## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (31-31) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (32-28)

FRIDAY, JUNE 7, 2019 — GLOBE LIFE PARK — 7:05 P.M. PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's won last night and are 2-1 over their last three games after losing five straight, which followed an 11-game unbeaten streak (10 wins and a suspended game)...are now 31-31 overall and are in third place in the American League West, 11 games behind Houston...the games behind are a season high...are two games behind Texas and Boston for the second AL Wild Card spot...Tampa Bay is 5.0 games ahead of Texas and Boston for the first Wild Card spot...started the season 10-8, went 5-13 over an 18-game stretch from April 14 to May 5 and are 16-10 (.615) since then...the mark since May 6 is fourth best in the AL...have spent eight days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 22 days in third, five days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 13-5 (.722) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 18-26 (.409) against right-handers...are batting .279 with an .849 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .237 with a .723 OPS against right-handers...have the second best batting average and third best OPS against lefties in the AL, and rank tied for third in the majors (first in the AL) in home runs off lefties (29)...have the fifth lowest batting average against righties in the AL.

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have just one home run over the last two games...snapped a season-high streak of 13 consecutive games with a home run on Wednesday night...had 29 home runs over that span (have not homered in the May 19 suspended game but homered in each of the previous three games before that)...have 44 home runs over the last 21 games and 95 for the season, which is fifth most in the American League...their 38 home runs since May 16 are second most in the Majors (MIN, 41).

**OFFENSE:** The A's have gone 53-for-216 (.245) with 27 runs, 11 doubles, and eight home runs over their last six games after hitting .283 with 89 runs (6.8 per game), 32 doubles, two triples and 31 home runs over the previous 13 contests...are tied for fourth in the American League in hit by pitches (28) and have the fourth fewest strikeouts (493)...have the third fewest stolen bases (22)...A's pinch hitters are 8-for-33 (.242) with two home runs, six RBI and six walks...rank second in the AL in pinch walks, third in home runs, tied for second in plate appearances (41), tied for fourth in hits, and tied for sixth in RBI...Oakland's number eight hitters are batting a combined .303 (69-for-228), which is the best mark in the majors...have the second best OPS (.905) in the American League (MIN, .916).

**STARTING PITCHING:** Brett Anderson takes the mound tonight, having given up just five total runs over his last three starts...he is 2-1 with a 2.65 ERA, seven strikeouts, and six walks during that stretch...took the loss Saturday night to snap an eight-game winning streak by A's starting pitchers...it was the first loss by an A's starter since May 14 (also Anderson)...starters went 0-1 with a 5.82 ERA (11 er in 17.0 ip) from May 28-June 1 after going 8-0 with a 2.73 ERA over the previous 11 contests...overall, starters are third in the American League in wins (24), fifth in opponents batting average (.239), fourth in OPS (.721) and slugging percentage (.411), fifth in ERA (4.21) and innings pitched (333.1), and sixth in on-base percentage (.310)...have a 3.49 ERA (72 er in 185.2 ip) over the last 34 games dating back to April 28 after posting a 5.12 ERA over the first 29 contests...used an "opener" for the third time this year on Wednesday and lost...are 1-2 in games in those games this season after going 4-5 last year.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have made just 10 errors over the last 28 contests...have committed 31 errors for the season, which includes 11 by second basemen, seven by pitchers, and 13 by all other positions...have a .987 fielding percentage, which is fourth best in the American League...opponents have 44 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors to New York-NL (49)...Matt Chapman leads Major League third basemen in total chances (204) and putouts (77), and ranks third in assists (122).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's won last night, taking the three-game series at Los Angeles-AL, 2-1...lost Wednesday night, snapping a season-high-tying four-game win streak...would be an eight-game winning streak if they win the suspended game from May 19...have lost each of the last five home games, which is their longest home losing streak of the season...went 4-5 on their nine-game homestand against Seattle (3-0), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Houston (0-3)...had not had a losing homestand since May 22-31, 2018 when they went 4-6 against Seattle, Arizona and Tampa Bay (excludes Tokyo)...have a record of 50-24 (.676) in Oakland dating back to June 16, 2018...are 18-15 (.545) at home this year compared to 13-16 (.448) on the road...went 6-2

on the last road trip to Seattle (0-2), Detroit (3-0) and Cleveland (3-0) after going 1-8 on the previous trip to Toronto (0-3), Boston (0-3), and Pittsburgh (1-2)...continue a season-long 10-game road trip today to Los Angeles-AL (2-1), Texas (four games) and Tampa Bay (three games).

