## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (33-33) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (40-24)

MONDAY, JUNE 10, 2019 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 7:10 P.M. EDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Split a four-game series at Texas over the weekend and are now 4-3 over the last seven games after losing five in a row...are 33-33 overall, which marks the fifth time in the last nine days the A's have been exactly .500...have not been more than one one game over .500 or one game under .500 since May 29 (29-27)...are in third place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by a season-high 11½ games for the second consecutive day...are two games behind Texas for the second Wild Card...started the season 10-8, went 5-13 over an 18-game stretch from April 14 to May 5, were 14-4 from May 7 to 27 and are 4-8 since then...have spent eight days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 24 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have hit 51 home runs over the last 25 games dating back to May 13, which are second most in the majors over that span to Minnesota (54)...hit 51 home runs over the first 37 contests and have 102 for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...it is also the most in Athletics history after 67 games...the previous high was 100 in 2000 (had 104 after 68 games that year)...Oakland has nine players with eight or more home runs, which is the most in the majors...the Athletics record for players with 10 or more home runs in a season is nine in 2000 and 2017...had their season-high streak of 13 consecutive games with a home run snapped last Wednesday.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .267 (216-for-810) with 136 runs (5.9 per game) and 46 home runs over the last 23 games dating back to May 16 after hitting .236 with 4.4 runs per game and 56 home runs over the first 44 contests...overall, rank fourth in the American League in hit by pitches (30) and fewest strikeouts (526) and are fifth in extra base hits (222)...have the third fewest stolen bases (22)...A's pinch hitters are 9-for-34 (.265) with two home runs, eight RBI and six walks...rank second in the AL in pinch walks, tied for second in plate appearances (42), third in home runs and RBI and tied for third in hits...Oakland's number eight hitters are batting a combined .300 (73-for-243), which is the best mark in the majors...have the third best OPS (.886).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 11-3 with a 3.88 ERA (53 er in 123.0 ip) over the last 23 games dating back to May 16 after going 14-15 with a 4.51 ERA over the first 44 contests...are 25-18 with a 4.29 ERA overall...rank third in the American League in wins, fourth in innings pitched (354.1), opponents slugging percentage (.415) and OPS (.728) and fifth in ERA and winning percentage (.581)...used an "opener" for the second time this year last Wednesday and lost...are 1-2 in games in those games this season after going 4-5 last year...openers have allowed at least one run in two of the three games (3 er in 3.0 ip, 9.00 ERA) but do not have a decision...Hendriks has started twice (May 11 and 29) and Soria once (June 5).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 5.49 ERA (73 er in 119.2 ip) over the last 13 games dating back to May 27 after logging a 2.88 ERA over the previous 18 contests...overall, have allowed 79 home runs, which is third fewest in the American League...have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.407) and the fifth lowest OPS (.725).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last four games (six errors total), which matches the A's longest streak of consecutive games with an error this year (April 27-30)...now have 11 errors in the last 11 games after a season-high eight-game errorless streak...have committed 37 errors for the season, which includes 11 by second basemen, eight by pitchers and 19 by all other positions...have a .985 fielding percentage, which is fifth best in the American League...opponents have 48 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors to New York-NL (52).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 4-3 on this season-long 10-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (2-1), Texas (2-2) and Tampa Bay (three games)...are now 10-3 on the road dating back to May 16 after starting the year 5-15 in away games...are 15-18 (.455) on the road compared to 18-15 (.545) at home...return home following the game on Wednesday for a season-long 10-game homestand against Seattle (three games), Baltimore (three games) and Tampa Bay (four games)...went 4-5 on the last homestand against Seattle (3-0), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Houston (0-3), which was their first losing homestand since May 22-31, 2018 when they went 4-6 against Seattle, Arizona and Tampa Bay...have a season-high five-game home losing streak but are 50-24 (.676) in Oakland dating back to June 16, 2018.

**HOME AND AWAY SPLITS:** The A's are batting .261 (318-for-1219) and are averaging 5.74 runs per game on the road (195 runs in 34 games) compared to .231 with an average of 4.09 runs per game at home...are averaging the third most runs per game on the road in the American League and the fourth fewest at home...have the fifth best road batting average the fourth lowest home batting average...have a 4.87 ERA (160 er in 295.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.78 at home...have the fifth highest road ERA and the fifth lowest home ERA.

