1), Texas (four games) and Tampa Bay (three games).

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .231 (255-for-1103) and are averaging 4.09 runs per game at home (135 runs in 33 games) compared to .263 with an average of 5.79 runs per game on the road...have compiled a 3.78 ERA (131 er in 312.0 ip) at home compared to 4.81 on the road...have the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 8-10 in one-run games and the 18 games are third most in the American League...are 14-17 in games decided by two runs or fewer and the 31 games are second most...are 2-6 in extra inning games...the losses are the most in the majors and the eight games are the most in the American League...allowed five runs in the 11th inning Wednesday and have surrendered a Major League leading 18 runs in extra innings (20.2 ip, 7.84 ERA)...allowed just eight runs in extra innings all last year (38.1 ip, 1.88 ERA)...are 4-11 in games decided in the last at bat...also lead the majors with six walk-off losses, which is one more than the A's season total from last year.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 5-6 in this stretch of 16 consecutive games against American League West competition that runs from May 24 to June 9...are now 13-16 (.448) in divisional play compared to 17-15 (.531) against all other teams...have a 4.75 ERA (140 er in 265.0 ip) against the West, 3.78 (126 er in 299.2) against everyone else.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 10 times this year...currently have five players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea) and all but Estrada are on the 60-day IL...Cotton began a rehab assignment May 17 but that was halted May 29 with a strained right hamstring...have had at least five players on the DL every day dating back to April 26, 2018.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 5-4...lost the last series at home 1-2 after winning three of four in the Coliseum in March...this is Oakland's first time visiting Angel Stadium this season...five of the Athletics' next 14 road games will be against the Angels...have seven more road games against Los Angeles-AL this season...lost the season series for the fifth consecutive year last season as they went 9-10 against the Angels...it is the Athletics (Kansas City and Oakland) longest season series losing streak against the Angels...went 5-5 at the Coliseum last year and 4-5 at Angel Stadium...are 36-49 (.424) against the Angels over the last six seasons...that breaks down to 27-27 in Oakland and 18-32 on the road...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 442-380 against the Angels...that includes 232-180 in at the Coliseum and 210-200 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 491-457 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ramón Laureano drew a walk in five plate appearances last night, extending his on-base streak to 24 games, which is the longest active streak in the Majors...is hitting .316 with a .359 on-base percentage, five home runs, and nine doubles during the streak...has raised his on-base percentage from .291 to .310...**Matt Chapman** has homered five times in the last 10 games and has 16 for the season, which is tied for seventh in the American League...leads the AL in home runs by a third baseman (16), home runs at home (12), and is tied for the lead in go-ahead home runs (8, Springer, HOU)...**Josh Phegley** leads all American League catchers with 33 RBI...**Marcus Semien** has committed just two errors and leads Major League shortstops with a .992 fielding percentage...snapped a career-high 42-game errorless streak on Sunday, which was tied for fourth longest in Athletics history by a shortstop.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1990** Rickey Henderson's collects his 1000th hit in Oakland uniform...he finished his career with the A's with an Oakland record 1640 hits...in **2003** the A's return to Philadelphia for the first time in 49 years as Oakland defeats the Philadelphia Phillies in interleague play, 7-4...Miguel Tejada collects four hits, including an Oakland record tying three doubles.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (4-3, 5.00 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his 14th start of the season, which will tie him for the most in the majors among non-openers...is 2-0 with a 2.48 ERA (9 er in 32.2 ip) and .139 (15-for-108) opponents batting average over his last five starts...that includes a start in the suspended game May 19 at Detroit, in which he is the pitcher of record with the A's leading 5-3 in the bottom of the seventh...went 2-1 with a 3.00 ERA and .189 opponents batting average over his first three starts and was 0-2 with a 9.41 ERA and .358 opponents batting average in five starts in between (April 7-May 1).

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 2-1 with a 2.87 ERA and .161 opponents batting average in six starts in May after going 1-1 with a 7.83 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in five starts in April...had the second lowest opponents batting average in the American League in May (Verlander, HOU .124)...his April ERA was his highest in a month of 10 or more innings (previous: 7.44 in Aug. 2017)...it was second highest in the majors this year among pitchers with 20 or more innings in April (Nova, CWS 8.42)...is now 5-9 with a 5.68 ERA in 25 career appearances in April...is 45-35 with a 3.53 ERA (271 er in 690.2 ip) from May through August.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .230 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .194 (26-for-134) against right-handed hitters compared to .270 (33-for-122) against left-handers...has held the opposition to a .182 (14-for-77) average with two outs...has walked just three batters to lead off an inning.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA (16 er in 41.2 ip) and .187 (28-for-150) opponents batting average in seven starts at night compared to 2-2 with a 6.75 ERA (21 er in 28.0 ip) and .292 (31-for-106) opponents average in six starts during the day.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 3-2 with a 3.81 ERA (22 er in 52.0 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-1 with a 7.64 ERA (15 er in 17.2 ip) in four starts on four days rest.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-2 with a 3.60 ERA (16 er in 40.0 ip) and .196 (28-for-143) opponents batting average in seven starts at home compared to 0-1 with a 6.37 ERA (21 er in 29.2 ip) and .274 (31-for-113) opponents average in six starts on the road...is tied for third in the American League in home wins...is now 8-3 with a 3.41 ERA (38 er in 100.1 ip) in 18 career appearances, 16 starts, in the Coliseum.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 2-1 with a 6.21 ERA (23 er in 33.1 ip) in seven starts against American League West competition compared to 2-2 with a 3.47 ERA (14 er in 36.1 ip) in six starts against all other teams...is now 11-14 with a 5.60 ERA (147 er in 236.1 ip) in 45 career appearances against the AL West, 47-44 with a 3.61 ERA (293 er in 731.1 ip) in 140 games against all other teams.

