OAKLAND ATHLETICS (33-34) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (41-24)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three of the last four games but are 4-4 over the last eight contests...are 33-34 overall and have not been more than one one game over .500 or one game under .500 since May 29 (29-27)...are in third place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by a season-high 12 games...are three games behind Texas for the second Wild Card...started the season 10-8, went 5-13 over an 18-game stretch from April 14 to May 5, were 14-4 from May 7 to 27 and are 4-9 since then...have spent eight days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 25 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 51 home runs over the last 26 games dating back to May 13, which are second most in the majors over that span to Minnesota (54)...hit 51 home runs over the first 42 contests and have 102 for the season, which is tied for fourth in the American League...it is second most in Athletics history after 68 games to the 2000 club, which had 104 (had 105 after 69)...Oakland has nine players with eight or more home runs, which is the most in the majors...the Athletics record for players with 10 or more home runs in a season is nine in 2000 and 2017...had their season-high streak of 13 consecutive games with a home run snapped last Wednesday.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .262 (220-for-841) with 138 runs (5.8 per game) and 46 home runs over the last 24 games dating back to May 16 after hitting .236 with 4.4 runs per game and 56 home runs over the first 44 contests...overall, rank fourth in the American League in hit by pitches (31) and fewest strikeouts (535)...A's pinch hitters are 9-for-35 (.257) with two home runs, eight RBI and seven walks...are tied for the AL lead in pinch walks, rank second in plate appearances (44), third in home runs and RBI and tied for third in hits...Oakland's number eight hitters are batting a combined .296 (73-for-247), which is the second best mark in the majors (Atlanta, .297)...have the third best OPS (.872).

STARTING PITCHING: Last night, Tanner Anderson became the 11th pitcher to start a game for the A's this year, which is tied for third most in the majors behind the Angels (15) and Rangers (12)...A's starters are 11-4 with a 3.85 ERA (55 er in 128.2 ip) over the last 24 games dating back to May 16 after going 14-15 with a 4.51 ERA over the first 44 contests...are 25-19 with a 4.28 ERA overall...rank third in the American League in wins, fourth in innings pitched (360.0), opponents slugging percentage (.414) and OPS (.725) and fifth in ERA and winning percentage (.568)...used an "opener" for the second time this year last Wednesday and lost...are 1-2 in games in those games this season after going 4-5 last year...openers have allowed at least one run in two of the three games (3 er in 3.0 ip, 9.00 ERA) but do not have a decision...Hendriks has started twice (May 11 and 29) and Soria once (June 5).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.57 ERA (79 er in 127.2 ip) over the last 14 games dating back to May 27 after logging a 2.88 ERA over the previous 18 contests...overall, have allowed 82 home runs, which is fourth fewest in the American League...have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.409) and the fifth lowest OPS (.727).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 11 errors in the last 12 games after a season-high eight-game errorless streak...have committed 37 errors for the season, which includes 11 by second basemen, eight by pitchers and 18 by all other positions...have a .985 fielding percentage, which is fifth best in the American League...have the fifth fewest double plays (44) and are tied for the third fewest unearned runs (15).

ON THE BASES: The A's have allowed 48 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors to the Mets (52)...however, opponents have been caught stealing 19 times, which is second most to the Phillies (22)...on offense, the A's are 22-for-35 (62.9%) in stolen base attempts...the percentage is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have the third fewest stolen bases in the AL and are tied for the third fewest attempts.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-4 on this season-long 10-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (2-1), Texas (2-2) and Tampa Bay (0-1)...are now 10-4 on the road dating back to May 16 after starting the year 5-15 in away games...are 15-19 (.441) on the road compared to 18-15 (.545) at home...return home following the game tomorrow for a season-long 10-game homestand against Seattle (three games), Baltimore (three games) and Tampa Bay (four games) beginning Friday...went 4-5 on the last homestand against Seattle (3-0), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Houston (0-3), which was their first losing homestand since May 22-31, 2018 when they went 4-6 against Seattle, Ari-

zona and Tampa Bay...have a season-high five-game home losing streak but are 50-24 (.676) in Oakland dating back to June 16, 2018.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .258 (322-for-1250) and are averaging 5.63 runs per game on the road (197 runs in 35 games) compared to .231 with an average of 4.09 runs per game at home...are averaging the third most runs per game on the road in the American League and the fourth fewest at home...have the fourth lowest home batting average...have a 4.92 ERA (166 er in 303.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.78 at home...have the fifth highest road ERA and the fifth lowest home ERA.

