ABOUT THE A'S: The A's won last night and are 3-1 over their last four games after losing five straight, which followed an 11-game unbeaten streak (10 wins and a suspended game)...are now 32-31 overall and are in third place in the American League West, 11 games behind Houston...the games behind are a season high...are one game behind Texas and Boston for the second AL Wild Card spot...Tampa Bay is 6.0 games ahead of Texas and Boston for the first Wild Card spot...started the season 10-8, went 5-13 over an 18-game stretch from April 14 to May 5 and are 17-10 (.630) since then...the mark since May 6 is fourth best in the AL...have spent eight days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 23 days in third, five days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 13-5 (.722) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 19-26 (.422) against right-handers...are batting .279 with an .849 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .237 with a .724 OPS against right-handers...have the second best batting average and third best OPS against lefties in the AL, and rank tied for fourth in the majors (tied for first in the AL) in home runs off lefties (29)...have the fifth lowest batting average against righties in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: Marcus Semien hit two home runs last night, giving the A's as a whole three over the last three games...snapped a season-high streak of 13 consecutive games with a home run on Wednesday night...had 29 home runs over that span (have not homered in the May 19 suspended game but homered in each of the previous three games before that)...have 46 home runs over the last 22 games and 97 for the season, which is fifth most in the American League...their 41 home runs since May 16 are second most in the Majors (MIN, 44).

OFFENSE: The A's have gone 63-for-254 (.248) with 32 runs, 13 doubles, and 10 home runs over their last seven games after hitting .283 with 89 runs (6.8 per game), 32 doubles, two triples and 31 home runs over the previous 13 contests...are tied for fourth in the American League in hit by pitches (28) and have the fourth fewest strikeouts (503)...have the third fewest stolen bases (22)...A's pinch hitters are 8-for-33 (.242) with two home runs, six RBI and six walks...rank second in the AL in pinch walks, third in home runs, tied for second in plate appearances (41), tied for fourth in hits, and tied for sixth in RBI...Oakland's number eight hitters are batting a combined .302 (70-for-232), which is the best mark in the majors...have the best OPS (.902) in the American League.

STARTING PITCHING: Paul Blackburn will make his first Major League start of 2019 this afternoon, followed by Chriss Bassitt making his ninth start of the year this evening...Brett Anderson took the loss Saturday night to snap an eight-game winning streak by A's starting pitchers...it was the first loss by an A's starter since May 14 (also Anderson)...starters went 0-1 with a 5.82 ERA (11 er in 17.0 ip) from May 28-June 1 after going 8-0 with a 2.73 ERA over the previous 11 contests...overall, starters are third in the American League in wins (24), sixth in opponents batting average (.241), fourth in OPS (.722) and slugging percentage (.412), fifth in ERA (4.21) and innings pitched (339.2), and sixth in on-base percentage (.310)...have a 3.52 ERA (75 er in 192.0 ip) over the last 35 games dating back to April 28 after posting a 5.12 ERA over the first 29 contests...used an "opener" for the third time this year on Wednesday and lost...are 1-2 in games in those games this season after going 4-5 last year.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have made just 12 errors over the last 29 contests...have committed 33 errors for the season, which includes 11 by second basemen, eight by pitchers, and 14 by all other positions...have a .986 fielding percentage, which is fourth best in the American League...opponents have 44 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors to New York-NL (50)...Matt Chapman leads Major League third basemen in total chances (207) and putouts (77), and ranks third in assists (125).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's won last night, taking the first game of a four-game set in Texas...lost Wednesday night, snapping a season-high-tying four-game win streak...would be an eight-game winning streak if they win the suspended game from May 19...have lost each of the last five home games, which is their longest home losing streak of the season...went 4-5 on their nine-game homestand against Seattle (3-0), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Houston (0-3)...had not had a losing homestand since May 22-31, 2018 when they went 4-6 against Seattle, Arizona and Tampa Bay (excludes Tokyo)...have a record of 50-24 (.676) in Oakland dating back to June 16, 2018...

are 18-15 (.545) at home this year compared to 14-16 (.467) on the road...went 6-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (0-2), Detroit (3-0) and Cleveland (3-0) after going 1-8 on the previous trip to Toronto (0-3), Boston (0-3), and Pittsburgh (1-2)...continue a season-long 10-game road trip today to Los Angeles-AL (2-1), Texas (four games, 1-0) and Tampa Bay (three games).