**CLOSE CALLS:** Six of the A's last eight games have been decided by two runs or fewer...are 16-18 in those games for the season and the 34 games are second most in the American League (Seattle, 35) and third most in the majors (Cincinnati, 36)...are 9-10 in one-run games and the 19 games are third most in the AL...are 2-6 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning losses and lead the AL in extra inning games...have allowed 18 runs in extra innings, which is twice as much as any other team (17 er in 20.2 ip, 7.40 ERA)...allowed just nine runs in extra innings all last year (8 er in 38.1 ip, 1.88 ERA)...are 5-12 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors in last at bat losses and are tied for second in last at bat games (Atlanta, 18)...also lead the majors with six walk-off losses, which is one more than all last year...have four walk-off wins, which is tied with the Astros and White Sox for the most in the AL.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 14-6 (.700) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 19-27 (.413) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (15-5)...are batting .281 with an .858 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .236 with a .718 OPS against right-handers...have the second best batting average and OPS against lefties in the American League but the fifth lowest batting average against righties...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in home runs off lefties (33)

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have used the injured list 11 times this year...currently have six players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Herrmann, Hundley, Manaea) and all but Estrada and Hundley are on the 60-day IL...have had at least five players on the DL every day dating back to April 26, 2018.

**A's vs. RAYS:** The A's and Rays meet for the first time in 2019 tonight...Oakland went 2-5 against Tampa Bay last year for the second consecutive season, marking the second time they have lost back-to-back season series to the Rays (2007-08)...the 2-5 record matches the A's worst ever against the Rays (2017)...went 1-3 in the Coliseum and 1-2 at Tropicana Field...have lost nine of the last 13 games and seven of the nine losses have been by one run...all-time, the A's are 105-73 (.590) against the Rays, which is their best record against any American League team...are 58-30 in Oakland and 47-43 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any AL team.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** is tied for sixth in the American League in extra base hits (31) and tied for ninth in home runs (16)...his 16 home runs are tied for the most among Major League third basemen...leads ML third basemen in total chances (210) and putouts (78) and ranks third in assists (127)...**Ramón Laureano** has reached base safely in 28 consecutive games, which is the longest active streak in the majors and third longest for the season...he is batting .318 with a .353 on-base percentage during the streak...**Josh Phegley** leads Major League catchers with 36 RBI and is tied for second among all AL players in RBI on the road (30)...**Marcus Semien** has hit safely in all seven games on the road trip and is 13-for-31 (.419) with two doubles, two home runs and nine RBI

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1979** Jim Essian hits an inside-the-park grand slam in the A's 12-1 win against Toronto...in **1992** Mark McGwire hits his 200th career home run off Chris Bosio in the A's 5-2 win at Milwaukee...he becomes the third Oakland Athletic to reach the 200 mark, joining Reggie Jackson and Jose Canseco...in **1997** Damon Mashore has three assists at Detroit to set an Oakland record for assists by an outfielder...in **2017** the A's set an Oakland record for hits in a doubleheader with 32 against Tampa Bay...Yonder Alonso had seven hits, to become the second Oakland player with seven hits in one day.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Tanner Anderson (4-4, 6.26 ERA with Las Vegas)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas today and will be making his Oakland debut...was acquired from the Pittsburgh Pirates on Nov. 20, 2018 for a player to be named later (minor league pitcher Wilkin Ramos)...was optioned to Las Vegas March 10 and is 4-4 with a 6.26 ERA and .297 opponents batting average in 11 games, including 10 starts, with the Aviators...is scheduled to make his first Major League start today...made his ML debut with the Pirates last year and was 1-0 with a 6.35 ERA in six relief appearances.

**ANDERSON vs. TAMPA BAY:** Is making his first career appearance and start.

**2019 WITH LAS VEGAS:** Was 4-4 with a 6.26 ERA and .297 opponents batting average in 11 games, including 10 starts...walked 26 batters in 54.2 innings, an average of 4.28 per nine innings...yielded 14 home runs, which was tied for fifth most in the Pacific Coast League at the time of his promotion...his opponents batting average broke down to .258 (34-for-132) against right-handed hitters compared to .356 (32-for-90) against left-handers...righties had a .799 OPS, lefties 1.116...yielded a .333 average with the bases empty, .250 with runners on...tossed six innings or fewer in each outing, including fewer than five innings five times...allowed two runs or fewer six times and five runs or more in his other five appearances.