CLOSE CALLS: Six of the A's last nine games have been decided by two runs or fewer...are 16-18 in those games for the season and the 34 games are second most in the American League (Seattle, 35) and third most in the majors (Cincinnati, 36)...are 9-10 in one-run games and the 19 games are third most in the AL...are 2-6 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning losses and lead the AL in extra inning games...have allowed 18 runs in extra innings, which is twice as much as any other team (17 er in 20.2 ip, 7.40 ERA)...allowed just nine runs in extra innings all last year (8 er in 38.1 ip, 1.88 ERA)...are 5-12 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors in last at bat losses and are tied for second in last at bat games (Atlanta, 18)...also lead the majors with six walk-off losses, which is one more than all last year...have four walk-off wins, which is tied with the Astros and White Sox for the most in the AL.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 14-6 (.700) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 19-28 (.404) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (15-5)...are batting .279 with an .854 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .234 with a .714 OPS against right-handers...have the second best batting average and OPS against lefties in the American League but the fifth lowest batting average against righties...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in home runs off lefties (33).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 11 times this year...currently have six players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Herrmann, Hundley, Manaea) and all but Estrada and Hundley are on the 60-day IL...have had at least five players on the DL every day dating back to April 26, 2018.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2019 last night...Oakland went 2-5 against Tampa Bay last year for the second consecutive season, marking the second time they have lost back-to-back season series to the Rays (2007-08)...the 2-5 record matches the A's worst ever against the Rays (2017)...went 1-3 in the Coliseum and 1-2 at Tropicana Field...have lost 10 of the last 14 games and seven of the 10 losses have been by one run...all-time, the A's are 105-74 (.587) against the Rays, which is their best record against any American League team...are 58-30 in Oakland and 47-44 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any AL team.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is tied for sixth in the American League in extra base hits (31) and tied for ninth in home runs (16)...his 16 home runs are the most among AL third basemen...leads Major League third basemen in total chances (212) and putouts (78) and ranks third in assists (129)...**Ramón Laureano** had his reaching base streak snapped at 28 games yesterday...he is batting .307 (35-for-114) over his last 31 games after hitting .216 over his first 36 contests...**Josh Phegley** leads ML catchers with 36 RBI and is tied for second among all AL players in RBI on the road (30)...**Marcus Semien** has hit safely in all eight games on the road trip and is 15-for-35 (.429) with two doubles, two home runs and nine RBI...the hitting streak is one short of his career high of nine (three times).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1978**, at the age of 18 years, 246 days, Mike Morgan becomes the youngest pitcher to start a game for the Oakland A's...he goes the distance, allowing 10 hits against Baltimore, but takes the loss in a 3-0 decision...Morgan's honor is short lived as Tim Conroy, at the age of 18 years, 81 days, gets a start 12 days later...in **1995** Mark McGwire hits three home runs in the A's 8-1 win at Boston after hitting two home runs the day before...his five home runs in consecutive games tied a major league record which he already shared...in **1999** Miguel Tejada hits three home runs in a game against Los Angeles to tie the Athletics record...he is the only Athletics shortstop to hit three home runs in a game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (5-3, 4.76 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his 15th start of the season, which will tie him for the most in the majors among non-openers...is 3-0 with a 2.79 ERA (12 er in 38.2 ip) and .167 (22-for-132) opponents batting average over his last six starts, beginning with his May 7 no-hitter...has the fourth lowest opponents batting average in the American League over that span and the eighth lowest ERA...the three-game winning streak includes a start in the suspended game May 19 at Detroit, in which he is the pitcher of record with the A's leading 5-3 in the bottom of the seventh...went 2-3 with a 6.81 ERA and .297 opponents batting average over his first eight starts.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-1 with a 3.59 ERA (19 er in 47.2 ip) and .201 (35-for-174) opponents batting average in eight starts at night compared to 2-2 with a 6.75 ERA (21 er in 28.0 ip) and .292 (31-for-106) opponents average in six starts during the day...ranks fourth in the American League in opponents batting average and OPS (.600) at night and 10th in ERA.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .236 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .196 (28-for-143) against right-handed hitters compared to .277 (38-for-137) against left-handers...has walked just three batters to lead off an inning...has held the opposition to a .198 (17-for-86) average with two outs but has issued 12 of his 22 walks in that situation...opponents are hitting .278 (15-for-54) with runners in scoring position but that drops to .174 (4-for-23) with RISP and two outs.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-2 with a 3.60 ERA (16 er in 40.0 ip) and .196 (28-for-143) opponents batting average in seven starts at home compared to 1-1 with a 6.06 ERA (24 er in 35.2 ip) and .277 (38-for-137) opponents average in seven starts on the road...has the second highest road ERA in the American League (Cahill, LAA 7.20)...is tied for third in the AL in home wins, ranks seventh in opponents batting average and 10th in OPS (.608)...is now 8-3 with a 3.41 ERA (38 er in 100.1 ip) in 18 career appearances, 16 starts, in the Coliseum.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-1 with a 7.64 ERA (15 er in 17.2 ip) in four starts on four days rest 3-0 with a 2.76 ERA (14 er in 45.2 ip) in seven starts on five days rest and 1-2 with an 8.03 ERA (11 er in 12.1 ip) in three starts on six days rest or more