NO-HITTER: Tossed his second career no-hitter May 7 in Oakland against Cincinnati to become the 34th pitcher in Major League history with multiple regular season no-hitters...is the seventh with a no-hitter for multiple teams (Ted Breitenstein, Jim Bunning, Randy Johnson, Hideo Nomo, Nolan Ryan, Cy Young)...was named American League Co-Player of the Week with George Springer May 13...it was his second career Player of the Week honor with the first coming Aug. 23, 2015 following his first no-hitter...this no-hitter was the 13th in Athletics history, including the eighth in Oakland history...it was the first since Sean Manaea last year on April 21...his other no-hitter also came in interleague play on Aug. 21, 2015 for Houston against Los Angeles (NL) and he has each of the last two out of six total interleague no-hitters...tossed 131 pitches, which were the most in a no-hitter since he threw 134 in his against the Dodgers...now has two career complete games, both no-hitters...according to Stats, Inc., he is the first pitcher in ML history to have each of his first two career complete games be no-hitters...also according to Stats, his 6.81 ERA entering the game was the highest by any pitcher entering a start in which he threw a no-hitter (min. 25.0 ip).

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starter against Seattle on March 20 in Tokyo and was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-7 loss...it was his first career Opening Day start and he became the A's 12th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 14 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice)...put together wins in back-to-back starts on March 28 against Los Angeles and April 2 against Boston...did not allow a run in either outing, marking the second time in his career he had back-to-back starts without yielding a run...the other time was June 20-30, 2012 when he did it in three straight starts...combined with Trivino, Soria and Treinen on a three-hit shutout in a 4-0 win over the Angels...allowed just one hit in six innings, a one-out double by La Stella in the fifth...then combined with Buchter, Trivino and Treinen on a seven-hit shutout in a 1-0 win over the Red Sox...allowed five hits in six innings and did not walk a batter...that gave him a 2-1 record, a 3.00 ERA and a .189 opponents batting average over his first three starts...then allowed a season-high six runs in three consecutive starts from April 7-20 and went 0-1 with a 16.20 ERA

and .442 opponents batting average...began that streak by tossing just 1.2 innings in a no decision at Houston April 7, matching the shortest start of his career (June 2, 2013 at Philadelphia)...walked a season-high four...struck out a season-high six batters April 12 at Texas...yielded a season-high nine hits in just 3.1 innings in a 10-1 loss to Toronto on April 20...it was his first loss in the Coliseum since July 18, 2016 while pitching for Houston, snapping a six-game Coliseum winning streak...tossed his second career no-hitter in the A's 2-0 win May 7 in Oakland against Cincinnati...walked two and struck out a season-high tying six...also tossed a season-high 131 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher since Mark Mulder had 132 in a three-hit shutout against Toronto on May 2, 2001...retired the first 11 before Winker reached base on an error with two outs in the fourth...set down the next seven before walking Suarez to start the seventh...Suarez was erased on a double play, Puig walked and Fiers then retired the final seven batters to complete the no-hitter...had his hitless streak and scoreless streak broken up by the first batter in his next start May 13 at Seattle as Haniger homered to lead off the bottom of the first...however, that was the only run he would allow in five innings of work and he would yield just one more hit...left with a 2-1 lead and Oakland built a 4-1 lead before Trivino allowed three runs in the eighth for the blown save...was the starting pitcher in the A's game at Detroit on May 19, which was suspended in the bottom of the seventh inning with the A's leading 5-3...is the pitcher of record.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss to Houston last Friday in Oakland...blanked the Astros on three hits and two walks and had a 2-0 lead entering the seventh...allowed a solo home run to Reddick and walked White with two outs...was relieved by Trivino who allowed a Kemp RBI double for the blown save...it was the second time the bullpen blew a save in a Fiers start (May 13 at Seattle, also Trivino).

FIERS vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 4-4 with a 5.25 ERA (61.2 ip, 62 h, 37 r, 36 er, 19 bb, 46 so, 12 hr) in 11 career appearances, 10 starts...is 1-3 with a 10.72 ERA (27 er in 22.2 ip) in five games in Angel Stadium and 3-1 with a 2.45 ERA (9 er in 39.0 ip) in six starts in his home ballparks...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year on March 28 in Oakland when he combined with Trivino, Soria and Treinen on a three-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win...tossed six of the innings and allowed just one hit while walking three...the hit was a one-out double by La Stella in the fifth...allowed only one base runner as far as third base...was 0-1 with a 7.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 14 h, 7 r, 7 er, 1 bb, 7 so, 2 hr) in two games, including one start, last year.