**2019 LAS VEGAS HIGHLIGHTS:** Allowed a season-high nine runs on a season-high 12 hits in his first start April 8 at El Paso but had a no decision in a 10-9 Las Vegas win...then yielded just two runs in 6.0 innings in each of his next two starts, picking up the win on April 13 against Fresno before taking the loss April 19 at Fresno...surrendered a season-high five home runs and matched his season-high by allowing 12 hits in a 12-3 loss to El Paso April 27...finished April 1-2 with a 6.85 ERA in four starts...then went 3-2 with a 4.82 ERA in six games, five starts in May...made his only relief appearance May 7 against Salt Lake, tossing 3.0 scoreless innings and allowing just one hit and one walk...then yielded 11 run in 8.0 innings over his next two starts, both losses...issued a season-high four walks May 19 at Salt Lake...allowed one run in each of next two starts, including May 24 against Albuquerque when he struck out a season-high seven batters in 5.0 innings...had a no decision in a 5-4, 10-inning loss but then surrendered one run in 6.0 innings for the win May 29 at Sacramento.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the Aviators 19-9 win over Round Rock last Tuesday...allowed a three-run home run to Yordan Alvarez in the first but Las Vegas came back with three in the bottom of the first...yielded another run in the second but the Aviators scored seven times in the bottom of the second and eight more in the third...had a 19-4 lead but was charged with two runs in the fifth and was relieved by Miguel Romero after tossing 4.1 innings.

**2018 RECAP:** Made his Major League debut with Pittsburgh and went 1-0 with a 6.35 ERA in six relief appearances over three stints with the Pirates...allowed a .333 opponents batting average and issued eight walks in 11.1 innings for a .444 on-base percentage...yielded a .321 (9-for-28) average against right-handed hitters compared to .353 (6-for-17) against left-handers...issued seven of his eight walks to lefties...allowed 2-of-6 (33.3%) inherited runners to score...first batters faced were 2-for-5 (.400) with a walk...opponents were 0-for-10 with two outs...was selected from Triple-A Indianapolis on June 27 and made his Major League debut July 2 at Los Angeles-NL (2.0 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...retired the first batter he faced (Bellinger ground out) but then allowed four straight hits...struck out Alex Wood in the fifth inning for his first strikeout...was optioned back to Indianapolis the next day...returned to Pittsburgh July 15 and was credited with his first ML win that day against Milwaukee (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb)...allowed a run in the top of the 10th

but the Pirates scored twice in the bottom of the 10th for a 7-6 win...was optioned July 20...rejoined Pittsburgh for a third time Sept. 4 and logged a 2.16 ERA and .207 opponents batting average in four outings in September...tossed a career-high 3.2 innings Sept. 23 against Milwaukee... also grounded out in his only big league at bat that day...struck out a career-high four in 2.0 innings in his final outing Sept. 30 at Cincinnati.

**2018 WITH INDIANAPOLIS:** Was 3-2 with six saves and a 2.64 ERA in 39 appearances with Indianapolis, all in relief...the ERA was a career-low and the saves and games pitched a career-high...walked 15 batters in 61.1 innings and his average of 2.20 walks per nine innings was second lowest among International League relievers...surrendered just two home runs (0.29 per nine innings), both solo shots...had a .277 opponents batting average, which broke down to .230 (32-for-139) against right-handed hitters compared to .344 (33-for-96) against left-handers...yielded a .292 average with runners in scoring position but that dropped to .194 with RISP and two outs...converted 6-of-9 (66.7%) save opportunities...allowed 7-of-24 (29.2%) inherited runners to score...had a 2.23 ERA in 26 games before the All-Star Break, a 3.24 ERA in 13 games after the break...compiled a 1.91 ERA in 22 games at home, a 3.49 ERA in 17 outings on the road...posted a 0.48 ERA in 10 day games, a 3.59 ERA in 29 appearances at night...went 0-for-2 as a hitter...tossed at least one inning in 35 of his 39 appearances, including two or more 17 times.