APRIL AND BEYOND: Went 1-1 with a 7.83 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in five starts in April but is 3-1 with a 3.09 ERA (15 er in 43.2 ip) and .182 (27-for-148) opponents average in seven starts since then...is now 5-9 with a 5.68 ERA in 25 career appearances in April and is 46-35 with a 3.54 ERA (274 er in 696.2 ip) from May through August.

NO-HITTER: Tossed his second career no-hitter May 7 in Oakland against Cincinnati to become the 34th pitcher in Major League history with multiple regular season no-hitters...is the seventh with a no-hitter for multiple teams (Ted Breitenstein, Jim Bunning, Randy Johnson, Hideo Nomo, Nolan Ryan, Cy Young)...was named American League Co-Player of the Week with George Springer May 13...it was his second career Player of the Week honor with the first coming Aug. 23, 2015 following his first no-hitter...this no-hitter was the 13th in Athletics history, including the eighth in Oakland history...it was the first since Sean Manaea last year on April 21...his other no-hitter also came in interleague play on Aug. 21, 2015 for Houston against Los Angeles (NL) and he has each of the last two out of six total interleague no-hitters...tossed 131 pitches, which were the most in a no-hitter since he threw 134 in his against the Dodgers...now has two career complete games, both no-hitters...according to Stats, Inc., he is the first pitcher in ML history to have each of his first two career complete games be no-hitters...also according to Stats, his 6.81 ERA entering the game was the highest by any pitcher entering a start in which he threw a no-hitter (min. 25.0 ip).

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starter against Seattle on March 20 in Tokyo and was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-7 loss...it was his first career Opening Day start and he became the A's 12th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 14 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice)...put together wins in back-to-back starts on March 28 against Los Angeles and April 2 against Boston...did not allow a run in either outing, marking the second time in his career he had back-to-back starts without yielding a run...the other time was June 20-30, 2012 when he did it in three straight starts...combined with Trivino, Soria and Treinen on a three-hit shutout in a 4-0 win over the Angels...allowed just one hit in six innings, a one-out double by La Stella in the fifth...then combined with Buchter, Trivino and Treinen on a seven-hit shutout in a 1-0 win over the Red Sox...allowed five hits in six innings and did not walk a batter...that gave him a 2-1 record, a 3.00 ERA and a .189 opponents batting average over his first three starts...then allowed a season-high six runs in three consecutive starts from April 7-20 and went 0-1 with a 16.20 ERA and .442 opponents batting average...began that streak by tossing just 1.2 innings in a no decision at Houston April 7, matching the shortest start of his career (June 2, 2013 at Philadelphia)...