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .231 (255-for-1103) and are averaging 4.09 runs per game at home (135 runs in 33 games) compared to .263 with an average of 5.81 runs per game on the road...have compiled a 3.78 ERA (131 er in 312.0 ip) at home compared to 4.72 on the road...have the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 8-10 in one-run games and the 18 games are tied for third most in the American League...are 15-17 in games decided by two runs or fewer and the 32 games are second most...are 2-6 in extra inning games...the losses are the most in the majors and the eight games are the most in the American League...allowed five runs in the 11th inning Wednesday and have surrendered a Major League leading 18 runs in extra innings (20.2 ip, 7.84 ERA)...allowed just eight runs in extra innings all last year (38.1 ip, 1.88 ERA)...are 4-11 in games decided in the last at bat...also lead the majors with six walk-off losses, which is one more than the A's season total from last year.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 7-6 in this stretch of 16 consecutive games against American League West competition that runs from May 24 to June 9...are now 15-16 (.484) in divisional play compared to 17-15 (.531) against all other teams...have a 4.67 ERA (147 er in 283.0 ip) against the West, 3.78 (126 er in 299.2) against everyone else.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 10 times this year...currently have five players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea) and all but Estrada are on the 60-day IL...Cotton began a rehab assignment May 17 but that was halted May 29 with a strained right hamstring...have had at least five players on the DL every day dating back to April 26, 2018.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 5-1...swept a three-game set in Oakland after splitting a rain-shortened two-game series in Arlington earlier this month...have won 14 of their last 16 games against the Rangers dating back to July 23 of last year and have outscored Texas 124-69 over that span...are hitting .302 (172-for-569) with 33 home runs and are averaging 7.8 runs per game in those 16 games...won the season series last year 13-6 and have won each of the previous two season series...the 13 wins matched the A's second most against the Rangers (15 in 2003)...went 7-3 in Oakland and 6-3 in Texas...have won 26 of the last 34 games, including 18 of the 21 in the Coliseum and five of the last six in Globe Life Park...are 370-368 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 196-173 in Oakland and 174-195 in Texas...are 107-107 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 467-450 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ramón Laureano entered the game last night as a defensive replacement and did not record a plate appearance, maintaining his on-base streak of 25 games, which is the longest active streak in the Majors...is hitting .313 with a .352 on-base percentage, five home runs, and nine doubles during the streak...**Marcus Semien** homered twice and drove in four runs last night...is now 8-for-14 (.571) with seven RBI and a walk over his last three games...has a .600 on-base percentage during that stretch...the three-game outburst has improved his batting average on the season from .252 to .270 and his on-base percentage from .343 to .356...**Josh Phegley** leads all Major League catchers with 34 RBI.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1933** Jimmie Foxx homers in his first three at bats in the A's 14-10 win over New York...he had homered in his last at bat the day before to give him four consecutive home runs...in **1965** Rick Monday is chosen by the Kansas City A's as the first player ever taken in baseball's free agent draft...in **1975** Ken Holtzman one-hits the Detroit Tigers in the A's 4-0 win...**Claudell Washington** homers twice and drives in all four Oakland runs...in **2008** Mark Ellis hits the fifth walk-off grand slam in Oakland history to lift the A's to a 7-3 win over Los Angeles in 12 innings.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (0-0, -- ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas today to serve as the 26th man for today's double header...will his first time appearing in a game at the Major League level in 2019...last appeared in a Major League game on July 6, 2019 at Cleveland...gave up six runs in 4.0 innings pitched...has never faced the Rangers in his career...is 2-3 with a 3.63 ERA in eight starts (44.2 innings pitched) on the road in his Major League career.

2019 WITH LAS VEGAS: Has made 11 appearances for Triple-A Las Vegas, all starts...is 6-1 with a 4.55 ERA in those 11 starts, spanning 57.1 innings pitched...has tallied 45 strikeouts and 18 walks, along with a .241 batting average against...threw seven scoreless, one-hit innings on May 23 against Albuquerque...has allowed 10 earned runs in two starts since then spanning 10.1 innings pitched...is 2-1 with a 3.67 ERA in five home starts...is 2-0 with a 4.09 ERA in two day starts...went 2-0 with a 3.49 ERA in five starts in the month of May.