**HOME AND AWAY SPLITS:** The A's are batting .231 (255-for-1103) and are averaging 4.09 runs per game at home (135 runs in 33 games) compared to .263 with an average of 5.83 runs per game on the road...have compiled a 3.78 ERA (131 er in 312.0 ip) at home compared to 4.78 on the road...have the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League.

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 8-10 in one-run games and the 18 games are third most in the American League...are 14-17 in games decided by two runs or fewer and the 31 games are second most...are 2-6 in extra inning games...the losses are the most in the majors and the eight games are the most in the American League...allowed five runs in the 11th inning Wednesday and have surrendered a Major League leading 18 runs in extra innings (20.2 ip, 7.84 ERA)...allowed just eight runs in extra innings all last year (38.1 ip, 1.88 ERA)...are 4-11 in games decided in the last at bat...also lead the majors with six walk-off losses, which is one more than the A's season total from last year.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are 6-6 in this stretch of 16 consecutive games against American League West competition that runs from May 24 to June 9...are now 14-16 (.467) in divisional play compared to 17-15 (.531) against all other teams...have a 4.73 ERA (144 er in 274.0 ip) against the West, 3.78 (126 er in 299.2) against everyone else.

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have used the injured list 10 times this year...currently have five players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea) and all but Estrada are on the 60-day IL...Cotton began a rehab assignment May 17 but that was halted May 29 with a strained right hamstring...have had at least five players on the DL every day dating back to April 26, 2018.

**A's vs. RANGERS:** The A's lead the season series, 4-1...swept a three-game set in Oakland after splitting a rain-shortened two-game series in Arlington earlier this month...have won 13 of their last 15 games against the Rangers dating back to July 23 of last year and have outscored Texas 119-66 over that span...are hitting .305 (162-for-532) with 31 home runs and are averaging 7.9 runs per game in those 15 games...won the season series last year 13-6 and have won each of the previous two season series...the 13 wins matched the A's second most against the Rangers (15 in 2003)...went 7-3 in Oakland and 6-3 in Texas...have won 25 of the last 33 games, including 18 of the 21 in the Coliseum and four of the last five in Globe Life Park...are 369-368 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 196-173 in Oakland and 173-195 in Texas...are 106-107 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 466-450 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Ramón Laureano** went 1-for-4 last night, extending his on-base streak to 25 games, which is the longest active streak in the Majors...is hitting .313 with a .352 on-base percentage, five home runs, and nine doubles during the streak...**Matt Chapman** has homered five times in the last 11 games and has 16 for the season, which is tied for seventh in the American League...leads the AL in home runs by a third baseman (16), and is tied for the lead in go-ahead home runs (8, Springer, HOU) and home runs at home (12, Trout, LAA)...**Josh Phegley** leads all American League catchers with 34 RBI...**Marcus Semien** has committed just two errors and leads Major League shortstops with a .992 fielding percentage...snapped a career-high 42-game errorless streak on Sunday, which was tied for fourth longest in Athletics history by a shortstop.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1994** Rickey Henderson steals second base against Milwaukee for the 1100th steal of his career...in **2001** the A's set an Oakland record when they are hit by a pitch five times in a 6-4 loss to Anaheim...Frank Menechino is hit by a pitch twice...in **2008** Carlos Gonzalez doubles twice against Los Angeles, giving him seven career hits, all doubles...he is the first player in major league history to produce extra base hits for each of his first seven hits since Johnny Mize in 1936.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brett Anderson (6-4, 3.95 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Went 3-0 with a 2.63 ERA and .222 opponents batting average over his first four starts, 1-3 with a 6.12 ERA and .287 opponents average over his next five starts from April 21 to May 14 and is 2-1 with a 2.65 ERA (5 er in 17.0 ip) and .254 (16-for-63) opponents average in three starts since then...has six wins overall, which is tied for 10th in the American League...combined for seven wins over his previous three seasons and has his most wins since going 10-9 for the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2015.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 4-2 with a 3.27 ERA (15 er in 41.1 ip) and .229 (36-for-157) opponents batting average in seven starts at night, 2-2 with a 5.11 ERA (14 er in 24.2 ip) and .299 (29-for-97) opponents average in five starts during the day...is tied for ninth in the American League in wins at night.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 2-2 with a 3.03 ERA (10 er in 29.2 ip) and .204 (22-for-108) opponents batting average in five starts against American League West competition compared to 4-2 with a 4.71 ERA (19 er in 36.1 ip) and .294 (43-for-146) opponents average in seven starts against all other teams...is now 16-17 with a 3.48 ERA (114 er in 295.0 ip) in his career against the West, 36-39 with a 4.33 ERA (288 er in 599.0 ip) against all other teams.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received three runs of support or fewer in each of his last four starts but his season run support average of 6.95 (51 rs in 66.0 ip) is seventh highest in the American League.

