OAKLAND ATHLETICS (32-33) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (34-29)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's lost both ends of yesterday's doubleheader and are 3-3 over their last six games after losing five straight, which followed an 11-game unbeaten streak (10 wins and a suspended game)...are now 32-33 overall and are in third place in the American League West, 11.5 games behind Houston...the games behind are a season high...are three games behind Texas for the second AL Wild Card spot...Tampa Bay and New York-AL are tied for the AL East division lead and are both 5.0 games ahead of Texas for the first wild card...started the season 10-8, went 5-13 over an 18-game stretch from April 14 to May 5 and are 17-12 (.586) since then...have spent eight days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 24 days in third, five days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 13-6 (.684) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 19-27 (.413) against right-handers...are batting .280 with an .854 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .235 with a .718 OPS against right-handers...have the second best batting average and OPS against lefties in the AL, and rank tied for third in the majors (tied for first in the AL) in home runs off lefties (31)...have the fifth lowest batting average against righties in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: The A's homered three times in the two games of yesterday's doubleheader, giving the team as a whole six over the last five games...snapped a season-high streak of 13 consecutive games with a home run on Wednesday night...had 29 home runs over that span (have not homered in the May 19 suspended game but homered in each of the previous three games before that)...have 49 home runs over the last 24 games and 100 for the season, which is fifth most in the American League...their 44 home runs since May 16 are second most in the Majors (MIN, 45).

OFFENSE: The A's have gone 76-for-319 (.238) with 38 runs, 16 doubles, and 13 home runs over their last nine games after hitting .283 with 89 runs (6.8 per game), 32 doubles, two triples and 31 home runs over the previous 13 contests...are tied for fourth in the American League in hit by pitches (29) and have the fourth fewest strikeouts (517)...have the third fewest stolen bases (22)...A's pinch hitters are 9-for-34 (.265) with two home runs, eight RBI and six walks...rank second in the AL in pinch walks, third in home runs, second in plate appearances (42), tied for third in hits, and third in RBI...Oakland's number eight hitters are batting a combined .297 (71-for-239), which is the best mark in the majors...have the second best OPS (.885) in the American League.

STARTING PITCHING: Frankie Montas will be making his 13th start of the season...has won three straight decisions...has not lost since April 19...gave up three runs on nine hits in 5.2 innings pitched against Texas earlier this season on April 29 at the coliseum...Brett Anderson took the loss Saturday night to snap an eight-game winning streak by A's starting pitchers...it was the first loss by an A's starter since May 14 (also Anderson)...starters went 0-1 with a 5.82 ERA (11 er in 17.0 ip) from May 28-June 1 after going 8-0 with a 2.73 ERA over the previous 11 contests...overall, starters are third in the American League in wins (24), sixth in opponents batting average (.242), fourth in OPS (.726) and slugging percentage (.413), sixth in ERA (4.31), fifth innings pitched (348.1), and seventh in on-base percentage (.313)...have a 3.72 ERA (83 er in 200.2 ip) over the last 37 games dating back to April 28 after posting a 5.12 ERA over the first 29 contests...used an "opener" for the third time this year on Wednesday and lost...are 1-2 in games in those games this season after going 4-5 last year.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have made just 14 errors over the last 31 contests...have committed 35 errors for the season, which includes 11 by second basemen, eight by pitchers, and 16 by all other positions...have a .985 fielding percentage, which is fifth best in the American League...opponents have 47 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors to New York-NL (52)...Matt Chapman leads Major League third basemen in total chances (209) and putouts (78), and ranks third in assists (126).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's lost both ends of yesterday's doubleheader, and are now 1-2 in this series against Texas...lost Wednesday night, snapping a season-high-tying four-game win streak...would be an eight-game winning streak if they win the suspended game from May 19...have lost each of the last five home games, which is their longest home losing streak of the season...went 4-5 on their nine-game homestand against Seattle (3-0), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Houston (0-3)...had not had a losing homestand since May