2018 WITH OAKLAND: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 victory over Kansas City June 7 in Oakland...allowed a lead-off home run to Escobar in the third inning but that was the only run he would allow in six innings of work...retired 11 of the final 12 batters he faced following the home run...was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-5 loss to Houston June 13 in Oakland...allowed a career-high eight runs in a career-low 1.1 innings...yielded three runs in the first inning on a two-run single by Gurriel and a sacrifice fly by Gattis...then surrendered five of the Astros seven runs in the second...Correa had a two-run triple and Gurriel a RBI single and he was relieved by Pagán with runners on first and second and one out...Pagan surrendered back-to-back home runs...had a no decision in the A's 4-2, 10-inning win at San Diego June 19...allowed a run to score on a fielders choice in the first but Oakland came back to tie the game with a run in the second...allowed a RBI double to Lopez in the bottom of the second but those were the only runs he would allow in five innings of work...the A's tied the game in the ninth before scoring twice in the 10th for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-3 loss at Chicago (AL) on June 24...blanked the White Sox on one hit over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed five runs in the fifth inning, all with two outs...Moncada had a three-run double and Garcia and Abreu followed with RBI singles...then allowed a leadoff home run to Palka in the sixth and was relieved by Hendriks...was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win over Cleveland on June 29 in Oakland...tossed 6.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits while walking one and hitting a batter...retired each of the final eight batters he faced and 14 of the last 15...was relieved by Buchter with one out in the seventh inning and the A's leading 2-0...Suffered the loss in his final start of 2018 on July 6...gave up six runs, five earned, in 4.0 innings pitched at Cleveland, including three strikeouts and one walk.

2017 RECAP: Made both his Triple-A and Major League debuts in 2017...spent the first three months of the season at Nashville where he went 5-6 with a 3.05 ERA in 15 games, including 14 starts...was promoted to Oakland July 1 and compiled a 3-1 record and a 3.22 ERA in 10 starts before a right hand contusion ended his season Aug. 23...struck out just 22 batters in 58.2 innings with the A's, an average of 3.38 per nine innings...that was the lowest mark in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...it was second lowest by an A's pitcher over the last 27 years (Saarloos, 2.99 in 2005)...went 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA and .212 opponents batting average over his first five starts through July 26...then went 2-0 despite a 4.39 ERA and .315 opponents average over his final five starts...allowed a .262 opponents batting average, including .225 (23-for-102) against left-handed hitters compared to .294 (35-for-119) against right-handers...yielded four of his five home runs to righties but issued 11 of his 16 walks to lefties...had a .585 OPS against lefties, .773 against righties...was 2-1 with a 1.47 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in five starts on the road compared to 1-0 with a 5.14 ERA and .301 opponents average in five starts at home...logged a 1.50 ERA over the first three innings of a game, a 5.02 ERA from the fourth inning on...opponents hit .133 with runners in scoring position and two outs...had a .212 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .294 after that...

was 3-0 with a 2.84 ERA in five starts on four days rest, 0-1 with a 3.67 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...allowed one run or fewer in five of his 10 starts and four runs or more four times...the A's were 6-4 (.600) in his starting assignments.

2017 WITH OAKLAND: Made his Major League debut July 1 against Atlanta and had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss...allowed just one unearned run in 6.0 innings of work and retired 14 of the final 16 batters he faced...tossed a career-high 7.2 innings and allowed one run in the A's 7-4 victory at Seattle July 6 to earn his first ML win...walked one batter in each outing to become the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 to toss six or more innings, allow one run or fewer and walk one batter or fewer in each of his first two games...is the eighth Major Leaguer to do it...was charged with his first loss in a 7-5 decision at New York (NL) July 21...tossed seven scoreless innings and allowed just two hits July 26 at Toronto but had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss...left after seven innings with a 2-0 lead but Casilla allowed three runs in the ninth for the blown save and loss...combined with Dull, Casilla and Treinen on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Los Angeles (AL) Aug. 5...tossed 6.2 innings and yielded five of the hits...did not walk a batter for the first time in his career...tossed 4.0 innings Aug. 16 against Kansas City to snap a career-opening streak of eight consecutive games of more than five innings pitched...that was the second longest such streak in Oakland history to Willie Adams, who had a 10-game streak in 1996...tossed 4.0 scoreless innings in his final start Aug. 22 at Baltimore and left the game early with a right hand contusion...was placed on the 10-day disabled list Aug. 25 retroactive to Aug. 23 and missed the remainder of the season...was transferred to the 60-day DL Sept. 5.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Frankie Montas (7-2, 2.83 ERA): Ranks sixth in the American League in ERA (2.83), tied for sixth in wins (7) and sixth in opponents slugging percentage (.361)...before allowing a two-run homer to Shohei Ohtani in his last outing, had not allowed a home run in eight consecutive starts, 48.0 innings and 208 batters faced...is averaging 0.56 home runs per nine innings, which is the fifth lowest mark in the AL...is 3-1 with a 2.63 ERA and .241 opponents batting average over his last seven starts...has 43 strikeouts in 41.0 innings over that span (9.44 per nine innings)...is 4-2 with a 2.36 ERA in seven starts on the road compared to 3-0 with a 3.54 ERA in five starts at home...ranks third in the AL in road ERA...earned the win in his last start at Los Angeles-AL (6.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, hr, bb, hbp, 3 so)...has faced Texas once this season, earning the win after allowing three earned runs on nine hits in 5.2 innings pitched (5.2 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 6 so).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: *Chris Bassitt (3-1, 3.27 ERA)*