**STRIKEOUTS:** Has struck out just 34 batters in 66.0 innings and his average of 4.64 strikeouts per nine innings is the lowest mark in the majors (Nova, CWS 5.43)...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.31 is second lowest (Keller, KC 1.29).

**2019 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was one of three inactive pitchers for the opening series in Japan...was slotted in as the A's third starter when the club returned home and made his first start March 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings to extend his home scoreless streak to an Oakland record 34.1 innings...broke the previous record of 33.0 set by Matt Keough (Sept. 5, 1979-April 16, 1980)...it is also the longest Athletics home scoreless streak since at least 1908...the streak ended in the first inning of his next start April 4 against Boston, marking the first time he allowed a run in the Coliseum since May 7, 2018...then tossed a season-high 6.2 innings and defeated the Orioles 13-2 at Baltimore on April 9 for his third win in his third start...the only other time in his career he won at least his first two starts in a season was in 2012 when he won his first four starts after missing the first 4½ months of the season following "Tommy John" surgery...was 3-0 with a 2.50 ERA over his first three starts through April 9...then went 0-2 with a 6.92 ERA over his next three starts through April 27...had his first no decision April 14 at Texas...allowed three runs in 6.0 innings and left with a 7-3 lead but the pen allowed a run in the seventh and four more in the eighth (Soria blown save)...was charged with his first loss of the season April 21 games Toronto when he lasted a season-low 2.2 innings following an ankle injury...it snapped a career-high tying four-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 19, 2018 (fourth time)...went 4-0 with a 3.50 ERA and .243 opponents average during the streak, which spanned seven starts...made his next scheduled start April 27 at Toronto but allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high 10 hits for his second consecutive loss...finished April 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA and .307 opponents batting average in five starts...then went 3-1 with a 3.34 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in five starts in May...snapped his two-game losing streak May 3 at Pittsburgh when he picked up his 50th career win in the A's 14-1 victory...walked a season-high five and had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 13-inning win over Cincinnati May 8 in Oakland...did not strike out a batter for the sixth time in his career as a starter...struck out a season-high five but also surrendered a career-high tying three home runs in a 4-3 loss at Seattle on May 14...left his start on May 20 at Cleveland after 5.1 innings with a cervical strain but did not miss a start...tossed a season-high 110 pitches in a 7-1 win over Seattle on May 26...the pitches were his most since June 26, 2015 at Miami (113).