22-31, 2018 when they went 4-6 against Seattle, Arizona and Tampa Bay (excludes Tokyo)...have a record of 50-24 (.676) in Oakland dating back to June 16, 2018...are 18-15 (.545) at home this year compared to 14-18 (.438) on the road...went 6-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (0-2), Detroit (3-0) and Cleveland (3-0) after going 1-8 on the previous trip to Toronto (0-3), Boston (0-3), and Pittsburgh (1-2)...continue a season-long 10-game road trip today to Los Angeles-AL (2-1), Texas (four games, 1-2) and Tampa Bay (three games).

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .231 (255-for-1103) and are averaging 4.09 runs per game at home (135 runs in 33 games) compared to .259 with an average of 5.64 runs per game on the road...have compiled a 3.78 ERA (131 er in 312.0 ip) at home compared to 4.83 on the road...have the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 8-10 in one-run games and the 18 games are tied for third most in the American League...are 15-18 in games decided by two runs or fewer and the 33 games are second most in the American League...are 2-6 in extra inning games...the losses are the most in the majors and the eight games are the most in the American League...allowed five runs in the 11th inning Wednesday and have surrendered a Major League leading 18 runs in extra innings (20.2 ip, 7.84 ERA)...allowed just eight runs in extra innings all last year (38.1 ip, 1.88 ERA)...are 4-11 in games decided in the last at bat...also lead the majors with six walk-off losses, which is one more than the A's season total from last year.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 7-8 in this stretch of 16 consecutive games against American League West competition that runs from May 24 to June 9...are now 15-18 (.455) in divisional play compared to 17-15 (.531) against all other teams...have a 4.79 ERA (159 er in 299.0 ip) against the West, 3.78 (126 er in 299.2) against everyone else.

THE INJURED LIST: Nick Hundley was placed on the 10-day IL yesterday with back spasms...the A's have now used the injured list 11 times this year...currently have six players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Herrmann, Hundley, Manaea) and all but Estrada and Hundley are on the 60-day IL...Cotton began a rehab assignment May 17 but that was halted May 29 with a strained right hamstring...he has since had hamstring surgery...have had at least five players on the DL every day dating back to April 26, 2018.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 5-3...swept a three-game set in Oakland after splitting a rain-shortened two-game series in Arlington earlier this month...have won 14 of their last 18 games against the Rangers dating back to July 23 of last year and have outscored Texas 130-82 over that span...are hitting .292 (185-for-634) with 36 home runs and are averaging 7.22 runs per game in those 18 games...won the season series last year 13-6 and have won each of the previous two season series...the 13 wins matched the A's second most against the Rangers (15 in 2003)...went 7-3 in Oakland and 6-3 in Texas...have won 26 of the last 36 games, including 18 of the 21 in the Coliseum and five of the last eight in Globe Life Park...are 370-370 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 196-173 in Oakland and 174-197 in Texas...are 107-109 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 467-452 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ramón Laureano logged a hit in each game of yesterday's doubleheader, extending his on-base streak of 27 games, which is the longest active streak in the Majors...is hitting .311 with a .348 on-base percentage, five home runs, and nine doubles during the streak...**Marcus Semien** recorded hits in each game of yesterday's doubleheader and is now 11-for-22 (.500) with seven RBI and two walks over his last five games...has a .542 on-base percentage and a 1.360 OPS during that stretch...the five-game outburst has improved his batting average on the season from .252 to .273 and his on-base percentage from .343 to .359...**Josh Phegley** leads all Major League catchers with 35 RBI.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1973 Ken Holtzman tosses a two-hit shutout to improve to 11-3 in the A's 4-0 win over Detroit...in 1990 Dave Stewart tosses a four-hitter as the A's shutout Kansas City, 5-0...in 1991 Jim "Catfish" Hunter becomes the first player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor the Hall of Famer by retiring number 27.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (7-2, 2.83 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks sixth in the American League in ERA (2.83), seventh in opponents slugging percentage (.361), tied for sixth in wins (7) and 10th in OPS (.656)...is also tied for third in opponent grounded into double plays (10), tied for eighth in unearned runs (6) and ranks ninth in run support (6.69).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed one home run in his last nine starts, 54.0 innings and 231 batters faced...allowed four home runs over his first three starts with the last coming on April 10 at Baltimore (Ruiz)...is averaging 0.64 home runs per nine innings, which is the fifth lowest mark in the American League...three of the five home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...four have come on the road.