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 17 and is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...took a no-decision in his last start...had just four wins over his first four seasons (40 games, 30 starts)...has three wins already this season...went 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA over his first five starts this year but is 1-0 with an 6.75 ERA (11 er in 14.2 ip) in three starts since then.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .207 opponents batting average...however, 19 of the 36 hits he has allowed have been for extra bases (10 doubles, one triple, eight home runs) and he has a .414 opponents slugging percentage...has held the opposition to a .141 (10-for-71) batting average with runners on base...opponents are 5-for-33 (.152) with runners in scoring position including 1-for-13 with RISP and two outs...held the opposition to a .205 average with RISP last year...opponents are batting .149 (14-for-94) with two strikes but five of the hits are home runs...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number seven hitter (0-for-19).

NIGHT AND DAY: Has picked up the win in each of his last two starts in a day game after starting his career 0-9 over his first 17 outings during the day...is 2-1 with a 3.21 ERA (12 er in 33.2 ip) in five starts during the day this year compared to 1-0 with a 3.95 ERA (6 er in 13.2 ip) in three starts at night.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed eight home runs, which is a new career high...six of the home runs have been hit by left-handed hitters, which is tied for eighth most in the American League...six have been solo shots.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received 36 runs of support over his first eight starts and his season run support average is 6.85 (36 rs in 47.1 ip)...last year, he received two runs of support or fewer in five of his seven starts and his RSA as a starter was 3.19...has received two runs of support or fewer in 28 of his 38 career starts.

PRE AND POST "TOMMY JOHN": Is 5-4 with a 3.22 ERA (34 er in 95.0 ip) and .214 (76-for-355) opponents batting average in 19 games (15 starts) since undergoing "Tommy John" surgery May 6, 2016...is averaging 8.43 strikeouts per nine innings (89 so in 95.0 ip)...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA, .263 opponents batting average and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Made the trip to Japan but was one of three inactive players for the two-game series against the Mariners...was placed on the 10-day injured list March 27 retroactive to March 25 with a right lower leg contusion...went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA in three rehab starts with Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas April 16...was recalled by Oakland the next day when Marco Estrada went on the injured list...made his first start April 22 against Texas and tossed 5.0 scoreless innings for the win...struck out a season-high nine in his second start April 28 at Toronto (also May 9 against Cincinnati)...however, had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss in 11 innings...left his third start on May 4 at Pittsburgh after five innings with a 4-3 lead but Wendelken allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save and loss...allowed a season-high seven hits and took the loss on May 9 against Cincinnati to snap the first winning streak of his career, a three-game streak dating back to last year...went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 11 games (seven starts) dating back to June 27, 2018...the loss was his first since June 22, 2018 at Chicago (AL)...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings, did not allow a run, walked two and yielded four hits in a 17-3 win at Detroit on May 16...tossed a season-low 3.2 innings and walked a career-high six batters in a no decision at Cleveland May 21...is the first Major League pitcher since at least 1908 with a pitching line of 3.2 innings, three hits, three runs, three earned runs, six walks and six strikeouts.

LAST START: Took a no-decision on June 2 at home against Houston...allowed three earned runs on six hits and one walk with one strikeout in 6.0 inning pitched...the A's ultimately fell in extra innings, 6-4.