walked a season-high four...struck out a season-high six batters April 12 at Texas...yielded a season-high nine hits in just 3.1 innings in a 10-1 loss to Toronto on April 20...it was his first loss in the Coliseum since July 18, 2016 while pitching for Houston, snapping a six-game Coliseum winning streak...went 1-1 with a 7.83 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in five starts in April...the ERA was his highest in a month of 10 or more innings (previous: 7.44 in Aug. 2017)...it was second highest in the majors this year among pitchers with 20 or more innings in April (Nova, CWS 8.42)...then went 2-1 with a 2.87 ERA and .161 opponents batting average in six starts in May...had the second lowest opponents batting average in the American League in May (Verlander, HOU .124)...tossed his second career no-hitter in the A's 2-0 win on May 7 in Oakland against Cincinnati...walked two and struck out a season-high tying six...also tossed a season-high 131 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher since Mark Mulder had 132 in a three-hit shutout against Toronto on May 2, 2001...retired the first 11 before Winker reached base on an error with two outs in the fourth...set down the next seven before walking Suarez to start the seventh...Suarez was erased on a double play, Puig walked and Fiers then retired the final seven batters to complete the no-hitter...had his hitless streak and scoreless streak broken up by the first batter in his next start May 13 at Seattle as Haniger homered to lead off the bottom of the first...however, that was the only run he would allow in five innings of work and he would yield just one more hit...left with a 2-1 lead and Oakland built a 4-1 lead before Trivino allowed three runs in the eighth for the blown save...it was the first of two times the bullpen blew a save (May 31 vs. Houston, also Trivino)...was the starting pitcher in the A's game at Detroit on May 19, which was suspended in the bottom of the seventh inning with the A's leading 5-3...is the pitcher of record.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-4 win at Los Angeles (AL) last Thursday...did not walk a batter for the fifth time this year...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a Goodwin sacrifice fly in the fourth...Oakland increased its lead to 6-1 before he allowed a two-run home run to Trout in the fifth...was relieved by Buchter to start the seventh with the A's leading 7-3.

LHP Brett Anderson (6-4, 3.98 ERA): Went 3-0 with a 2.63 ERA and .222 opponents batting average over his first four starts, 1-3 with a 6.12 ERA and .287 opponents average over his next five starts from April 21 to May 14 and is 2-1 with a 3.09 ERA and .267 opponents average in four starts since then...has six wins this year after combining for seven wins over his previous three seasons...has his most wins since going 10-9 for the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2015...is 2-2 with a 6.16 ERA in four starts against American League East teams compared to 4-2 with a 3.21 ERA in nine starts against all other teams...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-3 A's win at Texas last Friday (6.1 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 1-1 with a 4.00 ERA (18.0 ip, 19 h, 10 r, 8 er, 5 bb, 17 so, 3 hr) in four career starts against Tampa bay...has not faced the Rays since April 19, 2013 when he was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss at Tampa Bay (1.0 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 1 so).

8-15, 4.44 ERA (126 er in 255.2 ip)
Saves/Opportunities: 14-for-27 (51.9%)

- A's bullpen has converted eight of last 11 save opportunities over last 22 games since May 18 but has 5.00 ERA (47 er in 84.2 ip) over that span.
- However, is 14-for-27 (51.9%) in save opportunities for the season...the 13 blown saves are tied for second most in the majors...the save percentage is second lowest in the majors and the saves are tied for 9th in AL.
- Is tied for the ninth fewest home runs allowed in MLB (29)...also fourth in fewest wins (8) and tied for the most losses (15).
- Ranks ninth in on-base percentage against first batters faced (.320) but has the second lowest slugging percentage against first batters (.315) among AL bullpens.