LAST SIX STARTS: Is 3-0 with a 2.70 ERA (11 er in 36.2 ip) and .221 (30-for-136) opponents batting average over his last six starts...has 39 strikeouts in 36.2 innings over that span (9.57 per nine innings)...the longest winning streak of his career is three games (twice, last: April 10-23, 2019).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-2 with a 2.36 ERA (11 er in 42.0 ip) in seven starts on the road compared to 3-0 with a 3.54 ERA (11 er in 28.0 ip) in five starts at home...ranks third in the American League in road ERA.

THIS AND THAT: Has career highs in wins (7), strikeouts (69), games started (12), and innings pitched (70.0)...the A's are 8-4 (.667) in his starting assignments and are 15-8 (.652) when he starts in his career...has allowed just one run in the first inning for a 0.82 ERA (12.0 ip)...opponents are hitting .122 (17-for-139) with two strikes...has yielded a .302 (19-for-63) average with runners in scoring position...has committed three errors, which is tied for the most among Major League pitchers and are the most by an A's pitcher since 2014 (Gray and Kazmir, 3 each).

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the Opening Day roster and was available in the bullpen for the two games against Seattle in Japan but did not pitch...was inserted into the fourth spot in the rotation when the season resumed and picked up the win in his first start March 31 against Los Angeles (AL)...took the loss in his second start on April 5 at Houston...then went 3-0 with a 3.50 ERA and .224 opponents average over this next three starts from April 10 to 23 to match the longest wining streak of his career (also May 27-June 8, 2018)...the first win came on April 10 at Baltimore when he retired the first 12 batters he faced...surrendered two home runs in the game, giving him four in his first three starts...has allowed one home run since then...allowed a run on three hits in 6.2 innings for the win in a 2-1 decision over Houston on April 17...did not allow a hit until Gurriel singled with one out in the fifth...allowed a season-high nine hits but extended his winning streak to three games in an 11-5 win over Texas April 23...had his three-game winning streak snapped April 29 at Boston when he allowed a season-high seven runs in 4.1 innings...only one of the runs was earned and the six unearned runs tied for second most in Oakland history...they were the most since Brett Anderson also had six on May 15, 2009 vs. Detroit...finished April with a 3-2 record and a 3.29 ERA in five starts...tied for fifth in the American League in wins...then went 2-0 with a 2.64 ERA in five starts in May...tied for ninth in the AL in May ERA...left his start on May 10 against Cleveland with a 3-2 lead but Trivino blew the save in a game the A's would win 4-3 in 12 innings...had career highs in strikeouts (10), innings pitched (8.2) and pitches (109) in a 7-2 win at Detroit on May 17...did not walk a batter, which marked the 27th time in Oakland history a pitcher struck out 10 or more and did not issue a walk...it was the first since Jeff Samardzija on Sept. 17, 2014 vs. Texas (10 so). had a no decision in the A's 6-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) a week ago today in Oakland...walked a career-high five batters in a season-low 4.0 innings.

LAST START: Earned the win against Los Angeles-AL at Angel Stadium...threw 6.0 innings, allowing just four hits, two earned runs, one walk, and one hit batsman...allowed his first home run since April 10, snapping an eight-game homerless streak.