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Houston last Saturday in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the second and he blanked the Astros on a hit and a walk over the first three innings before allowing a two-run home run to Reddick in the fourth...also yielded a RBI single to Bregman in the fourth

**ANDERSON vs. TEXAS:** Is 3-4 with a save and a 4.82 ERA (65.1 ip, 66 h, 40 r, 35 er, 28 bb, 55 so, 8 hr) in 14 games, including 11 starts...is 1-3 with a 5.80 ERA (23 er in 35.2 ip) in eight games at Globe Life Park and 2-1 with a 3.64 ERA (12 er in 29.2 ip) in six games in his home ballparks, all in the Coliseum...had a no decision in his only start this year, an 8-7 A's loss at Texas on April 14...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed two in the bottom of the first when Andrus had a RBI triple and later stole home...did not allow a hit over the next three innings and had a 7-2 lead when he allowed a RBI ground out to Pence in the fifth...left after six innings with a 7-3 lead but the pen allowed a run in the seventh and four more in the eighth (Soria blown save)...was 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA (13.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in two starts last year.

**2018 RECAP:** Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract March 19 and began the season at Triple-A Nashville before he was selected on May 2...went 4-5 with a 4.48 ERA in 17 starts with Oakland in a season that was interrupted by two stints on the disabled list...was out from May 19 to July 7 with a strained left shoulder and Aug. 28 to Sept. 12 with a strained left forearm...walked just 13 batters in 80.1 innings for an average of 1.46 walks per nine innings...that was a career low and was second lowest in the American League among pitchers with 80 or more innings pitched (Kluber, CLE 1.46)...struck out just 47 but his 3.62 strikeout-to-walk ratio was a career high...his starts and innings pitched were his most since 2015 when he made 31 starts and tossed 180.1 innings with the Dodgers...had a 1-2 record, a 6.08 ERA and .356 opponents batting average in six starts at the All-Star Break last year...then went 3-3 with a 3.81 ERA and .251 opponents average in 11 starts after the break...issued eight free passes in 23.2 innings before the break (3.04 per nine innings) and then walked just five batters in 56.2 innings after the break (0.79 per nine innings)...has a 25-34 career record before the break, 27-22 after the break...allowed a .285 opponents batting average, including .257 (18-for-70) against left-handed hitters compared to .293 (72-for-246) against right-handers...surrendered nine of his 10 home runs to righties...yielded a .333 batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .280 when leading off an inning but he walked just three...went 2-1 with a 2.78 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in seven starts with Triple-A Nashville...did not allow a home run in 32.1 innings...struck out 36 (10.02 per nine innings) and walked just six (1.67 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.0...his opponents batting average included a .223 (21-for-94) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .314 (11-for-35) against left-handers.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHERS

**RHP Paul Blackburn (0-0, --- ERA):** Will be making his first Major League appearance of the season...is 6-1 with a 4.55 ERA in 11 starts with Triple-A Las Vegas this season, including 45 strikeouts and 18 walks...went 2-3 with a 7.16 ERA in six starts with Oakland last season...has never faced Texas in his career...is 5-4 with a 4.48 ERA in 16 career Major League starts, all with Oakland.

**RHP Chris Bassitt (3-1, 3.27 ERA):** Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 17 and is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...picked up his third win of the season on May 27...had just four wins over his first four seasons (40 games, 30 starts)...went 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA over his first five starts this year but is 1-0 with a 6.75 ERA in three starts since then...has allowed three or fewer runs in all but one of his eight starts this season...has held the opposition to a .141 batting average with runners on base.

# ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

## TEAM

7-15, 4.27 ERA (114 er in 240.1 ip)  
Saves/Opportunities: 12-for-25 (48.0%)

- A's bullpen has converted six of last nine save opportunities over last 17 games since May 18 but has 4.54 ERA (34 er in 66.1 ip) over that span.
- However, is 12-for-25 (48.0%) in save opportunities for the season...the 13 blown saves are second most in the majors...the save percentage is second lowest in the majors and the saves are tied for third fewest.
- Is tied for the fourth fewest home runs allowed in MLB (26)...has the fourth fewest wins (7) and tied for the most losses (15).
- Has fifth highest on-base percentage against first batters faced (.326) but the third lowest slugging percentage (.325) among AL bullpens.

## 35 RHP AARON BROOKS