**2018 MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS:** Allowed five runs in 0.2 innings for the loss and blown save in his first outing on April 6 against Columbus...would not allow another earned run until May 28 for a streak of 23.2 consecutive innings without an earned run...that lowered his season ERA to 1.85...had a 16.1-inning scoreless streak from April 8 to May 12...finished May with a 0.68 ERA in 10 appearances...recorded five of his six saves over a seven-game stretch from June 25 to July 28 and did not allow an earned run over that span (8.2 ip)...had a 1.91 ERA when he allowed a season-high six runs in 1.2 innings July 31 at Columbus...also surrendered a season-high five hits in that game and issued three walks, his only outing with more than one walk...had a 4.26 ERA over his final nine contests...logged four of his six saves in the month of July...had allowed just 1-of-18 (5.6%) inherited runners to score through the end of July...then allowed all six of his inherited runners to score in August...struck out a season-high four batters in 1.2 innings against Lehigh Valley, Aug. 7...tossed a season-high 3.0 scoreless innings Aug. 19 at Lehigh Valley, a mark he matched Aug. 29 against Toledo.

- A's bullpen has converted eight of last 11 save opportunities over last 21 games since May 18 but has 4.70 ERA (43 er in 82.1 ip) over that span.
- However, is 14-for-27 (51.9%) in save opportunities for the season...the 13 blown saves are tied for second most in the majors...the save percentage is second lowest in the majors and the saves are tied for 8th in AL.
- Is tied for the fourth fewest home runs allowed in MLB (27)...also fourth in fewest wins (8) and tied for the most losses (15).
- Has ninth best on-base percentage against first batters faced (.320) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.315) among AL bullpens.

- Began the season as the A's fifth starter and went 2-3 with a 5.74 ERA in six starting assignments before pitching in relief of "opener" Liam Hendriks May 11...has a 4.00 ERA (4 er in 9.0 ip) in four relief appearances.
- Has allowed 42 hits, nearly half of which have been for extra bases (10 doubles, 10 home runs)...has a .263 opponents batting average and .513 slugging percentage.
- Has a 3.86 ERA (9 er in 21.0 ip) in five games at home, an 6.98 ERA (15 er in 19.1 ip) in five games on the road.
- Has not faced Tampa Bay in his career.

*Last Year: Spent the entire season at Triple-A Colorado Springs in the Milwaukee Brewers organization before he was traded to Oakland Sept. 3 for cash considerations...pitched in three games for Oakland in September and did not allow a run in 2.2 innings*

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 29 for his second stint with the A's and has not allowed a run in 17 of 19 games since his return...has a 1.59 ERA (2 er in 11.1 ip) and .158 (6-for-38) opponents batting average over that span...logged a 7.04 ERA and .375 opponents average over his first 13 games before he was optioned to Las Vegas April 22.
- Is tied for first in the American League in games pitched (32).
- Has allowed a .156 (7-for-45) average against left-handed hitters, .440 (11-for-25) against right-handers.
- Is 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 3.0 IP) with 2 strikeouts in three career relief appearances vs. Tampa Bay.

*Last Year: Went 6-0 with a 2.75 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in 54 relief appearances in his first season with the A's...allowed just 2-of-30 (6.7%) inherited runners to score, which was the lowest percentage in the majors.*

### 16 RHP LIAM HENDRIKS

Saves/Opportunities: 0-0  
Inherited Runners/Scored: 17/7 First Hitters: 6-20, 4 bb, sf, hbp

- Has made two appearances as an opener this year...the first came in the A's 3-2 win over Cleveland on May 11 (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...is now 0-1 with a 3.38 ERA (4 er in 10.2 ip) and a .225 (9-for-40) opponents batting average in 10 career starts as an opener...the A's are 5-5 in those games.
- Has not allowed a run in 15 of his last 17 games and has a 1.31 ERA over that stretch (3 er in 20.2 ip).
- Allowed two runs on May 29, snapping a career-high 14.2-inning scoreless streak, but the May 19 suspended game is part of the streak...was on the mound when the game was called with a 2-2 count on the first batter in the inning.
- Is tied for eighth among American League relievers in innings pitched (33.2) and sixth in ERA (1.34).
- Won his second game with 2.0 shutout innings on May 21 at Cleveland.