MONTAS vs. TEXAS: Is 0-0 with a 2.89 ERA (9.1 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 3 er, 5 bb, 8 so, 1 hr) in four career appearances, including one start...the start came in his only appearance last year, a no decision in the A's 13-10 win in 10 innings at Texas on July 24...allowed two runs in the first inning on an error and a Beltre sacrifice fly...Oakland came back with single runs in the third and fourth innings to tie the game at 2-2 but he allowed two runs in the fifth inning on a Calhoun home run and an Andrus sacrifice fly...left after five innings trailing 4-2...his other three appearances came in relief in 2017...pitched in Texas on April 9 (1.2 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 1 so), Oakland on April 17 (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so) and Texas on May 13 (0.2 ip, 2 h, 2 so).

2018 RECAP: Went 5-4 with a 3.88 ERA in 13 games, including 11 starts, over four stints with Oakland...was 5-2 with a 3.35 ERA in eight starts during his first stint from May 27 to July 9 and 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five games over his final three stints...surrendered just five home runs in 65.0 innings after yielding 10 home runs in 32.0 innings in 2017...struck out 43 batters (5.95 per nine innings) after fanning 56 in 47.0 innings (10.72 per nine innings) over his first two seasons...allowed a .290 opponents batting average, including .276 (35-for-127) against right-handed hitters compared to .305 (39-for-128) against left-handers...yielded 20 of his 28 extra base hits to lefties and had a .378 slugging percentage against righties compared to .523 against lefties...also went 4-5 with a 4.65 ERA in 15 games, all starts, with Triple-A Nashville...had a .255 opponents batting average, including .189 (18-for-95) against left-handed hitters compared to .290 (51-for-176) against right-handers.

RHP Tanner Anderson (0-0, -,-):	Returns to big league action for the first time since Sept. 20, 2018 with Pittsburgh...is 1-0 with a 6.35 ERA in six Major League appearances...will be making his first start in the Majors...gave up five earned runs in his Major League debut, then allowed one earned run or fewer in each of his next five outings...is 4-4 with a 6.26 ERA in 11 games with Triple-A Las Vegas this season spanning 54.2 innings of work...10 of those 11 outings are starts...has 37 strikeouts and 26 walks...has given up 14 home runs and a .297 batting average...was acquired via trade from Pittsburgh on Nov. 20, 2018 for a player to be named later or cash...after graduating from Harvard in 2015, Anderson was selected in the 20th round of that year's First Year Player Draft by Pittsburgh...in four career minor league seasons with PIT, he went 21-13 with a 3.24 ERA, 221 strikeouts, 72 walks, 10 saves, and 311.1 innings pitched in 120 appearances, including 22 starts.

- Is tied for the fourth fewest home runs allowed in MLB (27)...also tied for the fourth fewest wins (7) and tied for the most losses (15).
- Has seventh highest on-base percentage against first batters faced (.321) but the third lowest slugging percentage (.316) among AL bullpens.

- Has allowed 42 hits, nearly half of which have been for extra bases (10 doubles, 10 home runs)...has a .263 opponents batting average and .513 slugging percentage.
- Has a 3.86 ERA (9 er in 21.0 ip) in five games at home, an 6.98 ERA (15 er in 19.1 ip) in five games on the road.
- Has a 3.38 ERA (3 ER, 8.0 IP) with 11 strikeouts in two outings in his career against the Rangers.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 29 for his second stint with the A's and has not allowed a run in 16 of 18 games since his return...has a 1.64 ERA (2 er in 11.0 ip) and .162 (6-for-37) opponents batting average over that span...logged a 7.04 ERA and .375 opponents average over his first 13 games before he was optioned to Las Vegas April 22.
- Is tied for first in the American League in games pitched (31).
- Has allowed a .159 (7-for-44) average against left-handed hitters, .440 (11-for-25) against right-handers.
- Is 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA (2 ER, 9.0 IP) with 13 strikeouts in 13 relief appearances against the Rangers in his career.

Last Year: Went 6-0 with a 2.75 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in 54 relief appearances in his first season with the A's...allowed just 2-of-30 (6.7%) inherited runners to score, which was the lowest percentage in the majors.
